YUGOSLAVIA (CONFIDENTIAL)

US Ambassador Belgrade states that there is reason believe that Yugoslav Government desires change it's position on Korea from one of neutrality to active support of United Nations. It is official's opinion that principal cause for Yugoslav Government's hesitation on making such change is uncertainty that rank and file of Yugoslav Communist Party is ready accept active endorsement of UN Policies in Korea.

Yugoslav Regime's desire to develop internal basis for such a change in policy is indicated by request for accreditation to Korea of Yugoslav Journalist on Staff of Politika, Yugoslavia's

second most important daily newspaper.

Comment: There were indications of Yugoslavia's readiness to vote with west in UN on question of aggression in fall of 1950, when Chief Yugoslav Delegate introduced resolution designed to halt any hostilities at an early stage or, failing that, to fix guilt for aggression. Marshal Tito told an American Newspaper Correspondent in November 1950, that in event of hostilities between United States and Communist China, Yugoslavia would adhere to any UN finding concerning aggressor, and would support subsequent UN action.

However, when voting on Korean situation, Yugoslavia has consistently abstained. It is possible Tito has decided his Party is nearly prepared support actively Western Policies in United Nations.





Comments Not believed that either the 38th or 50th CCF Armies (Corps) have completed their reptd plans to move back to Manchuria, although intention to do so appears to have existed (INTSUM 3119, 3121, 3131). Other repts indicating the w/d to 50th CCF Army (Corps) to Pyongyang area appear more valid (INTSUM 3126, 3131). Until more concrete evidence is reed, acceptance of reptd w/d of 38th and 50th CCF armies (Corps) to Manchuria cannot be accepted, they will be carried as res in Korea. 39th CCF Army (Comps) 1) listh CCF Div: 1 CCF PW captd 8 Apr by US Ist Cav Div vic CT 9412, identd comm plat, 343d Regt, listh Div, 39th CCF Army (Corps). These 2 CCF Army Gpm were formerly atchd to 2d And 1st CCF Fld Armies, resp. dur the Virtually unopposed rampage of Chinese Red Forces in China proper in 1949. Of 20th CCF Army Grp, whileh remained with its parent unit, the N China GCF Army Grps dur that pd, only the 66th CCF Army (Corps) has been ident in Korea. Although It has been indicated through PWS and other sources that remaining elms of 20th CCF Army Grp would enter or had entered Korea, no confirmation has been reed to this effect. "Jehol Army Grps" This ident was probably made in ref to 57th Army (Corps), 20th CCF Army Grp, inasmuch as this CCF Army (Corps) was formerly known as Jehol Column. The designation, Jehol Column, was in effect until 1946, when it was redesignated 2d Column of M China People: Liberation Army. This in turn became 67th Army (Corps), 20th Army Gro. N. China CCF Army Gross in early 49. It is to be noted (INTSUL 3135) that a Chinese NCO PW, fr 66th CCF Army (Corps) captd late Mb 51, claired hearsay knowledge that 67th CCF Army (Corps) was to arr in Korta shortly. 

Regarding categorical denial by Moscow press on 7 April of presence of any Soviet troops in Manchuria.

US Ambassador Moscow, commenting on this announcement by

the Soviets, observed that:

A. Statement was "crystal clear" and suggests that Soviets are determined to establish as a "fact," absence of Soviet troops in Manchuria.

B. In order to issue categorical denial, no mention was made of Soviet troops known to be in Port Arthur area in accordance with terms of the Sino-Soviet Treaty of Feb 1950.

C. Mere issuance of denial - which is most unusual indicates Soviets attach special significance to subject, and this action may portend new form of intervention in Korea denial serving to establish in advance that Soviets are not officially involved. On other hand, it may foreshadow opposite possibility, i.e., move for negotiated settlement of Korean war.

Q-2 agrees this public denial of presence of even single Soviet soldier in Manchuria is unusual and definitely indicates importance which Soviets attach to adhering publicly to their original line of non-involvement in Korean war. Failure to mention Soviet troops in Port Arthur indicates that Soviets either do not consider that area to be in Manchuria or that, for propaganda purposes, it was preferred not to issue qualified statement.

No Soviet line divisions are believed to be in Manchuria (other than forces in Port Arthur area), but presence of Soviet military advisors, and technicians has been confirmed in Manchuria

Certainly, by choosing to join battle mostly only over rear areas occ by his own grad forces, en sacrificing his max striking capability, but by same token acquires an optimum pen as regards retovery of downed pilots, Inasmuch as trained pilots are defonitely in 1td nbr, his present tactics may represent a conscious endeavor to conserve his pilot corps until a flow of trained repla is established. In all probability, both pilot and acft limitations have exerted considerable influence on en's apparent decision to conserve his air potential against the day when its full commitment is exigent. D. Approximately 1 2 of IV Arty Corps has moved to Altengrabow Field Arty range (southwest of Berlin) and to Wustrow

Antiacit Arty range. E. There are indications that indications that unit of 3d Shock Army participated in CPX near Perleberg (northwest of Berlin near British Zone boundary) early Mar, and similar exercise or demonstration may have been conducted by 3d and 4th Guards Mechanized Army Units southwest of Berlin, 10-15 Mar.

CINCEUR comments that conduct of CPX problems this early in training season indicates units are further advanced this year

than at same period in past years. Comments Beginning of CPX problems by Soviet units in Germany this year occurred approximately two months earlier than last year, and this development tends substantiate other indications of possibly increased scope of field training during current season.

