Items on Korea follow: Dispatch by Tillman Durdin in New York Times yesterday states "Many Russian troops are leaving Manchuria, and moving to Northern Korea, according to authoritative sources here. The Russians are also said to have recently reinforced the Port Arthur Area. They are believed here at present to be carrying out the commitment to evacuate the Northeast by the end of April, but their withdrawal are being made in such a way that their forces in Northern Korea and Kwangtung Peninsula are being strengthened....."

Story by Richard Johnston in yesterday's New York Times says "In communique issued this morning by the Joint United States-Soviet Commission, which has been meeting here since March 20, the intention was announced of carrying out the terms of paragraph 2 and 3 of the Moscow decision of Foreign Ministers on Korea.....The work of the commission will divide into 2 stages. The first step will be to consult with Korean groups and to pass on recommendations to the 4 powers for final decisions.....The second step will be, with the participation of the Koreans, to assist in the political, social and economic progress of the Koreans and the development of Democratic Self Government...."

Ken Evans said over ABC 30 March "The American-Russian Zones would be eliminated. The U.S. Delegation wanted to wipe it out as one of the U.S. and Soviet-Korea Commissions first acts; but presumably the 38th parallel will have to be recognized for some time longer...."

Henry Gladstone said on his Mutual Broadcast 30 March "The apparently peaceful relations (in Korea) are marred by the Russian refusal to permit an American airplane to land on it's territory. The plane is presumed to have been carrying a message to the Soviet Commander in relations to the Joint U.S.-Soviet Commission in Korea.

Item on Korea follows: INS dispatch from Seoul today states "4 Korean students who said they recently came from the Russian Occupied Zone of Northern Korea spoke today at a mass meeting in Seoul and told stories of demonstrations and shootings in the Soviet Area. The stories lacked confirmation since American newsmen are barred from the Russian Zone. Russian sources in Seoul in the American Zone had no comment to make on the reports of unrest. Kim San Nook, one of the speakers at the mass meeting, said a student demonstration in the City of Siniju in Northern Korea was broken up by Soviet Troops armed with machine guns. The speaker said the demonstration was staged as a protest against a Russian order closing schools. The other speakers told similar stories of unrest and also said that an acute rice shortage is increasing the discontent of the Northern Koreans. In the American controlled Southern Zone, authorities have also been faced with growing agitation over the rice shortage and 2 organized demonstrations were staged within the last few days."

"1. Travel is authorized as recommended in reference cable of limited number Korean businessmen to travel at own expense to United States for purpose establishing business contacts provided that:

a. It is understood this authorization does not involve commitment to Korean Businessmen to open up trade between U.S. and Korea or permit U.S. investment Korean industry at any particular date.

b. The Koreans selected are such as would be authorized to operate under the contemplated licensing system to be established when trade between Korea and US is opened, in that these individuals are not engaged in any activities contrary to purpose of occupation.

c. There are available to Korean Businessmen sufficient dollars to pay for their transportation and maintenance while in US.

Cases of small pox are occurring aboard transports en route from your theater to US. This is cause for increasing military and public concern here in the states that emergency necessitates stringent control measures both here and in theater and advises that these should include (1) successful revaccination (as evidenced by definite unmistakable primary, vaccinoid or immune reaction) by medical officers of all personnel embarking for US via air or water unless accomplished within previous sixty days. The result of vaccination to be interpreted and certified on immunization register in all cases by a medical officer. Copy of immunization register to be in possession of each individual at embarkation. (2) Strict compliance with paragraph 5 AR 615-250 is requested to control embarkation of small pox contacts. Palmer Hoyt writes in UP dispatch from Seoul today "The Joint United States-Soviet Commission which is meeting to set up a provisional agreement for Korea is deadlocked on the question consulting Korean political leaders. An authoritative source said that the stalemate may mean a delay of weeks or months before the commission will be able to form a provisional government or settle economic questions. . . . The Moscow decision called on the commission to 'consult Korean Democratic parties and Social organizations.' In a communique last week, the commission announced formation of a subcommittee to discuss such consultations. The Soviets, however, reportedly are taking the view that Korean leaders or parties and organizations which opposed the Moscow Conference decision or which publicly opposed trusteeship are not eligible for consultation on formation of a provisional government. Under this view, many parties thus would be ruled out since the Moscow decision was strongly opposed last December by various groups. Your cable MFIC 1220 of 12 Feb 1946. 1. Your cable raises question as to whether field commissioners are the responsible agents of the U S Government for handling of Lend Lease matters such as offers of Civilian Authorities of Lend Lease countries to return Lend Lease property.

