Dear General Whitney:

You will, I hope, pardon my presumption in writing to you informally. Perhaps it can be excused on the grounds of inter-professional courtesy.

Unfortunately, I have not had the opportunity to see you since my return from the assignment with Colonel Fertig, and so must take this method of thanking you for letting me participate in what turned out to be the most unusual and interesting assignment I have had.

Colonel Fertig is, in my opinion, the finest Commanding Officer I have had, and it was a pleasure to work for him in all respects. I have already had the pleasure of writing and telling him so - for what it is worth to him - now that I am "out" and cannot be accused of "apple-polishing".

During the period of my stay in Brisbane, thanks to your consideration in temporarily lengthening my stay here, I have had my "rotation" request approved, but have recently requested that it be changed to a 45 day leave to enable my return to this theatre after some time at home. Col. Myers has indicated that he can use my services with the AIB, and it is projected that I shall return to the Bureau after my leave, if everything goes well.

Could you possibly indicate to me informally what plans are for Col. Fertig? If possible, and he is to continue in this theatre, I should like to work for him again. The AIB work is based upon the presumption that Colonel Fertig will possibly return to the United States, and would be a most interesting assignment in that event.

Colonel Ind was here for a few days last week, and we enjoyed lunch together, and some small discussion of matters dealing with the Bureau of mutual interest. He is looking quite well aside from an "astabrine tan".

At the present time, I am awaiting transportation to the States and filling in the time at the Bureau learning the "ropes" and trying to be of some use to Col. Myers.

Please accept my cordial respects, and congratulations upon your richly-deserved promotion. Perhaps I shall have the pleasure of meeting you again at some future date.

SUBJECT: Extension of temporary duty.

TO : Commanding Officer, FSS, G-3, GHQ, SWPA, APO 500.

1. Letter order AG 201-Evans, James L. Jr., GHQ, SWPA, dated 19 February 1945 instructs undersigned to proceed to Base G, APO 565 and Base 3, APO 923 on TDY for purpose of carrying out instructions, and upon completion thereof to return to APO 500.

2. As of March 26, 1945, undersigned completed thirty days stay at Australia Base Section, APO 923.

3. Interview with the Deputy Controller, Allied Intelligence Bureau, at this Base Section, indicates that there may be use for the services of the undersigned in the Allied Intelligence Bureau, but that due to exigencies of the Service, the matter cannot be immediately decided.

4. Inasmuch as the letter order referred to does not specifically limit the length of temporary duty designated thereunder, undersigned respectfully requests permission to remain at Australia Base Section pending decision in the near future of the matter referred to in paragraph 3 above.

5. Orders have been issued by the Office of the Adjutant General, GHQ Rear Echelon, placing undersigned on non-travel per diem status while on TDY at this Base Section.

6. It is respectfully requested that undersigned be notified by radio of desired action in connection with this request.

It has now been six months since I have had a letter from my husband, Major James L. Evans O-356781.

You were kind enough to write me a letter which I received the latter part of February, 1944, telling me that my husband was in fine health, that he was doing a good job, and that he had been promoted to Major.

It was a great relief to me to receive this letter, and I am sincerely grateful to you for writing to me. However, as time goes on and still no letters from my husband, I cannot help being concerned--and hope daily to receive a letter from him. 

I might add that the enclosed letter to my friend the Luxton's contains, as you will see, a deal re: one fruit cake. Col. Fertig got a large slice of the last one, so if you can expedite censorship of this letter, it will contribute greatly to morale.

SUBJECT: Claim for Loss, Damage or Rifling of Mail Matter.

TO : Commanding Officer, Allied Intelligence Bureau, APO 5001

1. The attached form relates to claim for indemnity on account of the loss, damage or rifling of an insured or C.O.D. parcel addressed to a member of your command.

2. It is requested that the "Declaration of Addressee", items 25 to 37 inclusive on Form 3812, be completed.

3. If addressee denies receipt of the parcel or claims it was received in a damaged or rifled condition, the form will be forwarded to the Army Post Office serving the addressee at the time the parcel was due to have been, or was, received.

4. Postal Officers receiving forms forwarded as required by paragraph three above will complete the "Declaration of Postmaster - Office of Address", items 20 to 24 inclusive on Form 3812, and postmark the form in space provided. If records of the APO show delivery to a unit mail clerk his statement relative to the disposition of the parcel will be obtained.

