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

Stry. 12 C.A. & Aug. 25 to 1 July 28; cadet M.A. 2 Fely 28; 2mi Lt. C.A.C. 10 June 32; A.C. 22 July 32 to 12 Dec. 32; let Lt. 1 Aug. 35; Capt. 10 June 42. 2. This officer was assigned to Beadquarters, Philippine Coast Artillery Command with additional duties as Assistant, S-4, Headquarters, Harbor Doformes of MARILA and SUBIC BAYS. Pollowing the fall of BATAAN, he was held as a prisoner of Ear by the Japanese until he escaped a few months ago. He has just been evacuated from the PHILIPPINES, arriving in ERISBANE yesterday aftermoon. 3. This officer's statement that he has not received pay since Movember 30, 1941, appears to be correct. 

Since his return from America a few weeks ago, Col. Malinik has been engaged in the Office of the A.C. of S., G.H.4. preparing studies and reports almost continuously.
- 4. I therefore feel that I am not qualified to pass upon this officer's characteristics and that I should not attempt to accomplish the Form 66-1 in all fairness to him and the record.
