

#### MEMOR ANDUM:

SUBJECT : Aircraft Warning in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS.

TO : Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3, General Headquarters.

The installation of an efficient Air Warning System in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS must be completed and the system functioning prior to the initiation of operations in that area. To accomplish this a ground observer system will be organized and will employ the communications channels now utilized for coast watching, intelligence, and weather. A Fifth Air Force officer, fully qualified technically in Air Warning requirements, will be attached to your office (on temporary duty) to assist in organizing and supervising formation and operation of the Philippine Air Warning System. This system will be placed in operation without delay.

FOP SECR IT traffic volume due to aircraft warning information will be detected by the enemy intelligence service and will result in intensified efforts on his part to locate and destroy all stations. 3. In order to relieve the present intelligence channels of this increased air warning traffic, it is proposed to establish a relay station on MINDINAO with ALLIED AIR Force personnel. This station to receive directly from Guerrilla net control stations all aircraft warning and weather information and relay it to a terminal station to be established by the ALLIED AIR Forces at a forward Fighter Control Center. In addition to relieving intelligence charmels of air warning traffic, this station will insure the timely receipt of air warming and weather information to the using agency. The personnel and equipment furnished by the ALLIED AIR Forces to be absorbed by them upon the establishment of the first Fighter Control Center in MINDINAO. - b. That the attached letter be dispatched to the Commander ALLIED AIR Forces.
- c. That the ALLIED AIR Forces establish a terminal station at a forward Fighter Control Center for direct communication with the relay station when established.




MEMORANDUM FOR CHIEF OF STAFF.

SUBJECT: Aircraft Warning in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS.

- 1. The following action is being taken to implement the plan for the development of an Aircraft Warning System in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS as outlined in your memorandum dated 20 June 1944, subject as above:
- of existing communication facilities to and within the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS are being improved by the installation of additional equipment at the terminal station (KAZ, DARWIN) by the introduction of continuous net operation and by the promulgation of suitable Signal Operation Instructions to standardise and closely control communication procedures.
- b. A Standing Operating Procedure for Ground Observers in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS based upon the standard procedure now employed by V Fighter Commend in the NEW GUINEA area has been prepared and will be distributed by courier as soon as practicable. An extract containing only essential instructions has been prepared and sent to all Net Control Stations in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS for distribution to associated posts and immediate use for instruction of all operating personnel.
- c. The above mentioned procedure will be placed in operation, utilizing existing radio channels, as soon as personnel in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS have had sufficient time for minimum indostrination.
- d. The Commander ALLIED ATR Forces will be provided sufficient information concerning communication facilities and operating procedure to permit the establishment of monitor stations at forward Fighter Control Centers for the interception and utilization of all sireraft warning information.
- 2. Completion of the above mentioned action will result in the formation of the nucleus of an excellent ground observer system in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS, all information concerning aircraft movements observed by existing posts being reported with a minimum delay to KAZ and simultaneously to appropriate ALLIED AIR Force Fighter Control Centers. It is anticipated, however, that the addition of aircraft warming information to circuits already carrying weather and intelligence traffic will ultimately overload these channels. MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, PHILIPPINE Subdivision, G-3.

SUBJECT : Aircraft Warning For K-1 Operation.

- 1. Analysis of the problem of providing aircraft warning coverage for the SARANGANI BAY Area indicates that coverage from the northwest, north and northeast by radar equipment will be rather spotty due to the nature of the intervening terrain. It is essential, therefore, that radar coverage be supplemented by a sufficient number of ground observer posts in order to prevent aircraft approaching from these directions undetected.
- 2. It is therefore recommended that a minimum of six (6) ground observer posts be installed without delay in the SARANGANI BAY Area to supplement existing guerrilla watcher stations providing aircraft warning coverage from the northwest, north and northeast. Recommended general locations, together with locations of existing and proposed guerrilla stations are indicated on the inclosed map. These ground observer posts will also be capable of providing general intelligence and weather information in this vital area.
- 3. Rersonnel and equipment for accomplishing the above mission can be obtained by utilizing the 1st Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company \*D\*, 583rd Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion, now being trained and equipped at CAMP TABRAGALBA containing one American officer and thirteen (13) American enlisted men and sixteen (16) Filipino enlisted men, augumented by two (2) weather observers of the 15th Weather Squadron.

SUBJECT: Air Warning in the Philippine Islands

TO : Commander ALLIED AIR Forces.

