Only when we are reasonably sure that we inflicted casualties do we report getting into a fight. Am as strict about ammo as anybody else much to irritation of front line commanders.

Enemy supply situation:

Port observations from June 1st to end July show that enemy had to bring in rice. Agents report for all garrisons show that enemy has sufficient rice for two months but must forage for his viands. Large amounts of sugar from other islands sometimes in Iloilo awaiting transshipment. He has usual iron rations. Ref class two: although poorly clothed, such not sufficient affect his combat efficiency seriously. However, he does not seem dequipped to withstand rain. Class three: about 2000 drums gasoline and a few hundred drums alcohol noticed in Iloilo Province for use planes, trucks and motorboats. Other local garrisons known to depend on Iloilo for alcohol. No alcohol made this island,

probably some from Negros as they come by motorboats, while gas and oil are unloaded from bigger ships. Santa Jose airfield has a few hundred drums of gasoline in stock. Class four: he has about 2300 trucks, railroad line extends from wharf Iloilo to Pototan, while suburban train reaches Dao from Capiz town. Motorboats supply garrisons in Antique and Capiz, sometimes sailboats. Class five: no large depots reported. Observations of inside agents show they have sufficient for ordinary guerilla fighting for several months but not for large and extended scale fighting. Except for a little food, copper ore, scrap, this island at present supplies enemy nothing. However, abundant harvest approaching and Nip dispositions show clear intention avail themselves of it. No date ref medical supplies and signals supplies except that he operates hospital in Iloilo and connects important garrisons with radio.

To maintain maximum signal efficiency ref our 394, request following requisition be given priority: two NEI sets 13, two transmitters type T50M with corresponding communication receivers and power plants, three receivers type three BZ's to cover shortages last two shipments, sulphuric acid sufficient for 30 net batteries without electrolyte now on hand, spare parts for radio sets and chargers, three complete three BZ with chargers and wet batteries, five sets type ATR4A, 100 diamond batteries and one nil portable sets type BC 322 with corresponding batteries. We distill our own alcohol fuel for engines but need bacly following to keep alcohol distilleries in operation: 12 thermometer with readings from zero to

100 degrees centigrade, 30 pounds soldering lead and two gallons muriatic acid.

Area commander dispersed evacuees when mopping up operations became imminent. To date, cannot tell jettisoned cargo. Japs left Culasi night June 21 moving south were in vicinity Bugasong