2. Field commissioners are official representatives of Foreign Liquidation Commission in area under their jurisdiction. It is assumed however that in areas where former FEA Lend Lease Representatives are stationed and are still handling Lend Lease matters (such as Daugherty in New Zealand and Brown in Australia) authority over such matters will generally be delegated to them and that in Lend Lease matters Field Commissioners will work closely and will take action in such matters only after consultation with such representatives.

3. In general, our policy is to accept back from civil and authorities of Lend Lease countries only items which are needed to fill needs of the U S Army or Navy in field, or other U S Governmental Agencies or UNRRA or items for which advantageous disposal arrangements can be made by FLC. Other items should be left in possession of Lend Lease Government awaiting disposition as a part of overall Lend Lease settlement.

"Brig Gen John R Sheetz, Deputy Mil Governor of Korea, said today that authorities have yet to find 1 case of starvation in Korea. If the Korean people cooperate, he said, there is enough rice in the country to last until the 1946 harvest in October. Answering Korean charges that "great numbers" of persons are starving because of a rice shortage, Sheetz said there is about 40% of last years 85,000,000 bushel rice crop still on hand in the American Zone, although it is not available on the open market. He attributed the Koreans anxiety to "Rice hunger" and said there are plenty of other foods available, including some grains but the Koreans are not satisfied unless they are able to obtain rice. He blamed the present market shortage of rice to loosening of controls when the American began their occupation. He said the U S Mil Gov't had not had control of the Provinces until Nov 1, and that during the previous month and a half Koreans allowed the situation to get "Completely out of hand." Agricultural Officials here estimated that this years rice crop will be 25% less than last year because of lack of fertilizer, but Sheetz said that whatever the crop is "It will not get out of hand, because we are going to control it from the very day the farmer cuts it."

War Department policy is that military personnel will be accorded accommodations on water transportation appropriate to the rank of the individual according to the principle applied in assigning quarters and comparable to those enjoyed by civilian travelers. Dependents will be furnished suitable accommodations as visualized in your message qualified only by the limitations listed below. For your information factors retarding immediate implementation of the policy include inadequate funds to make conversions of sufficient ships, incompatibility of keeping ships in yards for lengthy conversions, and concurrently maintaining schedules. As a result the majority of commercial type ships under Army control retain wartime converted conditions. Para 1. Further 2 WX 99991, CX 58690 and CFBX 25699, combined Chiefs of Staff have informed French through their military attache in Washington that:

A. There is no objection to the relief of Chinese troops in North French Indo-China by French forces since the combined Chiefs of Staff consider that such arrangements are matter for determination between governments of France and China.

B. The French Military Commander in Indo-China should act as a medium for French Government for coordination with the SCAP on matters related to the repatriation of Japanese from that country, and that the Chinese Supreme Commander and Admiral Mountbatten should be relieved of duties and responsibilities for disarmament and evacuation of Japanese in Indo-China.

C. It is most desirable to have the French Commander in Indo-China conform to present repatriation schedules which envisage the completion of the evacuation of the Japanese from Northern Indo-China by 15 April.

Para 2. The combined Chiefs of Staff have requested that the French instruct their commander with regard to:

A. Transfer of the above-mentioned duties.
B. Adhering to present repatriation schedules for Northern Indo-China.

Para 3. The British are instructing the Supreme Allied Commander Southeast Asia Command to make necessary arrangements with French Commander in Indo-China for transfer of the repatriation responsibilities to the French. You will be informed as to effective date.

Supply of essential material from US for program of housing dependents is subject. Reurad C 58844 dtd 15 Mar 1946 situation described in C 58844 of 15 Mar is recognized here. The same condition exists in all overseas theaters and is worse in the ZI. Loss of trained pers due to demobilization and the acceptance of untrained pers in selective service has reduced the combat effectiveness of the Air Forces to its lowest ebb. As a general rule, trained pers in large numbers will not become available until late fall of this year. However, starting in Apr, approximately 200 airplane mechanics are scheduled to be sent to you each month. Commencing in May, a small increase in trained pers in other categories will become available from reenlistments and civilian life and a proportionate share will be shipped to your theater. Critical shortages will continue to exist in repair pers until late 1946. Confirming recent correspondence on the sub, no more basic or basic specialist will be shipped to PACUSA unless specifically requested.