(5) Chinese Communists are primarily interested in reconstruction of country, which is likely to take 20 to 30 years, by which time Chinese leaders will have become more Chinese and less Chinese Communist than is case today. Indo-China (Secret)

Reports from United States Officials in Indo-China show following activity by Viet Minh during period 23-31 Mar:

A. On 23-24 Mar, Viet Minh Division in Dong Trieu area attacked southwest toward Sept Pagdoes. This attack was stopped by French, who did not pursue Viet Minh into Dong Trieu area where they would have been exposed to two Viet Minh Divisions

in Luc Nam area. B. On 31 Mar, strong attacks were reported East of Dong Trieu by Viet Minh 308th Division. French were reported holding firm. Light Viet Minh attacks against Vinh Yen were storacd by French. Latest Viet Minh moves indicate they may next strike East of Quang Yen coal mines.

C. Only harassing action reported North and West of Hanoi during week. High French officials are reportedly considering possibility that current Viet Winh action may have purpose of covering entrance of Chinese Communist "Volunteers" into fight.

Comments Present Viet Minh attards appear to be in some force. It is believed that further attacks will develop. 0-2 continues to give Chinese Communist forces in vicinity of Indo-China border capability of intervention in Indo-China without further warning.

Comment: C=2 estimate Communist field forces along coast from Shanghai to Canton is 385,000; figure from Shanghai to Swatow is in general agreement with G=2 order of battle. While it must be granted sufficient shipping is available to Chinese Communist with which to launch limited attack, such move is regarded as highly unlikely in view of probability of failure with resultant loss of both shipping and troops involved. G=2 concurs with reporting officer's estimate of unlikelihood of limited attack in near future.

According to report received by United States Counsel General Hong Kong, CCF Command Korea has reported that UNS Air Force has fearsome power cause casualties and seriously affect morale of troops who may be forced lie prostrate all day under air attack without daring raise their heads. Report further stated Peking had decided send 30 to 50 jets and small number other planes fly regularly over Korea to raise spirits of troops. Since, however, 80 percent of experienced pilots are hired Soviet personnel they will not be allowed enter dangerous areas or engage in combat due to possibility of being shot down over UN controlled area thereby giving rise to international complications.

up to division size during first half of World War II, but their combat record was generally poor and none were of mongoloid races. Such national units were completely eliminated shortly after war and Soviet present policy is to scatter men of minority nationalites throughout army. There is no record of formation of any mongoloid units, based on racial characteristics rather than nationality. Reinforcement capabilities of mongolian type personnel from Soviet Amred Forces is estimated 100,000 to 150,000 men. Few are trained in technical skills which Chinese communist also lack. So far as known, no separate Soviet Mongoliant units exist. Since present policy is mixture as opposed to segregation, any mongolian units would have to be specially formed, and if wholly mongol, they probably would be understaffed in good officers and specialists. It is doubtful if more than five well-trained divisions of mongoloid Soviets could be formed now.

Peoples Republic of Outer Mongolia, considered by Seviets as a separate puppet, has an army of some 30,000 mem. This force, which has some token mechanized elements and an air arm of sorts, could be reinforced by outer mongolians and other mongoloid personnel to a strength of 100,000 effectives in a relatively short time. However, commitment by Seviets of such an expanded ower mongolian army in Korea would certainly excite Chinese Communist suspiction of ultimate Soviet motives. An equal effort expanded in direct material aid to Chinese Communists and North Koreans probably would be considered more desirable by CCF and Soviets.

REUR B. If Soviet mongolian units were to be used in Korea, they probably would be formed in Soviet Far East, perhaps around Ulanude, capital of Buryat-Mongol autonomous republic. Personnel would be brought from units chefly within the USSR, so as to maintain security. If outer mongolian army were to serve as vehicle of mongoloid reinforcement, such units would be formed up probably in outer mongolia, around Ulan Bator (Urga), and in Eastern outer mongolia where former Soviet military installations exist.

Although some mongoloids may be employed as "Volunteers", it is considered that they would make no advantageous contribution



It is considered that neither determination of suitability of areas on Korean Peninsula or off-shore islands which might be utilized under proposed plan of Geneva Zones Orgn or recommendation of suitable areas for consideration can be made until specific conditions and details of opn of proposal have been agreed upon and announced.







These elm ident themselves from an unk Army Gp of 1st Fld Army. Contg repts have indicated presence elm 1st Fld Army in Korea. Most persistant mention by PWs and agents has been of 19th Army Gp, 1st Fld Army and to a lesser extent of 28th Army Gp, 2d Fld Army. Since 25 Mar, 19th Army Gp with 63d, 64th and 65th CCF Armies as components, has been carried as believed to be in Korea but unloc. (END FEC-4)


Comment: Prev repts indicating move of 9th CCF Army Gp across Yalu River into Manchuria dur late Dec 50 and Jan 51, poses possibility that above reptd action was in progress earlier than stated. This is 1st rept associating Japanese pers with 9th CCF Army Gp, and it believed that if above action occurred, it was accomplished prior to 9th CCF Army Gp's recommittment along 38th Parallel. The units that have Soviet equip and atchd Arty and Tk Units are believed possibly to have relationship to prev reptd TF Jnits, the actual orgn of which unk.

PW further stated that CCF tactics dur curr phase were to be as fol: If UN forces driving N from Seoul, were found to be sufficiently weak, the CCF forces would allow them to penetrate as far N as Tongduchon, in vic CS 2998. then, 39th, 40th. 42d and 50th CCF Armies (Corps) would atk from E and 27th, 60th and 66th CCF Armies (Corps) would atk from W. If however, UN forces are stronger than expected, the CCF will retreat N of 38th parallel and def. Comment: Such a plan described above might conceivably be in process execution but no definite conclusions can be drawn now, pending further confirmation. Mentioning of 60th CCF Army (Corps) indicates 60th Army (Corps), 18th CCF Army Gp, might possibly be loc somewhere within operational distance of front line; however, pending further confirmation, 60th CCF Army (Corps) not yet accepted.
