



1. I am pleased to advise that despite diestablishing contact, thirty-five tons of arms.

l. I am pleased to advise that despite difficulties encountered in establishing contact, thirty-five tons of arms, ammunition, signal equipment and demolition supplies with two sabotage teams were delivered to Colonel VOLCKMANN on the east coast of Ilocos Sur on the night of 23 November. This will materially strengthen our position immediately north of the Lingayen Gulf, in the Lingayen Gulf area and in the Central Luzon plain.

2. We have two submarines scheduled to depart from Woendi Island on or about 1 December. I am endeavouring to arrange for both to deliver additional shipments to Colonel VOLCKMANN, in order that that situation may be given all possible strength prior to the M-l operation. This move will not be popular with other areas having need for additional supplies, but I feel that the situation in western and central Luzon requires highest priority at this time be given to the supply of those areas.



1. Herewith is a compilation of information on guerilla organizations operating in Luzon. I believe it will be of interest to you. Much of the information given should be cautiously evaluated but it affords a general view of the Luzon guerilla organizations and emphasizes its complexities.

2. Whether any coordination between these units, within the time available, could be effected is doubtful. Certainly the most pressing need lies in the further extension of communications in order to bring more of these groups into communication with each other and with this headquarters.

Yesterday I went to the town of Malitbog, in Sogod Bay, to check its feasibility for use as a forward base for guerilla supply, as recommended by Commander Parsons who is now discussing the same with the Navy and G-4. 2. The port, formerly a shipping point for copra and hemp, is situated due west from the Panaon Strait. It is a weather protected port with a pier extending out to deep water. At the head of the pier are large twin bodegas capable of the storage of several thousand tons of supplies, with tracks laid from bodegas to the end of the pier. 3. With little additional work it should prove satisfactory as a base for both submarines and surface craft used in future supply activities. In submarine supply to Luzon not less than six days in the round trip from the present base at Woendi would be saved, with a corresponding proportionate increase in operational efficiency. 4. 



Nautilus made contact with Major Anderson and Major Lapham in Central Eastern LUZON on 21 and 22 October respectively delivering forty tons of supplies to each. In addition, two demolition teams of two officers and four enlisted men each, together with one radio team of six men were sent to Major Anderson. Two demolition teams and one radio team were sent to Major Lapham. b. The U.S.S. Narwhal made contact with Colonel Suarez in the Tawi Tawi region of the Sulu Archipelago on 17 October delivering ten tons of supplies and then proceeded to ABCEDE delivering sixty tons of supplies for NECROS. One demolition party composed of two officers, four Filipino enlisted men and twenty-seven aircraft warning personnel were included in this shipment to ABCEDE. Nineteen civilians and two service men were successfully evacuated from NEGROS. c. The U.S.S. Cero, scheduled for Major Volckmann of Northwestern LUZON and carrying twenty tons of supplies, two G-2 Intelligence Officers (Sixth Army), one weather team of two enlisted men, one radio team of six enlisted men and one demolition team of two officers and four enlisted men was unable to make contact with Volckmann and proceeded to Major Anderson at Central Eastern LUZON. Vessel is due to arrive this date. d. The U.S.S. Ray departed Woendi Island 27 October for Rowe in MINDORO with two tons of supplies and one Intelligence Officer and two weather personnel. Weather personnel are equipped with upper wind instruments to record upper wind levels to 30,000 feet. Vessel due to arrive 2 November. 2. In all shipments accessary weapons, ammunition, demolitions, radio equipment and food were sent into each area. 3. It is planned to supplement the shipments to Anderson and Lapham during the early part of the month. Shipment is also scheduled for Volckmann at this same time. - 3. The development of communications in Luzon is proceeding slowly too slowly, as there are only 21 radio stations on that Island with which we are in communication. Steps are being taken to speed this development particularly in the Northern area. There is much work to be done here and little time available for the task.

Guerilla forces on Cebu should be directed to assist the operation by harassing, sabotage, interruption of communications, destruction of supplies and attacks on isolated small bodies of the enemy with a view to impeding the enemy' to the maximum extent possible and to preventing his reinforcement of the area involved. They should not be directed to make large scale attacks on formed bodies of enemy troops. 2. I consider that Cushing's policy of limiting recruiting to the men that he is able to arm and equip is sound. These men should not be inducted until transport facilities permit the actual delivery of arms, equipment and essential supplies. Cushing will be authorized to increase his forces only as arms and equipment become available to him. 3. It is deemed inadvisable to direct the forces from Cebu to participate in operations in another island. These are local forces whose effectiveness is dependent largely upon their knowledge of the terrain and their freindship and coordination with the civil population of their own districts. 


Under existing policy the CEBU Area Command will remain under GHQ during the K-2 operation.

- 3. Due to the proximity of CEBU to LEYTE, it should certainly be committed by GHQ on "A" minus three days, K-2 operation, to put pressure on the enemy and harass by all possible means any attempt to move forces from CEBU to reinforce the enemy garrison in LEYTE and be alert for any intelligence on enemy moves in the CEBU area. In addition it is recommended:
  - (a) That CUSHING be authorized to recruit another 10,000 men to reinforce the CEBU Area Command, to be armed and otherwise equipped as the necessary transport facilities become available; and
  - (b) That by understanding with KANGLEON on "A" mimus three days,




CUSHING be directed to dispatch as much of his force as can be spared from CEBU to the West coast of LEYTE by banca and other means of water transportation available to reinforce the LEYTE Area Command and assist it in the execution of any guerilla combat mission to the enemy's rear as may be assigned by the Commanding General, Sixth Army.

