Supplement to Report Nbr 120: Follow up treatment on Ruhr
Agreement:

Unfavorable German reactions to the announcement will
make it necessary for our media to stress the fol additional
points:

A. The draft agreement on the International Authority of
the Ruhr constitutes part of the allied effort towards a final
settlement of all the basic aspects of the German problem-as far
as this is possible with the Soviet Union excluding herself from
an active cooperation in this effort. The overriding concern in
all these settlements for the Allied powers is to prevent any
possibility of a recurrence of German aggression. If this should
seem a farfetched danger to the Germans today, they will have to
remember that the problem is to accomplish a long range settlement
which will protect this as well as future generations from German
aggression. They should also remember that the world has exper-
ienced a formidable revival of German aggressive power within 20
years after Germany's last defeat.

B. The Ruhr constitutes the crux of the German countries.
It is inevitable that the Allied Powers must concentrate a large
measure of their attention upon the way this potential will be
used in the future.

C. For these reasons, German complaint that German inter-
ests are not sufficiently safeguarded in the present agreement,
merely reflects a basic misapprehension as to the Allied approach

to the German problem as a whole following Nazi aggression and defeat.

D. Nevertheless, the present agreement is by no means unilaterally restrictive. Rather, it reflects a compromise between the security interests of the Allied Nations and the interest of reviving the European Economy as soon as possible, with Germany playing an important part in this process. Germans may credit it to the importance of this consideration in interallied thinking at this point, that the powers of the International Authority are carefully limited so as not to interfere unduly with the German management of the Ruhr. The International Authority is supposed to act only in those cases where the German management should be found violating the peace and security of other European Nations or utilizing the Ruhr resources to the detriment of Germany's neighbors. A peaceful and democratic Germany should have no difficulties in avoiding the violations, for the suppression of which the International Authority is to be established.

E. Having established these points, we should stress the various ways in which the agreement is taking care of German interests (participation in OEEC, representation of German Trade Interests, etc).

F. Non German areas may be reminded of the inescapable difficulty of reconciling the 2 guiding principles (security vs economic revival), as an explanation for the compromise nature of the agreement. The fact that the agreement evokes no enthusiasm on either side (e. g. France, Germany) might be used to bolster this point further in all output.

Report Nbr 1201 State Dept (OII) treatment of major current issues (material is designed for guidance of media addressed to indigenous populations).

1. Soviet unilateral acts in Berlin. German media should intensify campaign exposing series of Soviet instigated unilateral acts in Berlin during 1948 with particular emphasis on those since Oct 22, 1948. (See Point 2 of Report 115 dtd Dec 15). Stress particularly acts which have disrupted or have been damaging to economic functions within city. Emphasize economic and other difficulties forced upon west sectors as result of east sector abrogation of 4 power agreements (though naturally pointing out airlift has served to thwart goodly proportion of Soviet directed measures).

2. Troop withdrawals. European media should keep reports on US troop withdrawals from Korea to required actual minimum without drawing any inferences for other occupied areas.

All areas should refrain from speculating on further troop withdrawals.

FYI: It is still expected here that a statement will be made on disposal of remaining troops.

3. Truman speech. Continue to play Truman's Kansas City speech heavily in all areas stressing particularly his condemnation of Soviets for failing to live up to past agreements.

This should help to obviate fear that a new appeasement approach is in making.

Without connecting the 2 incidents, also give heavy play to reports of Soviet Cabinet changes.

4. Indonesia. In case of further Soviet accusations at UN concerning "weak" US position on Indonesia, use comment to recall that US took initiative in bringing Indonesian issue before Security Council and show how Russians have attempted to sabotage direct and quick action. Also recall Jessup speech.

5. Bene-Greek agreement. Reports on Belgium, Netherlands and Greek Trade Agreement and similar agreements among European nations in the future should be placed in their proper context as part of the OEEC Program developed under ERP.

6. Mindszenty arrest. In line with previous guidance, give good play to all aspects of Mindszenty arrest and watch for upcoming developments. Note statements by Archbishop Dalton of Ireland, National Lutheran Council, et al. Our output should be based on position that we will uphold freedom of religion anywhere.

7. Tito speech. Tito speech and subsequent action of Yugoslavia in cutting off exports to Soviet satellites should be given extensive straight play without editorializing or speculating. Tito's words should be left to speak for themselves. Do not indicate that we ourselves are playing up to Tito, but emphasize that Tito, himself, is striving for independence of action.

This item is useful for all areas to show how Soviets are attempting to keep their satellites in economic servitude by reducing them to suppliers of raw materials. Such attempts inevitably occur where Soviets obtain control.

