Re W 91741 Oct. In compliance your desire for opinion of developments in terms of effect on Civ Svc Reform Japan submit comments as follows.

1. Considering broad scope and fundamental character of legislation under review involving coordination with agencies inexperienced in public personnel administration and variously motivated in situation influenced by govts having many variables in public personnel policy and practice, with some confusion generated by releases of info not always compatible with American or occupation interest, nbr of issues finally contended is gratifyingly small.

2. While record contains statements relative to rights of govt employees which are subj to sharp question in light of American policy and practice, Part 2 B involves no immediate practical damage to program provided secrecy of decision is respected. If not respected, it may adversely affect occupation prestige and form basis for continued agitation in an already inflamed area of administration.

3. As you will recognize Part 2 A presents problems. It is difficult to evaluate additional administrative burden it will impose on Japanese Bureaucratic Reform where its implications are somewhat different from those involved in its application elsewhere in normal, mature and stable employment situation. Believe, operationally, we can reduce its effect to that of an inconvenience rather than an unsurmountable obstacle to cleaning up situation. Am chiefly concerned with its effect on occupation prestige and effectiveness. Successful passage and administration of National Public Svc Law as well as effectiveness of occupation generally require that Japanese public and officials assume unqualified support of occupation policies at least on part of American Govt. Accordingly, there has been attempt in work of many here to recognize that occupation should not be put in position of modifying position, especially where such modification would

be externally evident. Part 2 A presents only point on which change in text of law is presently indicated. Handling requires finesse based on fact that revision of law is not involved but only minor correction of copy to conform to Gen MacArthur's original idea. Again secrecy is important. Dept of Labor has high enthusiasm for this point and if it is made publicly to appear an enforced reversal of previous decisions damage is done. In detail it is believed requirements of cable will be satisfied by corrections of text of law substantially as fol:

A. In Article 98, delete from third sentence words "from among persons in svc," and insert in lieu thereof "of their own choice." After sentence 3 add sentence "employees may join associations of their own choosing."

B. In Article 101, delete from last sentence words "on an occasional or intermittent basis requiring only a minor portion of an employee's time."

C. Reword Article 11 of new supplementary provisions along fol lines: "Any employee association or union actually existing on the effective date of provision of Article 16 (old Article 17) of the supplementary provisions of the National Public Svc Law, and having as its main constituents personnel of the govt svc, may continue its existence and personnel of the govt svc may from time to time create employee association. All such associations shall provide democratic process for the election of officers and the conduct of business and otherwise conform in organization, purpose and procedure to the provisions of this law. Such organizations shall register with the authority under procedures of that authority."

4. In gen, thanks to much diligent effort particularly on part of Army Staff and cooperation from State, conclusions reached on legislation, while subj to much discussion in principle, are probably as favorable as can be secured under conditions here existing barring drastic action or protracted delays. Consider prompt settlement of issues important both from standpoint of administration and creation of situation in which any further developments external to American Govt will find American position clarified and definitely established.

Proposed accounting and other procedures and reporting methods advanced in re rad except as hereinafter modified appear to be adequate for handling revolving fund. This reasoning is based upon our understanding that:

(A) PL 820 cotton must be commingled with cotton recd from other programs.

(B) Interest of fund in proceeds from sales must be determined by apportionment basis.

(C) Japanese accounting systems used by consignees of PL 820 cotton cannot be accurately integrated with American procedures.

A 2. If you will designate banks to be used we shall undertake in advance to agree with them on mechanics for ltrs of commitment. Suggest that when you arrange establishment special accts under PL 820 you keep in mind 2d sentence of Para 6 A of DA-3 of TT 1130. DA power of withdrawal from US bank account should expedite handling of interim interest pmts mentioned Para F Below.

C 1 B. How is interest to be recovered? Should not total cost values mentioned in receipt be supplemented by such amt of interest as may be determined by Mil govt? Same interest problem should be provided for in Paras 2 B and 2 D 1.

F. Repayment of notes will be accomplished by your deposit with US Army Finance Off Tokyo on SF 1044 as collection to 21 X 6372. Finance Officer and SCAP separately will advise Ch of Finance attn FINA by rads giving all data of such collection.

Rads will be verified to each and FOUSA Wash DC will be instructed to effect disbursement charging 21 X 6372 in favor of Treasurer of US.

