Dept desires retain current 2145 GMT Korean prog for present pending evaluation other elms which might determine further sched revision. Consideration will be given reschedule Korean broadcasts to fill half hour block rather than cutting into 2 blocks (URTEL 431 Aug 18). Meantime agree Fukuoka and Matsue continue carry first 15 mins instantaneous relay of 2145 program and repeat at 2245 of same first 15 mins. Providing 5 second pause at 2144:30 GMT to accommodate breaking away. Assume in any reschedule Fukuoka wld be retained for half hour total regardless exact time and that Matsue wld be avail both for instantaneous relay of half hour prog and rebroadcast as well. Korean local time change one factor in final determination of sched.

Advise if local Jap time change for 10 affects avail of stations for relay and rebroadcasts particularly 1300 to 1400 GMT, for current termination Jap broadcast sched.

"Have honor to acknowledge receipt of your tel reporting the designation by the US Navy Dept of 3 hosp ships with appropriate identification marks. The contents of above-mentioned tel have been communicated to appropriate authorities. At the same time the Govt of the People's Democratic Republic of Korea protests against numerous bombardments and shooting up of hosp, hosp CACS, ambulances etc by American a/c. These constitute a flagrant violation of the Geneva Convention for the Amelioration of the condition of the wounded and sick in Armies in the fld. The Govt of the Peoples Democratic Republic of Korea wants that the opposing side be informed that all mobile ambulance units and all fixed hosp institutions bear the emblem of the Red Cross in accordance with the Geneva Convention.

I do not know if the bulletins of all hqs or correspondents succeed in giving an idea of what the Amers are doing in Korea. I don't know if the readers in Europe reading the dispatches of the advances of the northerners and the description of the battles succeed in understanding how hard fought, ~~so~~ fearful and ferocious this war is. It is a true miracle that the troops of MacArthur have succeeded in preventing themselves from being pushed into the sea. It is a real miracle that they have been able to resist a tremendous attack and not dissolve.

They have come with the conviction that they were to conduct a police action, an ordered and clean operation of public order. Instead have found themselves submerged up to their necks in a campaign that is not less difficult than the war in Spain, France or against the Japanese".

Lofreddo explains the preparation of the Comies, their adequate equipment, means and training. Then he continues: "Notwithstanding everything, despite the inferiority of numbers which is worsening daily, the Amers have held the attack. Their recruits in Korea have fought as their comrades fought after 4 years of experience under fire against the soldiers of the Rising Sun.

"The Amer soldiers have legs broken from fatigue, they are severely tried by the heat and the humidity of this country, they do not enjoy the standards that distinguish their Army among all others, but you never hear them lament for those things. They are only furious because they do not have forces enough, because

Following London 777, Aug 8 repeated your information:

"British Press sounded loud warning note on Formosa over long bank holiday week end ending today. Several serious papers, notable Times, Guardian, and Sunday Observer, emphasized danger that US policy in neutralizing Formosa runs grave risk of embroiling America in a war with China which could serve interests only in Kremlin.

Urgent almost strident tone of comment was set by Observer on Sunday which devote its editorial column entirely to Formosa saying that: Two events of last week have greatly increased danger of war breaking out between American and China over Formosa.

First is resumption by General Chiang Kai-Shek of the bombing and blockade of Chinese mainland, which President Truman had requested him to stop.

Second is visit of General MacArthur to Formosa, during which arrangements were made, he declared, for the effective coordination of his and General Chiang's forces in defending Formosa against any attack which a hostile force might be foolish enough to attempt. Neither of these actions is compatible with the neutralization of Formosa which President Truman had proclaimed to be the object of American policy. The combined effect of them is to place American in a position which is hard to distinguish from active intervention in the Chinese Civil War on the side of General Chiang. Seen from Peking, this can appear only as extreme provocation.

It is hard to see how MacArthur could sink Chinese ships attacking Formosa without thereby creating a state of war between America and China. In such a war, observer declares China would rally most of Asia to her side and all available American resources would be absorbed for indefinite time, setting Russia free to roam at will in Europe and middle east.

