Once the advance of major forces on the ground is halted, the program of air interdiction becomes principal means of destroying enemy forces unless the enemy elects to carry the battle to us. The effectiveness of the air effort could be increased greatly by the use of airfields at WONSAN and PYONGGANG, both of which, though well forward, are outside of operating radius of MIG's from present bases. From the standpoint of ground forces a line covering PYONGGANG and WONSAN is considerably shorter than currently approved objective line. As a matter of advance planning, desire your comment on feasibility, once currently assigned objective line is reached, of advancing right and center to cover WONSAN and PYONGGANG. Desire your views on following courses of action to gain this line:

1. Coordinated wide front advance from then current positions.
2. Penetration from CHORWON-KUMWHA area to WONSAN to cut off enemy forces to south and east.
3. Course 2 in conjunction with amphibious landing at WONSAN.

Also another quantity of **11,8**95 miles consisting of 6,895 miles W-110-B, 4,250 miles WD-1 and 4,250 miles W-143 has been booked on SS Sgt Antolek by Marinex, estimated time of departure Yokohama 8 April 51, estimated time of arrival Pusan approximately 12 April 51.

Balance of Wire W-110-B and WD-1 on hand at Yokohama is extremely low. W-130 remains in reasonably good supply. It is imperative that W-130 be used in place of W-110-B wherever possible. Also W-143 should be used to maximum extent practicable.

Due in from zone of interior as of 30 March 51 includes 92,899 miles W-110-B and 30,648 miles W-120. Shipments against these quantities will undoubtedly include some W-1 and W-143. Extent of such substitutions is not definitely known. Field wire production in zone of interior is still extremely limited and difficulty is being experienced in supporting FEC demands. Strong representation will again be made to DA relative to critical field wire supply situation in FEC. However, every effort must continue to be made to conserve existing stocks and to recover wire no longer in use until wire from current production becomes more plentiful.

This reply in three parts. PART I. Ref item A. The term "Mongolian troops" could refer to one of three types, namely Soviet Mongols, Outer Mongolians, or Inner Mongolians. Within the Soviet Union, members of seven nationalities have Mongoloid features. About 750,000 men from these nationalities can be considered suitable for military service. These people are backward and many speak no Russian. In general, they have shown little enthusiasm for Soviet regime and some groups have been persecuted for political unreliability. Hence only minority have had military training. Soviets formed some homogeneous national units up to division size during first half of World War II, but their combat record was generally poor and none were of Mongoloid races. Such national units were completely eliminated shortly after war and Soviet present policy is to scatter men of minority nationalities throughout Army. There is no record of formation of any Mongoloid units, base on racial characteristics rather than nationality. Reinforcement capabilities of Mongolian type personnel from Soviet Armed Forces is estimated 100,000 to 150,000 men. Few are trained in technical skills which Chinese Communists also lack. So far as known, no separate Soviet Mongolians units exist. Since present policy is mixture as opposed to segregation, any Mongolian units would have to be specially formed, and if wholly Mongol, they probably would be understaffed in good officers and specialists. It is doubtful if more than five well-trained divisions of Mongoloid Soviets could be formed now.

Peoples Republic of Outer Mongolia, considered by Soviets as a separate puppet, has an army of some 30,000 men, organized into 6 divisions with 1 corps headquarters. An additional 10,000 men comprise security troops who are believed to be primarily charged with border security. This force, which has some token mechanized elements and an air arm of sorts, could be reinforced by Outer Mongolians and other Mongoloid personnel to a strength of 100,000 effectives in a relatively short time. Soviets of such an expanded Outer Mongolian army in Korea would probably excite Chinese Communist suspicion of ultimate Soviet motives. An equal effort expanded in direct materiel aid to Chinese Communists and North Koreans probably would be considered more desirable by CCF and Soviets.

That area of China known as Inner Mongolia and formerly considered as a part of Manchuria is actually a CCF military district and is a definite potential source of manpower. The military and political leader of the area is WU Lan-fu, alias Yun Tse. A Chinese WANG Tsai-Tien is deputy commander of the Military District, and Hu Ping-chuan is Chief of Staff. The 5th Cav Div is identified in the Tsitsihaer area, formerly commanded by Mongol O-Nen-Jih-Tu. It is believed other Cav divs exist in the area, with a Chinese Wang Hai-shan, and Mongol Wu-Lo-Chi-Ao-Hsi-Er listed as commanders. It is estimated that not more than 20,000 Cav troops exist in the area which may be organized in 3 to 5 divs.

PART II. Ref item B. No definite answer can be given to whether these Mongolians, if used, would come from USSR or Manchuria. They could be furnished from both areas. If Soviet Mongolian units were to be used in Korea, they probably would be formed in Soviet Far East, perhaps around Ulanude, capital of Buryat-Mongol Autonomous Republic. Personnel would be brought from units chiefly within the USSR, so as to maintain security. If Outer Mongolian army were to serve as vehicle of Mongoloid reinforcement, such units would be formed up probably in Outer Mongolia, around Ulan Bator (Urga), and in eastern Outer Mongolia where former Soviet military installations exist.