(In Washington a State Department spokesman expresses surprise at the report and said he felt certain that no unilateral action would be taken by the American members of the commission)...Various quarters predict that Dr Syngman Rhee, longtime campaigner for a Free Korea, would come out of semi-retirement to become Governor of the American Zone. There appear to be 2 major factors behind the American Plan. one is the alleged Russian disposition to prolong the Joint Commission sessions for political reasons. The other is threatened disintegration of United States officer personnel of the present Military Government due to the Army discharge program."

UP dispatch from Seoul today reports "Large numbers of Soviet troops-estimated to be as high as 50,000-have been moved from Manchuria to the Russian occupied zone of Korea, reliable sources said today. Koreans who recently have come to the American Zone said that many thousands of Soviet troops are concentrated between the Soviet zone capital of Pyong Yang and the 38th parallel which divides the Russian and American occupied territories. The refugees reported constant military maneuvers, artillery and light weapons practice and aerial activity was taking place in this area. About 40,000 soldiers were said to be stationed there. It was estimated that the total of Soviet troops in all of North Korea was 106,000."

The assured production capacity level for Japan's machine tool industry should be placed at a balanced type-size aggregate of 10,000 units annually.

"3. Arsenals, Army and Navy

No assured production capacity level should be assigned to the aircraft industry.

"5. Ball and roller bearing industry

"8. Light metals industry

No assured production capacity for Japan's light metals industry should be given.

"9. Thermal electric power industry

The assured production capacity level for Japan's thermal electric power industry should be placed at an aggregate installed public utility capacity of 1.0 million kilowatts.

"10. Sulfuric acid industry

The assured production capacity level for Japan's sulfuric acid industry should be placed at 2.0 million metric tons (62% acid equivalent) annually.

"11. Soda ash, chlorine and caustic soda industry

The assured production capacity level for Japan's soda ash, chlorine and caustic soda industry should be placed at 260,000 metric tons of soda ash, 28 thousand metric tons of chlorine and 100 thousand metric tons of caustic soda annually.

Part I. (1) Now before SWNCC is paper entitled "Assured production capacity levels for Japan" purpose of which is to determine US policy with respect to assured production capacity levels for Japan which US would recommend for adoption by FEC. Attention is invited to fact that "minimized requirements" are presented this paper whereas "maximized requirements" described radio Jan WX 94752. Neither set "requirements" is to be regarded as reflecting US views concerning level industrial capacity to be retained Japan under terms final program not yet defined.

(2) Assumptions upon which assured production capacity levels prepared: estimates Japanese postwar peaceful requirements for production considered in 8 of the 10 industrial categories (arsenals and aircraft industries excluded) are based insofar as possible on requirements for peaceful consumption manifested in the year 1930. In certain cases adjustments are made for population changes and for other factors which may be expected to affect legitimate postwar requirements. In keeping with the basis concept of "irreducible minimum" capacity levels all requirements estimates are weighted downward and are presented only for purposes of recommending assured capacity levels below which ultimate reparations will not cut.

Part II. Conclusions subject paper follow:

"4. It is concluded that:

A. The policy governing assured production capacity levels for Japan as stated in appendix "C" is suitable for adoption by the Far Eastern Commission;

Re CFB 27330 not to CINCAFPAC nor needed and CK 59523. Present output prices for equipment under the Lendlease Act will expire on 30 June 1946. Thereafter Lend Lease transfer of equipment to Chinese Government can legally be made only pursuant to an agreement executed at governmental level prior to 30 June 1946. Such an agreement must be made by State Department with Chinese Government; W 82174 as designed to obtain the information which State Department requires in order to reach this agreement. Since you are unable to furnish this information and agreement negotiated with Chinese Government to complete implementation of the pre-occupation program and of the training equipment program beyond 30 June 1946, will have to refer to the projects only (without identification of equipment required) with provision that total cost shall not exceed 20 million dollars and program shall not extend beyond 2 September. It would appear from your radio that this figure is more than adequate to cover any unforeseen difficulties but in any case inform us as to your views on this assumed figure and date.

There is one OTHER QUOTE UNQUOTE of transfer which would meet the requirements of the Lend Lease Act. Equipment being shipped from Pacific theaters, but not from XI, could be transferred on paper to Chinese Government before 30 June 1946 regardless of geographical location, and physical transfer to Chinese Representatives made after that date. This would mean the Chinese acceptance of goods sight unseen and other possible complications which make such a method appear unfeasible and undesirable. Request your comments.