Each such repayment will be expedited here to minimize interest charges. Treasury desires all principal repayment transactions in even \$50,000 amts. Since actual date of repayment can only be determined here the portion of repayment to be used for principal and/or interest will be included in instructions of COFFIN to FOUSA Wash DC. Suggest that when you make principal payments this way, \$50,000 multiples, you compute interest to estimated date of pmt to Treasury, allowing five days until actual time required can be determined from operating experience, and add to your pmt this interest on amt of principal paid to cover through estimated pmt date. Treasury will not accept interim partial pmts unless accrued interest on amt of principal pmt is made simultaneously. If your interest pmt to Finance Officer too high excess will be held in 21 X 6372 for later use. If your interest pmt too low, deficiency will be made up here from whatever amt may be avail in 21 X 6372 or in your special PL 820 bank accts in US subj to withdrawal by special representative. Advice of principal and interest breakdown will then be rendered to SCAP. Under this procedure COFFIN will maintain records to reflect:

- (A) Total amts borrowed.
- (B) Total repayments to borrowings (by note).
- (C) Total interest charges repaid (by note).

Part I. Considerations presented in urads, together with all developments on this matter including particularly commitments you have made personally and thru Sebald, have been carefully reviewed here as has the detailed explanation given by Mr Hoover of intended opn of Natl Pers Auth provided for by Draft Bill. Info provided by Mr Hoover, especially as to detailed plans of opn for Natl Pers Auth had not been evident fr Draft Bill sent your Z 24312 fr other info avail here.

We understand that operation of the auth will include broad protection of employment rights of all categories of Govt workers. Thus, according to Mr Hoover's explanation of operating regs of auth, regular civil servants will be given full opportunity to air their grievances before Bureau of Equity or Compensation of Natl Pers Auth; these civil workers may appeal to these Bureaus individually or collectively, may have witnesses subpoenaed by govt, may introduce testimony and may have pub hearings upon rqst. In add, our pos on this matter in FEC has been improved by statements made by French, Netherlands and Philippine representatives at meeting 14 Oct as reported to Sebald.

Part II. Basic principle re rights of labor referred to in W 90494 and application of these rights to categories of govt workers given emphasis in that cable, are regarded as ordinarily applicable in democratic countries and as applicable in Japan unless SF considerations indicate otherwise. There is no objection, however, to Natl Pers Auth having auth to adopt regs to prevent abuses of these rights.

In accordance with this policy, Art 98 of Natl Pub Sv Law and Art 11 of New Supplementary Provs, as given in your Z 24312, particularly when read with Art 101, should be worded so as to remove fr law itself any modification of these 2 rights. It is desired that these rights should be clearly recognized in law.

B. Re extension of limited collective bargaining rights to communication workers, we recognize situation described your C 64695 but with understanding that results of present program will be closely observed with view to providing such rights to these workers when political and economic conditions warrant.

Part III. With respect to Pars 5, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14 of WAR 90494, we have discussed these points with Mr Hoover. As result of these discussions our understanding of points raised is as fols (comments fol on each of above paras);

Par 5. Basic provisions of law make it applicable only to employees of National Govt. When Govt corporations are set up employees of these corporations will cease to be govt employees. Until that time they are govt employees and law does apply to them, unless amended specifically to exclude them (see Par 13 below).

Par 10. It is clear that law applies only to employees of National Govt and not to prefectural or local govt employees. However, teachers in national institutions and in Ministry of Education will come under its provisions.

Par 11. Last subpar of Art 1, as transmitted in urad Z 24312, is apparently in error. It should have read as fols: "Insofar as they are inconsistent or in conflict with prior laws or implementation thereunder, the provisions of this law shall control," Omitting last 10 words.

Par 10. Mr Hoover states that it appears, as some agencies here have contended, that unless other penal offenses are involved, dismissal or loss of employment rights would be sufficient punishment for violations of this type. There are other factors involved which are not evident here, request statement of offenses considered appropriate for add penal punishment.

As you were advised in ourad Oct, negotiations for retention of the YFP-1 for sv in Korea during the post-transfer period are being carried on with State, SCA and Navy Dept. "According to the reports of the US press agencies from Japan, a secret military conference with General MacArthur was held in Tokyo during the period of Oct 12-14. At this conference, according to the Associated Press report of Oct 15, there was discussed the question of increasing American Occupation Forces in Japan and that of preparing measures against a surprise attack on Japan, although it is known by everyone that nobody threatens Japan. The same report of the above mentioned agency states that the US Mil key officers have expressed great satisfaction with the fact that the former Japanese Naval Base in Yokosuka is being converted into a modern Naval Base, capable of serving large Naval forces, which is in contradiction to the Cairo and the Potsdam declarations as well as to the decisions of the Far Eastern Commission on the same subject.

"Drawing attention of the Far Eastern Commission members to the above mentioned reports and referring to the Far Eastern Commission 'Basic Post Surrender Policy for Japan' of June 19, 1947, Part 3-1-Disarmament and Demilitarization, the Soviet Delegation considers it necessary that the US representative on the Far Eastern Commission inform the Commission on the substance of this question."

