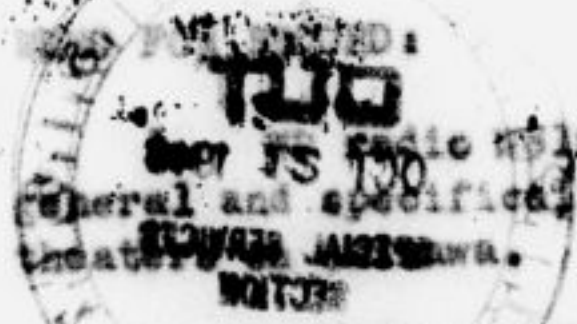

Memo for Record: Part 3, ourad ZX 19849 is as follows: "Category 6 statements. Para 2, part 4, does not authorize changes of category to category 6. This restriction requires an officer desiring to bring his dependents overseas to sign categories requiring longer periods of service than he desires to serve. Since this extension is unsatisfactory to the officer, he may elect immediate separation. Lack of sufficient replacements and existing officer shortage will still require retention of officer in theater regardless of his desire for immediate release. This action will cause dissatisfaction and general lowering of morale. Also since many officers desire to have their periods of extended active duty terminate on the completion of overseas tour, category 6 is the most suitable statement to satisfy this objective. Mandatory limit on overseas tour of 36 months will require many officers to return to the ZI prior to expiration of volunteer period. For the purpose of bringing dependents to the theater, it is recommended that authority be granted to sign category 6 statements to become effective upon arrival of dependents provided such statement increases the length of service for which individual has volunteered. Answer furnished in WCL 49688 is not clearly understood. This requires confirmation of our interpretation.

1. References and Background:

a. Radio C-64385, 22 August 1946 (MacArthur-to-Eisenhower message initiated by G-1) in which CINCPAC submitted a strong request for \$7,225,000 under Project 411, GARIOA (Pay of Civilian Personnel). This money is essential for payment of critically needed personnel.

b. Radio WCL 38123, 23 August 1946, received concurrently with dispatch of our radio reference a, above, announcing allotment of \$2,000,000 for this purpose, leaving a balance of \$5,225,000 still required.

c. Radio W 99177, 1 September 1946 from Washington in reply to radio reference a, above, which gave breakdown of apportionment of GARIOA funds, indicated that no additional funds could be made available, and suggested that adjustment be made within allotted funds, preferably from Project 110 (Grain, Food and Kindred Products).

d. Radio C-63199, 16 September 1946, reply to radio reference c, above, recommending that no adjustment be made affecting Project 110, but suggesting instead that Project 120 (Agricultural Supplies and Fertilizer) be decreased by \$5,095,000 and Project 510 (Educational Activities) be decreased by \$130,000.

e. Radio W 80423, 17 September 1946 from Washington, dispatched prior to receipt in Washington of reference d, above, which advised of the amounts included in additional requirements presented to the Budget Advisory Committee and once more suggested that Project 110 be decreased for procuring the \$5,225,000 we needed.

f. Radio C 65550, 26 September 1946 which reiterated our previous stand against any decrease in Project 110 and re-stated our request that Projects 120 and 510 be approved for adjustment purposes.

2. Present Status and Discussion:

a. The War Department's firm reply to our radio reference 1 d, above, was received in basic radio, W 82102, 3 October 1946. In this message, WDSBU sets forth reasons for inability to decrease Project 120 (Agricultural Supplies and Fertilizer). All of FY 46 and 47 money in this project has been committed for procurement or production of fertilizer. Breakdown, as furnished in radio W 82102, is as follows:

Based upon the above commitments, the War Department urges that the fertilizer project not be re-programmed. Any cutback would involve loss of FY 46 funds which cannot be re-obligated.

b. Originally the reason for selecting Project 120 (Agricultural Supplies and Fertilizer) for adjustment in lieu of Project 110 (Grain, Food, and Kindred Products) as recommended by the War Department was that the apportionment of Project 120 more nearly approaches the dollar requirement for imports than any other GARIOA appropriation and it was not deemed practicable to obtain fertilizer up to budgetary authorizations within the fiscal year. Project 110 (for food) was avoided for adjustment purposes as far as possible in view of SCAP's previous urgent requests for additional food. Any willingness on the theater's part to withdraw money from the food fund would appear as a retraction of prior statements.

