



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## CHRONOLOGY

- 7 Dec 41 In Cebu City acting as Captain of Volunteer Guards, also writing for Cebu City papers.
- 10 Apr 42 Japanese invasion of Cebu.
- 1 Jun 42 Escaped to Negros.
- 1 Aug 42 Joined Captain ANTONIO's guerrilla forces as propaganda officer.
- 15 Dec 42 Reported to Colonel MATA's Headquarters.
- 13 Feb 43 Commissioned 1st Lt and appointed propaganda officer for the 72nd Division.
- Teb Aug 43 Carried on propaganda work in the San Carlos and Bacolod areas.
- Sep 43 Established own CP in the San Carlos area.
- Oct 43-Jan 44 Continued propaganda work, investigated Jap atrocities and reported on enemy air and naval activity in San Carlos area.
- 2 Feb 44 Ordered to District Headquarters, delivered lectures en route.
- 25 Mar 44 Arrived at District Headquarters and placed in charge of printing press and propaganda work.
- Evacuated because Colonel ABCEDE believed that he could do the guerrilla cause more good in OHQ than in Negros.





Japanese Intentions Recently, the Japanese on Negros commenced digging fox holes, reinforcing garrisons, improving the air fields, and bringing in vast amounts of ammunition, food, gasoline, bombs, planes, machines and motors.

Threats have been made to use gas on the guerrillas. In the past two months over 1000 tanks of gas have been stored in Bacolod

and Dumaguete.

Planes have been seen in Bacolod with the American colors

painted on the under side of the wings.

Air raid shelters are being constructed in all of the occupied towns. The civilians are required to construct shelters under their houses.

Guerrilla Organization The guerrilla army is doing a splendid job in preventing the enemy from exploiting the resources of the island to a greater degree.

Many officers are unfit for command duty, some are lazy, some are cowardly and some downright dishonest. This condition has been made possible by following the "family" system which permits every member of the family becoming an officer when one member holds a high rank in the army.

The percentage of officers to men is greatly out of propor-

tion.

PERSONNEL REQUIREMENTS: American officers are badly needed. The Filipino officers do not want them, but the men do.

COLONEL ABOURDE : He is a fearless and capable leader.

COLONEL MATA : A fearless and well trained leader.

MAJOR HUDOLFO REYES : He is the DIO. He works day and night and has proved his ability.

MAJOR BACLAGON : The CO of the North Negros Sector. He is an honor graduate of Baguio Military Academy.

CAPTAIN LOWENZO TEVES : A mis-fit and does not have much ability. He does not cooperate as he should.

CIVIL GOVERNMENT: The officials cause almost as much trouble as the enemy. It is run by professional politicians who hold personal interests above the welfare of the people. Disputes continually exist between the army and the government. The officials have had their relatives appointed officers in the army.

ALFREDO MONTILEBANO : Governor of Negros. He is a no good politician. His control of money has resulted in chaos and inflation. He is playing politics with the future in mind.

BENEDICTO: Deputy Governor of Negros. He is playing politics, has his eye on the future, and has had all of his no good relatives appointed officers in the army. The only one being any good in Major Roberto BENEDICTO.

DON PEDRO HLIZALDEV: Provisional Treasurer. He is a man of proven integrity. He is at logger-heads with the Montelibano clique because he demends receipts for all money passed out.

DON "FURBEYRE" : Deputy Governor of East Negros Sector.
Though a politician, he is honest, loyal, and intelligent.

Japanese Atrocities In Ayongan, in March, 1944, small children were roasted and civilian prisoners were made to eat the bodies, even the private organs. The Japanese soldiers ate most of the bodies themselves.

Captured guerrilla personnel are usually slowly skinned alive, starting at the head and working down. Many are beaten to death, others are burned to death, while others have been

buried slive.

In two cases, young babies were torn from their mothers' arms, hurled into the air and caught on the point of the bayonets.

In the Cadiz area, the enemy, enraged because adult civilians had escaped, cut off the toes and two inches of the feet from some eight or nine small kids and left them to bleed to death.

INDEPENDENCE: The average Filipino wants independence without knowing what the word actually means. Though they want to run their own government, they want the protection of the United States.

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