- 1. Action is now being taken to establish an Air Warning System in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS which will be operating prior to operations in that area. Ground observer and coast watcher stations now in operation in the Islands and their associated communication facilities will be employed to form the basis of this system. Information on enemy aircraft detected will be reported in accordance with an operating procedure based on that used by the V Fighter Command. Detailed information as to channels which can be monitored to intercept these air warning reports will be supplied later.
- 2. It is anticipated that the addition of air warning information to communication channels already carrying both weather and intelligence traffic may seriously overload these circuits. It is therefore desired that the ALLIED AIR Forces furnish the necessary personnel and equipment for the establishment of an air warning relay station in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS. This station will receive directly from Guerrilla control stations all air warning and weather information and will relay it to ALLIED AIR Force Fighter Control Centers.
- 3. Personnel and major signal equipment to be furnished are as follows:

4. It is further desired that the personnel furnished for this duty be in excellent physical condition, be highly qualified technically and be volunteers for duty in enemy territory. This personnel will be placed on detached service with the 5217th Reconnaissance Battalion, Provisional, APO 923 as soon as possible for training prior to movement to destination. Triple A air priority is authorized for the transportation of personnel and equipment from present location to APO 923.




MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Top Secret letter, this Headquarters, file Ag 321 (16 July 44)C dated 16 July 1944, Subject: Air Warning in PHILIPPINE ISLANDS directed the Commander, Allied Air Forces to establish certain aircraft warning facilities in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS without delay. The 1st Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company "D", 583rd Signal Aircraft Warning Bn has been designated to accomplish this mission. In addition, this unit will establish five (5) observer posts to provide aircraft warning to the K-1 operation and will provide intelligence information to this Headquarters. The provision of these additional facilities will require additional equipment as indicated in the inclosed letter.

- 2. Basis for requirement for individual items is as follows:
  - a. Radio Sets, Navy type TCS-9 and Power Units PE 236: Highly mobile 25 watt set for use at net control station. Two operational, one spare.
  - b. Radio sets, SCR-284: For use at observer posts. Five (5) sets required in addition to five (5) authorized by CO 306, Hq 5th Air Force, dated 14 May 44, to provide suitable spare components and equipment for use at supplementing guerrilla ground observer posts.
  - c. Reel equipment CE-11 and Headset TS-10: To provide telephone communication from concealed radio station to exposed observer posts.
  - d. Test set I-77: For use in repairing radio equipment.
  - e. Camera: To photograph hostile installations in SARAGNI BAY and DANSALAN RIVER VALLEY.
  - f. Watches, type A-11: Required for accurately reporting of time of observation of aircraft.
- 3. Subject unit, less personnel and equipment, will be shortly attached to the 5217th Reconnaissance Bn, APO 923, for administration and training and must be fully trained and equipped by 1 September 1944.



#### MEMO FOR RECORDS

- 1. Undated Top Secret Memorandum from the Chief of Staff to the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-3 directed the establishment of an efficient aircraft warning system in the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS utilizing existing intelligence personnel and facilities prior to the commencement of operations in that area. Full use is now being made of existing facilities, aircraft warning information being passed on normal intelligence circuits to this headquarters and appropriate Air Force agencies.
- 2. To extend existing installations and to improve the overall efficiency of the aircraft warning system, it is now contemplated to augment intelligence facilities utilizing ground observer platoons of the three light weight Signal Aircraft Battalions currently assigned to this theater, i.e., the 583rd, 596th and 597th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalions. These units will install both ground observer posts and pack-type radar posts as required both prior to D-day and after the commencement of actual operations in a given area. To accomplish this mission, it is essential that these organizations be authorized certain additional items of equipment as indicated in the inclosed list.

SUBJECT: Special Equipment for Ground Observer Units.

- TO : Commending General, United States Army Forces in the Far East, APO 501.
- 1. It is anticipated that the primary mission of military ground observer units in conjunction with future operations in this theater will be the establishment prior to actual landings in a given area of sufficient observer posts to provide accurate and timely information concerning aircraft movements, ship sightings, weather data, and other general ground intelligence. The accomplishment of such a mission within enemy held territory makes it essential that ground observer organizations be furnished certain items of equipment over and above that currently authorized for normal operations behind our own lines.
- 2. It is therefore desired that a project be established with the War Department to authorize the 583rd, 596th and 597th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalions the inclosed list of equipment in addition to that currently authorized by War Department letter, file AG 322 (17 Apr 44) OB-I-AFREG-M, subject: Constitution, Activation, Reorganisation, and Disbandment of Certain Signal Aircraft Warning Units, and that shipment be requested from the United States at the earliest practicable date.
- 3. It is further desired that the 20th and 21st Ground Observer Platoons, Ground Observer Company "D", 597th Signal Aircraft Harning Enttalion, currently attached to the 5217th Reconnaissance Enttalion (P), APO 923, for administration, supply and training and contemplated for early commitment, be furnished both T/E items and above mentioned special equipment with the least practicable delay and not later than 1 October 1944, items being requested as a special project being diverted from theater stocks pending receipt of replacement equipment from the United States.
- 4. Equipment requested in letter, this headquarters, file AG 475 (18 Aug 44) G-D, dated 18 August 1944, subject: Special Equipment for 583rd Signal Aircraft Warning Enthalian, will be charged to this same project and theater stocks will be replaced upon receipt of shipment from the United States.



