M/R: 1. Wash rad W-92340, 19 FEB 47, states that Gilbert desires enter Japan for consultation with Military authorities on matters international civil aviation.

2. Previous rqst fr JCS was suspended by rqst further info as to Gilbert's activities in view of fact that 2 CAA representatives had already been in Japan, and it was understood that no further action was to be taken by CAA until definite request was submitted in current Wash rad, it is noted that Gilbert's activities relate only to international civil aviation affairs, whereas the office being set up by CAA in Japan is to handle purely American civil airlines flying thru Japan.

3. FEAF (Lt Col Johnson) strongly urges that Gilbert be cleared since many questions concerning international civil aviation in the Pacific are dependent upon results of conference which Gilbert is now attending in Australia.

Part I.

On basis of information available regarding March and April food import arrivals and April and May programs as outlined in urad W 92211, Japan will actually receive following imported food in fiscal year 47: grain/flour 1,073; canned foods and miscellaneous 45; total 1,118. Requirements are 1,556 as stated in ourad C 68180, leaving deficit of 438 for this fiscal year.

Part II.

The deficit of 438 will result in foodstocks being reduced below level necessary to maintain staple food ration of 1246 calories per day (reourad CX 69825 from Food Mission). Theater food deficits for the critical July - October period are: July 291 (of which 150 are provided for by shipment program outlined urad W 91990), August 422, September 339, October 171.

Part III.

Realized here that it is unlikely that tonnages of the magnitude necessary to meet theater deficits can be shipped during months July ~~and~~ October. Therefore, imperative that

shipments prior to July be maximized so that necessary carry-over into period of greatest shortage, July - October, approach more adequate level. In reply to urad W 92211, we have stated that corn is entirely acceptable for Japan and are hopeful that additional shipments will be made as a result of this action. Labor inefficiency, general unrest and malnutrition will be inevitable result of a second food crisis. In addition to unfavorable effects upon the objectives of the occupation the hindrance to economic rehabilitation will result in greater burden on American taxpayer.

David Conde was formerly on duty with CI&E as an employee of OIC in the motion picture division. CI&E did not desire Mr. Conde's re-employment as a war dept civilian due to differences of opinion on policy to be followed and methods by which existing policies were to be implemented.

Washington radio WCL-29193 dated 14 Nov 46 stated that Reuters was asking acceptance of Conde as their correspondent here. G-2 security report on Conde stated that Conde was accused of conducting a campaign to foster production control by unions on strike. Further that he consistently gave his support to Japanese leftists in the moving picture industry.

Our radio C-68388 stated Conde was not acceptable to this theatre as a correspondent. Present radio queries WDSFR as to whether Reuter's News Agency has ever been advised of the above fact.

(C-50219) On V-J Day Radio Moscow was broadcasting to Japan in Japanese on a regular schedule. These broadcasts ceased on 9 September 1946 but were resumed on 13 December 1946. Present broadcasts are four in Japanese and one in English to Japan daily. Broadcasts are monitored by Foreign Broadcast Information Bureau in Hawaii and Tokyo. From V-J Day to April 1946 the programs were relatively innocuous, since then more vigorous news and comment has developed.

Broadcasting by Russia to Japan is intended for Japanese public consumption. Under JCS Directive 1380/15 SCAP is required to censor all communications to the Japanese people. However, censorship of these programs cannot be effected as the programs originate and are broadcast in a foreign country. Much of the content of the programs are in violation of SCAP Memo AG 000.77 (22 September 45) dated 22 September 1945, subject: Radio Code for Japan, which states "Broadcasts must adhere strictly to the truth, nothing shall be broadcast which might directly or indirectly disturb public tranquility, there shall be no false or destructive criticism of the Allied Powers, there shall be no destructive criticism of the Allied Forces of Occupation, and nothing which might invite mistrust or resentment of these troops. Broadcasts must be factual and completely devoid of editorial opinion. Broadcasts shall

not be colored to conform to any propaganda line. No news cast shall be distorted by the omission of pertinent facts or details." At present except for armed force radio only the Japan Broadcasting Corporation engages in public broadcasting in Japan. All Japan Broadcasting Corporation programs are censored prior to broadcast.

Within the last few months these Russian broadcasts have contained frequent attacks on United States and British policy in the Far East. Frequently these broadcasts are used to introduce communistic propaganda and to make vicious attacks on the Japanese Government and by inference on the Occupation policy of Japan. The impact of this unrestricted license to feed misinformation to the Japanese populace is serious.

Consideration was given to using the only countermeasures available here, namely radio jamming, but this was not attempted in view of international agreements and consideration of the technical problems involved. Instructions are requested earliest.

MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD: Moscow shortwave radio broadcasts, in Japanese and English, beamed at Japan are increasingly critical of U.S. and British policy in the Far East, attack the Occupation policy of Japan, and are used to introduce communistic propaganda to Japan. These programs, originating outside of Japan, cannot be censored although much of their content is in violation of the Radio Code for Japan (SCAP Memo 000.77) (22 Sept 45) (dated 22 Sept 45) and should be censored under JCS Directive 1380/15. Instant radio presents this problem to the State Department and requests instructions.