5. Upon completion of necessary action, all papers will be returned to the Postal Officer, United States Army Forces in the Far East, A.P.O. 501.

INSTRUCTIONS TO ALL POSTMASTERS INVOLVED

TO EXPEDITE ADJUSTMENT OF INDEMNITY CLAIMS—ALL POSTMASTERS WHO ARE IN ANY WAY INVOLVED IN THE HANDLING OF INDEMNITY CLAIMS ARE ENJOINED TO GIVE PROMPT ATTENTION TO ALL SUCH CLAIMS AND TO TAKE ANY ACTION REQUIRED OF THEM AS EXPEDITIOUSLY AS POSSIBLE.

POSTMASTER GENERAL.

The sections of the Postal Laws and Regulations cited in these instructions are to the edition of 1940. Section 1885 covers general provisions regarding domestic insured and C. O. D. mail; section 1886 covers domestic insured mail; sections 1887 and 1888 cover domestic C. O. D. mail; sections 1882 and 1889 cover the general policy governing the payment of indemnity.

Read and comply carefully with instructions in the current July Guide under heading "Indemnity for Lost, Stolen, and Damaged Insured and C. O. D. Mail and Failure to Receive Remittances on C. O. D. Mail."

This form should be filed in with pen and ink, typewriter, or indelible pencil.

DO NOT LET THIS DOCUMENT PASS FROM THE CUSTODY OF THE POSTAL SERVICE.

POSTMASTER—MAILING OFFICE

IN EVERY CASE REPORT MUST BE MADE TO OBTAIN A BILL OR SIGNED STATEMENT FROM THE PERSON WHO SOLD THE ARTICLES TO THE OWNER, SHOWING THEIR VALUE AND DATE OF SALE. When claim is started at your office, you will have your declaration and the declaration of the sender completed, and immediately send the form to the postmaster at the office of address. On claims involving steamer parcels the name of the sender need not be entered in your certificate when the claim is started at your office. The signature of the sender to his declaration will be sufficient in those instances. The name of the sender must always be stated, however, in your declaration when the claim involves a C. O. D. parcel.

In event the claim was started at the office of address, and this Form 3812 is received by you with the parcel number, name, and address of sender, and name and address of addressee already filled in on the mailing postmaster's declaration, you will verify the particulars already entered, correcting them when necessary, fill in the remaining items from your records, and obtain the declaration of the sender in the regular manner. If it is necessary in your certificate to correct any entries made by the postmaster at the office of address, you will make a marginal notation to that effect on the form. When this form is completed, dispose of it as instructed below under the heading "Disposition of Completed Form."

In claims involving damage, the sender, in answer to Item 11 on reverse side of this form, or on separate sheet if necessary, should be required to describe in detail the packing and wrapping of the parcel involved showing the kind of container used, that is, whether wood, single or double faced corrugated cardboard, fiberboard, etc.; the kind of cushioning material used, if any, such as excelsior, sawdust, etc., and a general statement as to the quantity of cushioning material used, the manner in which used both in connection with the contents as a whole and the individual articles, and any other information which will enable the Department or postmasters authorized to adjust indemnity claims to determine whether the parcels for which claims are filed were properly prepared for mailing. In cases involving loss or rifling of domestic insured or C. O. D. parcels, report must also be made on Form 651 or 1510 to the Post Office Inspector in Charge of your Division, as required by section 810, paragraph 4, Postal Laws and Regulations.

When this Form 3812 is received from the postmaster at the office of mailing with page 1 already completed, you will fill out, postmark, and sign the "Declaration of Postmaster—Office of Address" on page 2, and obtain the declaration of addressee. When this form is completed, dispose of it as instructed below under the heading "Disposition of Completed Form."