- 1. The 20th and 21st Ground Observer Platoons (formerly let and 2nd Platoons) Ground Observer Company "D", 597th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion were transferred (less personnel and equipment) to APO 923 and attached to 5217th Reconnaiseance Battalion (P) for administration, supply and training by Top Secret letter, Hq USAFFE, file FECC 370.5 dated 8 September 1944, subject Attachment of units. These units have subsequently been filled, equipped and trained for operations with enemy held territory, the first being organized to operate a relay station and three pack-type redar posts and the latter to operate a relay station and five observer posts, and are tentatively committed for employment in support of K-2 operation as follows:
- a. 20th Ground Observer Platoon: Establishment of a relay station at headquarters 8th Military District, USAPIP to relieve tectical charmels to the unit of sireraft warning traffic and pack-type radar sets in northeastern PANAY, Southeastern MASBATE and northern CEBU.
- b. 21st Ground Observer Platoon: Establishment of relay station at Headquarters SAMAR area command, USAFIP, to relieve tactical charmels of aircraft warning traffic, and five observer posts in southern SAMAR.
- 2. In order to have the above mentioned units in position for immediate departure by submarine from WOENDI Island upon receipt of formal request from Allied Air Forces and approved by this Headquarters of the above mentioned plan, it is recommended that they be moved to APO 923 as herein requested.
- 3. It is further recommended that a training detechment of one officer and five enlisted men of Ground Observer Company "D", 597th Signal Aircraft Warming Battalion be moved from APO 923 to APO 920 concurrently with the above mentioned move in order to instigate the training of additional Ground Observer units for operation within enemy held territory with the least tracticable delay.

Authorize and furnish the 22nd Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company "D", 597th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion 100 Filippino Pesos per individual from intelligence funds and the unit in addition to items currently authorized by T/O and E 11-400 dated 1 March 1944 equipment listed in Appendices II to VII, inclusive. 



SUBJECT: Pre-assault Ground Observer Plan for 42nd Fighter Sector.

TO: Commanding General, Fifth Air Force, APO 710.

- 1. The following expansion of plan of this Headquarters for the establishment of an aircraft warning system in the 42nd Fighter Sector prior to commencement of actual operations in that area as outlined in letter, this Headquarters, file AG 381.42 dated 16 October 1944, subject: Air Defense Plan for the 42nd Fighter Sector is submitted in accordance with instructions of the Communications Officer, Fifth Air Force.
- 2. Aircraft Warning information from the #2nd Fighter Sector will be obtained prior to commencement of actual operations from existing guerrilla observer posts and by supplementing these posts by two (2) packtype radar posts and four additional ground observer posts of the 22nd Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company "D", 597th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion. This unit will be moved by submarine to a convenient rendezvous point in the MINDORA area so as to arrive not later than U-14 and will be moved to desired locations with the assimtance of guerrilla forces with the least possible delay. Proposed locations for such posts as well as the locations of existing posts and ground observer posts to be installed by the 21st Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company "D", 583rd Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion are indicated in Appendix I.
- 3. It is requested that the above plan for the development of air-craft warning facilities in the 42nd Fighter Sector prior to actual assault operations in that area be approved and the following implementing action be taken with the least practicable delay:
- A. Place on detached service with the 22nd Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company "D", 597th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion, now being filled, equipped and trained at APO 920 twelve (12) trained Filippino enlisted men of the 5217th Reconnaissance Battalion (P), six (6) of whom are qualified radio operators (SSN 776) and six of whom are trained Scouts (SSN 761). Past experience has proved that composite American-Filippino teams are essential for operations within enemy held sections of the PHILIPPINE ISLANDS. These personnel should join the above mentioned unit with the least possible delay to ensure maximum team training prior to departure.