8. Czechoslovak trade. Output to eastern Europe should look for pegs to review Czech economic situation. (Note Clementi speech on Czech-Soviets plan). In view of Czech attacks on US for limiting exports, recall that Czechoslovakia was prevented by its Soviet masters from participating in the overall plan of European recovery and that she was forced instead to join those who are seeking to undermine this recovery. In answer to Czech charges that ERP lowers living standards in western Europe, point out reconstructive aspects of ECA, Czech requests for industrial machinery which Soviets are unable to supply, and general inconsistency of Czech attacks on ERP, coupled with

1. Ruhr Agreement. In reference to special Rhur guidance transmitted on 27th, output to Eastern Europe should stress those measures in the draft agreement which preclude a resurgence of German mil aggression.

In order to combat Soviet propaganda exaggerated amount of foreign investments in Rhur industries reports of US Alien Property Custodian, and 1937 Handbuch der Deutschen Aktiengesellschaften, will be useful in highlighting the small extent of such investments.

2. Koch case. Senate subcommittee report of Koch case deserves good play to illustrate:

A. Insistence of American people, as expressed by Congress, that war crimes must receive due punishment;

B. Insistence that such punishment must be fair and just on the basis of proper evidence and without violating basic principles of law (double jeopardy);

C. Possibility that war crimes may be punished, according to German criminal law as recommended in the report;

D. Possibility offered by system of checks and balances inherent in American democracy, of acknowledging and revising errors.

3. Indonesia. Continue to follow previous guidance on Indonesian issue, but balance mil reports and keep editorial comment on a proportionate basis. Use comment angle that US is acting on principles overriding other pressing interests. Fact that we want to preserve unity in European Recovery Program and Atlantic Pact, is not preventing US from condemning Dutch actions in Indonesia.

4. Eastern Europe. Output to Eastern Europe should watch for and exploit any indications of territorial designs on Yugoslavia by Cominform satellites.

5. US recognition of Republic of Korea. Watch for upcoming statement of US de jure recognition of Republic of Korea about Dec 31 or Jan 1. This is expected to involve change in status of present special mission, to that of an embassy.

While UN GA recognized Republic of Korea as the only lawful govt in Korea, that action did not constitute individual recognition of the Republic by the nations who voted affirmatively for the American-Australian-Chinese resolution in the General Assembly. US is taking lead in granting individual nation recognition as a logical result of the Gen Assembly's action. It is assumed that individual nation recognition by other favorably disposed nations will follow US announcement. For the time being, avoid all mention of or speculation on subj of US troop withdrawal.

Special State Dept (OII) guidance on Ruhr Agreement.

The communique (scheduled for release 28 Dec 48) announcing the draft agreement prepared by representatives of the 6 powers on establishment of an international authority for the Ruhr should be treated as an important and necessary step towards the integration of Germany into the future economic structure of Western Europe and toward German reentry into the family of nations. It should be noted this draft agreement is being referred to the respective govts for consideration and approval, and now only constitutes the recommendations of the London Meeting to the govts. Note also that the recently concluded discussions in London were largely technical discussions to implement principles previously agreed upon in some detail (and announced in Jun) by the 6 powers, which had met at London during the spring. (The discussion just concluded took place in accordance with Annex C of the London Agreement.)

The communique shows agreement was reached by the delegates reconciling, without compromise in principles, the points of view of the participating countries on the future use of Ruhr resources, which is one of the most difficult problems relating to postwar Germany. It is noteworthy that, in spite of the agitated discussions within the countries represented at the meeting (in their press, etc), the work proceeded in a "friendly atmosphere," and agreed recommendations on all the matters on the agenda were reached by the delegates.

As stated in the communique, the draft agreement provides arrangements for assuring the fair and non-discriminatory allocation of Rhur coal, coke and steel between domestic use and export. It also foresees that after the occupation arrangements will be made to prevent the use of the Rhur resources for purposes of German rearmament; to prevent the return of Nazis to dominating positions in ownership or control; and to prevent excessive concentrations of economic power. (Note that the question of final ownership is not affected by the draft agreement.)

In setting up and defining an international authority (to which a future German Govt will have the opportunity to be admitted as a full voting member), the 6 powers have attempted to create an orgn which will be able to utilize the resources of the Rhur in the common interests of both the German economy and those of the other European countries cooperating in the common economic goals, while leaving operations, management and production in German hands. Here the basic problem which the representatives of the 6 powers were trying to solve arises out of the fact that while the Rhur is a part of Germany and development of and production in its basic resources is dependent on German labor and management, its products are needed by many countries in and outside of Europe. This dependence has been in the past used to further German economic dominance over other countries. In addition the heavy industry of the Rhur has been the economic basis of past German aggression. The international authority attempts to provide effective insurance against unilateral use by Germany of Rhur resources, without undue interference with German management.