Possibility of accomplishing necessary transfers through PIC for surpluses is not considered practicable.

Related subject: Gen Marshall accepts your recommendation that no additional equipment be provided for communist units other than that obtained in paragraph 1a of CFBX 25549. This answers CINCAFPAC CK 59523 MF 3 April.

Following is an extract from W 81636 sent to Commanding General United States Forces Africa Middle East Theater Cairo Egypt to illustrate: "It is not necessary that local purchases by United States forces from United Kingdom Forces be paid for in lire. Use of SW RLJKC is satisfactory. However we should not pay United Kingdom Forces for material they have requisitioned from Italians SG secured from Italians by paying lire against which they did not set up sterling or dollars. It is not considered desirable that transactions be forwarded to London for settlement. It is preferred that they be settled locally in like manner to any other item of local procurement." Item C. You are authorized to make payments for all transactions between 2 September 1945 and 31 March 1946 in accordance with item B above subject to the limitation under item A 1 above (as regards specific countries) wherein such payments must have been agreed to by the War Department, and item E below. Para 2. Representatives of the general accounting office have expressed themselves as willing to accept any reasonable evidence presented for payments to be made for supplies acquired during the period 2 September to 31 December 1945 and for a reasonable adjustment period (not later than 31 March 1946) thereafter, each case to be considered on its merits. They expressed themselves, however, as opposed to continuation of improvised practices any longer than necessary, and requested institution of standard procedures without further delay. Except where evidence is submitted that such procedures are impossible, the following are the minimum requirements of the GAO and the War Department for transactions commencing not later than 1 April 1946.

(A). There must be a legal contract between the United States Government and the vendor. Such contracts may stipulate payment to persons other than the vendor, for example the Foreign Government, but in such cases the contract must specifically provide to whom payments are to be made and must contain provisions that payment to the designated payee will be an acquittance from the vendor to the United States Government when payment is so made. A Foreign Government may be a vendor if it signs a contract.

(B). Priced invoices must be submitted by the vendor, properly certified.

(C). Standard form 1034 must be prepared and certified by a designated certifying officer for payment by United States Army Disbursing Officer. The certifying officer will probe this certificate by maintaining as an administrative record the receiving and inspection reports and causing to be made such administrative audits as he deems necessary.

Item A. Following payment instructions governing local procurement are to be used:

Para 1. All payments for goods and services insofar as local cash payments have been agreed to by War Department, will be made in local currency. In this connection Treasury Department will make available for transfer to local Disbursing Officer, foreign currency balances which it may have on hand. Disbursing Officers in countries where excess currency balances are held will be periodically advised of the currencies available for transfer to United States Army Disbursing Officers upon request. These balances will be used in lieu of acquiring locally, additional foreign currency by purchase through issuance of checks on United States Treasury.

Para 2. You should inform War Department if any transactions of setting local procurement obligations since 2 September 1945 against surplus property or similar transactions are being considered locally which would make payment as described in para 1 above unnecessary.

Item B. New Related subject. War Department does not desire to encourage non-standard procurement procedures. Now that hostilities have ceased, all theaters must convert to standard procurement practices without delay. There are certain minimum requirements of law and regulations which must be met. It is desirable to undergo some inconveniences now in converting to standard practices rather than incur the risk of wholesale disallowances by the controller general when vouchers of the Disbursing Officers are processed.

Para 1. Accounting and procurement procedures which were considered adequate for reciprocal aid procurement will not be satisfactory where appropriated funds must now be actually disbursed. This is particularly true from the point of

Reference your W81018 and W83063. Decisions and actions taken under authority of W98613 follow:

A. Three press releases dated 7, 15 and 18 March have announced the military governors intentions regarding the sale, conditions, and payments of certain former Japanese owned farm lands. The lands are to be sold only to farmers who work the land. Payments are to be in kind, in easy installments over a long period. There are to be no middle men or commissions and no resale for a fifteen year period.

B. A draft ordinance on disposition of farm lands is in preparation and will be issued at an early date.

C. Disposition of urban residences and small businesses is under study.

D. No disposition of any of the three types of property has yet been made. USAFIK ownership of above property was established by ordinance 33 vesting Japanese property in military government of Korea. Assertion of United States title threrfore already effected. The word "Sale" has been used in the press releases. In view of the fact that the sale of property will be subject to confirmation by Korean provisional government, the use of the word "Sale" or "Transfer" is considered immaterial.

