Inasmuch as the number of Officers assigned to the AAF World-Wide has been reduced to equal approximately the strength authorized by the War Department as of 30 Jun 1946, it will no longer be mandatory to recommend for relief from active duty overage-in-grade Officers. However, commanders are authorized to continue to recommend those overage-in-grade Officers for relief from active duty who become non-essential to the organization to which they are assigned.

For budgetary planning purposes only, your estimates will be consistent with and based upon information as follows in 2 parts:

Part 1: Missions and responsibilities during fiscal year 1948 will be the logical projection of those in effect at the time of rendition of your estimate with a military personnel strength during the period 1st July 1947 through 31st December 1948 totaling 271,000, to be composed of Air Forces, 74,000 and other forces 197,000.

Part 2: Assumptions are that:

- (A). The average tour of foreign service both in occupation forces and other overseas garrisons, will be two (2) years and that 50 percent of the average strength overseas during fiscal year 1948 will be returned.
- (B). Maximum conservation of personnel, both

- (C). Special field exercises will be conducted as deemed necessary to the accomplishment of the theater mission.
- (D). In overseas areas exclusive of areas of occupation, elements and activities of Regular Army shall be housed in permanent type construction by 30th June 1952.
- (E). Construction projects will be justified by individual items. Local resources will be exploited to the maximum extent practicable to provide necessary facilities. Construction fund estimates for projects required to be accomplished in fiscal year 1948 will be limited to known requirements. Estimate of cost for each project to be contracted for during fiscal year 1948, will be adequate to finance the project to completion.
- (F). In areas of occupation, reparations, and local resources will be exploited to the maximum extent practicable to provide necessary facilities. Construction requiring appropriated funds will be of an emergency and temporary nature designed to meet the needs of occupying forces during the period of occupation only. Projects will be submitted and justified by individual items.

Estimate of cost for each project will be adequate to finance the project to completion.

- (G). (1) Permanent type building, utilities and other facilities located on installations or portions thereof required for the postwar military establishment, will be brought progressively to normal peacetime standards for economical maintenance, comparable to good commercial, municipal or state practices for similar facilities in the same locality.
- (2) Buildings, utilities and other facilities of other than permanent types, located on installations or portions thereof required by the War Department for the postwar military establishment will likewise be brought to normal peacetime standards, consistent with the type, the anticipated need for, and the economical life expectancy of the individual facility.
- (3) The maintenance of these installations will be brought up to normal peacetime standards by 30th June 1949.

Items 2 A through 2 D and items 5 D and 5 E our June WX 91918 represents potential availability phosphate rock sufficient to meet your combined requirement of 800,000 tons.

1. B. Re operations on Anguar. Appreciate lighterage problem and weather conditions represent limiting factors, however fulfillment your requirements of 800,000 tons dependent upon Anguar operation providing 276,000 tons during period ending 30 June 47.

1. C. Re item 5 D, WX 91918. 374,000 tons phosphate rock from US sources firm. Dates of availability being determined. Will advise.

You are authorized to continue to provide on a reimbursable basis to representatives and employees of United States Government Civilian Agencies in the Philippines such appropriate privileges facilities, services, and supplies as, in your opinion, are necessary to the accomplishment of their missions and the protection of their health and are not available from the local economy, until such time as these agencies can become self sufficient.

In this connection, these agencies should be informed of a target date after which the War Department can no longer furnish such services. The limit of 31 December 1946 is suggested as the date beyond which such services cannot be furnished. However, it is the desire of the War Department to assist these agencies in setting up their own facilities at the earliest practicable date in order that the War Department may be relieved of these burdens.

The exercise of this authority should be coordinated with the U S Ambassador to the Republic of the Philippines and is to be restricted by your capabilities from existing facilities without detriment to services being rendered to troops and without the retention of Military personnel to provide services. Acknowledgement together with comments and recommendations is requested.

The following received from the State, War, and Navy Departments, is furnished in reply to your 051873 dtd 10 June 1946: "agree segregation of German individuals should accompany seizure of property but suggest property seizure and segregation repatriation centers desirable in advance actual embarkation if likelihood appreciable delay.