Observer pleads for 'wait and see' policy that would give China fair chance to develop independently of Moscow and asks 'does it count for nothing that nearly all these nations now feel solidarity with Communist China and side with her over the Formosa question, even while they oppose aggression in Korea. Is their advice to be contemptuously disregarded and their good will and trust, so laboriously earned, to be thrown away? Is our whole well-thought-out and hitherto not unsuccessful Asian policy to be laid in ruins for the sake of keeping a paltry island in the discredited hands of General Chiang?'

Observer concludes that in this case it is America not Britain which 'suddenly without consultation reversed previous policy over Formosa, and thereby--which is more important--gravely endangered our highest common interests in Asia.' Britains duty, editorial ends, is to try to induce us 'to see and redress a mistake which, if persisted in, means tragedy for her no less than for US.'

London Times took somewhat similar line on Monday. In editorial devoted mainly to Korea and UN, it said:

Russian and Chinese policy will be determined not by any UN resolutions but by the assessment in Moscow and Peking of the military situation in the Pacific. Like all other governments in the world, the Soviet and Chinese Governments are waiting to see whether the American and South Korean divisions can hold the bridgehead around Pusan, and they will thereafter set their course. They may still believe the the risks of precipitation a great war compel caution on them, yet it is more prudent to expect a Communist diversion elsewhere, designed to drain UN forces away from the task of developing the Korean bridgehead.'

Editorial then declared need is to 'understand that Russia chief desire is to embroil the western powers--and especially the US--with Communist China. There is, no doubt, little that the western powers can do on their side in this matter, for Peking may in any case decide to intervene in Korea or more in

arms elsewhere. But the western powers, while preparing against any such move, can avoid needless provocation. Still more urgent, editorial concludes, is need for full and open understanding between General MacArthur and Washington and between Washington and other western capitals on policy towards Formosa. The Chinese Nationalists, in the island, far from being neutralized as President Truman intended, have resumed their air attacks on shipping and ports from behind the screen of American warships. Manchester Guardian on Saturday was less concerned and commented that the American decision on Formosa is a legitimate gamble that the act of neutralization will be a deterrent to new complications rather than a cause of them. But Guardian diplomatic correspondent, on Monday termed MacArthur-Chiang pact a blow to the west and a propaganda gift to the Communists. The American decision to defend Formosa seems to have been taken (possibly against the advice of Mr. Acheson) for strategic and internal political reasons. Without possessing the technical equipment which would justify expressing any view on the real strategic value of Formosa, one has reason to believe that the American strategists are more concerned to deny any addition to Communist-controlled territory than to hold the island for any positive strategic value it might have for themselves. Article continues that whatever MacArthur's genius as a soldier there is little justification for thinking the formulation of policy could be left with safety in his hands. His well-known views on the need for America to support Chiang Kai-Shek and to defend Formosa may have forced, and certainly influenced, President Truman to link the defense of Formosa with that of Korea. Correspondent says it is probably MacArthur agreement with Chiang that went somewhat further than American Administration intended. It concludes to allow the cause for which the forces of the UN are now fighting in Korea to become identified or linked with the preservation of such a regime as that of Chiang Kai-Shek would be worth several battles to the Communist.

Similar speculation as to whether MacArthur's trip to Formosa had administration backing was contained in number of dispatches from Washington correspondents of British papers. Typical was following, frontpaged in Daily Telegraph Monday:

'President Truman is said to have known nothing beforehand of General MacArthur's recent visit to Formosa, and to be most anxious to emphasize that while the US is prepared to send military aid to ensure defense of the island, there can be no question of general political rapprochement with the Chinese Nationalists. The President is said to be particularly concerned that it should be understood that US policy specifically excludes any possibility of American action against the Chinese Mainland.'