In presenting the significance of the agreement to German audiences we should emphasize and explain the validity of the apprehensions with which the nations of Western Europe approach the Rhur problem. We must make clear in particular that the draft agreement is establishing an arrangement which will be for the benefit of all parties concerned, and involves the relationship of Germany and her neighboring countries in the future. While Germans understandably are at present preoccupied with revitalizing the economic resources of their country to satisfy immediate and pressing needs, we must make them see that the future employment of Rhur economic potential is closely related to future relationships between the countries of Europe. We must make it clear that the objective of present long range settlements is to make Germany an important sharer in and contributor

to the welfare of the European community, rather than being its center, a threat to its security, or merely a bystander. They must also be made to understand that the problem before the delegates of the 6 govts was one of a long range settlement rather than one of many short range measures of limited scope.

It is anticipated Sov media will attack communique and draft agreement on the issue of protecting foreign investment interests in Rhur coal, coke, and steel enterprises. Article 16 of the draft agreement, crux of the anticipated attack, should be defended on the basis that it is purely anti-discriminatory, and that it does not call for special privileges and concessions vis a vis German owned enterprises in the Rhur. (In this context reference may be made to extra-territorial status enjoyed by Soviet AGS in Sov Zone of Germany, as well as that of Soviet satellite mixed corporations in Eastern Europe.)

Article 26 of draft agreement is also worthy of attn and development.

"The establishment of full relations between the US Govt and the Govt of the Republic of Korea brings to an end the occupation auth exercised by USAFIK since their entry into that country in Sep 45. The major part of such forces have already been withdrawn and such US troops as still remain in Korea do so at the request of the Korean Govt. In consonance with the General Assembly resolution of 12 Dec these too will be withdrawn as early as practicable. Also in conformity with that resolution, the US Govt will endeavor to afford every assistance and facility to the new UN Commission on Korea in it's efforts to help the Korean people and their lawful govt to achieve the goal of a free and united Korea."

View here that interim military agreement (Ref B) remains in effect until complete withdrawal of US troops from Korea; that in view of a projected presidential executive order transferring responsibility for administration of economic aid program to ECA a new civil affairs agreement need not be negotiated.

Official termination of military occupation considered necessary in consonance with Public Law 793 to permit transfer responsibility to ECA; considered desirable in view of formal recognition of Govt of Republic of Korea.

Your question a: Procurement by SCAP of GARIOA and EROA supplies may continue until info that an agricultural product has been declared surplus and acquired under Dept of Agriculture price support programs is received in the Dept of the Army at Wash.. Notice to the Dept is held to be constructive notice to all parties including SCAP.

3. Your question b: The test as to whether SCAP can proceed to execute a contract based on an agreement made before an agricultural product has been declared surplus and acquired by the Dept of Agriculture is whether or not an enforceable obligation has been entered into prior to the declaration of such surplus. So long as there is a meeting of the minds on the major terms of a contract and no legal requirement that such contract is only enforceable if it is in writing, a legal obligation exists and execution of a formal instrument is merely evidence of the agreement reached. Accordingly, for purposes of Sect 112 (E) if an enforceable oral agreement has been reached before a commodity is declared surplus, the date of the formal signed instrument is not material.

4. Your question c: Negotiations which have not been fully completed do not constitute an obligation and therefore must be abandoned at the time a commodity is declared surplus.

International Emergency Food Committee has allocated for the period Jan/June 19, 495,000 mtms rice from Egypt and 15,000 mtms rice from Burma for Ryukyus and 50,000 mtms glutinous and gr C rice from Siam for Japan. Egypt still owes DA some rice on corn/rice exchange and arrangements will be made here to purchase sufficient amount to complete full cargo.

It is desired that SCAP obtain the 15,000 mtms from Burma by trade agreement with reimbursement from GARIOA funds. Rice should be transported by SCAJAP ships if possible and scheduled to arrive in Ryukyus in Apr.

It is our understanding that 50,000 mtms rice from Siam will be obtained by trade agreement and that SCAJAP shipping will be used. If full reimbursement from GARIOA funds is requested, it should be noted that the GARIOA Food Import Program will be reduced by the difference between cost of rice and equivalent quantity of wheat.

1. USCC recd total of \$16,113,470.32 from sale of tin which includes \$4,021.39 recovered for loss and damage. After deducting expenses of \$897,976.96 including USCC commission of \$322,299.67 total of \$15,215,493.36 was paid to your acct. Recoveries of losses were made up as fol: Dutch A/C-7,841 lbs, \$2,972.07; British A/C-589 lbs, \$338.57; unclaimed-2,041 lbs, \$710.75.

2. Price agreement stipulated L 370 per lton for 46 tin allocation and MOS buying price in Malaya for subsequent allocations. This latter price was L 423 per lton. Tin was sold to RFC at fol CIF NY equivalents: L 370-69 cents gr A, 68.875 cents gr B, 68.625 cents gr C; L 423-78.7 cents gr A, 78.55 cents gr B, 78.25 cents gr C.