Although some Mongoloids may be employed as "volunteers", it is considered that they would make no advantageous contribution to Communist operations in Korea, particularly in view of the vast remaining manpower resources of Communist China and USSR. Available reports, while unconfirmed and sketchy, also indicate that "Mongolian" forces are now in Manchuria (See G-2, FEC INTSUMS 3045, 3050, 3067, 3073, 3089 and 3109).

PART III. Ref item C. The Mongolian Republic is the term commonly used to refer to Outer Mongolia. The Inter Mongolia Semi-Autonomous Region, a newly created buffer zone between Manchuria and the Mongolian Republic, is an administrative area controlled by the Chinese Communists. (See Map No. 4, G-2 FEC INTSUM 3125) Outer Mongolia declared her independence from China in 1936 and in the same year was recognized by the USSR. For information on Mongolian army insignia, see G-2 FEC INTSUM 3102.

1. For additional background information, see G-4 Journal Nos. 03912 and 04771.

2. Ltr from Eighth Army, subj: Donation to Korea of Prefabricated Buildings, dtd 9 Feb 51, requested 60 buildings, located at Masan and of no longer any military value, be donated to ROK. The JA opinion was that, due to the fact that to date policy with respect to the settlement of claims between ROK, its Nationals and the US Government has not been finally determined, a donation was not feasible.

3. Since these buildings were being used for refugee purposes, it was the consensus of G-4, Engr, and JA that the transfer of the buildings to ROK fell within the purview of the CHIK program; thus could be diverted from military stocks in Korea for issue to ROK.

4. Msg ZX 45685 requested DA issue a part program authorizing diversion of 58 building shells, tropical precast, complete, 20 ft by 54 ft from military stocks in Korea for issue to ROK. Pursuant to provisions of Public Law 911, 81st Congress, subject diversion to be without reimbursement.

5. DA msg 29716 stated that an approved part program SKU 60-4-613 was being issued authorizing diversion but, that diversion would be on a reimbursable basis.

6. Instant msg informs Eighth Army of above decision and points out the fact that there are 58 instead of 60 buildings available for transfer. The fact that two buildings had been cannibalized was ascertained by Col Hensey, G-4 KEAD, while on an inspection trip to Korea.

3. Eighth Army clearance of stories emanating in Korea which are sent by teletype or are mailed will not require further clearance in Tokyo unless the contents are changed.
4. Stories rewritten in Tokyo will be censored by PAD GHQ.
5. Stories as desired by Eighth Army may be transmitted to Tokyo for final action. This applies particularly to stories having international or political aspects.
6. The contents of Par 5 above will not rpt not be transmitted to the press.

1. Radio CG Army Eight GX-3-5454 KTR DTG 301410 I replied to radio CINCFE CX 58366 DTG 221311 and stated Hannibal Victory can unload at Inchon provided ship's gear can off load the lighterage. Capacity to handle heavy lifts is limited in volume to 40 tons per lift which can be handled. Part 2 stated in order to avoid congestion, it is recommended that Hannibal Victory discharge Sasebo for transshipment by LST and/or Pusan for transhipment by LST and rail as discussed with Mr. Vierhus, CINCFE and Lt Col Harraves, 2d Log Comd, over telephone yesterday.

2. Radio CINCFE CX 58366 DTG 221311 advised the Hannibal Victory nominated to lift equip for AF Engr Avn Bn from Okinawa to Inchon. Total

cargo 1628 L/T 7958 M/T. Heavy lifts consist of 56 pcs 5-10 L/T, 35 pcs 10-15 L/T, 20 pcs 15-20 L/T, 2 pcs 20-25 L/T, 6 pcs 25-30 L/T and 1 pc 40 L/T. Ms. also advised additional units of this type are scheduled for mvmt to Inchon in the near future. Requested availability of facilities at Inchon to discharge listed equip from Hannibal Victory.

3. Hannibal Victory has one 50 ton boom on No. 3 hatch and 1, 30 ton boom on No. 4 hatch, that are in good working order; therefore, equip scheduled to be lifted on the Hannibal Victory can be discharged from the ves to lighterage with ship's gear.

4. Info aval CINCFE indicates majority heavy lifts cannot be moved by rail from Pusan due to tunnel clearances.

5. Recommendations contained in part 2 cited msg were informally discussed with Lt Col Hargraves; however, no firm commitment was made that CINCFE was in agreement with this proposal since the ship's gear could discharge the equip, it was considered that the use of the Hannibal Victory for mvmt of the cargo from Okinawa to Inchon, which would move the equip in one lift and avoid re-handling, was the best solution. Army Eight, Trans Sec, (Maj Males) was advised of this on 30 Mar 51.

6. Forwarded to G-4 for approval prior to dispatch.

7. Action completed on TJs 4898 and suspended on 5263 until 2 Apr pending dispatch.