Press generally has also carried over week end dispatches from Washington speculating strongly that President sent Harriman to Tokyo to confer with MacArthur about latter's recent trip to Formosa. Typical of such agency messages widely reproduced in serious British Press was following contained in JP dispatch from Washington and frontpaged on Paris edition Herald Tribune Monday:

'Mr Harriman flew to Japan Friday with instructions to emphasize that the US political attitude toward the Chinese Nationalist regime must be kept carefully separated from the purely military matter of defending Formosa. He was dispatched informants said, after administration officials decided that American political aims in the Far East had been severely damaged by General MacArthur's recent conferences with Generalissimo Chiang Kai-Shek and by the statements issued by Nationalist officials.' Most papers frontpaged prominently but briefly reports of Harriman's arrivals in Tokyo and Korea.

Times today continues comments on Formosa in editorial on 'India and Korea.' Remarking that Nehru 'speaks with special authority about fears and aspirations of the non-Communist peoples of Asia,' Times says his statements to Indian parliament last week 'deserve close study both in this country and in US, for no settlement in Korea that ignores Asian sentiment can be lasting.'

After discussing at length the Nehru-Stalin-Acheson correspondence, editorial then concludes with following on Formosa:

In particular she fears that the American attempt to isolate Formosa from hostilities is bringing its own dangers and is strengthening Asian suspicions that the western powers wish to support and reinstate bankrupt and out-of-date regimes. From the first she saw the danger that this policy might give Communist China grounds for intervention.

It may indeed be argued that India's policy shows insufficient appreciation of the risk to Asia presented by the growth of the new and sinister imperialism which is the goal of Communist intrigue, and that it is for her to set the example to other Asian countries by ranging herself more fully with the powers now opposing the march of aggression. But in giving strong reminders of the depth of feeling behind the great Asian national movements, and of the need for understanding and forbearance towards areas that have not ranged themselves openly on the side of aggression, the voice of India--like that of Pakistan and other free countries--deserves to be heard.

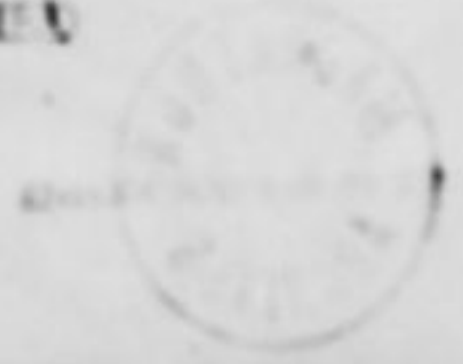
This was an editorial echo of a dispatch from the Times Washington correspondent on Monday. After usual speculation re MacArthur-Chiang talks and Harriman trip, dispatch says:

The original decision to quarantine Formosa was taken, so far as can be discovered, solely to prevent the spread of war in the Far East and not to help General Chiang Kai-Shek or to appease his supporters in the US. But there have been recent rumors that more solid help is going to be given to the Chinese Nationalists--rumors which may think true after Mr Acheson refusal to deny them on Wednesday. Quarantining was probably a good idea, provided that the Chinese Communists accepted it or that success in repelling an invasion of Formosa could be guaranteed, but there is great doubt here whether the American 7th Flt, which is still very short of destroyers, could prevent an armada of 2,000 junks from making a crossing which would take only 16 hours. The result of all this has been dismay among those who have no doubts of American intentions and hate to see propaganda abroad lost in the political acrobatics at home. It then concludes: 'It will profit the US little to win Korea and lose Asia.'

Press yesterday and today also carries protests from 2 MPs, 1 Labor and 1 Conservative, against American policy in Formosa. Fenner Brockway, Labor MP, announced he had sent a telegram to Attlee pointing out that 'danger of World War now lay more in Formosa than in Korea' and asking that it be made clear that 'British support of UN action in Korea cannot be extended to action unauthorized by UN against China.' Peter Baker, Conservative MP, said yesterday: 'The government should tell the US State Department that we are most concerned about General MacArthur's parleyings with Chiang Kai-Shek. Many of us are worried about Formosa. It plays a vital part in Pacific strategy. But the free nations, whose moral purpose in Korea is so high, cannot have truck with the corruption, the reaction and the wrongdoings of Chiang Kai-Shek and his rump.'

