





Commander Rowe has read into the Signal sent him on 22 October that the "Canaries" had been incorrectly used, and it is requested that you advise Lt. Commander Rowe of Section 22's admiration for the work he and his party have done. 3. The widespread briefing and field work carried out reflects the greatest credit on all concerned, and it would be this Section's deepest regret if Lt. Commander Rowe and Lt. Herrandez felt that their work and difficulties were not fully appreciated. 4. The very first requirements of "Canary" were that it must be compact and light, resulting in dry cell batteries of short life performance having to be installed, and it was for this reason that we recommended that the equipment be destroyed rather than burden the party with useless equipment. 5. The best of our equipment in the hands of highly skilled operators frequently gives trouble, causing disappointing results so that this section well knows the effort that can be expended without any result. In addition, the canary was designed for a different purpose but it was decided to send the equipment along in the hope that despite the relative insensitivity of the set, it might be possible to locate radar stations in the immediate vicinity of Manila. 6. Following the conversation between yourself and my officers this morning, the handbook giving details of Enemy Radar is being prepared, and it is felt that when this reaches Lt. 

1. The following extracts from letters and a report regarding the LEPANTO COPPER MINE, located at MANLSAYAN, Lamon, Philippine Islands, are listed below for your information concerning possible future shipments of copper are from SAN FERNANDO, La Union, P.Is

at one hundred fifty thousand tons. One hundred two thousand tons is believed available in Japan proper, Korea, Manchuria, Formona. The present rate of Lepanto production is one fourth of Jap requirements. Successful operations against the mine would be a serious blow to the Jap war effort."

withis office estimates that copper production from the Lepanto nine will not greatly exceed 40,000 tons of metal for 1944 (roughly 25% of Japan's requirement) by reason of the following considerations based on the study of information from reliable sourcess.

"Computent mining engineers estimate that as of December, 1943, copper production at Lepante is about 2000 tons of ore per day averaging 6 per cent metallic copper, or 120 tons of metallic copper daily and 43,000 tons annually. It is further estimated that before the end of 1944, 5,000 tons per day of 6 per cent ore will be mined at Lepante."

trusks have been moved to Hankayan, Dr. Bain reports, and a tram

be used to transport the ore to the shipping point. At San Fernando
two places have been built to handle the ore which is shipped northward apparently to some Formosan port, the boats making a round