4. The LEYTE Area Command, while under strong leadership, has an estimated strength of only 2300 men who have had nothing like the experience of the CEBUANOS in guerilla warfare. For this reason its reinforcement from CEBU appears essential to provide maximum guerilla support to the K-2 operation. Success of the initial guerilla action in direct support of our operations, publicly recognized, will contribute immeasurably to the unity of the people and the strength of future support - its failure would have a demoralizing effect upon the guerilla forces in other areas.





- 1. Attached letter from Major Bernard L. ANDERSON (Central LUZON) inclosing copy of Bulletin No. 1 issued by the Civilian Protective Service "Republic of the Philippines" is forwarded for your information.
- 2. Attention is invited to request for instructions in re evacuation of civilians from populated areas.
- 3. Such a project of mass evacuation, as that apparently in contemplation, would present many difficulties in the matter of movement, shelter, feeding, medical and other care. Furthermore, encouragement by this Headquarters of such mass movement might tend to seriously impede the advance of our forces after land operations in a given area have commenced.
- 4. It is believed that as a matter of policy, Major ANDERSON and other local commanders and leaders should be instructed to advise against any evacuation other than the movement of inhabitants away from the immediate vicinity of important enemy military objectives subject to our attack - that otherwise civilian non-combatants should be cautioned to continue, as far as possible, to adhere to their normal routine until otherwise instructed.
  - 5. Your comments are requested.

- 4. The present plan of the CPS for evacuation is to send evacuees to out of the way places in the provinces. The organization of large evacuation centers is being avoided.
- 5. The CPS has requested the following from this com
  - a. Where are best localities to send evacuees?
  - b. Can medicines be supplied to us?
  - c. Will you furnish identification to group leaders, so they will be protected and not molested by guerrilla units? This request is made in view of the findings of our investigators that have been sent into the provinces, who have learned that all guerrilla units respect your signature.
- 6. This command has assured the leaders of the CPS that same is very much interested in the protection and welfare of the general public and that all possible cooperation and assistance will be extended.
- 7. It is requested that your desires and instructions be furnished this command.


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

- 1. Guerilla forces in the Philippines have operated in wholly irregular fashion and under conditions of the utmost difficulty. The penalty imposed by the enemy for their activities has been immediate death, often through inhuman torture. As has ton the case in practically all guerilla movements, they have probably been forced to adopt the principle of "an eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth", not only for their own immediate protection through intimidation but also to secure the necessary cohesion among their own forces. Desperate men who fight outside of the rules of land warfare cannot be expected to apply those rules unilaterally. I know of no case in history where it has been done. For these reasons I do not concur in the promulgation of the proposed directive.
- 2. Upon reoccupation of various localities in the Philippines, the guerilla forces will come under the direct and immediate control of the regular armed forces of the United States. They will be recognized and regularized and from that time forward will, of course, be required to abide by the established rules of land warfare.



- 1. In view of the warning which the C in C proposes to give to the Japanese Military Commander on "A" Day plus 4 of K-2 operation in re the treatment and protection by the enemy of American and Filipino PsOW, civilian internees and civilian non-combatants, it would appear desirable to take stock of and re-orient insofar as possible the present practices permitted by our own commanders of the several Philippine areas.
- 2. Our guerilla forces have never burdened themselves with keeping or protecting Japanese captives and have not infrequently submitted them to severe methods of torture. As we return and recognize these forces more officially and directly as elements of our Command, such practices, if known to the enemy, may, not without justification, become the pattern for his treatment of our prisoners in his hands including the survivors of Bataan and Corregidor.
- 3. A directive from this Headquarters probably would not provide an absolute control over these guerilla practices but it would have the effect of encouraging more circumspect conduct in the same and at least cause them to be concealed from the enemy rather than publicized to him by way of threat or notice of retaliation as at present. It would furthermore put the enemy's high Command on notice of the C in C's own position in the matter on which he gives formal warning.
- 4. In view of the foregoing and in order to forestall any unanswerable comeback from the Japanese Military Commander to the C in C's warning, or provide any color of justification for enemy atrocities, it is suggested that the following instructions be dispatched on "A" minus 1 day to all Philippine the following instructions be dispatched on "A" minus 1 day to all Philippine commanders in the clear (to provide the enemy high command with informational copy):

SCRUPULOUSLY ADHERED TO THE CIVILIZED CONCEPT OF THE HONOR, DIGNITY, AND PROTECTION DUE THE ENEMY WHO SURRENDER TO BECOME PRISONERS OF WAR UNDER THE LAWS AND CUSTOMS OF WAR. THIS CONCEPT WILL CONTINUE TO GOVERN IN THE CONDUCT OF ALL OF OUR FORCES ENGAGED IN THE PHILIPPINE CAMPAIGN AND ITS RIGID AND FAITHFUL ADHERENCE IS ENJOINED UPON ALL CONCERNED. TO SUCH END
