STAYING IN BATAAN. WE SHALL HAVE TO FOLLOW IN THE STEPS TAKEN BY MACARTHUR WHEN HE WITHDREW HIS FORCES FROM THE SOUTH. IN CASE THE MINDORO IS A TRICK AND THE ENEMY STRIKES IN THE NORTH IT WILL BE HARD TO MOVE OUR FORCES FROM THE SOUTH, AND WE SHALL FIND OURSELVES SANDWICHED IN THE CITY. RETREAT THROUGH WATER (MANILA BAY) WILL BE USELESS. FIRST WE MUST REALIZE OUR FORCE IN LUZON IS SMALL IN COMPARISON WITH INVADING FORCES. MOST OF OUR NAVAL FLEET WAS DAMAGED OR SUNK AND OUR AIRFIELDS ARE BEING DAMAGED WORSE DAY BY DAY. IN THE CITY WE MUST PLANT DEMOLITIONS IN ALL SUPPLY POINTS. WE CANNOT DEPEND ON FILIPINOS ALTHOUGH WE WILL NEED 100,000 FOR EMERGENCY WORK. CONCERNING ARMS AND AMMUNITION, WE MUST ACCEPT FACT THAT THE MOTHER LAND HAS NOT SENT ANY ADDITIONAL SUPPLIES IN THE PAST FIVE MONTHS. A LARGE NUMBER OF MEN ARE WITHOUT ARMS AND WE MUST BE THRIFTY WITH AMMUNITION. BEFORE THE MONTH IS UP I NEED A COMPLETE INVENTORY OF TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES AND ARMS. ON THE 27TH I WILL CALL A MEETING AGAIN AND FURNISH EACH OF YOU MAPS OF PROVINCES MENTIONED ABOVE SHOWING DIVISION OF OUR FORCES. FROM THE NAVY I WANT THE LAYOUT OF MINES, SUBMARINE PROTECTIONS AND ACTIVITIES OF THE NAVY.

FORCE BECAUSE IT IS IMPOSSIBLE FOR ENEMY TO STRIKE IN APARRI.

ZAMBALES: ONE GENERAL SENT HERE WITH MODERATE FORCE FOR SUPPORT OF BATAAN AND LOWER PANGASINAN, LINGAYEN.

LINGAYEN: PLACE ONE INFANTRY DIVISION PLUS SUPPORTING ARTILLERY AND TANKS, AMERICANS MIGHT REGAIN ISLAND THROUGH SAME WAY WE DID IN 1941.

BAYOMBANG, NUEVA VIZCAYA: PLACE ONE INFANTRY REGIMENT, CONSTRUCT ONE LARGE TRANSMITTER FOR COMMUNICATIONS WITH BICOLS IN CASE MANILA EVACUATED.

BULACAN AND PAMPANGA: THESE TWO PROVINCES TO SERVE AS STOPPING PLACES IN CASE WE ARE FORCED TO RETREAT TO NORTH, BULUCAN TO HAVE A FORCE AS HOME GUARDS, FORCES IN PAMPANGA TO PUT UP RESISTANCE UNTIL ARMY HAS REACHED BATAAN.

CLOSING REMARKS OF YAMASITA AS FOLLOWS: "IN CASE THE ENEMY ATTEMPTS LANDING BATANGAS AFTER MINDORO WE WILL AWAIT WITH ONE ARTILLERY DIVISION, SUPPORT BY AERIAL DEFENSE. WE MUST HAVE TWO OPERATING SOUTHERN AIRFIELDS. REINFORCEMENT WILL COME VIA LAGUNA. IF RETREAT IS IMMINENT WE CAN USE TWO ROUTES EASILY, ONE THROUGH RIZAL AND THE OTHER THROUGH CAVITE. FROM THESE ROUTES WE MOVE TO NORTH, PERMANENTLY

ONE TANK DIVISION, TWO INFANTRY DIVISIONS TO BE SENT THERE, NAVY TO BE IN CHARGE OF ALL SHORE DEFENSES AND WATER SURROUNDING BATANGAS, ALL SPARE AIRPLANE PARTS IN MANILA TO BE SENT THERE.

CAVITE: CENTRAL NAVAL CENTER, TO AID IN ARTILLERY COORDINATION WITH CORREGIDOR, MINES TO BE REPLACED CLEAR TO INNER MANILA BAY, MOST MINES TO BE PLACED BETWEEN CAVITE AND CORREGIDOR.

BICOL PROVINCES: LEGASPI AND SORSOGON ONLY, TWO GENERALS SENT WITH SMALL DETACHMENTS OF INFANTRY AND TANKS, TRANSMITTER TO BE BUILT IN LEGASPI, BUT NOT MANY FORCES INSTEAD RELYING ON TAYABAS FOR DEFENSE.

RIZAL: TO BE SUB-DIVIDED INTO DISTRICTS AND DIRECTED BY VARIOUS COLONELS, TAYTAY TO SAN PEDRO MAKATI TO BE MADE INTO RESERVATION WITH HEADQUARTERS AT MCKINLEY, EASTERN PORTIONS OF RIZAL TO PROVIDE STOPPING PLACE FOR OUR FORCES IN RETREAT NORTHWARD.

BATAAN: TO SERVE AS RESERVE PLACE IN EMERGENCY AND TO BE FORTIFIED: LARGE FOOD AND MEDICAL SUPPLIES TO BE PLACED IN PROVINCE.

APARRI: BARGES TO BE STATIONED IN APARRI WITH A SMALL

TYPED INCOMPLETE

FOLLOWING IS REPORT OF CONFERENCE CALLED BY YAMASITA ON 16 DECEMBER AT SANTA MESA. THERE WERE FOUR GENERALS, TWO ADMIRALS, TWO COLONELS, YAMASITA AND SECRETARY PRESENT. YAMASITA OPENED CONFERENCE WITH FOLLOWING REMARKS:

"WE MUST NOT EXPECT ANY REINFORCEMENTS FROM THE MOTHER COUNTRY, SHE HAS TO HAVE ALL THE FORCES SHE NEEDS FOR HER DEFENSE. THE CONVOY WE EXPECTED 06 DECEMBER CANNOT CROSS THE SEA DUE TO LACK OF PROPER CONVOYS. THIS WILL LAST FOR ABOUT TWO MONTHS ONLY AND IT IS UP TO US TO PUT OUR BRAINS TOGETHER TO STOP THE EVER INCREASING ENEMY."

THE CONFERENCE THEN LAID PLANS FOR DEFENSE OF LUZON AS FOLLOWS:

TAYABAS: HEADQUARTERS AT MAUBAN, TWO INFANTRY DIVISIONS, ONE ARTILLERY DIVISION, ONE COMBINED CAVALRY AND TANK DIVISION, NEW TRANSMITTER TO BE BUILT AT MAUBAN OR LUCENA, ONE GENERAL AND TWO COLONELS TO BE APPOINTED PROVINCE COMMANDERS.

BATANGAS: MAJORITY AIR FORCE TO BE MOVED HERE PLUS

Attention is invited to attached message from Captain Miller with Marking's group near Manila. The information of course will have to be carefully and cautiously evaluated but if worthy of credit it marks the achievement of our ultimate aim in driving our sources of intelligence direct to the enemy high command. It will demonstrate the extent and depth of the loyalty of some of these people who, ostensibly in the service of the enemy, have subjected themselves to the contempt of the guerillas and worse than death at the hands of the enemy. It is a type of service under the C-in-C (and there is a lot of it) which seldom in history have other military commanders had available to them.