3. Tin was trfd as fol.

(A) For Dutch acct (on basis of L 370 per ton): Gr A, 5,854,664 lbs; Gr B, 1,943,010 lbs; Gr C, 55,060 lbs; (on basis of \$423 per ton) Gr A, 2,009,053 lbs; Gr B, 1,246,983 lbs; Gr C, 21,092 lbs.

RFC claims that 440,682 lbs should be subj to L 370 price since that quantity was residue to 46 AUS alloc. RFC claims further that contract covering this tin was dtd 10 Feb 47 and transfer of title was effected on 19 Feb 47.

5. Expenses totaled \$897,976.96 made up of fol items: Ocean freight, 402,769.38; demurrage, \$2,577.40; domestic freight, \$26,520.12; storage, \$10,282; handling, \$11,853.60; inspection, weighing and testing, \$57,868.20; Marine insurance, \$28,087.52; war risk insurance, \$30,320.68; custom brokers fees, \$89.50; misc, \$5,308.89; USCC commission, \$322,299.67.

6. All expenses were paid by USCC out of proceeds recd from sale of tin with exception of inspection charges for tin of Dutch origin which were paid directly by Netherlands. It would appear that most equitable div of expenses would be in same proportion as amt of tin for which compensation is allowed bears to total amt, deducting \$14,185.19 from item for inspection, weighing and testing which represents estimated inspection charge for non-Dutch tin. Assuming that compensation is allowed for all tin claimed, expenses would be borne 51% by Dutch, 42% by British, and 7% by SCAP. Inspection expense of \$14,185.19 for non-Dutch tin would be borne 86% by British and 14% by SCAP.

7. In formal note, Netherlands Embassy objects to commission paid to USCC. Position of US Govt is that such commission is normal expense and properly chargeable against gross proceeds. Dutch also suggest that former owners of tin recovered in Japan should rightly receive the net proceeds of its liquidation by RFC less all applicable expenses. This suggestion will be rejected.

8. With respect to dispute regarding applicable price for 1,536,171 lbs title to which passed 5 May 47, to RFC, Dutch have agreed to accept settlement on basis of L 370 subj to future adjustment for that quantity to which L 423 basis may be applicable under price agreement. Dept of State is discussing this point with RFC with a view of adjusting contract price between USCC and RFC.

Little troop movement Central China. Nationalist units isolated between Hsuchou and Puai River apparently making little effort escape. Nationalist withdrawals from Pangfoutu Nanking area will facilitate COVYUNIET take over area north Yangtse and immediately threaten Nanking-Shanghai area.

Rumors peace and coalition in China have assumed new significance with recent statement Premier Sun Fo who announced formation new cabinet and intimated his govt might consider compromise with Communists.

Believed here overall Nationalist position China deteriorated to extent that one of fol developments almost certain:
(1) Peace negotiations, (2) Surrender, (3) Coalition Govt,
(4) Collapse of Nationalist Govt. Third more likely.

In Indonesia, Dutch police action quickly followed proclamation interim govt Indonesia excluding Indonesian Republic. Indonesia capital and top Indonesian leaders captured. Meeting Security Council, called by US and Australia, unlikely influence course Dutch mil action which will probably reach main objectives shortly. The fol press release, with the approval of the Dept of State and the COS is for simultaneous release in Wash and Tokyo to AM papers Wed, Dec 29, 48 after 2400 Z time unless you recommend alternate date. Classification of press release will be considered lifted as of that time.

"Forces under Gen MacArthur to be regrouped, Army announces.

"The DA today announced plans for a gen regrouping of US Army Forces serving under Gen MacArthur.

"The current reduction and regrouping of US Forces in Korea has been made possible by the establishment of the Govt of the Republic of Korea, its assumption of the responsibilities of govt and the UN Gen Assmely declaration on Dec 12, 48, that that govt is the only lawful one in Korea.

"This withdrawal of a portion of the US troop strength in Korea will facilitate a redistribution of troop strength in Japan proper and a regrouping of the present tactical units in the Far East.

"The recent operations demonstrated by the Korean Constabulary, civil police and Coast Guard in connection with an uprising at Yosu in South Korea has justified the decision to reduce US Forces in Korea. In the contemplated regrouping of forces, troops of the 7th Inf Div will be moved from Korea to Japan in several echelons to replace the 11th Abn Div which is being moved to the US for tentative station at Camp Campbell, Kentucky.

"The Army pointed out that the scheduled changes when completed will be in consonance with a UN resolution calling for occupying troops of the US and of Sov Russia to be withdrawn from Korea, 'as early as practicable'".