Washington Post today published a ltr from Yongjeung Kim, President of Korean Affairs Institute, calling upon the Soviet American Commission to grant Korea freedom and withdraw occupation troops. The ltr says... "The Korean problem is not Koreans alone. It became a Soviet American problem when the 2 great allies took on the responsibility of reestablishing an Independent State for Korea. Now they are suffering under their self imposed burden. If they cannot fulfill their responsibility it may become the responsibility of the United Nations ..."

New York Herald Tribune yesterday reported speech by Dr. Helen Kim, President of Ewha Womens Univ of Korea. Dr Kim said an "invisible border" exists between American and Russian Zones in Korea and that no correspondence or communication is allowed between the Zones.

New York Times story today states "Is a drive to eradicate the last traces of a heavily financed Japanese espionage program left behind in Korea by the Japanese, in, it is estimated, 8,000,000 yen was disbursed among Koreans for the purpose of promoting Anti-American and Pro Japanese activities, American authorities are investigating the disposition of 5,000,000 yen still unaccounted for ..."

AP dispatch from Seoul yesterday reported "Stamping out of undesirable police methods in Korea was credited yesterday to American occupation forces by Maj Claude Broom, former director of the Detroit Police Training School..."

Ken Evans said in WMAL news broadcast 6th April "There was bitterness in the words of Gen Hodge ... Hodge lashed out against those responsible for destructive criticism of the US Army. He charged that agitators, Anarchists, those who are guided from abroad, and what he called "Inspired Permites" are not only trying to break down the American /its, but break down American Democracy."

Kizard says Military violating terms of Moscow agreement by not encouraging Democracy and charges U S Army Command "Continues to use, and be used by, a small group of Koreans who are distinguished only for their past enthusiasm for Japanese rule." Article says General Hodge "Consistently ignored those left wing parties which represent the great majority of Koreans."

AP dispatch from Seoul today says "The US Soviet Commission on Korea issued its 4th Communique today, again saying merely that discussions would continue "On subjects previously announced." The Commissions Task is to chart the countrys rehabilitation and arrange for the establishment of stable Gov't. The discussions began in mid March. Complete Liaison between John R Hodge, Commander of American troops in South Korea, and Col Gen I M Chistiakov, Commander of Soviet troops in North Korea, was established with arrival in Seoul of 2 Russian Majors. A 3rd Russian Liaison Officer will arrive next week. American Liaison men already are at the Russian Hqs at Pyengkang. Gen Hodge left yesterday by plane for Tokyo to confer with Gen MacArthur."

Story by Richard Johnston in New York Times today remarks on paucity of news made available by Joint Soviet American Commission. It says "The American Press is insisting that the American and Korean people have a right to know what destiny is being worked out for this country...the official silence is giving rise to all kinds of fantastic rumors."

connected with foreign trade. Operation of the fund does not reflect any foreign currency equivalent and does not require establishment of a rate of exchange for import or export of goods.

Part 4. Reference your radio para C. Strict interpretation would mean elimination of import of other goods essential to Japanese civilian economy, requirements for which are indicated in parts 3 and 6 our radio CA 57156. Elimination of such imports, many of which available from nearby areas, would bring much of civilian economy to a standstill and prevent restoration of peacetime employment. Methods of payment for imports proposed para C your radio insufficient. Exchanges of goods between Japan and nearby areas are essential and would be impeded or stopped by restriction of financing to United States dollars. Third paragraph your radio March WCL 24101 refers to State Department inquiries among other nations in regard to barter or reciprocal trading arrangements to supply necessary imports into Japan in exchange for available Japanese exports. Recommend such inquiries be continued vigorously. (C 59745)

Part 2. Assume para A urad applies only to accumulation of yen balances in payment for post war imports goods and services and with presumed purpose of ultimate conversion to dollars from War Department appropriations or from funds in special account established in accordance urad WX 95166.

Part 3. Since last para urad refers to acquisition of yen only by American and other foreign nationals, presume para A and B urad do not refer to yen balances in Japanese Government Foreign Trade Fund resulting from sale of imported goods turned over to Japanese Government by SCAP. Such balances are not accumulated for conversion to dollars, but are to be used for yen payments to suppliers of goods for export. The Foreign Trade Fund was established by law of 21 December 1945. Info also desired as to action taken for the ret of NEI Guilders held by DOS under auth contained Ourad W 99788 dtd 7 Mar. Also advice as to progress of negotiations for the repmt to the US of \$266,204.16 representing previous overpmt to the NEI Govt for their currency used by US Army. In event Guilders were not ret'd to NEI Govt prior to devaluation what action has been taken to adjust DOS accts for loss resulting from devaluation.

