MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. Major commands submitted estimated fund requirements for programs to be aprtially supported by nonappropriated funds during Fiscal Year 1949. These were subjected to close review by the Special Services, Troop Information and Education, G-1, and G-4 Sections. In a meeting held 5 June 1948 the G-1 recommendations were presented to the Board of Directors, Far East Command Central Welfare Fund, who, after close inspection, recommended approval thereof.

2. In his action on the minutes of the meeting, the Chief of Staff approved in principle the recommendations for nonappropriated fund support, and stated it would be the basis for the grant of First Quarter of Fiscal Year 1949.

3. Unobligated balances of appropriated funds are not available after the close of a fiscal year, and allocations are reduced to the amounts actually expended. In the case of nonappropriated funds, however, the major commands have the funds in their possession. It is considered advisable to have nonappropriated funds handled in the same manner as appropriated funds by having the major commands return any funds unobligated at the end of the current fiscal year.

Reference Highlight Nbr 106. Patrols in quake stricken area, report no damage to Toyama or Kanazawa. Demolished bridge vicinity of Daishoji (1129-1493) preventing emergency patrol from extending south to Fukui. 1st Test casualty figures place known dead at 39, with approximately 800 to 1,000 injured. 10% of injuries suffered were of serious nature. Medicine to counteract epidemics have been shipped to area in quantity.

Homeless persons represent major problem. 36th Medical Collecting Company on scene, augmented by personnel from Medical Detachment 24th Inf Regiment.

86 officer workers of the Kyushu Branch Office of the Toho Motion Picture Co, went on a 24 hour strike at 290800 Jun, at Fukuoka City (1345-116) Fukuoka Ken. B-2, Fukuoka MG Team.

A strong earthquake struck the Fukui Ah Ishikawa-Toyama area at 281714 Jun. Epicenter located in vicinity of Fukui City (1120-1460) Fukui Prefecture. Initial and severest shocks lasted approx 1 minute. Heaviest damages were sustained in Fukui City. 7% of city completely destroyed, remainder damaged. 30% of total damage resulted from fire. Buildings damaged in Fukui City include: MG Offs' Quarters, MG EM Quarters, and CIC building. The Prefectural and Municipal Buildings were slightly damaged. Other towns in Fukui Prefecture that were severely damaged include: Mikuni (1110.4-1470.9), Maruoka (1120.5-1470.3), Misuoka (1120.9-1460.3), Kanaza (1120.2-1400.0).

The water supply in Fukui City and above mentioned 4 towns has been completely disrupted. Nbr of dead and injured in Fukui Prefecture unknown. Communications from Takefu (1110.5-1440.3) Fukui Prefecture to Fukui City were completely disrupted by quake. One-way truck route reopened 290300. Rad communication established from Fukui City to Osaka as of 290900. 50 houses destroyed and 60 persons injured in Daihoji (1120.9-1490.2) Ishikawa Prefecture. No damages have been reported in Toyama Prefecture.

Fukui Prefectural officials appealed to adjacent prefectures for doctors, medical supplies and food. Japanese relief agencies have situation well in hand. Japanese disaster program proving effective. Japanese not earthquake victims have been encouraged to rebuild roads and bridges into

Reconnaissance planes from Itami AFB flew over area within several hrs of quake but were forced to return due to poor visibility. 5th AF has scheduled 2 photo reconnaissance planes and 2 C-47 type planes to depart Nagoya at 290700 Jun. Maj Gen Swing CG I Corps and I Corps MG Off departed Kyoto by special train 290139 for the devastated area. Occupation force depts in the affected area will be evacuated to Kyoto via this special train.

During subject voyage the ship's master of the Kaio Maru reported that 250 tons of baggage were loaded aboard his vessel at Kiirun, necessitating the elimination of the lift from Taku-Bar due to insufficient space to accommodate repatriates concentrated there. The Chinese Government has reported that only 61 tons were loaded at Kiirun.

Information is requested as to the total amount of baggage received aboard the Kaio Maru broken down by the ports at which subject baggage was loaded, as well as any unusual circumstances which have been reported to you in connection with the loading of subject baggage at the port of Kiirun, Formosa, during the voyage of 6 May - 23 May 1948.

An undetermined nbr of electrical industry office workers went on a 16 hour strike at 020800 Jun in Tobata, Wakamatsu, Kokura and Moji. All strikers are members of the North Kyushu Chapter of Densan. B-2, Area 3 CIC

1800 employees of the Osaka Asahi Press plan a strike to commence 6 Jun. Negotiations are in progress. Employees of the Nagoya and Kyushu branches of the Asahi Press are also alerted to strike if negotiations fail. A-1, Area 9 CIC.

4,050 office workers of the Kyushu Electric Co went on a 24 hour strike in Fukuoka at 010001 Jun. B-2, Fukuoka MGT.

On 2 Jun, 120 employees of the Shoun Machine Works, Toyono Gun, Osaka Prefecture, went on strike for an indefinite period. Union demand 6,000 yen wage per capita for month of Jun. C-2, Area 9 CIC.

A fire occurred in Fukui City, Fukui Prefecture, at 290330 May. Fire destroyed an entire city block. No occupation force personnel or property involved. A-1, Area 13 CIC.

At 021245 Jun, a kitchen range in the 595th Engr Dump Truck Co, Osaka City, exploded causing a fire which destroyed the mess hall, officer quarters and orderly room. Fire was under control by 1400. No casualties. Extensive damage. A-1, Area 9 CIC.

920 members of the Osaka Chamber of Commerce Union staged a walkout at 011200 Jun. Walkouts will be held every afternoon until 5 Jun. Cause is dissatisfaction with wages. C-2, G-2, 25th Div.

On 22 May, 3 Communists who had been discharged by the Komatsu Manufacturing Co, Komatsu City, Ishikawa Prefecture, entered the plant and started a hunger strike. When they refused a request to leave, they were forcibly ejected. They stationed themselves at the front gate where they were joined by 30 Communists from Kanazawa City. The 3 continued their hunger strike until 27 May at which time their physical condition forced them to discontinue. A group comprised of leading union representatives in Ishikawa Prefecture have formed the Democratic Cooperative Investigation OPERATIVE INVESTIGATION are investigating the trouble. At 011400 Jun, 67 persons waving red flags pushed past guards into the grounds of the Komatsu Manufacturing Co. At the same time 15 others forced their way past guards at another gate, seized the general manager and occupied the main office for 2 hours. Employees of the plant became angry at these actions and when they assembled at the main office the intruders left. Supporters for the intruders arrived by train from Kanazawa City, Ishikawa Prefecture. Among the group entering the main office were 3 Koreans and 10 known Communists. The Koreans told guards that in the event of trouble they could get 10,000 other Koreans to assist them in a very short time. Japanese police were notified but never went to the factory. C-2, Area 13 CIC.
