

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN.

This is to certify that the undersigned personally knows John F. Balme, previously employed by the Hongkong & Shanghai Banking Corporation, Iloilo City, Panay, Philippines.

He was sworn in and commissioned as a 1st. Lieutenant in the USAFFE by Genl. Chynoweth at Nisi, Lumbuna, Panay, Philippines sometime during the month of January, 1942.

Balme was assigned to Finance as 61st. Division USAFFE Auditor and worked in that capacity until the date of invasion 16th April, 1942. From the latter date until the date of surrender 3rd. May, 1942 he was assigned to the QWB in Mt. Daloy.

During the period June-November 1942 he was with the undersigned in the mountains of Capiz Province, Panay.

From December 1942 until the date of his departure to Australia in 1944 Balme was working with the guerrillas, receiving his Special Order from Lt. Col. Relunia of the 4th. Philippine Corps. on the 16th. December, 1942 and later working directly for Col. M. Foralita in the 6th. Military District.