It is considered that complete restrictive measures should be enforced on Germans as soon as possible. Request confirmation that all Germans referred to in Washington 86033 dtd 27 Apr 1946 except those in category single "C Single" are subject forcible repatriation."

In this connection, regulation no. 1 to Berlin Law no. 5, recently approved, subjects property of "objectionable Germans" to the vesting decree, thus eliminating category "B".

2. The provisions of paragraphs 2 and 7 WARX 80434 remain in effect.
3. The use of officer linguists classified as scarce category military occupational specialists for other than the specifically intended Table of Organization and non Table of Organization is not authorized.
4. Specific information is desired at the earliest practicable date stating current assignment and reason therefor of all Officer linguists so classified not occupying appropriate Table of Organization or non Table of Organization Assignment as full time linguists.
5. Received 3 July 1946 from Senator Thomas C Hart alleges over 50 scarce category linguistic officers now in AFPAC are not currently assigned duties commensurate with their critical military occupational specialty. Since the War Department has already been called upon by several members of Congress to justify the holding on linguists in service for 42 months, it is imperative that linguists retained under the provisions of WCL 37500 dated 15 January 1946 and WARX 80434 dated 13 March 1946 be assigned full time language duties. It is strongly recommended that the theater troop basis be readjusted to provide a sufficient total of Table of Organization and Non Table of Organization positions either in Allied translator and interpreter Section or on language teams for all linguists required by theater. Continued reports of misuse of linguists will force War Department to lower discharge criteris for linguists.

Foreign currency exchange control is subject.

1. Exacting measures for foreign currency exchange control in Japan, Korea and the Ryukus Areas of the Pacific Theater have proved inadequate. Accordingly a more effective control system has been established in certain areas as described below.

2. For US authorized personnel in Japan, Korea, and Ryukus Islands, a currency conversion program will begin in near future, beginning date hereafter referred to as "C" day. During the conversion period all Bank of Japan, Bank of Chosen, and type "B" supplemental military Yen currency notes (all subsequently referred to as indigenous Yen currency notes) deemed by AFPAC authorities as having been acquired only from official sources, will be exchanged on a 1 for 1 basis for type "A" supplemental mil Yen currency notes (type "A" supplemental mil Yen currency notes are not presently authorized for exchange nor in circulation in any area except in an inconsequential amt). After 2400 on "C" day, no indigenous Yen currency notes will be reconverted into US dollars or US dollar instruments.

3. Type "A" supplemental mil Yen currency notes so issued in AFPAC will be the only medium of exchange authorized within the mil enclave, will be freely exchanged for authorized personnel returning from the effected areas, but will not be legal tender in the local economy. Personnel desiring to make purchases in the local economy may obtain indigenous Yen currency notes for that purpose at any Army Finance Office, but subject

Disbursing officers may accept such indigenous Yen currency notes without regard to time limitation under same circumstances as set forth in para 4 C, subparagraphs (1), (2), and (3), sec II, Fin Bul no 97, 45, before it was amended, as explained in para 5 C, sec III Fin Bul no 32, 46, for the exchange of old issue French Franc notes.

6. Those portions of Fin Bul no 97 and Fin Bul no 32 pertaining to Japan which are in conflict with the foregoing instructions are hereby amended accordingly. This directive is classified Secret. After "C" day it will be downgraded to Unclassified and paraphrased contents released for general distribution.

7. Attention is again invited to the future use of Type "A" supplemental mil Yen currency notes as compared to the type "B" supplemental mil Yen currency notes used in the past. Although these 2 types of currencies closely resemble each other, except for the "A" and "B" printed thereon respectively, only type "A" can be used within the mil enclave in Japan, Korea and Ryukyus Islands or be reconverted into US dollars or US dollar instruments after "C" day. Purchases of new type "A" yen after 10 July 46 by mil pers or in cases where other than mil pers are auth use of Army facilities as exceptions to "Non-support" policy, may be made with dollars this remitted.