Labor organ Daily Herald also took up Formosa problem today saying: 'When President Truman gave orders to the American 7th Flt to cover Formosa, the clear aim was to neutralize the island and limit the conflict. Since then the Nationalist forces of Chiang Kai-Shek have continued their attacks against the mainland, and General MacArthur has paid a visit to the island.'

Editorial concludes: 'The British people will be eager to see any misunderstandings on these problems swiftly removed. Our interest, and the interests of freedom-loving and peace-loving people everywhere, is to secure the maximum agreement, not only between this country and the United States, but also with those countries in Asia whose aid is vital to make the world safe from aggression.'

Daily Worker today takes full advantage of opportunity to exploit these editorial questionings in British Press about Formosa. Worker editorial today says 'America is preparing war on the peoples Democratic Republic of China and is dragging the British Government along.' Worker then summarizes some of week end comment on Formosa and declares that both in Formosa and Korea American has only 1 objective 'domination'. Communists on other hand, Worker says, are fighting for 'a policy of genuine independence, of land reform, of industrialization in the interests of the people', while American are 'seeking to mobilize the whole capitalist world' to defeat this aim."

"Should Thailand refuse to participate when action is needed and let big powers bear all the burden unaided, the result in the long run would be that only 3 or 4 big powers would practically govern all the peoples of the world. MYTEL 1 July 6 and 2 July 27. Loffredo's initial articles from Korea have been widely published. They have so far reflected Emb expectations of good factual reporting with fair and friendly comments. Loffredo added following comment to first article after account of actual battle situation:

"It is undoubtable that the war in Korea is waged by the North Korean forces after an accurate, meticulous and precise strategical preparation. It has been calculated that the rainy season would have made it difficult for USA forces to stage the great aerial operations that otherwise would have taken place with great efficacy by transferring entire formations at the right moment and with ease. In this case the northern fighters would have been inferior to the USA bombers. That is why the battles have been fought at night-until now the particular characteristic of this war-with heavily armoured tanks of an unusually wide track and consequently very advantageous on the soft ground of the rice paddies and with motorized troops on jeeps surmounted by armoured turrets provided with heavy machine guns.

"An objective evaluation of the war as it has been waged by the USA forces, must acknowledge that, despite their numerical inferiority, they have succeeded in stopping their adversaries in the directions adopted from the beginning that would have led them to the coast of the Korean Straits along the mountains of appenninic character and the Seoul-Taejon-Taegu road, on which the northerns have advanced 200 KM.

"The Korean war acquires a special physiognomy by the combination of northern preparations and American training. Tonight, after a day of heavy rain, there is a 3/4 moon lost in the vapours of mist that blacks out the outlines of all, even the near, objects. 57

Each such hospital ship had a gross registered tonnage of 11,758 tons (displacement of 15,450 tons), a length of 520 feet, 1 funnel (machinery and stack aft), 2 masts (mainmast and foremast), and 3 K posts which from side view may have the appearance of masts. The marks of identification will be as follows:

1. Hull painted white;
2. Horizontal band of green, whole length of ship;
3. Red Cross painted in middle of starboard and port sides;
4. Red cross painted on deck, illuminated electrically at night;
5. Red cross painted on funnel, illuminated electrically at night.

It is requested that notification of the foregoing designation, characteristics and markings be made through the regular channels to appropriate governments. In view of the great urgency of this matter, it is further requested that it be handled as expeditiously as possible, and the Navy Department informed of the receipt of this notification by such appropriate governments."

Can be increased to 600,000 according to needs. 50,000 crack Pinpiao troops to support Ch En Yi's forces. Chinese Commie air and naval forces will be concentrated for this battle for first time.

"4. Strategy for attack: Initial attempt gain air superiority. "Boat waves" concentrated on one point on shore Taiwan until bridgehead won. Coincident sponsoring of rebellion within Taiwan.

"5. Chi Commies said consider American 7th Flt insufficient protect Formosa Straits. Believe Commie aid and sub strength can neutralize it. Consider morale Nat Army low.

"6. In every Regt of Chinese Commie Armies are Sov advisers and instructors busily training troops. Every effort made keep this activity secret from populace. Many American return students, especially air students now working with Chinese Commie milit forces. Signed Pearson".
