Surrendered to the Japanese and was appointed puppet Covernor. Apperently ecoperating with the Japanese, but also reported to be helping the guerrilles,

Bow JUSTON CORP : Irish, Redemptorist missionary from St Clement's, Iloilo. Now probably in concentration camp.

Dr & I CHLLEN : Ilcilo Port Quarentine Officer for many years, held the rank of let Lt in the ermy. Reported in St Feul's Hospital in Moilo, and also reported in economicration emp.

New WILLIAM DALY : Brish, Redesptorist missionary from St Clement's, Iloilo. Now probably in eccessivation comp.

ROY ALLEN /: American, living at Ilcilo, went with the army to Mindenso to work on an airfield. Reported sent to Corregidor later. Is a civil engineer, married to a Filipina. Rumored that both he and his wife went down with the S S "Corregidor" when she was sunk by a mine in Manila Bay.

W A ALLEN /: American, married to a Filipina. Has four children. Was master mechanic of Philippine Railway Company at Iloilo. Should be a valuable man in the reconstruction of the railway. Present whereabouts unknown, but probably in the vicinity of Calinog.

YEATOR ALLEN : Brother of W A Allen. Seemingly had no occupation and is probably now with his brother.

ANTONIO BELOV: Italian, believed not to be a naturalized /merican. He is a veteran of the SpanisheAmerican War. Present whereabouts unknown.

LCUISE BLANCAFLOR : American, married to Filipino doctor. Thereabouts unknown.

Miss BOCKNER V: Was with Mission Hospital in Iloilo. Captured by Japanese and is reported to have married Luis "Casanase" while in concentration camp.

BOEND V: Ex-Spanish American War veteran. Was living in Cabatuan, Iloilo.

THEODORE "CASANASE": American, son of Pedro "Casanase" by his first wife. Reported surrendered to the Japs.

JAPANESE PENETRATIONS AT PASSI : In September 1943 a Japanese mobile unit reided Passi, Noile, and killed 84 people who were living on land belonging to "Yu Jeco". At another time about 50 Chinese were captured and killed there. Some of them were burned to death.

WEATHER CONDITIONS : The rainy sesson begins in Pensy in June and lests until November, and at this time only the first class roads can be used by cars, trucks, and tanks. The rest of the year is dry.

HEALTH COMDITION: Have been good since the declaration of war. There have been no epidemies reported. Nost of the doctors are with the guerrills army.

FOOD SUPPLIES : There will soon be suffering, perhaps starwation, in some areas of Pansy, especially around Ilcilo and other coastal towns. The army takes up to 30% of what is produced, and large planters are holding their stocks of rice for higher prices. An inveding force could not count on food being sveilable on Pansy.

CURRENCY : Practically none of the preser currency is in circulation. The 1941-1942 and 1943 issues of emergency notes circulate readily smong the people. and the issues of 1941-1942 are preferred. The Japanese have issued notes which are not ther numbered or signed. These are generally regarded as worthless, and are not accepted except in the gerrisoned towns.

There were colonies of Japanese in Iloilo and other Prewer Japanese Residents towns on Paney before the wer, and many of these

Japanese left the country before war was declared. Those who remained were placed in concentration in the provincial jail in Moile at the outbreck of wer and were later transferred to Sam Agustin and later still to Man Enrique. They seemed to be well treated, although the food allowence was small. At the some time all Japanese property in Iloilo was taken over for the army by the Alien Property Custodien, William GENTERLE, at present Lt Col 6th Military

A few of the older Japanese residents appeared to be pro-Filipine and District. were opposed to the war. Several sons of Japaness-Filipino parents are now with the guerrille,



On 29 February 44 a patrol of this mobile force, accompanied by some B.C.s came into Tabilong Barrie where Whitney was staying. The captured the Barrie Temmienti, and Whitney and his family escaped to a clump of bamboo, a few yards from the village. Mrs. Whitney's grandmother, an old Filipina lady of 97 was bayoneted by the Japanese and five other civilians were killed in the Barrie. Mr. Alemane from the Barrie next to Talibor latter told Whitney that his wife had been caught by the Japanese, behanded and mutiliated.

FERRARES Puppet Mayor of Pototan under the Japanese. He is pro-guerrilla, and sends to the army what information he can get from the Japanese. In Pebruary 1944 he sent word to Whitney that the Japanese were planning to come to his Barrie.

Heile Port Guartermaster: This was organized on 20 December 1941 under the direction of the quartermaster at Cebu. One hundred men, including six Americans were employed there. The office managed the Port of Ileile, chartered bests for the army, and purchased supplies of food, gasoline and oil from Ileile City and the back country for the use of the army.

They shipped food and tropps out to Bataan and Mindanao and also shipped food inland to Army depots near Lambumao and Passi.

GOLONEL MCLANNAN Cavalry officer. Organised the Iloilo Fort Quartermaster office in December 1941. Relieved in March 1942 and sent to Negros to organise a combat force.

MAJOR RICHARD JONES Succeeded Colonel McLannan in March 1942. Reported he escaped to Bacolod at the time of the invasion and later surrendered there.

PAUL MENG American pilot of the Iloilo Negros Air Express; worked at the Iloilo Port Quartermaster. Was killed on 16 April 1942 in the Japanese invesion of Iloilo. Believed his wife is maintained in Manila.

CHURLES MOAT Englishmen from Asbate, Norked at the Iloilo Port Quartermaster office. Was sent to San Jose in Antique on 14 April 1942 to dispatch rice bests to Culion. Has not been heard from since.

SANTER American from Masbate. Managed a warehouse for Iloile Fort Quartermaster. Whitney saw him on the afternoon of 15 April 1942. Since, contrary to orders, the warehouse was not destroyed, Whitney conjectures that Sawyer was billed or captured,

ANSE EMERSON American. Spanish-American War veteran. Procured palay for the Ileile Port Quartermaster. Escaped with Whitney to Lambunae on 16 April 1942. Later captured by t Japanese there and taken with his Filipina wife and three children to Ileile.

GILBERT RENTON By U.S. Navy, from Masbate. Produced palay for the Iloile Fort Quartermaster. Escaped with Whitney to Lambunes on 16 April 1943. Later joined the guerrilla in Ordnance. Reported to have died of dysentry leaving a Filipina wife and one child in Lambunes.

HOBART American, retired Master Sergeant of the U.S. Army at Pototan, aged about 73. Reported bayonstted by the Japanese during 1943, leaving two daughters.