Firstly, Soviet prisoner of war retentions: Since Soviets will fail to meet agreed 31 Dec deadline for return of German POW's, media should recap Moscow CFM agreement re POW's and build up to 31 Dec repatriation shortfall by USSR. Treat problem as violation by USSR of solemnly entered international commitment; stress broad economic humanitarian reasons for early repatriation and by this emphasis avoid presenting issue in such way as to evoke residual Nazi sentiments. Point out Sov reluctance to repatriate punctually extends to Austrian, Italian, Japanese POW's as well; early completion of repatriations by US and UK, and expected fulfillment by French of 31 Dec deadline. Pick up statements by US and other western spokesmen urging early repatriation for humanitarian and economic reasons (e.g. OMGUS official quoted 1/23/47 that Germany needs its younger men to work for economic recovery, and that humanitarian grounds "are well known, and we Americans, as the first to free the prisoners, are the logical ones to present the argument" (at Moscow CFM): OMGUS 11/47 report titled "Population transfers": The retention of these men denies essential labor to the German economy"; and similar statements by Clay and others. While not accepting Soviet official figures on POW's given at Moscow CFM as necessarily accurate,

media, with proper qualification, may use them nevertheless to highlight repatriation shortfalls. Revive earlier statements by German Communist spokesman (such as Grotewohl, Emil Carlsbach, etc) promising punctual return (also Soviet Major's statement over Radio Berlin, reported ISD 2-way 12 Oct 48, to effect 890,000 German POW's still (SIC) in Russian hands). After deadline has passed, more aggressive treatment this issue naturally indicated (FYI watch for possible 3-power representations to USSR re POW repatriation).

Secondly, Austrian treaty talks. Soviet acceptance of Austrian initiative for resumption of treaty talks presents opportunity for reiterating US concern, in line with the desires of the Austrian people, for speedy and substantial progress towards full Austrian independence. However, we should continue to refrain from undue optimism regarding prospects of success at forthcoming 4-power talks. While it would be premature at this point to speculate on possible Soviet position in new talks, this seems good time to review main controversial issues over which agreement was blocked at preceding session.

Thirdly, Spanish West-German trade agreement. View here is that agreement is purely commercial and merely one of a series of trade agreements between Western Germany and other countries, designed to promote Western German recovery, including some made with Latin-American, Mediterranean and iron curtain countries. Make clear that agreement has no political implications.

Fourthly, Eastern Europe. All areas, and particularly output to Eastern Europe should note: A. Current Cominform Journal article on needs for purges of Communist parties in several Eastern European countries. B. Passive resistance to work competition in Poland and to Hennecks movement in Germany (Soviet Zone). C. Czechoslovakia courts conviction of Father Hucks, another instance of general church persecution. Three point program presented at Bulgarian Communist Party Congress which does not include friendship with the western states.

Fifthly, US directive to Japan. US directive to Japan and MacArthur's letter should merely be reported without speculation as to whether Japanese people will be willing and able to carry

out economic acceleration program. In case of criticism of US unilateral action in issuing such a directive, point out that US action is authorized under terms of reference to FEC which permits US Govt to "issue interim directives to the Supreme Commander pending action by the Commission whenever urgent matters arise not covered by policies already formulated by the Commission." Avoid interpretation that new decree means abandonment of economic reform program. Stress that priority is now being given to recovery over every other consideration. At the request of the State, Army, Navy, and Air Force Depts the following conclusions contained in SANACC 99/11 are transmitted for your information. A copy of SANACC 99/11 was dispatched to you via registered air mail this date.

"1. Japanese nationals, including Japanese concerns engaged in commercial fishing and other commercial aquatic activities, should eventually be permitted access to all high seas areas accessible generally to nationals and enterprises of other nations.

"2. Japanese fishing ops should conform strictly to:

a. The provisions of agreements relating to whaling to which the US is a party;

b. The provisions of other agreements relating to conservation of Marine resources to which the US is a party;

c. The policies or rules governing specific fisheries announced by the US, or by other govts in conformity with policies announced by the US with respect to coastal fisheries.

"3. Pursuant to Par 1 above, the US representative on the Far Eastern Commission should agree to the recognition by the Far Eastern Commission that the SCAP may at his discretion expand present Japanese fishing or other commercial aquatic activities. If such expansion will involve fishing or other commercial aquatic activities in an area in which any country has a direct concern, arrangements shall be made between SCAP and such country. Should it become apparent that a definition of direct concern will be necessary before FEC recognition of the above can be had, a definition agreeable to them should be obtained by the US representatives to that body and referred to SANACC for appropriate action.

"5. 30 days after SANACC approval of this paper or upon approval by FEC of the position contained herein prior to the end of such period, the US Govt will advise SCAP that he is auth under the terms of FEC-035 to permit the extension of the present Japanese fishing area eastward to include the area bounded by a line from 40 deg north latitude, 165 deg east longitude; east to 180 deg longitude; thence south along the 180th Meridian to 20 deg north latitude; thence west along the 20th Parallel to 165 deg east longitude; thence south along the 165th Meridian to 16 deg north latitude; west to 150 deg east longitude; thence north along the 150th Meridian to Tropic of Cancer; west to 141 deg east longitude; thence south along the 141st Meridian 16 deg north latitude; west to 130 deg east longitude; thence north along the 130th Meridian to 20 deg north latitude; west to 123 deg east longitude; thence north to 24 deg north latitude, 123 deg east longitude.