Items of interest on Korea follow: Letter by Dr Syng-man Rhee, representative on the Democratic Council of South Korea, is published in Washington Star today. It appeals to the American Delegates on the Korea Commission and to the American people to support unification of Korea into one country and denounces Communists in Korea. The letter says " Unification of Korea should be the first step to take by tearing down the 38th parallel which divides Korea into two halves, before taking up the formation of a government. Also, no government will last that is not organized by the Koreans themselves... The Koreans are determined not to have Communism forced down their throats at this time... The entire nation is willing to make great sacrifices and fight for a United and Democratic Republic of Korea..."

Richard Johnston in New York Times today writes that the continuing lack of news from the Soviet American Commission is producing rumors in Korean Press. He cites one such rumor to effect Democratic Council has prepared plan for interim government including constitution, abolition of American Soviet dividing line and immediate withdrawal of occupying troops. Johnston says this report is "Vigorously denied by some members of the American Delegation."

New York Times dispatch from Seoul today states "After 3 months of investigation of the assassination, December 30, of Song Chia Woo, 56 year old president of the Conservative Democratic Party, 4 men were arrested last night by Korean Police..."

The following is an extract of the General Council minutes 9 April 1946.

Proposed revision of AR 615-275, "Authorized absence for FM" was approved 29 March. The new revision, which will become effective 1 July 1946, authorizes furlough for FM similar to leave provisions for Officers. Ordinary furloughs will be authorized on the basis of 2½ days per month of active service; may accumulate during any one enlistment period; and will be granted in addition to reenlistment furloughs, except TUGCLOSING the 12 month period subsequent to the beginning of the reenlistment furlough, no ordinary furlough credit will accrue. Unused furlough credits will not be carried over from one enlistment period to another, nor will period of enlistment be extended to grant unused furlough credit.

The War Dept policy recomposition of Army Retiring Boards is to exclude Medical Dept Officers except Medical Corps Officers as prescribed in Sec 1246, revised statutes. Therefore Officers of the Dental, Veterinary, Medical Administration, Sanitary and Pharmacy Corps are not eligible to sit as non-Medical Corps members of the Army Retiring Boards.

The National War College for Army, Navy and State Dept Officers will shortly be located at former Army Navy War College. The college will be the highest level educational institution of the Armed Forces. The first course is 3 Sept 1946 to 21 June 1947.

Publication has been directed of a War Dept Memorandum prescribing the space allowances which will be observed in planning permanent installations, preparation of cost estimates and in the development and execution of final designs pertaining to future construction activities. Space standard prescribed for troops is 72 sq feet per person as compared to the war times standard of 60 sq feet per person.

The results to be expected from measures taken or to be taken cannot be foreseen. In any event Agriculture believes little if any addl wheat other than amounts already in sight will be avail during Apr for export.

B. 100,000 tons of wheat have been procured for export to Japan during Apr. 11 ships by name have been given berthing dates but as yet the several actually placed on berth have not yet been completely loaded. No effort has been spared to get wheat from farm to ships but as of today Agriculture estimates that about 88 to 90 thousand tons will actually depart during Apr.

C. Rpts of surplus food stocks in Pacific Areas while not of magnitude to affect our claims before Combined Food Bd appear to be of sufficient amount to be of real assistance if you call such stocks forward promptly.

D. Secy Anderson has thoroughly considered our requests for your minimum requirements as well as the strong support given those requirements by his own representative on the spot, Col Harrison. He insists that any so-called commitments made in connection with food allocations at the present time must be viewed in the light of actual food stocks on hand during period involved as the facts concerning same become avail.

4. While Dept Agriculture does not state that target of 150,000 during Apr is changed it does adhere to the view that a maximum of 90,000 tons will probably be exported to Japan during Apr.

