1. Under the provisions of paragraph 104, AR 600-15, it is recommended that the Bronze Star Medal be awarded to 1st Lieutenant James B. Hollway, O-200223, U.S.A., for exceptionally meritorious service in operation of M21 type during the crucial period from 1 January 1945 to 1 March 1945.

2. Lieutenant Hollway, during the B-1 operation, by his close supervision and technical skill assured the efficient operation of the Philippine Intelligence nets. During this period he worked at all hours of the day and night in addition to the many cables the information received. The willingness and efficiency with which he carried out his duties was outstanding.

3. The services of Lieutenant Hollway since the period in question has been honorable.

In early January 1945 when the Mike One Operation was mounted, Lieutenant McGivney was given charge of KAZ radio station which was contacting guerilla nets in all parts of the Philippines. After the landing KAZ Leyte continued to contact directly all guerilla nets except those in Northern Luzon and in addition KAZ in Luzon. On March 1 all guerilla stations had passed to either Sixth or Eighth Army.

During this period Lieutenant McGivney has efficiently operated his station and message center and has willingly and cheerfully conformed to the wishes of G-3, PI Section. It is considered that he performed in an outstanding manner a difficult task.

A letter of commendation was prepared and signed by General Russell but returned by General Chamberlin with the remark that if McGivney's work was beyond expectations why not recommend him for a medal.

The letter being sent to the C in C for approval recommends award of Bronze Star Medal.
