Re WX 86909, 8 Apr 49. State Dept will not concur in any reference to withdrawal from or termination of occupation of Korea, accordingly simultaneous release not authorized now. However, State Dept concurs in following which DA proposes for release Hawaii only and Washington followup if required: "CG USAFP announced today that the garrison forces in Hawaii will be increased by approximately 4,000 troops early this summer. This is a part of a general allocation of troops in connection with periodic adjustments to coincide with the beginning of the FY. While becoming a part of the garrison in Hawaii these troops will be an integral part of the general reserve, the remainder of which is in the US."

In addition DA will furnish soonest guidance to answer expected queries on subj of troops moving from Korea to Hawaii. Suggest no comment until guidance is available to you.

This is G-2 Highlight 387 dtd 21 Feb 49.

This data is handled by Korean authorities as Top Secret and it is requested their classification be accorded the same consideration as US Top Secret until after purge.

1. The following advance info of a pending new drive starting 23 Feb to rid Communists from Korean Security Forces is fwded:

A. Approximately 5 weeks ago Maj Kim Chong Young, S-2, 1st Regt, Korean Army and head of the Seoul SIS, apprehended a civilian named Lee Jai Bok. This man was the nrbr one man of the Security Section of the South Korea Labor Party, his mission being to secure all pertinent info. on the South Korean Army, Navy, and Police force. After this arrest, and possibly a great contributing factor, the National Police were able to arrest Lee's sec (Kim Young Sik). Kim's arrest led to the confiscation of many documents on the South Korean Security Forces.

B. The documents mentioned above were kept by the police for approximately 10 days and only yesterday, 17 Feb were they turned over to the Korean Army. When these documents were first confiscated, Col Paik Son Yup, G-2, Korean Army requested the police turn over to him a list of the Army pers involved. This request was refused by the police.

1. The following advance info of a pending new drive starting 23 Feb to rid Communists from Korean Security Forces is fwded:

A. Approximately 5 weeks ago Maj Kim Chong Young, S-2, 1st Regt, Korean Army and head of the Seoul SIS, apprehended a civilian named Lee Jai Bok. This man was the nr one man of the Security Section of the South Korea Labor Party, his mission being to secure all pertinent info on the South Korean Army, Navy, and Police force. After this arrest, and possibly a great contributing factor, the National Police were able to arrest Lee's sec (Kim Young Sik). Kim's arrest led to the confiscation of many documents on the South Korean Security Forces.

B. The documents mentioned above were kept by the police for approximately 10 days and only yesterday 19 Feb were they turned over to the Korean Army. When these documents were first confiscated, Col Paik Son Yup, G-2, Korean Army requested the police turn over to him a list of the Army pers involved. This request was refused by the police.

Reurad CX 66112 of 9 Dec 1948, following is interim reply to serve as guide in preparation of revised table of distribution for KMAG and detailed troop list for USAFIK after 15 Jan 49. More complete info will follow in reply to urad CX 65751 of 27 Nov 48 now being studied in State and DA.

General composition of USAFIK as recommended in urad CX 65751 is approved. However, it is opinion here that KMAG, when established, should be divorced from administrative and command control of USAFIK and should be an integral part of Diplomatic Mission as contemplated in POLAD Annex to Plan FINESPUN. This concept need not alter plan for concurrent command of USAFIK and Military Advisory Group by Brigadier General Roberts.

Proposed plan for continued logistic support of USAFIK should be revised in keeping with above concept. All elements of Diplomatic Mission, including KMAG, should be logistically supported by Joint Administrative Service Organization being organized for that purpose in accordance with memorandum of understanding between Muccio, Coulter and Wolfe of 11 Oct 48.

On 17 Nov Gen MacArthur sent representative members of his staff for conference. Primary purpose of their visit was to offer such assistance and support as may be necessary for the evacuation of US Nationals from China.

Little assistance from CINCFE is required unless there is a serious outbreak of violence against foreigners. In this case CINCFE is ready to receive, care for in Japan and provide for the onward routing of evacuees who may be transported from China under serious emergency conditions.

The evacuation is proceeding in an orderly manner. Embassy warnings have caused considerable movement toward the coastal cities, primarily Shanghai and Tsingtao. US nationals so desiring are routed trans-Pacific. The majority of other nationals are going South, usually via Hong Kong. There has been no stampede and none is expected.

Evacuation of the Peiping-Tientsin area was completed 17 Nov with the departure of 3 LST's from Tientsin. 91 US nationals are routed to Tsingtao and will depart on General Butner for US. Several hundred foreign evacuees are now en route Shanghai. About 300 US nationals remain in this area and intend to stay regardless of developments. In case of violent emergency we shall be ready to render all practicable assistance.

The primary operations are in TINTISAN, the Yangtze valley and at Shanghai. Evacuees are moving down river in our ships from Nanking and via aircraft from Hankow. The Hankow-Canton railroad remains in operation and can assist in removing load from

Hankow. Generous allowance is made for removal of household effects. The demand for overseas transport from Shanghai is small. About 200 civilians depart this week for US and this rate is expected to continue until the up-river evacuation is completed when it should drop off unless influenced by fears of violent uprising. For those nationals in Nanking required by urgency to remain, ships and aircraft of adequate capacity will remain on station and ready to assist as long as practicable.

Assistance rendered by JUSMAG will be effective in evacuating Hankow. A directive has been issued to complete commitments of JUSMAG as soon as practicable so that JUSMAG Forces can be reduced.