Above statement later released to press by Soviet Embassy. In view considerable press interest aroused, Department of State then issued following reply:

If and when there is an official reqst fr 5 Western European Nations for US participation in a North Atlantic Pact, our output should stress European initiative in this pact. In meantime, we should not go beyond communique released on 26th, and avoid speculation as to extent and form of any US pact. Wait for official US response. American editorial comment may be useful to indicate gen sympathetic interest here. Avoid linking the pact with European Recovery Plan and continue to emphasize non-military nature of latter.

Secondly. ERP.

Reports on possible US, British disagreements on ERP should be kept to a minimum and should be juxtaposed by items such as announcement of \$310,000,000 ECA loan to Britain.

Thirdly. US Occupation Forces food purchases fr Spain.

Spain point out that Spain, like other European nations, will merely participate in competitive bidding.

Fourthly. Anti Soviet propoganda.

In our gen effort to expose and attack Soviet Communist maneuverings all over world, we should guard against attacking Soviet actions and proposals which to an impartial audience are basically sound. Thus there appears little merit in attacking 15 Yr Plan which has obvious appeal. It might be more useful to present American Editorial comment sympathetic to plan. In separate context we may refer to long range economic planning in US which takes place without loss of personal liberties or large scale regimentation that accompanies such plans in Soviet Union.

Fifthly. Deviations among Soviet economists.

Using as a peg Mikheev article in Bulletin of Academy of Sciences of USSR, (Nbr 4, 1948) output should point to "Deviations" and "Wrong thinking" in economic theories constantly being suppressed by Soviet Union and as evidence of deviationism even in high party circles in Soviet Union itself.

Sixthly. Kolkhoz.

In our continuing effort to expose Soviet intentions of collectivizing agriculture, we should pick up recent statement by Bulgarian Minister of Agriculture, calling for "Socialization of Village Economy" by creation of "Labor Cooperative Farms." Point out that "Labor Cooperative Farms" is merely another mask for what everyone knows is directed at formation of Kolkhoz.

Seventhly. Polish Food Crisis.

Arrest of Polish Food Minister Lechowiz and other high ranking food officials should be branded as an attempt to find scapegoats for food shortages especially meat and sugar which have resulted in long queues of house wives.

Eighthly. Soviet Satellite Dissensions.

As part of our campaign of underlining Soviet satellite dissensions, ISB output should play such items as Yugoslav note to Albania on Yugoslav "citizens" being detained there, and Yugoslav criticism of Romanian treatment of Yugoslav minorities.

Ninthly. Korean Revolt.

All areas should note evidence of North Korean and Soviet implication in Korean revolt (such as printed Northern Korean flags) as described in official State Dept release of Oct 26.

Tenthly. US Tro Withdrawals fr Korea.

Do not use reports of Chinese resolution to be presented to UN Gen Assembl - calling for retention of US trps in Korea. Fol previous guidance to effect that US trp withdrawal will be in accordance with UN's decision.

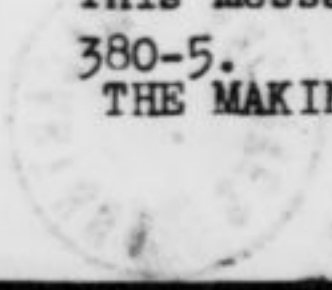

Secretary Royall in receipt ltr from Basil Walters Chairman American Society Newspaper Editors Committee on Freedom of Info asking for complete report on reasons behind alleged actions American officers in handling press during current Korean uprising.

Allegations made by Keyes Beech in Chicago Daily News articles of 22 Oct datelined Seoul. Summarized, article charges US Army and State Department have prevented correspondents from finding "this war" by barring them from trouble zone. That South Korean Government censorship has kept Korean press from printing anything but government handouts. Gen Herren quoted as telling newsmen "We don't want any correspondents going down there writing scare stories. We have got 4 correspondents stationed here but they are under control."

Gen Herren alleged to have told correspondents that they could get all the info they needed from Army handouts. Ambassador Muccio alleged to have said he did not want correspondents contributing to the "Soviet propaganda barrage."

Gen Coulter alleged to have said that he could not offer correspondents help in reaching the area because such action would constitute interference with the affairs of the Korean Republic. On this allegation Kim Gong Sung quoted as stating "That is just an excuse" and further pointing out that an Army plane was only easy means of reaching the revolt area.

Beech states that President Syngman Rhee agreed to help correspondents to reach area by train after Gen Coulter suggested that it was purely a Korean matter. Beech concluded by stating that revolt had then been under way 3 days but little reliable info reaching Seoul with Korean and American reports varying widely. Request immediate advice which will enable Secretary Royall to make reply.

Prospect early termination Berlin deadlock ended by Soviet veto in Security Council. Action revives speculation establishment by Soviets of Eastern Germany as separate state. Korea possible model. First steps creating tyrannical Communist controlled govt and powerful ruthless police force already taken in Soviet Zone Germany. Typical Communist constitution ready for adoption. Govt established under it would claim jurisdiction all Germany. Moscow could then recognize German Communist Govt following Korean precedent.