c. In view of the War Department's current statement, however, as set forth in radio W 82102, no alternative is apparent at this time other than to approve the recommendation of the War Department to make adjustments from the food project and, at the same time present substantial arguments to indicate the critical food situation in this theater. This action is set forth in the above proposed reply.

d. No objection was taken to the theater's willingness to cut back Project 510 by \$130,000; however, request was made in basic radiogram for specific indication of items wished eliminated from plan presented in Reorientation Branch Program. This breakdown (presented by Civil Information and Education) is set forth in the above proposed reply.

3. It is recommended that the above radio be approved for dispatch.
4. The interests of USAFIK are involved and have been considered.
5. This closes action on G-4 Journal 27702.

Part II. US Provost Court, SEOUL, found Lee Sang Ho, Chief Editor of the Korea Central Times (CHOONG AND SINMOON) and KWANG, Tai Byuk, Chief of the Administrative Section, guilty of violation of Proclamation #2, in that they printed inflammatory editorials and statements by leftist groups attacking Military Government, the police, and the US Army. A decision of this court which may be of far reaching significance is quoted:

"The Court is of the opinion that the quoting of an organization or Party, as authority for a statement published in an effort to avoid responsibility for such statement, is not a defense if the matter published is false and calculated to injure the reputation of any person or the government."

This decision should have a serious effect on the tendency of Korean papers to avoid responsibility by ascribing statements to a party or an official.

Part I. Strike reports as of 071700/I October: In Seoul area situation remains unchanged. Trains run normal and on schedule throughout South Korea, with exception of Taegu area. Traffic through this point still somewhat limited. Southbound trains from Seoul are scheduled to pass through the affected area during daylight. Trains still under Military Guard, although, they have, as yet, made the trip without incident.

In the Southern most provinces, the use of troops has greatly facilitated work of police. Minor disturbances are still occurring, and seem to be on increase.

In Chinju (35 degrees 12 minutes North Lat-128 degrees 20 Minutes East Lng) at 07115/I October, a mob was dispersed by tactical troops and police. Two rioters killed and several wounded.

In Masan (35 degrees 12 minutes North Lat-128 degrees 34 minutes East Lng) at 061000/I October, rpt 500 people destroyed Police Inspectors house. Forty tactical troops and police dispersed mob. Four rioters killed, and 1 Police Officer seriously injured. At 071000/I Oct, mobre-gathered at police station. One hundred troops are being sent from Chinhae as reinforcements.

In Kuryong-PO RI (36 degrees 30 minutes North Lat-129 degrees 34 minutes East Lng) during afternoon 6 October mob of 2,000 Leftists attacked town with dynamite and grenades, damaging many buildings. One hundred and fifty Rightists

Three Leftists killed and three wounded. Mob threatened to return. One armored car and 14 soldiers have been sent to establish a road block there.

In Sansan (36 degrees 14 minutes North Lat-128 degrees 18 minutes East Long) at 051632/I October, Military convoy carrying rice stoned on leaving the town. Guard fired into the mob and 2 or 3 of the rioters fell. Convoy then proceeded unmolested.

In Kumi (36 degrees 02 minutes North Lat-128 degrees 25 minutes East Long) on 5 October, Communist mob overran police station seized 27 rifles, 2 pistols, and 1,200 rounds of ammunition. Five rifles returned on demand of US patrol leader.

Uneasiness has also been reported in Ulsan, and a mob reported in Changnyong (35 degrees 32 minutes North Lat-128 degrees 30 minutes East Long). In general situation in the South is unchanged. US Troops have, as yet, had no difficulty in controlling the mobs encountered, and no casualties among troops reported.

Part II. In a plenary session held 4 October, with representatives of Rightists and Leftists parties, there was passed and signed the working agreement of the coalition committee. Also was passed and signed agreement concerning the interim legislature.

The legislature is to consist of 90 members and will be a "first step" legislature, to be replaced in "a short time" by representatives of all Korea, elected through direct universal suffrage.