Hospitalization has been offered to numerous civilian evacuees including some non-ambulatory cases and pregnant women. Such steps have been pointed toward affording continued care while effecting evacuation.

It has been my policy to render every possible assistance and consideration to US nationals and others designated by our consulate. Due to the absence of US commercial shipping in the Far East, the facilities of Army and Navy transports must be utilized. Transport captains are providing increased capacity by adopting semi-emergency measures where necessary. In my opinion all members of the Armed Forces are executing their tasks in a commendable manner but it should be noted that our evacuation is causing considerable loss prestige and much derogatory comment. Newspapers pointedly calling attention to diametrically opposed policies US and Britain.

Subj is evacuation of depts and mil pers JUSMAG. This rad in 6 parts.

Part 1. Evacuation of depts is proceeding in an orderly manner under the Dirs JUSMAG. Dependents with their cabin and hold baggage are being moved fr Nanking and outlying stas by air directly to ship or to billets to await shipping. 59 depts fr Nanking and Peiping will be staged at Tsingtao including 23 pregnancy cases which Adm Badger has accommodated in the repose. Remainder will be evacuated thru Shanghai which has accommodations for their housing and care.

Part 2. Plan for evacuation of depts is as fols:

359 on USAT Buckner, now in Shanghai with ETD about 13 Nov after arrival of USAT M M Patrick.

221 on Patrick with ETD about 27 Nov after arrival of USAT Republic unless conditions permit earlier release of Patrick.

Of remaining 520 depts, plan to evacuate 200 on USS Butner at Shanghai and Tsingtao and 320 on USAT Republic at Shanghai. Unless an unforeseen emerg develops, only 1st cl accommodations will be utilized for depts. In emerg all depts can be evacuated on M M Patrick by using trp cl space. Depts on Buckner, Patrick and Republic will be disembarked at Yokohama and regrouped for onward movement to ZI by water or by commercial air, for those whose sponsors will probably be asgd in FEC and who desire such action, for quartering in Japan.

G-4 FEC states FEC can accommodate these depts. The foregoing plan for evacuation of depts has been accelerated by the early arrival of the Buckner and Patrick but is the same plan originally made. Directors JUSMAG consider that evacuation of depts still absolutely necessary but not so urgent as a few days ago.

Part 3. While it is probable that JUSMAG mil pers will be considerably reduced in the near future I recommend that the rate of reduction be at the discretion of the Directors JUSMAG. An early mass evacuation of mil pers would have a disastrous effect on the morale of the Chinese officials which has greatly increased in last 72 hrs. In addition, such an evacuation would force the abandoning of much personal property because of ltd packing and crating facilities. Present arrangements will provide ample facilities for evacuation of mil pers before any danger that can be foreseen develops.

Part 4. The uncertainty and apparent lack of confidence that existed among Chinese civil and mil leaders has largely subsided and their morale and confidence has materially improved. The earlier fear was caused by indications of an imminent mil collapse at Hsuehchow coupled with uncertainty as to the evacuation of Hulutao, the resignation of the Premier and the Cabinet, the belief of the people that families of high Chinese officials were being evacuated, food scarcity and resultant disorders. These conditions all have improved. Hulutao was evacuated successfully making 100,000 trps avail for the Hsuehchow area. Order has been restored in Nanking and Shanghai with establishment of martial law on 11 Nov. No further reports of trp defections have been made. The mil situation in the Hsuehchow area remains serious but with no present signs of an immediate collapse. If the Communists continue their offensive, which is probable, have little doubt but that Nanking and Shanghai will fall. Based on today's mil situation only, this could take place in 3 to 4 weeks fr now.

Part 3. While it is probable that JUSMAG mil pers will be considerably reduced in the near future I recommend that the rate of reduction be at the discretion of the Directors JUSMAG. An early mass evacuation of mil pers would have a disastrous effect on the morale of the Chinese officials which has greatly increased in last 72 hrs. In addition, such an evacuation would force the abandoning of much personal property because of its packing and crating facilities. Present arrangements will provide ample facilities for evacuation of mil pers before any danger that can be foreseen develops.

Part 4. The uncertainty and apparent lack of confidence that existed among Chinese civil and mil leaders has largely subsided and their morale and confidence has materially improved. The earlier fear was caused by indications of an imminent mil collapse at Hsuehcou coupled with uncertainty as to the evacuation of Hulutao, the resignation of the Premier and the Cabinet, the belief of the people that families of high Chinese officials were being evacuated, food scarcity and resultant disorders. These conditions all have improved. Hulutao was evacuated successfully making 100,000 trps avail for the Hsuehcou area. Order has been restored in Nanking and Shanghai with establishment of martial law on 11 Nov. No further reports of trp defections have been made. The mil situation in the Hsuehcou area remains serious but with no present signs of an immediate collapse. If the Communists continue their offensive, which is probable, have little doubt but that Nanking and Shanghai will fall. Based on today's mil situation only, this could take place in 3 to 4 weeks fr now.

1. It is proposed that this command retain one regimental combat team from the 7th Inf Div, together with necessary ammunition and equipment, until W plus 120.

2. The regimental combat team will consist of the 32d Inf, 48th FA Bn, the 7th Div Reconnaissance Co, one company of 113th Combat Engr Bn, one platoon of the 7th Div QM Co, and a detachment of the 7th Medical Bn.