French coal strike marked by violent clashes between govt forces and Communist strikers in south during past week. Occupation of northern mines by troops as measure for protection mines relatively uneventful. Situation has necessitated transfer 4,500 troops and 3,000 gendarmeries from French Zone Germany and mobilization 30,000 to 40,000 reservists. Govt support by French public increases as Communist leaders express gratification over damage done by strike to ERP. Showdown nears as strike enters fourth week and miners funds approach exhaustion. All out armed violence as last resort of Communists believed unlikely.

Soviet Military activity normal past week except slow withdrawal Korea continues. Report of strengthened AA defenses Soviet Zone doubted in absence confirmatory evidence.

Recent shift some Yugoslav forces to Hungarian and Rumanian borders may reflect Yugoslav uneasiness. Units include crack 1st Yugoslav Proletarian Div noted for loyalty to Tito.

Current release Class 1926 reduces Bulgarian Army by 35,000 to estimated 57,000 including frontier troops. Peace treaty permits 55,000. Induction Class 1928 expected late Nov.

In Poland the Communists are purging govt army and parties of undesirables. Communist and Socialist Parties scheduled for merger Nov.

Greek Army stalled Vitsi Area. Continuance stalemate into 1949 without conspicuous successes natl army elsewhere would seriously threaten stability of Greek Govt. War weariness of Greek people and present slowdown of operations seem to have contributed to lower army morale.

Acceptance UN cease fire proposal by Arabs and then Jews on 23 Oct after Israel breached truce by launching assault in Negeb Southern Palestine was followed by Jewish attacks on Syrians and Lebanese in Galilee Northern Palestine. Arabs repulsed latter attacks and maintained position on high terrain dominating routes to nearby Jewish settlements. Jewish strategy apparently designed to eliminate Arab threats north and south preliminary to attempt complete control Jerusalem. Should accomplishment this objective by negotiation fail repetition recent Jewish attack and truce tactics expected culminating in surprise attack on Arab forces in and around Jerusalem. Continued discord among Arab states precludes possibility unified Arab action as measure to prevent piecemeal defeat by Jews.

Defeatism spreads among supporters China Natl Govt. Natl intentions Manchuria unclear. However recent recapture port of Yingkow approx 100 miles south of Mukden lends support to recent rumors that evacuation Manchuria contemplated. Communists isolate natl forces Chihhsi Hulutac Area along rail corridor. Communist forces not used Chihhsien operation in position to move either against Mukden Area or south along the rail corridor. In Central China Communist forces occupied Chenghsien and Kaifeng following natl withdrawal to Hsuehou area.

Force of South Korea outburst appears spending itself as loyal constabulary and police recapture towns seized by insurgents. Rebels retreat to hills raises possibility protracted guerrilla warfare. Uprising not believed ordered by Soviets but local Communists in accord with customary tactics threw support to outbreak of lawless violence precipitated by mutiny among small contingent constabulary. Incident characterized by shocking savagery of insurrectionaries. Expeditionousness of initial rebel moves and quick appearance of North Korean flags and propaganda suggest premature utilization of plans for Communist revolt at later date.

Reurad C 62860. Proposed Banking Reform Program is subj. Fol are tentative gen comments and questions Army, State, Fed Res and Treasury re proposed Japanese Banking Reform Program outlined urad and memo dtd 28 May 48 from ESS/FI to ESS/C.

1. Gen agreement here with your objective of establishing new and more independent monetary auth possessing broad powers. Such auth is essential to eff overall monetary and credit controls in stable Japanese economy. Particular type of orgn is considered matter primarily of concern to Jap govt in consultation with SCAP staff as tech advisers.

2. Principal concern here is that success of such basic monetary and central banking reform would be jeopardized if introduced in present inflationary period before other fundamental measures are taken to stabilize Japanese economy. Danger reform would become discredited by being associated with conditions for which it was not responsible. View here is establishment new monetary auth should be integral part coordinated stabilization program and should be introduced only after programs success is reasonably assured. Traditional type monetary and credit controls cannot be eff until appropriate economic environment has been established.