5. This is by way of being an interim report. Continued efforts will be made to obtain increase of Apr shipts.

In TT 6019 Apr 46 between Secy Agriculture Anderson and Col Harrison his food representative in Tokyo in Item W 13 Anderson stated "If the requirement overall is scaled to 600,000 tons we can see our way fairly well since we have shipped 116,000 tons Jan to Mar plus 17,000 tons of rice have 100,000 firm now for Apr and should be able to ship 150,000 May and June with balance of 600,000 tons in July." Item W 19 "You can tell SCAP we will make every effort to ship about 150,000 tons per month Apr May and June in order to bring Jan to June shipts to 600,000 tons and that I personally think that goal possible."

2. Your minimum food requirements have been urgently pressed before Cabinet Food Committee Secy Agriculture Anderson and the Combined Food Bd by Secy War Patterson and Asst Secy Petersen. The presentation was not limited to technical data but included discussion of the effect the failure of the US Govt to meet your minimum food requirements would have upon our ability to achieve the objectives of Occupation. It is certain that no allocation PXDOKIGOADE during April and if one is made remainder of second quarter it undoubtedly will be at expense of allocations to Japan. If combined Food BD should make such an allocation War Dept is obligated to ship to destination indicated in submitting food reqmts.

4. Following shipts are available at San Francisco and would have no effect on wheat shipts referred to in paragraph 2 above. Request advice soonest on destination.

Items of interest on Korea follow:

New York Times correspondent from Korea reported April 12 first evidence that Korean Political leaders may be planning to petition United Nations for a settlement of the Korean question should the Joint United States Soviet Commission deliberations fail. Source of the story was Seoul press report that at its 2nd days session the National Society for the rapid establishment of Korean Provisional Government under the Joint Chairmanship of Kim Koo and Dr Syngman Rhee, had opened a discussion of sending a mission to the Security Council.

Correspondent said in reporting Hodge return to Korea after meeting with MacArthur "Officials explained that General Hodges visit had as its purpose a discussion of the Korean food situation and matters dealing with the disposition of the United States Troops in Korea, but it is believed that the Joint Commissions meetings took up considerable time in the meetings of Generals Hodge and MacArthur...." Correspondent further said Korean political groups were becoming active again returning to discussions for unification and other topics that have been lying dormant since the United States and Soviet Delegations began their deliberations March 20.

You are authorized to distribute the tasks in the China area as recommended in paragraphs 1 to 6 inclusive of CFBX 27412 of 3 April. Assume provisions of paragraph 4E apply to all U.S. Forces, China. It is noted that there is no mention of arrangements for operation of Chinese manned War Shipping Administration ships presently under Army control. This matter should be resolved and included in your plans. Phased withdrawal Marines will be initiated as soon as practicable in accordance instructions to be issued shortly by Chief of Naval Operations and will be continued as rapidly as General Marshal may consider situation China permits. Future changes which may be desirable may be arranged in the area by recommendation of commanders concerned and put into effect after confirmation by War and Navy Departments.

The directive contained in WX 88636, 14 December 1945 remains in effect except as modified by WX 82100 and the provisions of this message.

1. FEC now formulating its policy governing restitution identifiable looted property.

2. Because general interest evidenced in aggressive action to recover such property to maximum extent, State Dept requests your consideration of directing Japanese Govt immediately to undertake inventory and impounding all looted property in Japan with severe penalties on Jap Nationals for failure to rpt and surrender such assets.

3. Pending determination final FEC policy proposed that action be confined to looted property as defined Feb W 98260. Difficulty of enforcement this proposal recognized but believed that your appropriate implementation might facilitate restitution in some degree and would be welcomed by Allied Powers.

Items approved as necessary for prevention of "such disease and widespread unrest as would endanger the occupying forces" (SWNCC 176/8 para 25 C) will be initially financed by WD funds. This together with the utilization of theater stocks and imports from Japan will constitute immediate program to provide part of urgent needs as stated urad CX 58221. Appropriate public announcement of this program can be made as it is approved.

Approval for additional imports (SWNCC 176/8 para 25 E) is dependent upon determination by State Dept of the level of economy in Korea consistent with the long term objectives of the occupation. Those items of Korean emergency import program which cannot be classified as applicable to the prevention of "disease and unrest" will be submitted to State Dept for consideration. Favorable action on any program to provide Korea's needs beyond that approved under "disease and unrest" is also dependent upon the progress of the US-USSR Joint Commission in establishing a Korean provisional govt since the policy of the US as stated in W 99133 is that such aid will be given on terms and under conditions fully agreed to by such govt.

The procedures suggested urad CX 59028 for disposing of supplies beyond those needed for "disease and unrest" are under consideration and will be covered in a further cable.