1. In W 80717, 6 Dec, it was pointed out that it was desired that SCAP survey fibre procurement possibilities in the Far East and after such survey had been made advise DA as to the balance to be obtained from sources outside the Far East. Although results of this survey have not reached us as yet, it is apparent that a substantial quantity of the FY 49 fibre requirement remains to be met.
 2. To meet balance of your requirements DA will furnish SCAP with rope which has been or will be surplus or excess. This rope is presently in depots throughout the US and ranges from good to poor quality, varying sizes and assorted manila, sisal and jute, the latter in relatively small quantities.
 3. The above rope will be made avail from Proj 122 funds at a much lower cost to the program and it is proposed that SCAP use this rope fibre as delivered in its present state or by re-working in Japanese rope mills. In this connection it should be pointed out that SCAP fibre representative recently here expressed opinion that this would be possible and in checking with governmental rope experts here this plan is thought to be most advisable. Cost of this rope to the GARIOA Program would approx \$150 per 1ton landed Japan which when compared to current prevailing prices of raw fibre appears to be a considerable saving in the GARIOA Program. During the war years, the US developed a project whereby scrap rope was re-worked and the resulting product was a rope of approx 90% the tensile strength of grade 1 manila rope.
 4. The exact amounts which can be recovered from surplus are not known at this time; however, it appears that before the

Details being given you in another message. Proposal will go to FEC on basis that 30 days later interim directive will be issued if agreement not yet reached. We strongly support your views generally that there should be no limitations but Navy's interest in trustee area, Interior's interest in conservation and American fishing industry and State's various interests have made this problem a difficult one to resolve.

Believe present considerable expansion should assist Japanese fishing considerably both as addition to food supply and for export and better as a step toward final solution than drastic action proposed in last para of C 66071.

During negotiation of the present agreement we have agreed to send you a message pointing out the Navy's concern over possible molestation of the natives and additional message outlining the conservation principles suggested by Interior and State to which it is considered the Japanese fisherman should generally adhere. Apparently Japanese prewar record in conservation not good.

In Feb we will press again for further expansion of area and would hope to obtain agreement before Apr when MFN treatment for Japan will come up again in order to make our national policy on this question more consistent with MFN principle. To meet the conservation argument will appreciate receiving before Feb 1 all possible evidence that Japanese following reasonable practices and also all available info indicating that Japanese fishermen not landing or molesting natives in trust area.

Fourthly. Austrian Schillings.

Pick up reports indicating Soviets have been dumping Austrian shillings on Swiss open market in their eager quest for hard "bourgeois" currency, thereby wilfully engaging operation which serves to retard firming up of shillings value. Such stories should have wide interest outside Austria, and should provide good peg for recapping Soviet exploitation of their zone in Austria, Soviet disregard for currency stability of satellite countries (particularly prior to and during their respective currency reforms), and of Soviet thirst for hard currency receipts by all available means.

"Notwithstanding recent unfavorable developments and independent of signature of the lease KOSCO is prepared to proceed with operating contract and to send staff as soon as contract signed or confirmation received from you that letter of intent to KOSCO for recovery of expenses incurred for performance of contract has been signed by the US. KOSCO feels that negotiations regarding lease may be commenced immediately but the lease is not to be signed until referred to New York. We would like to settle question of disposal of govt owned stocks remaining in tanks at end of the operating contract. Our feeling govt owned stocks should be taken over on consignment bases similar to present method of operation with Petroleum Distributing Administration. KOSCO will have no interest in any lease agreement unless participating companies licensed to market product. Similarly assurances must be obtained that allocation will be made of foreign exchange to recover the necessary and reasonable US dollar expenses incurred by marketing companies.

Chinese member stated his govt interested only in sp purpose structures such as aircraft hangars or shelters for engines, and now proposes fol substitute Par 2, which he reports agreed to by SCAP:

"Those structures or portions of such plants or establishments including equip accessory thereto which, by virtue of initial design or construction can be economically dismantled and re-erected and which, in the opinion of the SCAP, are not required for purposes of the occupation or for Japan's peaceful needs as defined by the Far Eastern Commission should be made available as reparations."

At same meeting Netherlands member proposed Par 2 of FEC-299/5 be removed from current Commission consideration and referred to appropriate committee to study whether make separate proposal re buildings. Netherlands proposal based by Mr De Blank of Netherlands Delegation that SCAP officials told him recently in Tokyo that while some buildings could be made available under certain circumstances, SCAP would release none while availability of buildings under FEC discussion. Netherlands apparently interested in general purpose as well as sp purpose structures.