3. In any case, question whether Nov 15 deadline could possibly be met in view of importance this reform.

What consideration has been given selective control instruments already in effective use in other countries, such as portfolio ceilings or regs of terms of particular types of loans or amts of security against such loans?

b. Re Memo grant re monetary auths role maintaining internatl value of yen. No mention of exchange control, problem of management of gold and foreign exchange reserves, relation these reserves to prospective demands upon them (should there be statutory reserve ratio and, if so, of what sort?), and gen procedure for determining exchange rate policy.

c. Under normal conditions would limits be placed on Central Bank purchases govt bonds or direct advances to govt? Has possible procedure for raising these limits in periods of emergency been considered?

d. Doubt whether appropriate to concentrate in proposed board of banking and finance broad auth over widely different institutions and opr. While recognizing effect of opr of such institutions as insurance companies, securities dealers and exchanges, and govt credit agencies upon monetary, credit, and banking problems, it appears much of usual reg and supervision of these institutions would require pers and procedures little related to the functions of a board which is mainly organized as Central Banking Board. In this connection, what powers would board have over such institutions and would it exercise those powers through subsidiary agencies? Would there be control over insurance company investment policy beyond soundness of investments? Would maj powers over govt credit agencies inject political considerations and possibly give rise to conflicts with these agencies?

e. Doubt whether proposals as presented offer workable div of auth between banking board and Board of Central Bank. Would be danger of over-lapping responsibilities and frictions. Actual need of proposed board of banking and finance and its possible composition, functions and powers still under study here. Would like your further views.

f. Question of cabinet membership of Chairman Banking Board is under study. In view strong emphasis your memo on advisability making banking board non-political, seems inconsistent for chairman to hold political post in cabinet responsible to diet and to be responsible for actions of board not

g. As to provision for reorganized RFB and other govt credit orgs, would appreciate add info. Would RFB continue as principal lending agency outside normal commercial banking system? Would Central Bank be able to control RFB lending opr by controlling its purchases RFB debentures? Considerations of monetary policy would require some such control RFB opr.

5. In view of foregoing would suggest that as internal program you explore possibility of expanding auth of present Bank of Japan to enable it to contribute more effectively credit control and related elements stabilization program. Such auth might include control over commercial bank reserve reqmts, perhaps auth to examine banking institutions, and possibly other functions listed your memo. While defects present credit control mechanism recognized here, it is considered important that when thoroughgoing reform is introduced, conditions strongly favor success.

6. Comments Pars 2 and 3 above do not necessarily apply to reform of other banking legislation. Re memo indicates much could be done immediately to improve reg of pvt banking institutions to insure their sound development on competitive basis even though monetary and Central banking reform were delayed. Detailed proposals in Pars 5 through 13 your memo still under study. More specific comments will fol soonest.

1. US election;

No matter what the outcome of presidential election,  
output should continue to be based on groundwork prepared  
in past, ie, continues bi-partisan character of US foreign  
policy. Effect of elections on composition of Congress may  
be cited to point out, that while conduct of foreign affairs  
is responsibility of executive dept of govt, basic contin-  
uity of policies of democratic govt are reflected, for example,  
in overlapping terms of Congress members. And in last anal-  
ysis, public opinion which has not changed on foreign issues

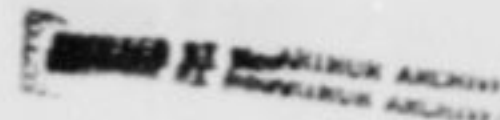

2. Berlin crisis:

Soviet rejection of smaller powers proposals should be used for full scale campaign, raising question whether Soviet Govt is basically unwilling to cooperate in a peaceful solution of Berlin crisis. Point out that Soviets are thereby rejecting, and placing their own judgement above, judgement of 6 nations not involved in dispute whose independent and objective thinking and desire for a peaceful solution is reflected in proposals.

Expose Soviet intention to hold on to blockade, at expense of Berlin population, and without concern for protraction and further aggravation of international tension, apparently in order to blackmail western world into concessions of an unknown character and extent. Reemphasize reasonableness of smaller powers proposals which would have amounted to western powers meeting what would appear to be foremost Soviet demands; i.e., convoking of CFM and introduction of Soviet currency, 4 power controlled in Berlin, subsequent to lifting of blockade.

Stress that most immediate reason for inflexibility of Soviet attitude in UN is to be found in fundamental weakness of their current position in Berlin: i.e., manifest impossibility of winning Berlin population's support for their objective of driving western powers from city. Recognizing that their influence is now confined to eastern sector, while western sectors are beginning to develop free democratic institutions, including an orderly police unhindered by Soviet sabotage, Soviets are clinging to blockade in hope of extorting some concessions which will make possible further inroads into western Berlin.

Highlight developments since Jun 23 (for instance, fact that Soviet blockade was originally intended to starve Berlin population into submission to Soviet rule), in order to make these points forcefully. Also refer to Soviet sponsored SED dodging of elections, and present wave of "self criticism" and purges within SED to illustrate present weakness of Soviet policy in terms of German support avoid giving impression that Vishinsky answer has definitely blocked further moves in UN.

3. Korean situation:

A. North Korean troop withdrawals: Avoid treating Soviet announcement of troop withdrawals from North Korea as an accomplished fact. Follow line taken by Lovett to effect

that US has no info that Soviet forces have begun to leave or actually have left North Korea.

