Kim, Koo, head of Korean Independence Party, assassinated at his home in Seoul on 261205 June 49. 2d Lt Ahn, age 33, Korean Army Field Artillery Group, allegedly a friend of Kim, entered latter's home armed with 45 caliber pistol and fired 4 rounds into Kim's body. Ahn graduated from Korean Military Academy 6-week course, 2 months ago. Ahn, member of Kim's party and Northwest Young Mens Association is at present being interrogated by Korean Army Military Police. Motive obscure as yet.

English language questions and answers at Pres Rhee's Press Conference today related exclusively to problem of Pacific Pact. Following text exchanges between Rhee and fgn correspondents:

"Secretary of State Acheson is quoted as having said yesterday to a press conference that the time is not right for a Pacific Pact, in view of the disturbed situation in certain countries in Asia. Do you care to comment on this comment President?"

"Ans: I really do not know what Secretary Acheson was referring to when he referred to disturbed situations in Asia. I think a Pacific Pact will be beneficial not only to Asia but to the US. But if the US does not take kindly to the idea, I think that Asia as a whole can take action. I think there are a good many countries, like the Philippines, Australia, and some of the South American States bordering on the Pacific, which will be interested in a pact. Later on, the US may be ready to participate in a pact."

"Q: Mr President, have any concrete steps been taken by any other countries to negotiate a Pacific Pact?"

"A: No concrete steps have been taken by other countries, as far as I know. But some messages have been exchanged in some quiet way, and some countries themselves have indicated that they are interested."

"Q: Mr President, you just said that some messages have been exchanged in connection with a Pacific Pact, and that some countries have indicated their interest in a pact. I wonder if you could tell us what countries have exchanged messages or expressed interest? (over)"

"A: I think it is a little bit premature for me to mention what countries are participating. You know that the State Dept is not in favor of the pact. And you know that the other day the Australian Fgn Minister declared in favor of the pact. About the South American States, I would rather not make any statement.

" : Secretary Acheson said that in Europe preliminary discussions had taken place before the negotiation of the North Atlantic Pact, but that they had not yet taken place in Asia or the Pacific. Do you care to comment on this, Mr President?

"A: I think I had better not start a discussion on this question. I know there are reasons for Secretary Acheson's policy. However, countries are interested in the Pact.

"Q: Acheson stated that the pact was not feasible now because of disturbances in certain areas of Asia but when affairs resolved themselves talks could begin again. Do you care to comment, Mr President, on the disturbed situations, especially in China, and their relation to the pact?

"A: I think that reason is very weak. All democratic nations should not wait, but should take definite action and help build up the Democratic Op, instead of remaining neutral. They should settle the Communist problem in favor of the democratic countries. I do not see why three democratic countries should band together and form a defense block. If we open up a Pacific Pact and invite the KMT, I think that this is strengthening the democratic elements in China rather than weakening them. The democratic nations must stand together and show some backbone, rather than standing individually. In the first and second World Wars the democratic nations got the worst of it. Why? The totalitarian powers stuck together and took the democratic countries one by one. Hang together or hang separately. I think in China all the democratic nations of the world are abandoning rather than helping democratic elements."

Following is text joint statement by Min Pon Affairs and Min Defense issued here this afternoon.

"It is reported that the USAFIK are withdrawing because the President of Korea has agreed to the withdrawal of US Forces at this time. It should be made clear what the President of this govt meant when he agreed with the idea of the withdrawal of trps fr Korea by the US. What the President meant was this. The US created the 38th Parallel jointly with USSR. The US will feel the responsibility both fr moral and political stand points with regard to the situations in the Far East.

"It is understood that the US should be assured of the adequate defense for the Republic of Korea before they withdraw their forces in from Korea. They should not consider withdrawing the American Forces until this obligation has been fulfilled. The President did not mean that they should withdraw until this has been fulfilled. Democracy is based on the moral sensibilities of the peoples while they deal with ea other. Korea sincerely expects a great democratic nation such as the US will not hesitate to fulfill its moral obligations.

"The Govt of the Republic of Korea has submitted to the authorities of the United States its minimum requirement that its defense forces need we hope the latter will cooperate with the government of the Republic of Korea in accordance with urgency and need of the Far East according to dependable information USSR has made agreement with the Puppet Government in North Korea to completely arm 6 divisions of Infantry and 3 divisions of motorized troops, to provide 20 patrol boats, fast destroyer, 100 fighter planes, 20 bombers and 100 reconnaissance planes, and to fulfill armed police forces The United States should
