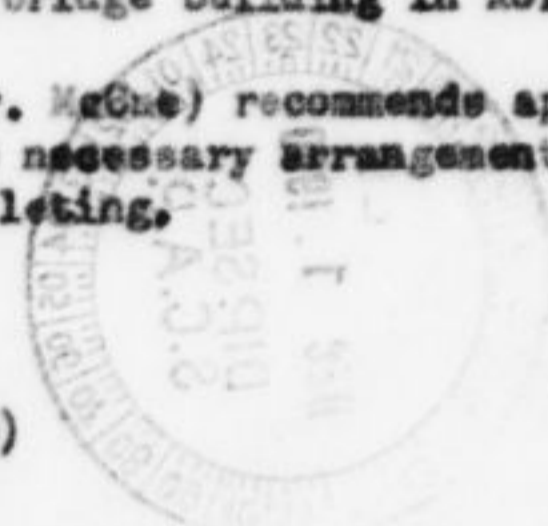

Subject is Personnel.

Following results meeting with eleven females (Rogers, Krunsky and Wright absent). All generally interested in answers following questions:

1. Allowable week or ten days temporary duty Hong Kong for purchase summer clothes.
2. Are living allowances paid as well as differential in three posts mentioned.
3. Request advance on claims for losses be approved prior departure; otherwise will be necessary request salary and per diem advance, which probably not adequate.
4. Want assurances that details are temporary and they will be returned to Korea when entry female employees permitted and option to resign and return to United States at government expense if cannot return Korea by April 1.
5. May they elect travel by surface in lieu air.

Individually, following results pending answers above questions:

Fitzpatrick, Riordan and Wilson agree to detail Rangoon. Will depart as soon as advance of funds effected.

Copelli prefers transfer Manila to accepting transfer Army. Will postpone marriage indefinitely. Desires delay departure three weeks.

McCabe will go Bjakarta if departure delayed to approximately December 15.

Naef and Williams wish resign and return United States.

Warnecke willing remain on loan to Army, replacing male secretary; otherwise will resign and return United States.

Abarno willing remain on loan to Army, replacing male secretary, or willing transfer permanently to Formosa if husband may accompany in some capacity. If remains Tokyo on loan, requests option of return transportation United States at end loan period if not possible husband return Korea.



Van Auken wishes remain Tokyo Field Office.

Rodgers and Krunsky resigning.

No comment regarding Wright and Boucher pending your recommendations.

Recommend Warneck^e and Abarno remain on loan to Army replacing Keen and Prosser.

Materese will be recalled by GHQ. Recommend continuation loan Copelli until his return Tokyo. End signed Jané.

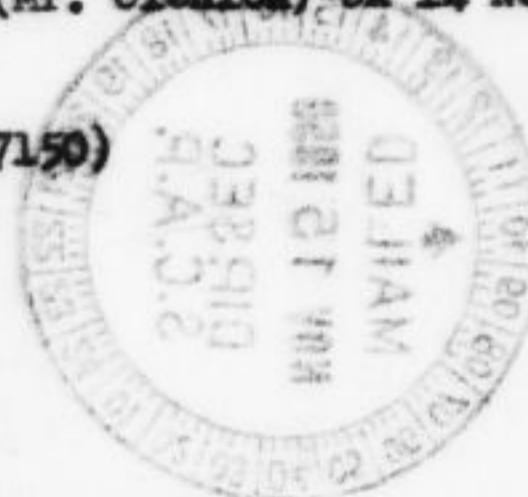

In continuation FMBTEL 281 Oct 20, folg further info re disposition of Communist collaborators in Seoul area has been developed. As of Oct 27 joint investigation committee had completed investigation of 9877 arrestees. Of these 4253 had been released, 4711 delivered to civil courts, 783 to mil courts and 130, all members NK Army, to MP.

Of 783 persons passed to mil courts, total of 251 have been tried with folg results:

A. Seoul Mil Court has sentenced 36 to death, 10 to life imprisonment, 10 to more than 5 yrs imprisonment and 1 to less than 5 yrs imprisonment.