B. Output should continue to stress US role of non-intervention in revolt indicated by Gen Coulter.

C. Lie on North Korean representation at UN: Wait for official announcement from Paris before reporting alleged Trygve Lie reply for Foreign Minister of North Korean Govt that latter's request for North Korean representation at current US session would be referred to UN Political Subcommittee.

4. Hoffman interviews.

Give good play to Hoffman interviews in Paris on 21st and in Berlin on 24th, noting in former that: European Recovery Plan is concerned solely with problems of European recovery and will not become involved in European rearmament; in latter: "Complete recovery of Western Europe can be expected by 1952;" and (German media only) Western German is one of most important factors in this optimism.

5. Discontent in Soviet areas.

All areas should note report of International Committee for Study of European Questions which found that "entire political system set up by Soviet Union in Eastern Europe since 1944 is imperiled by popular discontent" reflected in widespread Communist purges.

6. Japanese prisoners of war.

All areas should play MacArthur's offer to provide Soviets with American ice breakers for speeding return to Japan of about 470,000 prisoners of war still held by Soviets. Use this opportunity to cite again Soviet failure to return Japanese prisoners of war at promised rate.

7. Takata visit.

Korean media should stay away from visit to US of Japanese journalist Ichitano Takata to cover US elections.

1. AEC informs that copies of their Sep 47 catalogues and price list of radioisotopes for international distribution (re above) has been fwded to Economic and Scientific Section your hq. Atomic Energy Commission further informs that they have recd several informal inquiries on shpmt of radioactive isotopes to Japan.

2. AEC policy on shpmt of radioisotopes to occupied areas has not been formalized since these areas were not considered at time of preparation reference catalogue and original policy formulation. AEC statement re use of radioisotopes makes possible inclusion Japan in foreign distribution. Pertinent portions AEC statement follow:

"Mr Lillienthal in a ltr addressed to the Secy of State on Aug 27, 47, made the following statement 'the commission is of the opinion that the type of radioisotopes involved, in the quantities and under the conditions prescribed, will not contribute to atomic energy research in other countries except to the extent that radioisotopes are tools which can contribute to any nation's gen scientific research program.' In gen, therefore, the Atomic Energy Commission considers the radioactive isotopes available under the foreign distribution program as research. tools which are not directly related to atomic research or development."

In view of this tech definition, State Dept and Army of opinion distribution in Japan of isotopes listed in catalogue is not in conflict provisions FEC Documents 024/8, dtd 7 Feb 47.

Semi-Weekly Report Nbr 97.

Firstly. Korean revolt.

A. Reports of revolt in south of Republic of Korea should be treated in context with soviet announcement of troop withdrawals from North Korea. We should point out the following "coincidences":

1. Tass on 17th reports "rebellion" in southern part of Republic of Korea even before the outbreak of major disturbances, at Yosu, and Tass report of disturbance at Taegu is not confirmed by Republic of Korea.

2. Tass-reported "rebellion" coincides with first "celebrations" for soviet troops departing from North Korea, and official soviet announcements of withdrawals comes im-

mediately before major disturbance gets under way in Rep of Korea.

All of this tends to support well known conclusion that Soviet action in withdrawing troops is simply a ruse to camouflage Soviet intentions to obtain complete control, and that even while this "withdrawal" is under way, Soviets are fomenting revolt and are continuing to strengthen their position.

B. German and Austrian media should stress Soviet strategy in Korea to expose motives of troop withdrawal offers made by Soviets for other areas, and use of organized indigenous forces in furthering expansion of Soviet sphere. However, while underscoring parallel where it exists, we should beware of glossing over existing differences especially concerning conditions in Republic of Korea and Western Germany and the chances of fomenting Communist-led revolts in these areas. Await official statements of US position of Republic of Korea developments and avoid speculation in this respect. Use US comment indicating that we will not be deceived by any Soviet suggestions for withdrawal of occupation forces from Germany. Keep showing basic difference between occupation of liberated Korea and occupation of ex-enemy territory.

Note: Output in all areas should use the term "Republic of Korea" rather than "South Korea" to differentiate the Rhee Govt quite clearly from the puppet govt in North Korea.

Secondly. Korea slave labor.

Watch for and use well authenticated reports that Red Army authorities in North-Korea have deported more than 50,000 Korean Christians and non-Communists for forced slave labor in Sakhalin, Manchuria and Siberia.

Thirdly. Berlin dispute before UN.