As sufficient accurate data as to mailing particulars and contents of parcels is seldom available at the address office when claims are first instituted, extreme care should be exercised in starting claims at address offices. When the evidence at hand and the circumstances warrant the institution of a claim at your office, you will enter in the "Declaration of Postmaster—Mailing Office," the number of the parcel, the name and address of the sender, and the name and address of the addressee; and at the bottom of that declaration, beneath the space for mailing postmaster's signature, you will write the name of the mailing office, but do not attempt to fill in any other items, and do not sign the mailing postmaster's certificate. The particulars mentioned must be entered before the declaration of the addressee is signed, as it is absolutely necessary that a description of the parcel shall appear on the form before the questions relating to it are answered. When the declaration of addressee and declaration of postmaster at office of address have been completed, the form must promptly be sent to the postmaster at the office of mailing for completion. However, unless sufficient information as to particulars of mailing of parcel and contents is available, the claim should be started at the office of mailing.

SENDER, ADDRESSEE, OR OWNER

PENALTY FOR MAKING OR USING ANY FALSE, SLEEVING, OR FRAUDULENT STATEMENT IN CONNECTION WITH THIS CLAIM: Fine of not more than \$500 and imprisonment for not more than two years. (See Section 35, Criminal Code of United States.)

This declaration may be made without cost before any post office inspector or other representative of the Post Office Department commissioned by the Postmaster General, or any postmaster or sworn employee of a post office

designated by the postmaster for the purpose. The impression of the postmarking stamp of the post office or station where it is executed must be affixed, if practicable. However, if preferred, the declaration may be executed before an officer authorized to administer oaths, who will affix his official seal, or if he has no seal, a certificate from a clerk of a court of record, showing that he is duly qualified to administer oaths, must be submitted.

No indemnity can be paid to cover or include the cost, if any, of furnishing this declaration, whether or not indemnity is paid or recovery is made.

The signatures of sender and addressee, wherever they appear in this form, should correspond exactly with their names as given in the certificate of the postmaster on page 1. In event the names as given in that certificate are misspelled or otherwise inaccurate, the correct names of sender or addressee should be signed, and immediately filed in parentheses, should be written "(same as —)", giving the name as entered by the mailing postmaster. 1

Indemnity is paid by mark, its genuineness must be attested by a disinterested witness.

Indemnity for lost, rifled, or damaged insured and C. O. D. parcels is limited to their actual value, allowing for depreciation, or to the actual cost of replacement within the limits prescribed by the Postal Laws and Regulations according to the fee paid.

No indemnity will be paid for a lost, rifled, or damaged insured or C. O. D. parcel: (1) When application is not made within six months from the date of mailing except in the case of insured mail addressed to the Philippines Islands or in the case of insured or C. O. D. parcels mailed or addressed to Guam, where the requirement that claims for indemnity be filed within six months from the date of mailing of the parcels has been extended to ten months from the dates of mailing; (2) unless lost, rifled, or damaged while in the custody of the Postal Service; (3) when the loss or reimbursement has been made therefor by the Post Office Department; (4) when such matter is not lawfully in the mails; (5) where other compensation or sender was instructed prior to the date of mailing of the parcel relative to proper packing and indemnification and failed to comply therewith.

DISPOSITION OF COMPLETED FORM

No postmaster should pay any claim chargeable to a leased appropriation. The date of mailing of each article within the fiscal year will fix the annual appropriation to which such claim will be chargeable. The appropriations from which claims are paid are valid for the fiscal year for which the appropriations are made, and two full fiscal years thereafter (or in other words for three full fiscal years). Postmasters at central accounts, offices, and two full fiscal years thereafter to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Registered Mails, all claims for indemnity received at their offices which are chargeable to leased appropriations.

Claims for indemnity covering insured mail addressed to the Philippines Islands or extending with the Canal Zone, U. S. naval vessels (except seagoing ships permanently located at continental ports), and officers and enlisted men served through the United States domestic mails and for both insured and C. O. D. mail exchanged with the United States Naval Operating Base, Guantanamo, Cuba; Guam, Tinian, and other islands of the Marianas Group, shall be transmitted to the Third Assistant Postmaster General, Division of Registered Mails, for adjustment regardless of the dates of mailing. The C. O. D. service with the Philippines Islands, Canal Zone, and naval vessels has been discontinued.

The following statement should be filed out only when the circumstances warrant. See appropriate instructions in the current July Postal Guide relative to (1) waiving the declaration of addressee, (2) disposition to be made of irreparably damaged articles possessing possible salvage value, and (3) requests that claim papers in case of indemnity claims be referred after audit to the Chief Inspector for investigation.