B. Advocate Court (apparently branch of Judge Advocate General, ROK Army) has sentenced 88 to death, 16 to life imprisonment, 19 to 20 yrs imprisonment, 5 to 15 yrs imprisonment, 33 to 10 yrs imprisonment, 17 to 1 yrs imprisonment, 1 to 6 months imprisonment and 15 acquitted.

Civil courts have begun to hear some cases, but it appears no verdicts yet rendered.

In practice all cases of civil nature, regardless degree of seriousness, are being delegated to civil courts, and all cases involving mil pers, installations, property, etc, are being delegated mil courts. ROK Army Chief of Staff has power to order case delegated to civil court transferred to mil court

Subject is entry Japan of Paik Lak Seung as commercial entrant. Pertinent information relative case follows: Paik initially granted clearance to enter Japan for seven days as intransit to Hongkong. After arrival in Japan and prior to his departure for Hongkong request received from Korean Mission for individuals entry for six months on government business (to sell Korean Red - Jinsen to Hongkong.) This request was denied since his business was not in Japan. Later request from Mission states that Paik was awaiting visa for Hongkong and he had important business in Japan which required an indefinite stay and frequent trips to Hongkong and Manila. No indication of the nature of the important business was given. Since it was apparent that Paik had remained in Japan beyond his authority to stay he was granted authority to remain in Japan until 1 September, which was considered adequate time for him to arrange travel to Hongkong or Korea. He finally departed Japan for Hongkong 18 September 50. Investigation reveals that Paiks family, Mrs. Paik Chang Hi, Mrs. Paik Chang Ai and Master Paik Keun S n arrived in Japan illegally. Upon personal request of Ambassador Kim, Korean Mission, individuals were permitted to remain in Japan until 30 September 50 or such time prior to that date which application for Paiks entry as commercial entrant was decided. Paiks demonstrated action in disregarding regulations led to denial of another request from the Mission for his entry from Hongkong as a commercial entrant. Since Paik was denied entry as a

commercial entrant the Mission was advised to make arrangements for the departure from Japan of his dependents. Mr Yi, Consular Korean Mission, approached a representative of this headquarters with another application for entry of Paik from Hongkong as a commercial entrant. This application states Paik is president of the Korean National Business Corporation and Taichong Textile Company and that the individual desired to purchase textile machinery in Japan for use in restoring the Korean textile industry. Information from Mr Yi indicates that Paik is in Hong Kong on behalf of President Rhee to sell "Jinsen" for government monopoly; that President Rhee has been needling Paik about the slowness of his business and desires him to expedite his sale and return to Japan, that Paik is reluctant to return to Japan again unless he has a bonafide clearance, that Paik upon his entry into Japan proposes to use the "Jinsen" money to procure textile machinery as stated in application. In view of the above outline of this case request information regarding Paiks status as a bonafide commercial entrant and or his connection with ROK government.

Following extracted summary of memo prepared by Second Secretary Donald S MacDonald following trip to Wonsan at my request. Begin summary: Following observations of conditions in Wonsan made during stay there Oct 15 and 16. Trip was made via NA aircraft in company with Army and Navy attaches.

Beside observing conditions and talking to some local inhabitants, I discussed situation with various Korean and American Army officers, a local pastor who is temporary Chairman of Self Govt Committee of Wonsan, and Provost Marshal of Korea First Corps.

Conditions in Wonsan are confused and unsettled; order has been preserved but no city govt can be said to exist. Damage to city is very heavy as result of aerial bombardment. About 2/3 of city's dwelling are destroyed and virtually all its industry. Not over 20,000 people are now in city of prewar population estimated at 150,000. Virtually all govt officials were evacuated with N Korean military forces; all records and money were taken out with them.

1. Physical damage: Most of center of town lies in ruin. Dock area was heavily bombed as were railroad yards and industrial plants. Oil refinery is wholly destroyed. It is estimated that 70% of all dwellings destroyed or badly damaged but several substantial buildings such as Provincial Capitol, normal school, City Hall and Public Auditorium still stand. American and Canadian Mission properties appear not damaged.