Jessup-Cadogan statements of 19th provide basis for effective reaffirmation of western position if we use them for reemphasizing main points, rather than following the delegates into all the details under discussion. Stress especially:

Soviet blockade measures dating back to Jan and Mar this year which are being intensified even while matter is before UN are part of a plan to apply pressure upon western powers in order to cause them to abandon Berlin, rather than a defense against measures taken by the western powers in their own zones. While this attempt has been unsuccessful, with the

powers continuing to stay in Berlin, the fact such pressure is being applied constitutes threat to peace. This view was held by western powers from the beginning, when they were taking initiative for direct negotiations with Soviet Govt in accordance with Article 33 of the Charter. Having failed to obtain removal of pressure through direct approach, they have reported existence of threat to peace to UN, for appropriate action. As both delegates stated, the western powers are ready not only to resume direct negotiations with the Soviet Govt on any aspect of the German question at any time, but will also take up discussions on the basis of the Aug 30th Directive to the Military Governors, ie, at the point preceding the complete reversal of established 4-Power Agreement on the part of the Soviet Government (as described again by Jessup), provided the Soviet Government will first abandon the blockade of Berlin.

Note that the US and British delegates were speaking for the 3 powers, presenting their consolidated case in team fashion. In discussing painstaking and comprehensive manner in which western powers reply to questions of other Council members, stress Jessup's statement that treatment before UN is the alternative open to western powers short of "meekly submitting" to Soviet pressure or the use of armed force.

Fourthly. Atomic energy.

Use US editorial and other comment to show that US is willing to exhaust every possible avenue of approach to settle this important problem.

Fifthly. Benelux.

Give good play to new Benelux Long Term Economic Plan submitted to Organization for European Economic Cooperation on 16th, without unduly stressing US European Recovery Programs role in this plan.

Sixthly. Soviet collectivization.

In line with previous guidances, continue to utilize suitable pegs, particularly the Cominform bulletin of Oct 15th

for showing intensified Soviet drive towards further socialization in satellite nations. ISB output to eastern European areas should emphasize Soviet plans for "Kolkhoz" (collective farms), which according to Soviet's own statements must absorb the present Kulaks.

Seventhly. Truman speech and Johnston statement.

As part of our efforts not to become victims of a "war psychology", we should use parts of Truman MIAOP speech on 18th, particularly: US "utterly rejects" war as a solution to world dispute.

US policy "is not now and never has been directed against the Soviet Union." Also note Eric Johnston's statement on 19th that there would be no war "in the foreseeable future" although "political tension" would continue. Mention, in this connection, his agreement with the Russians for showing American films in Russia.

Solution problem appears remote. Moscow evidently firmly committed tactics exploitation Berlin geographic isolation for furtherance Soviet strategic objectives Germany. Soviet tactics here as elsewhere flexibly adapted to changing situation.

Security Council scheduled consider Palestine today as Israeli-Egyptian forces clash in serious violation truce and reject UN mediators cease fire overtures. Israeli forces using air and armor attacked Egyptian positions Negeb with ostensible objective relief isolated Jewish settlements. Israeli advance to vicinity Gaza, seat Palestine Arab Government and main Egyptian base Palestine, jeopardizes Egyptian position and facilitates Jewish occupation northern Negeb. Israeli move may have elimination Egyptian Army as initial objective in campaign for conquest all Palestine. Political discord among Arab leaders conducive disunity and uncoordinated direction various Arab National Armies.

French Troops and Police clashed violently with coal strikers as government forces moved into mines to save from destruction threatened by communist labor abandonment of pumps and safety devices. Queuille Government fairly successful in settling strikes outside coal industry and apparently determined to deal firmly with latter.

Normal Soviet Maneuver Activity continues Germany, Austria. No significant changes in Soviet order battle.

Presence rpted in Berlin of Von Seydlitz and other key figures in Communist free Germany movement of Germans captured at Stalingrad. Arrival supposedly associated with sweeping expansion and strengthening German Police in Soviet Zone.

Hungarian forces recently increased 800 men to total 17,800. Further increase of 12,000 expected shortly. Shpmt of Soviet military material into Hungary in Aug and reported plans for armament manufacture among other indications revitalization of Hungarian forces.

In China Communist capture Chihhsien another severe blow tottering Nationalist Government. Nationalists complete withdrawal forces along Lunghai railroad vicinity of Cheng Hsien Kai Feng to south of Hsu Chou in anticipation Communist operations isolate Hsu Chou. Communist expected to clear entire corridor and increase pressure against Nationalist forces in Feiping Tientsin area. Continued inability of Nationalist forces to stem tide of Communist victories emphasizes probability that Communists will establish own time table for further operations. Continued reverses together with renewed inflationary spiral indicate probability increased military defections and defeatism throughout Nationalist areas.

Dutch-Republican negotiations on Indonesia will probably be resumed as Dutch reduce demands on Republic. Negotiations not expected to succeed however.

MFN treatment for Japanese is the subj.

1. By independent action I have transmitted a ltr to you dtd 13 Oct in which I have reviewed the difficulties encountered in obtaining Most Favored Nation treatment for Japanese trade in the ITO Charter and the two sessions of the contracting parties to Gen Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT). In essence the problem can be reduced to these basic facts.

