1. Local press reports that Department of State has issued warning to Americans in Hong Kong and Macao. Every consideration will be given toward providing assistance in event serious trouble develops, however, due to current employment, CINCFC position regarding commitment of military forces must remain unchanged. Availability of naval vessels is dependent upon the existing situation and immediate urgent requirements at the time.

2. For planning purposes, it is suggested that the following information be obtained and maintained current:

- a. Best estimate of number of remaining evacuees after termination or saturation of commercial facilities.
- b. Sex and approximate ages.
- c. Most likely ports of embarkation.
- d. Planned debarkation point.

1. In TS radio NR 080608Z dated 8 Jan 51, the Chairman, Manila Liaison Group again requests info as to availability of Navy ships for evacuation of Americans from Hong Kong. CINCFE policy that all commercial means should be exhausted before calling upon this command for assistance remains unchanged.
2. Message suggests meeting with representative of this headquarters for "on the spot" investigation of Hong Kong situation. Meeting appears desirable in view of current critical situation, and CINCFE planning responsibility directed by JCS 1259/27.

1. Proceeding with printing new repeat new currency here priority basis. Japanese Ministry of Finance making available all government currency production facilities. Four-color plates now being made for 1,000 and 100 won notes using designs prepared by NOK. Estimated production by July 15, 25 billion won (25 million pieces) denomination 1,000 and one billion won (10 million pieces) denomination 100. Approximate cost 400 yen per 1,000 pieces.
2. Production additional old design in Washington not repeat not deemed advisable.
3. Plan for immediate conversion one for one basis under serious consideration as best expedient.
4. Your comments requested.

MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD:

Reference radios from Washington state that the U.S. Bureau of Engraving and Printing could produce 10 million pieces of currency per day following receipt of order but would require two weeks' notice prior to production to do so. Notes would be of same design printed in U.S. in 1947. Cost would not exceed \$3.50 per 1,000 pieces.

Japanese Ministry of Finance will turn over all facilities on emergency basis to print Korean currency. Will start printing Saturday, 8 July. Estimated production 35 million pieces by 15 July. Washington agencies concur in proceeding with printing of currency in Japan.



He said he had spent most of night and practically all day with top Koreans and key members National Assembly and feels he can hold them in line a little longer. For Acheson and Rusk from Dulles and Allison.
It is possible that South Koreans may themselves contain and repulse attack and if so this is best way. If, however, it appears they cannot do so then we believe that U.S. force should be used even though this risks Russian counter moves. To sit by while Korea is overrun by unprovoked armed attack would start disastrous chain of events leading most probably to world war. We suggest that Security Council might call for action on behalf of the organization under article 106 by the Five Powers or such of them as are willing to respond.