Chinese and Netherlands assert above proposals correspond with your views. Language Par B (2) of tentative State-Army agreement fwded you for comment in ourad, in our view prohibits removal of "buildings". If your understanding with Chinese and Netherlands conflicts will welcome proposal for amendment B (2) in your reply to ourad or will accept your and interpretation of Par. Please inform what reply we should give China and Netherlands as to your future action this matter under Advance Transfer Program.

B. Resistance of collectivization behind iron curtain, particularly Lithuania, without picking up erroneous press statements that this info came through US diplomatic channels.

C. Criticism of Soviet statistical Bureau for being "too mathematical" and its transfer within the govt.

D. Analysis of Premier Stalin's writings by "Historicus" in current issues of Foreign Affairs Quarterly. (Watch for special Vossa commentary on this).

Seventhly. Dubinsky. Give good play to Dubinsky article in Foreign Affairs Quarterly in which he charged that WFTU is ignoring destruction of workers rights and predicted formation of a new federation of free trade unions.

Part 1. Detailed comments compiled by tech experts of various govt agencies, including State, Treasury, Fed Res and Army, will be quoted in fol paras as tech assistance to SCAP in handling banking reform legislation.

Part 2.

A. Primary purpose this rad is to sup you specific comments on paras 5 through 13 re memo. To make these comments it was necessary to adopt definite assumptions about immediate revisions most feasible in monetary and central banking flds. In accordance ourad Oct (see especially Para 5) we assumed most practical approach would be interim program to expand auth present bank of Japan. View here is such program would provide bank of Japan with controls sufficiently powerful to permit it to curb credit and thus play its part in stabilization program. This would not preclude more extensive changes in monetary and central banking system if and when further study, especially of your proposed banking board, should prove such changes practicable and desirable.

B. Interim program might be accomplished by amendment Bank of Japan law:

(A). To require banks to hold reserves with Bank of Japan,

(B). To give Bank of Japan control over reserve reqmts within prescribed limits, (see comment below on your Para 5 I),

(C). To make Bank of Japan principal regulating, supervising, and examining auth of all banks (excepting possibly that right to charter new banks be left with Minister of Finance),

right to charter new banks be left with Minister of Finance), (D) to foster independence of bank by deleting most provisions giving control over banks opr to M-nister of Finance (see, for example, articles 21, 24, and 25 Bank of Japan law) and by giving bank officers more secure tenure (see article 47), and (E) to grant Bank of Japan such add powers control money and credit as may be deemed feasible.

C. With this approach in mind suggest your references "Banking Board" in Paras 5 through 13 be modified to read "Bank of Japan."

Part 3.

Discussions here also influenced greatly by realization that most if not all Japanese banks now technically insolvent and not likely to be corrected permanently until economic conditions materially improve. In such situation objectives of legislative reform must necessarily be limited. However, believe it possible to make comprehensive revisions existing legislation to eliminate structural defects and improper practices of banks with view of making banks better able serve domestic and foreign clients and meet needs Japanese economy.

Part 4.

Fol are comments on detailed proposals outlined in Paras 5 through 13 ESS/FIN Memo Nbr 010 dtd 28 May 48. Numbers correspond paras your memo. Sub par 5-system of pvt banks.

(A) In new statutes replacing SP laws, suggest retention all useful and desirable banking facilities under uniform auth and law with affirmative provisions covering powers, type of orgs, and nature of business of each class of institution, as well as necessary limitations.

(B) Recommend defining different types of banks, item E, commercial bank, Trust Company, savings bank, etc.

(F) Agree in principle with uniform reg and supervision of banking institutions, but in case of agricultural credit coops with heavy seasonal borrowing reqmts and credit institutions with greater risks, compliance with all restrictions and limitations applicable to banks might be impossible. In add to SP chapters or sections to meet these situations, suggest appropriate measures to place central banks for cooperatives under banks of Japan.

(I) Suggest res problem be handled by amending Bank of Japan law. Bank of Japan should be given power alter reserves all banks without discrimination within fairly wide limits, EG, between 10% & 50% for demand deposits. Suggest also Bank of

Japan be given power in exceptional circumstances to establish reserves up to 100% against any future increases in deposits or some other variant SP reserve plan. These reqmts can be made more flexible for control purposes, especially under present conditions, by giving Bank of Japan to permit certain percentages of reserves to be held in form of assets other than yen deposits with Bank of Japan.

(K) Agree to prohibition bank affiliations with securities company of dealer, but question feasibility of complete prohibition dealing in securities by banks. Member banks Fed Res System are permitted to deal in govt obligations and certain other classes of securities and to purchase and sell securities for acct of customers.

(M) Gen prohibition interlocking directorates with other banks and other inappropriate businesses is essential. However, provision should not preclude sv of qualified executives of appropriate businesses outside banking and financial circles as dirs of a bank. Practical business experience and judgment of such reps are necessary and useful in formulation of sound banking policies.