A. Most of contracting parties to GATT fear Japanese competition. They believe the large number of Japanese confined to a relatively small space in Japan will cause considerable unemployment and result in low cost of labor, low production cost and keen competition. Thus they feel Japan will again become a menace to the trade of these countries.

B. These countries will negotiate bilateral agreements with Japan but will not tie themselves to a multilateral commitment until such time as they can analyze a Japanese trade program and can see how Japanese trade can be integrated into an overall plan for Asia. Until such time, interested countries will not surrender their freedom of action by giving a multilateral commitment to Japan.

C. There is a strong possibility that the UK and the Commonwealths will discuss matter of opposing MFN treatment for Japan at their current Imperial Conference in London. If this were to happen, a serious obstacle to granting MFN treatment for Japan in the GATT or ITO would indefinitely hamper our efforts to make Japanese Economy self-sustaining.

To insure that the Imperial Conference would not foreclose on granting MFN treatment to Japan (per Para 1 C above), Embassies in London and respective Commonwealths were requested to contact foreign offices and urge the Commonwealth delegates to support proposition of creating a committee to explore this Japanese trade question sympathetically with US with a view of working out a common policy prior to next GATT session in Apr 49. Reports from London indicate that American Embassy is maintaining pressure for such a committee but that no reply from UK is possible until after Imperial Conference.

3. Feeling here is that with high level pers of Commonwealth available in London immediately after termination of Imperial Conference that more could be accomplished now than at some future date with a relatively lower level conference. Therefore Embassy in London has been requested to comment on scheduling such a conference in London about 1 Nov with high level Reps of Commonwealth. This would probably last 3 or 4 days. If this conference can be arranged, it is proposed to have an Army rep, a rep from your hq, possibly 1 from State Dept and 1 from American Embassy in London to represent US. In view of complexity and delicate nature of problem, an eminently qualified key rep of your hq should attend so that the Japanese Economic Rehabilitation and Trade Programs can be presented in their best light and also answer those numerous and diverse tech questions that may arise.

4. Your comments are urgently requested. American Embassy London will inform your hq upon establishment of committee and of all subsequent developments prior to convening of proposed conference.

Caution: Output should not preclude possibility that West Sector parties might be obliged once more to reset election date.

Do not give impression that west powers wish in any way to interfere with electoral plans or issues themselves; make clear that recent election indorsement by western powers, was response requested by, and in accordance with feelings of duly elected Berlin officials, and that west's interest in election is dictated solely by desire to see democratic processes protected and observed.

Unable to understand delay in making funds available to O'Hara and would call your attn fact that continued absence from abaca market will seriously curtail quantity which can be secured balance of FY.

2. Best estimates here indicate 35-40 thousand bales per month available for over next 12 month period and world demand far exceeds this amt. Would urge funds be made immediately available to O'Hara for entry into market against Japanese reqmts on basis discussed with O'Hara when Lt Col Baldwin and Mr McDaniel were in Tokyo. Reurad C 64458. The proposed legislation denies the strike weapon to transportation workers but permits them a measure of collective bargaining through formation of the government corporation for transportation.

Part of the difficulty stems from the fact that communications workers, who like railway workers would be in private employ in this country, are not given similar treatment. You have pointed out the difficulty of giving a limited measure of collective bargaining to some government employees and not to others but have provided this limited collective bargaining for employees of government corporations.

We suggest that the major part of this difficulty could be overcome by forming a similar government corporation for communications excluding the postal service if you consider this desirable. We recognize the past strike threats which have centered among the communications workers, but do not believe that broad basic legislation should draw distinction between transportation workers and communications workers for this reason alone.

Please advise soonest whether government corporation for communications is a feasible solution.



In Apr, members of Netherlands Purchasing Commission, Wash, agreed with CAD representatives that ECA dollars, if and when available, would be used to purchase Japanese textiles in addition to any previously planned purchases. ECA purchasing authority was issued on this basis but was amended 8 Sep 48 at request of Dutch to cover \$13,899,156 purchase of Japanese textiles for Apr-Sep delivery.
3. Although contrary to assurances given US, amendment appears to be Dutch prerogative and will not be changed by ECA.
4. Will attempt here to persuade Dutch to use remainder of ECA-NEI money for textiles for new purchases. Total ECA grant at present programmed for NEI covering entire period 1 Apr 48 to 30 June 49 is approximately \$40,000,000.
5. Dutch have submitted and ECA is processing 4th quarter purchase authorization Japanese textiles for \$11,100,000 deliveries Oct-Nov-Dec 48. Will advise apd amt and deliveries when finalized by ECA.
6. Although status of deliveries of your May 48, \$38,700,000 contract with NEI not known here, it appears advisable on basis of add funds available to Dutch for textiles that you attempt negotiate as soon as possible and add contract with NEI Mission for as much as you can get out of them.