4. Entire question of commercial airlines operation in Japan is dependent on CinC's answer to Wash Rad # 81893 1 October 46 which is a government level radio stating terms and plans under which commercial airlines might operate in Japan as outlined by CAB with presidential approval of these terms and plans as indispensable to future structure of international airways system.

5. G-4 (Col Keating) and PACUSA (A-3) (Lt Col Johnson) state that presence of high level policy planners such as Conway and Robertson in Japan is o.k. but inasmuch as no commercial airways exist in Japan, routine inspectors such as Jakobi, Kerr, Schmid and White are unnecessary at this time. They also question necessity for four if and when they eventually are allowed to come.

Korea. Part II. Report received from Hodge 6 October 1946. "Strike" situation in Korea is more serious than at first indicated. The Communists have taken and are taking full advantage of all the cumulative fancied wrongs, gripes and restlessness at delay of independence on the part of the Koreans, including the peculiar Korean psychology of anti everything and its hatred for any control.

The principal activation basic gripes that are fanned and propagandized cleverly and credibly by the Communists are as follows:

A. Shortage of food, which is based on fact. Although we have been able to maintain generally a minimum ration to prevent starvation by using to fullest extent all available grains including imports, we have had no rice for rationing for many weeks. Food and rice are synonymous in Korea, therefore they are willing and anxious to believe the Communist stories of people starving to death. These are augmented by stories that Americans have shipped rice to US and substituted POW-food (corn); that the Americans shipped millions of sacks of rice to Japan to help feed the Japanese so that General MacArthur could control them; then the Americans are starving the Koreans so as to insure their subjugation and colonization by US; that the Americans are hoarding and protecting rice for the profiteers.

B. Economic conditions are bad. Propaganda is that Americans are destroying Korean economy and are obligating the future Korean Government for

all civilian used goods shipped into Korea in order to get it so far in debt that the US will have to take over all Korean assets.

C. Delay of independence which is one cause of extreme restlessness. Propaganda is that the Americans have purposely delayed Korean independence to get full control; that the proposed coalition and legislature controls to prolong the power of the American Military Government; plus any other lie that makes a good story.

D. Dislike of control. Koreans have always hated police, either their own or Japs, since they represent control. Propaganda is that the police protect pro-Japs, profiteers and moneyed class, discriminating against laborers and poor.

E. Opposition to grain collection program. This is greatest point of contact by Communists with farmers, and subject of great efforts. All Koreans would like a free market with low prices. Communists are well aware of the importance of grain controls in keeping away unrest and starvation and are putting up tremendous and total effort on stopping all collections of rice. They are aided in this by the natural desire of the farmer and the landlord to do their own free trading to obtain better prices.

The tight food situation and the fact that rice is in short supply makes the Koreans highly susceptible to any lie or slander put out from Communist sources.

Events starting in Taegu several days ago and now spreading in the province of Kyonsong-Pukto and Mamdo are indicative of the temper of the Korean people when they get excited. Reports indicate general vicious attacks on police and police stations, with fifty or more police known dead, terrorism

against Korean Military Government employees and families of all who have helped the American effort including police, and sabotage against utilities and communications. American troops had to take over all law enforcement under martial law. There is every evidence that these disorders were carefully staged and led by experts. Terrorism is still spreading in both Kyongsong provinces.

Although railways are partially in operation, restlessness and strikes in all areas are increasing, including several strikes in schools, as well as industries. All strikes are headed by Communist agitators and in addition to the demands for increased food, pay, etc, demands generally include purely political demands such as turning over the Government to the "Peoples Committees", disbanding the police and release of all Communist and terrorists who have been jailed.