6-Govt credit corporations

(Banker) consider reorgn and control reconstruction Finance Bank of maj significance due to effect ok its opr upon Natl Monetary and credit situation over which Bank of Japan should leave full auth through proposed expansion its powers. In present inflationary situation it would seem imperative to require RFB to get its loanable funds from govt so as to subj it to budgetary control. Refer Para 4 GW 91507 Oct 48. Request further info.

(C) If provision does not allow SP Banks to segregate regular banking and investment banking into 2 sep entities for future opr, and subj banks elect to become regular banks, suggest non-commercial banking functions be transferred to RFB, central banks for cooperatives and other appropriate orgns.

(E) In view past importance postal deposit system to small Japanese communities, believe strenthening of system to improve savings and transfer functions is desirable. From point of view monetary control, crucial issue is control of investment policy. Add info would be appreciated.

8-separation from securities business.

(B) Disposal within 1 year of stocks acquired in loan liquidations appears too rigid. Suggest that law make provision for time extensions subj to discretion of bank auth to minimize

losses from forces sales.

There appears to be no provision for disposition of stocks previously purchased and now held by banks. In this connection and in view of importance of stimulating broad ownership of equity capital, consider desirability reopening stock market.

9-loan and investment limitations.

(A) (B) Relating loans to any one person or company to percentage of deposits appears unwise. Suggest as interim measure that bank of Japan be given discretionary auth to establish loan limitations. Type of security offered important factor. Agreed loan policy should emphasize dispersion of credit and distribution of risk.

(C) Prohibition against bank affiliates re para 7 (D) memo nullifies need for this provision.

(D) Purpose this proposal not clear, but such loans should be based on principle cited 9 (A) above.

(F) Concur if past tendency has favored real estate loans in excessive amts. Info has indicated lack of urban home financing in Japan; if true, consider possibility bldg and loan associations as financing facility when conditions warrant.

(H) Agree but suggest provision be made for time extension subj to bank auths discretion.

(M) If directors are intended to become guarantors of loans to other directors and their companies, proposal would place undue burden upon them. However, full accountability to shareholders for such loans is essential.

(R) What is reason for this prohibition?

(W) Subjection of aggregate of investments in any company's securities, loans to same company, and loans to other collateralized by same company's stocks and bonds to percentage limitation of banks deposit appears too restrictive and detrimental to securities market. Believe principles cited para 3 para 9 (A) (B) above might apply similarly to investments. Also suggest extension of liquidation period by auth banking supervisor, if necessary, to minimize losses.

New Subj: Unsecured loans. It is record that consideration be given to desirability of limitation on unsecured loans which bulk economically high in bank statements.

10-capital stock ownership and management.

(A) Appears impractical to try estimate deposits under present conditions.

In absence better knowledge Jap banking reqmts and due to inflationary conditions in Japan, interested agencies find it difficult make specific recommendation this subj.

Suggest exploration possibility of adopting ratio or combination of ratios capital to risk assets. For details, see Fed Reserve Bill on Guatemalan and Philippine bank laws. This type of ration, together with flexible res reqmts, gives monetary auth both quantitative and qualitative credit controls.

(B) What is purpose of stating maximum amt of auth capital stock rather than amt out standing or to be sold in articles of association of a bank? In this connection, it is not important require publication bank statements?

(E) Why should at least 50% of banks capital structure consist of capital stock? US banks, for example, are considered satisfactory with surplus and undivided profits in excess of capital stock.

(R) Concur, if feasible, to hold simultaneous shareholders meetings at various cities.

(U) What is purpose this provision?

(V) Is this too restrictive? Would it not discourage investment in bank capital?

(X) Places unwarranted burden upon directors.

(E) Do not understand urgency of filling vacancy on Board of Directors in short period. Apmt of good directors may require more time. Suggest period of 6 months with discretionary auth in Bank of Japan to extend.

(H) Unless terms "negligency" and "mismanagement" are carefully defined, provision subjecting directors, officers, and employees to extreme liabilities might discourage sv of competent persons.

11. Bank charters, licenses or permits.

(D) If merger or consolidation agreement is ratified by stockholders holding 2/3 of issued stock and apd by banking auth, see no need for public hearing.

(G) In accord Part 1 this radio, would suggest giving Bank of Japan veto power over chartering.

12. Reports, examinations and supervision.

(A) Recommended that examination and supervision by banking auth be restricted only to banks and credit institutions receiving deposits and making loans. Refer also to Para 4 D W 91507 Oct 48.

(I) Suggest, if possible, at least 1 examination a year for each banking institution.

(S) Is this intended for examining personnel? If not provision might unduly curb bank officers and employees in exchange of credit info through appropriate channels.

13. Offenses, crimes and penalties.

(E) Refer Part 3, Para 10 (HH) above.

Part 5.

A. Proposals Para's 5 through 13 not subj to specific comments are generally in accord with accepted banking practices.