FCO. Data on Communist Regime: Appearance of people returning Wonsan is much worse than in South Korea pinched faces and ragged clothes are universal. Inhabitants stated there was no rice ration except to officials; some said they had had no rice for months. A monument in city square bears Russian and Korean inscriptions praising Red Army for liberating Koreans from Japanese. Russian sign boards

are in evidence around the city; these and large quantities of propaganda materials are evidence of Russian influence. Four Russians were said to have been in Soviet Consulate until quite recently. Virtually nothing of intelligence value was left by N Koreans. All currency in banks had been taken off. All important Govt personnel, as well as most minor functionaries, had left town with N Korean military forces. Before leaving all political prisoners were taken out of cells and at least several hundred had been shot or buried in a cave. As a result, virtually no leaders or educated people, either Communist or non Communist, could be found upon whom to build a temporary local govt.

3. Steps taken by Korean Army: Wonsan was secured by First Corps on Oct 11. Military Police arrived shortly afterward accompanied by about 100 male student volunteers and 30 girl students from Kangung. MPs organized local volunteer security force of about 250 to help maintain law and order; men of age 35 to 40 were chosen and local students were not used for fear Communist indoctrination would make them unreliable. Apparently relations between military and local population having been good and there has been little lawlessness. MPs and Korean Army CIC had taken only about 20 prisoners these were Communist small fry half in Wonsan prison which otherwise empty. Korean Army Civil Affairs Officer arrived Wonsan Oct 14. He was welcomed by about 50 Wonsan inhabitants headed by an old preacher. Civil Affairs Officer called a meeting of towns people in Central Square on Oct 15 which was attended by about 10,000 people. He informed people of their responsibilities under Army control. ROK Home Minister Chough who had arrived that morning also addressed the meeting. He reportedly spoke in generalities about fighting Communism. He made no specific statement about relation of N Korea to ROK but stated he was sending 200 police and administrators to Wonsan fr ROK. Plan had been made by Civil Affairs Officer and local committee to hold election for permanent Chairman of Self Governing Committee, but it was decided to postpone election for time being. Meantime, Wonsan was virtually without govt; Civil Affairs Officer and his small staff could do little directly. Nothing had been done to provide food or other facilities to inhabitant. Civil Affairs Officials directing survey however of avail technical personnel for rehabilitation of utilities and believed such people were avail if material and supplies could be brought in. Estimate of current population varied fr 10 to 20,000. At rate of return of refugees, it is possible population may reach 100,000 in matter of few weeks.

Paik Nak Sung now in Hongkong to sell ginseng. Mission officials believe Paik may have obtained agreement from ROK whereby Paik will retain for his own account all proceeds in excess of US\$2,450,000. Chase Bank, Hongkong, appraised ginseng approximately US\$3,500,000. Recommend you advise appropriate officials ROK:

1. Mission representative is available to proceed to Hongkong immediately to assist in selling ginseng.
2. Mission does not concur in selling the 35,000 cattles of ginseng now stored in Hongkong for US\$2,450,000, as such action does not conform to Article II(c) of the Aid Agreement.
3. Mission will concur in selling this ginseng only at prices in line with current prices in Hongkong and which prices are approved by Chase Bank.
4. All proceeds should be deposited to credit of Bank of Korea in Chase National Bank of New York.
5. Any compensation or commission paid to Paik should have prior approval of ECA Mission to Korea in accordance with Article IV, Section 2 of Aid Agreement.
6. ECA Korea insists that ROK direct Bank of Korea to send a message to Chase Bank substantially as follows: "Paik Nak Sung now in Hongkong for purpose of selling 35,000 cattles of red ginseng now consigned to your order. You are authorized to release any quantities upon cash payment which in your opinion is fair and reasonable. All proceeds shall be converted to US dollars and transferred to the Chase National Bank of New York for credit of the Tokyo office of the Bank of Korea." End signed Anderson.