Reliable information from several sources indicates that the immediate aim of the Communists at the present time is to block coalition between right and left and to stop the establishment of a legislative body. Its aim is also to create a state of confusion preparatory to a wide spread terrorism program on October 10 in celebration of the Russian Revolution, which is to be followed by a general uprising in November, date still undetermined and depending upon success of earlier efforts. Lyuh, Woo Hoong, the enigma of Korean politics, visited North Korea last week and in personal conferences confirms the foregoing and all other information we get to the effect that the disorders are entirely the work of the radical Pak Heun Yung Communists here with the assistance of some ten thousand North Korean ex-Eighth Route Army thugs who have infiltrated into South Korea since last spring. Lyuh further tells me that these Communist "Friends" in North Korea do not approve

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of this action and favor a coalition in South Korea as a step toward independence. He indicated that he has taken a definite stand now and will help US in the coalition and legislative body and do all he can either to discredit or to gain leadership of the radicals to get terrorism stopped. He says fifteen August was originally set as the beginning of trouble, but Communist propaganda had not yet taken hold and the food situation was better then. He stated further that the radical Communists are in a desperate all out fight to make heroes out of themselves by doing a great act for their country by driving out the American Forces. Further discussion indicated that back of this scheme is the idea that the Communists will drive out Americans so the Russians can establish a "Democratic" Government and withdraw and let Korea be independent. Lyuh's sayings never reveal all his motives fully where he stands, but his statements against interest of the Communists and the Russians are worthy of consideration.

Strike report as of 051200 Oct. Only slight change in the Seoul area. 40 trains were run from Seoul on 30 Sept which is almost normal. 42 trains are scheduled for 4 Oct.

Trains operated on schedule and without incident in Seoul area. Three trains have moved South from Taejon towards Pusan and 1 train moved North and by 051030 was reported to have passed troubled area in vicinity of Taegu without incident. These trains were all manned and guarded by US personnel.

Situation at the Seoul Electric Co remains unchanged. 7 newspapers were published in Seoul 4 Oct. Demonstration involving approximately 2000 took place at capitol building Seoul at 031200. 35 ringleaders were removed by police and CIC, and group dispersed at 1400. Apparent basis of demonstration was demand for more food; however handbills stated, "Down with American imperialism." In Inchon stockyard workers struck morning 4 Oct. This strike incited by Chawn Pyawng (leftist labor organization) and inflammatory handbills were issued by that party.

Situation Pusan and other areas of South Korea remained practically unchanged with the exception of Kyongsang-Pukto. Trains ran locally on schedule. Strikes of heavy industrial company and tram-car operators continue with no disturbances.

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The disturbance in Kyongsang-Pukto is apparently an outgrowth of the railroad strike, rather than an integral part thereof. The rioters have directed their attacks at police and Korean Govt Officials. Demands for rice have become

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secondary to the desire to "Kill and get even with the police." In Taegu it is only fear, reportedly, that has kept the railroad employees away from work. There has not as yet, been any demonstration against US troops. Report received from Taegu reveals the first reported opposition to US troops. At 030030 an engineer patrol checking railroad for sabotage met resistance north of Waegwan and returned to Taegu rather than create an incident. This same report discloses presence three women in one mob.

Taegu area remained the "hot spot". At 021700 martial law was established in Taegu and 4 M 7 mounts and 280 infantrymen took over the city. 40 members of the 200 man Korean Constabulary Unit, known to be trustworthy, are being used to augment US troops. 1900 to 0600 curfew imposed and "No assembly" order issued. Streets of Taegu fairly well cleared by 022230. Rioters moved out into the nearby villages and continued attacks on police. Summary of police casualties in Taegu reports 53 killed and 20 seriously injured. Casualties among rioters are as yet unknown. Prior to establishment martial law, 46 homes of Korean Govt and police officials were raided by rioters.

In Waegwan on night 2-3 Oct mob attacked police station, killed the Chief of Police, and disarmed the policemen. Rioters confiscated 50 rifles and one case of dynamite. The 60 policemen stationed there have disappeared. No details of disappearance available. Rioters fled to the hills on the approach of US troops who have taken over. Rioters destroyed 2 highway bridges north of Waegwan. 1st bridge protected by combat engineer patrol not molested.

In Yongchon on morning of 3 Oct, a mob reported 10,000 overran the police station and disarmed and kidnapped the 40 policemen there. The Korean county head was killed and police station burned. Police reinforcements from Taegu and

Sunu were repulsed by the mob and some police captured. During the night 2-3 Oct, rioters raided homes of police and Korean Govt officials, destroying furnishings and beating the occupants.