B. Remittances of type for relief or religious orgns or those which normally will not be spent in Army facilities will be made thru trust fund mentioned above. Subsidiary accts under 218905 are 218905.1 for Japan, 218905.2 for Korea. Corresponding subsidiary appropriation accts are 21.8905.00. for Japan and 21.8905.002 for Korea. Dollars will accumulate in trust fund accts to finance essential imports and for other APD purposes and yen outpayment will be made to remittees by Bank of Japan as Fiscal Agent for SCAP and upon payment will charge SP SCAP Acct for remittances from US. Outpayment in type "A" supplemental yen after 10 July 46 is in no instance possible in remittances of this type.

Reurad C 61935 consideration of recommendations in your C 61935 of 12 June, together with world wide strategic requirements results in following Post Occupation Deployment Plan for Ground Forces: 1 Division-Philippines. 1 RCT-Ryukyus. 1 Division-Hawaii. For a total of 2 and 1/3 Divisions.

It is considered that limited number of Divisions available to Post Occupation Army make it inadvisable to commit to outer perimeter all such units allotted to Pacific.

Your Air Force plan of deployment is under study. 3 day Fighter Groups requested by you in your C 61935 cannot be furnished, however, due to requirements of strategic reserve.

It is emphasized that deployment herein delineated is basis for permanent construction programs which must be kept to minimum. Need for strengthening primary bases in Pacific with additional units is recognized, however, and should such units become available they will be allocated after consideration of your recommendations.

Revision of WD letter "War Department plan for Peacetime Overseas Bases" dated 14 February 1946 now in preparation will specify detailed deployment of Ground and Air Units.

Comments relate both to items particularly interesting themselves and to those departing from their ideas for sound Japanese economy. Summary follows for your info.

Imports:

- A. Cotton. Other nations than India and US should be permitted to sup cotton to Japan.
- B. Salt. British sups are available, including British West Indies as well as don. Japans requirements are judged much more than 200,000 tons.
- C. Petroleum products. British sources would like to sup share of Japanese requirements.
- D. Nicotine sulphate and derris root. Japanese requirements as given seem much too large, as these are in extremely short sup.
- E. Wool. To omit this seems incorrect; though Japan should not be allowed to consume completed textiles, she should export them to earn foreign exchange.
- F. Pig iron. Japan has more than enough, plus large amounts of scrap iron and steel. Without importing pig iron, Japan might need more coking coal.
- G. Manganese ore. Japans need for it at all is questioned.

A. Textile machinery. Should not be exported, as textiles are one of Japan's best means of earning foreign exchange. Even if present spinning industry cannot absorb loom capacity, it should in time.

B. Hardwood and plywood. UK needs sups, and inquires if they will be available.

C. Fine flax machine tow. UK would like to obtain this commodity. (your comments are requested wool, pig iron, manganese, and textile machinery)

For your info State Dept has replied to British, making points summarized below:

1. Both import and export programs submitted by SCAP some months ago were somewhat tentative estimates.

2. Trade relations between Japan and countries other than US have admittedly not developed speedily. Among other things to blame for this are failure to solve problems of establishing governmental trade representation in Tokyo, and lack of working arrangement concerning methods of settlement and currency conversion.

3. This govt agrees that cotton-producing countries other than US which did and can now sup Japan should be taken into account, and Far Eastern Commission is working on principles to govern sources of Japanese imports. As for salt and other commodities neither in short world sup nor in great surplus, it is expected that SCAP's purchases will be guided largely by considerations of price and means of payment. SCAP has already made inquiries in British Africa.

4. This govt agrees that Japanese imports of nicotine sulphate and derris root should not deprive United Nations, and amount stated in import program will be screened with this in mind.

Subject is policy on repatriation from Ryukyus of persons claiming US and other foreign citizenship.

During March 1946 the entire population of the Ryukyus was screened by Military Government personnel for citizenship information. Citizenship claims were as follows: US 206 Philippine Islands 386 Peru 247 others 193.

Under consideration by the SWNCC is the following policy pertaining to repatriation from Ryukyus of persons claiming US and other foreign citizenship.