- 1. Inclosed correspondence outlined plane of the Allied Air Forces for the establishment of certain aircraft warning facilities in HINDORO prior to commencement of L-3 operation. Implementation of this plan will require transportation of thirty-eight (38) personnel and approximately nine (9) tons of supplies and technical equipment to a suitable rendezvous point with reprecentatives of Lt. Codr. G.E. ROWE, USHE, now conducting intelligence activities in that area. Detailed logistics are inclosed.

This Headquarters considers the implementation of the above plan highly desireable but not of sufficient priority to divert the USS MARWHAL from her presently assigned mission of supplying demolition equipment to Northeastern LUZON. The USS STINURAY will not be available for her next mission until 22 Nov., a date too near to U-day to permit its utilisation for this purpose.
- 3. It is therefore requested that an investigation be made as to the possibility of diverting one or more operational submarines for transporting all or part of the 22nd Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company "D", 597th Signal Aircraft Warning Bn. to MINDORO. Further request your comments on feasibility of utilizing flying boats (Catalina) for this purpose. Priority of detachments is as follows:
  - (1) Radar Posts.
  - (2) Control Station.
  - (3) Ground Observer Posts.



b. Authorize and furnish the 22nd Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company \*D\*, 597th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion 100 Filippino Pesos per individual from intelligence funds and the unit in addition to items currently authorized by T/O and E 11-400 dated 1 March 1944 equipment listed in Appendices II to VII, inclusive. Additional items are required to permit the unit to accomplish its mission and to permit each individual and each individual post to survive for a minimum period of thirty days operation in enemy occupied territory independently all other personnel or organizations. Requirements are based upon actual operational experience of intelligence parties functioning in the PHILIPPINE Islands.

c. Move the 22nd Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company "D", 597th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion at a strength of one officer and thirty-seven (37) enlisted men with personal gear and approximately four tons of technical equipment by submarine to a convenient MINDORO ISLAND and arrange with guerilla leaders for necessary assistance in transporting personnel and equipment to desired locations.



: Commanding General, Fifth Air Force, APO 710. TO

- 1. The following expansion of plan of this Headquarters for the establishment of an aircraft warning system in the 42nd Fighter Sector prior to commencement of actual operations in that area as outlined in letter, this Headquarters, file AG 381.42 dated 16 October 1944, subject: Air Defense Plan for the 42nd Fighter Sector is submitted in accordance with instructions of the Communications Officer, Fifth Air Force.
- 2. Aircraft Warning information from the 42nd Fighter Sector will be obtained prior to commencement of actual operations from existing guerrilla observer posts and by supplementing these posts by two (2) packtype radar posts and four additional ground observer posts of the 22nd Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company "D", 597th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion. This unit will be moved by submarine to a convenient rendezvous point in the MINDORA area so as to arrive not later than U-14 and will be moved to desired locations with the assistance of guerilla forces with the least possible delay. Proposed locations for such posts as well as the locations of existing posts and ground observer posts to be installed by the 21st Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company "D", 583rd Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion are indicated in Appendix I.
- 3. It is requested that the above plan for the development of aircraft warning facilities in the 42nd Fighter Sector prior to actual assault operations in that area be approved and the following implementing action be taken with the least practicable delay:
- a. Place on detached service with the 22nd Ground Observer Platoon, Ground Observer Company "D", 597th Signal Aircraft Warning Battalion, now being filled, equipped and trained at APO 920 twelve (12) trained Filippino enlisted men of the 5217 Reconnaissance Battalion (P), six (6) of whom are qualified radio operators (SSN 776) and six of whom are trained Scouts (SSN 761). Past experience has proven that composite American-Filippino teams are essential for operations within enemy held sections of the Philippine Islands. These personnel should join the above mentioned unit with the least possible delay to ensure maximum team training prior to departure.



- Air Force, subject: "Ground Observer Plan for MIKE I," dated 21 October 1944, which outlines a plan for the establishment of ground observer posts generally along the line SAN FERNANDO DILALONGAN prior to S-Day. Locations of posts have been so selected to provide visual observation of any aircraft flying southward from the CAGAYAN RIVER VALLEY.
- 2. Analysis of predicted radar coverage for both M-I (including M-I consolidation) and M-2 operations indicate that little or no warning will be obtained from aircraft approaching the landing beaches from the CAGAYAN RIVER VALLEY. With the enemy's present knowledge of radar and its limitations, it is safe to assume that this weakness in our aircraft warning system will be fully exploted by raiding aircraft from the FORMOSA Area. The establishment of Ground radar posts at the southern boundary of the CAGAYAN RIVER VALLEY is therefore essential. Transportation difficulties in the desired areas makes it vital that personnel and equipment be landed at a convenient rendezvous point at least two weeks prior to commencement of the M-I Operation.