In Tongyong 031200, mob of 2,000 stormed police station and disarmed the police, taking 120 rifles and 380 rounds ammunition. Approximately 13 police, including the chief, were injured. 50 police from Pusan who attempted to enter Tongyong were repulsed by the mob. Two Batteries of Field Artillery ordered into Tongyong arrived at 040115. Detachment immediately took over town and made 15 arrests. Forty rifles and an undisclosed number of policemen were recovered from rioters. Approximately 37 policemen remain missing.

Less violent disturbances have been reported from other towns. At Say-ong at 022200, police refused to use their weapons against mob which had taken over village. In Andong at 022000, approximately 300 railroad workers, armed with clubs, held a meeting without violence. In Kyongju at 031100, 4 policemen were beaten by a mob. Mobs are also reported in Kunwi and Yongsang. Telephone and teletype lines to points south of Kumchong were cut at 032230, manner unknown, and were still out at 051200.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

1. WD radio 45976, 20 Sept 46 refers to report of Chairman Sheridan of Congressional Committee which recently visited Korea and contains resume of action taken by AES, WD to furnish PX supplies to Korea. This radio also requests specific recommendations of the CG, USAFIK as to what AES, WD can further do to alleviate PX supply conditions in Korea.

2. WD radio WCL 46898, 26 Sept 46 is follow up on WD radio WCL 45976 and request expected date of reply. Reply of CG, USAFIK is contained in radio TKAES 207, 26 Sept 46 to Washington.

3. WD radio WCL 43862, 16 Sept 46 refers to PX supply status in Japan and Korea as reported to Assistant Secretary of War, and is substantially the same as WD radio WCL 45976 to General Hodge. CINCAFPAC reply to WCL 43862 setting forth views of this headquarters concerning action required to alleviate PX supply conditions in Japan and Korea was dispatched in radio ZX 20078, 2 Oct 56. Info copy of this radio was dispatched to General Hodge.

4. As CINCAFPAC reply to WD radio WCL 43862 stated that visit of an officer from AES, WD is not deemed necessary, but CG, USAFIK reply to WD radio WCL 45976 requested such visit, this matter was discussed with Col. Bell, DC/S XXIV Corps by Col. Morris, SSO, GHQ. Colonel Bell stated that XXIV Corps required a member of the AES, WD Audit Team to make a preliminary survey of Exchange records in order that preparations can be made to facilitate audit. Col. Morris informed Col. Bell that Mr. Constable, supervisor of AES Audit Team now in Japan, would be made available earliest for this purpose. Col. Bell stated that, in this event, visit by an officer from AES, WD is not required at this time.

5. Instant radio is to bring CINCAFPAC reply mentioned above to attention of the WD in connection with their radio to General Hodge and his reply thereto.

1. a. WD radio WCL 43862, 16 Sept 46 refers to the matter of lack of certain types and quality merchandise for sale in PX's in Korea and Japan as reported to the Assistant Secretary of War on his recent visit to Japan and furnishes resume of action taken by Army Exchange Service to fulfill PX requisitions.

b. Efforts of this office to trace the origin of, and to determine details of report to the Assistant Secretary of War have been unsuccessful. No one connected with the Exchange had contact with Mr. Peterson during his recent visit to Japan, and as it is understood that Mr. Peterson did not visit Korea, it is assumed that such report was informal.

2. A brief survey of 8th Army AES requisitions for Japan and Korea indicates that requisitions are being placed in sufficient time to allow AES, WD the normal required period of 60 days to procure and deliver merchandise to the POE for shipment. An additional 60 days is allowed for transmittal of theater requisitions to AES, New York and over-water shipping from West Coast.