- A. Persons with bona fide documentary proof of US citizenship who desire repatriation at their own expense should be repatriated to the US or its possessions; persons claiming US citizenship and not possessing necessary documentary evidence should be investigated thoroughly by the State Dept.
- B. The Military Government authorities should furnish the State Dept with all relevant information concerning persons claiming foreign citizenship (other than US and Japanese) in order that the State Dept may inform the interested govts of the number and present status of persons in the Ryukyus claiming citizenship and request these govts to indicate what course of action they intend to pursue. Cost of repatriation of such persons should be borne by the individuals or by their respective govts.
- C. Any expense incurred by the US Military Govt in connection with repatriation should be charged to occupation costs.

The following, received from the State, War, and Navy Departments, is in reply to C 60299 of 25 April 1946 and C 61485 of 29 May 46:

"This radio in 2 parts:

Part 1: (a) Ourad WX 86033 of 27 April answers parts 1 and 2 of urad C 60299. Part 1 may be retroactive as you deem necessary.

(b) Reurad C 61485, agree your interpretation that business expenses of German concerns in Japan may be paid, provided expenses are for maintenance and preservation, whether business concern is in category A or B.

(c) Following is regulation nbr 1 effective 5 May 1946 under Berlin law nbr 5:

"In accordance with article IV of control council law nbr 5, there shall be added to the category of persons covered by article III also those persons who were German citizens on or after 1 September 1939 and who at any time have lived abroad (continuously or intermittently) and who aided or attempted to aid Germany or her allies during the war or who assisted Germany or her allies in the preparation for war, but shall not apply to any citizen of any country annexed or claimed to have been annexed by Germany since 31 December 1937."

Interpretation here is to subject to law nbr 5 individuals previously included in category B (ourad WX 86033). The foregoing has been repeated to the Office of Military Govt for Germany (U.S.) for information, together with parts 1 and 2 of urad C 60299.

- (7) To maintain an operating relationship with mil or diplomatic liaison missions which their govts have established in Japan, in order to coordinate actbn and take care of routine matters such as communications. These functions are those proposed by SCAP except for addition of item number 3

WD has again advised FLC that in its opinion disposals contemplated under paras 4 (A) and (B) of 91167 will not relieve theater commander of custodial responsibility contemplated under para (C) thereof. Proposed Chinese agreement, reourad WX 92583 dtd 26 June, has caused issue, but has not been considered grounds by WD for modifying position in view of early date at which surpluses will be declared, number of personnel required and cost to US of custody therefor, time involved in conclusion of Chinese negotiations and developments and implementation of Chinese plans for acquisition of Pacific surpluses, the logistical necessity for concentration by Chinese or Philippine Area surpluses, as well as nature and condition of subj surpluses located in Japan.

WD has recommended to FLC that credit terms be sought authorizing the sale of such surpluses for the Japanese Govt and its agencies as the theater commander, in consultation with FLC representatives, deems will not have a sale value outside of Japan exceeding the cost of the US of storing, guarding, accounting for, packaging and handling, etc. Items not contemplated such credit would constitute a first charge against exports as under category (A) supplies referred to above.

Your comments on para 1 and 2, as well as estimates as to number and category of personnel (Military and Civilian) and custodial costs involved on a monthly basis, would prove helpful.

A. Predicted date of final action of Governmental agreement.

B. Source of shipping for initial move and subsequent maintenance of Chinese Forces.

2. SCAP states that original move could be made with minor dislocation of current shipping but such shipping is manned by Japanese, which should be understood and accepted by Chinese.

3. Re 1 A. Estimate that within 1 week JCS will complete action on revised detailed agreement made by SCAP and Chinese on 4 June. SCAP will probably be required to confirm certain amendments with Chinese after which Governmental agreement will be concluded in Washington. Total time to complete agreement estimated to be 2 to 3 weeks.

4. Re 1 B and 1 C. It is contemplated that initial move and short and long term maintenance should be carried out to maximum extent practicable utilizing shipping under control of the Chinese. Agreement specifies that Chinese will be self supporting to maximum extent practicable.