3. Figures quoted in WD radio WCL 43862 indicate that AES, WD is receiving requisitions for adequate PX requirements for Japan and Korea expeditiously and is placing orders with U.S. vendors promptly, but timely deliveries against purchase orders are not being made to the POE for shipment overseas. This condition indicates an inadequate follow up procedure in the Zone of Interior to insure actual shipment of merchandise to the theater. The need of a firm procurement processing time in the Zone of Interior and the need of assurance of actual shipment within this time is essential for proper planning by the Exchanges. Instant radio specifically requests such assurance and provides an analysis of the figures quoted in WD radio WCL 43862 to point out the extreme inadequacy of shipments actually made from the POE in the past three months. Purchase orders placed by AES, WD for 8th Army Exchange for five months ended 31 Aug 46 represent a per capita cost of sales of approximately \$20.00 per month. Purchase orders

placed by AES, WD for XXIV Corps for three months ended 31 Aug 46 represent a per capita cost of sales of approximately \$16.00. However, merchandise actually shipped to Japan and Korea against these orders totals 8,634 tons or less than one shipload.

4. It is not believed that a survey of Exchange operations in Korea by two AES, WD auditors, presently on TDY with 8th Army, would alleviate supply problems to any extent. Special Services Officer, GHQ, recently visited Korea for this purpose and made several recommendations to General Hodge which are included in a report to the DC/S 16 Aug 46, subject: "Report of Visit to XXIV Corps by Chief, Special Services Section, GHQ, AFPAC". XXIV Corps has already initiated action upon these recommendations, one of which was to send the Corps Exchange Officer to the U.S. to personally present AES problems in Korea. It is felt, however, that the XXIV Corps Exchange Officer (Colonel O'Reilly) should not extend his visit any longer than he deems necessary. As to problems of AES in Japan, it is felt that they were fully presented to AES, WD by the 8th Army Exchange Officer (Colonel Case) upon his recent visit to the United States in June last.

5. As requisitions for adequate PX supplies to meet the demand in Japan and Korea have been and are being regularly placed, it is felt that the proposed visit to the theater of a "trouble shooter" from AES, WD is not necessary but that the "trouble shooting" is required in the Z/I to expedite shipments of merchandise.

6. Specific instances of delay in procurement by AES, WD will be incorporated in a letter to the Chief, Special Services Division, WD as they are too detailed to be included in instant radio.

7. Personnel problems were recognized by 8th Army Exchange in the early days of the occupation and a requisition for 42 civilians was submitted to AES, WD in March 46. First arrivals against this requisition were on 23 August 46. A second requisition for 65 civilians was placed in June 46. To date, only 24 civilians have arrived in the theater. Statement in WD radio WCL 43862 that 70 civilians have departed the U.S. cannot be reconciled and clarification is requested in instant radio. XXIV Corps requirements of civilians is 95 and that headquarters has been requested to expedite placement of requisition.

8. Instant radio suggests as an alternative to the suggestions in WD radio WCL 43862, that the AES, WD establish an overseas section in the San Francisco office to solely represent Exchanges in the Pacific, to be responsible for complete follow up on requisitions and procurement action thereon, and to insure prompt shipment of PX merchandise from the POE. Instant radio also suggests that such overseas section be adequately staffed and that the staff of the AES, New York office be increased if necessary to insure prompt shipments to the theater, at additional expense to the Exchanges if so required.

9. Action has been taken to relay WD radio WCL 43862 to 8th Army and XXIV Corps.

(C-65717) Special Report Korea. Indications point to the beginning of a general strike throughout southern Korea directed and lead by Communists, in conformity with their known policy "to make the disorders appear spontaneous with the people and keep the party name out of it."

Added to the railroad strike, printers walked out, demanding free press, reopening of three Leftist newspapers, and release from arrest of personnel of these papers. Engineers and clerks of the telephone system and postal employees are on strike in Seoul. Some maintenance and repair men of the seoul electric company are on sit-down strike. However the company is still in operation and a meeting of representatives of the Seoul Electric Co. and the Military Government has been scheduled for 1 October. Textile workers in five plants and workers in the iron works at Taegu are also on strike.

Pusan reports railroad employees there are willing to return to work but are prevented by the strike in the remainder of South Korea.

There has been no proved instance of sabotage. Possible sabotage is blamed for destruction by fire 24 September of an inspectors' and dispatcher building in the railroad yards at Iri. On 29 September it was reported that civil police were despatched to railroad docks in Seoul to prevent strikers from breaking up equipment.

Numerous reports indicate Right-wing employees are becoming convinced that they have been made tools of the Left-wingers.
