

AP Washington 28 Dec: State Dept officials conceded tonight that the tug of war between the US and the Soviet Union over Korea has almost hopelessly stalled chances for early unification of that country and has resulted in a bitter struggle in which Russia has some advantage. The officials also reported, in a NBC radio program, that American aims in Korea have reached a critical point, with complete defeat in prospect unless food and rehabilitation are supplied promptly in the American Zone. Edwin M Martin, Chief of the Division of Japanese and Korean Economic Affairs, declared that "All of the Far East is watching the performance of 'The American way' in Korea. The deciding factor between success and failure, he added, can be our ability to get supplies to Korea during the next year. If we are penny-wise on this, we will be pound-foolish regarding our position in the Far East." Hugh Borton, Chief of the Division of Japanese Affairs, predicted that since American aims of a year ago to unify Korea quickly and get out had fallen through, the US would have to stay for a long time and at considerable cost. He strongly implied that the reason for continued American occupation is that if American Forces did not stay, Russian Forces would overflow the entire country. Mr Borton said the American program calls for



.....On this anniversary of the Moscow Declaration once again I would like to bring to the attention of the Big 3 Foreign Ministers the following suggestions for the fundamental solution of their problems in Korea:

In order to reestablish unified Economic and Political development the unnatural boundary at the 38th parallel should be removed immediately and unconditionally.

2. A Korean Oppression in Korea without any interference from the Soviet and American Commands.

3. Korea is not an enemy Nation and occupation is not necessary. Therefore, all Soviet and American Armed Forces should be withdrawn simultaneously and immediately from Korea.

4. The Provisional Govt should have sole right to select such Foreign Advisers and Technicians as Kores may need in rebuilding her national life and to dismiss those who do not properly serve Koreas national interest.

Sale of Army generated scrap is subj. The Office of War Mobilization and Reconversion has certified to a critical shortage of ferrous and nonferrous scrap metal in the US and has requested that all future sales of such Army generated scrap be made exclusively to persons who will undertake to ship the scrap to the US, to the extent that this can be done without substantial sacrifice of revenue to the Government. On 24 Dec the Dept of State amended FIC Regulation 8 to permit the importation into the US of surplus property in the form of ferrous and nonferrous scrap metal.

However, under provisions of War Assets Administration Regulation 17, certain non-ferrous metals are required to be stock piled or can be sold only on allocation to satisfy a civilian deficiency. Details have not been completed to cover the sale of all non-ferrous metals, but are expected to be forthcoming within a short time. Additional info concerning sale of some of the strategic and critical materials listed in Walk. Assets Administration Regulation 17 will be furnished

you at a later date.

effective upon receipt of this message, sales on a competitive bid basis and deliveries of ferrous scrap metal will be made only to those persons who will contract to return such scrap to the US for use in the US economy. The opinion is expressed here that it will not be economical for prospective buyers to attempt to return small quantities of scrap to the US. Scrap should be accumulated until minimum ship load quantities are available before offerings are made. No ferrous scrap will be returned to the US at Army expense.

Department to sell this scrap without substantial sacrifice of revenue to the Government, it is requested that bids be analyzed carefully. The average of past prices paid to you for similar scrap, and estimates of consincurred by the Army in the sale of such scrap, should be obtained and compared with bids made by buyers for return to the US. If bids by buyers for return to the US are not reasonably comparable with past prices obtained, current bids should be submitted to the War Department for decision before awards are made.

Part 1. With the exception of approximately 150 dependents consisting chiefly of those who have requested deferments, no backlog exists for shipment to ETO. Port calls for either air or water transportation have been issued by NYPE for all dependents on the Dec priority list.

Part 2. On the ETO Jan list, port calls have been issued for all adults travelling without children, and the completion of their movement from NYPE is expected by 10 Jan. Port calls have been issued for all dependents travelling with children between the ages of 2 and , and through priority nbr 302 for dependents travelling with children from 6 months to 2 years. It is expected that the final shipment of all dependents on the Jan priority list will be completed by approximately 20 Jan.

Part 3. There is no change in the movement fore ast for Japan. Movement of dependents on Dec list is expected to be completed in Jan, plus approximately 50% of Jan list.





Kim Il Sung, Mussolini like North Korea Communist Leader, is reported by refugees to have gone to Moscow to discuss the advantages of establishing an autonomous "Peoples Republic," which he would lead. Kim, who adopted the name of an aged Korean revolutionary here, is a vigorous man of about 35, selected by the Russians for his present post a year ago. In Northern Koreas name he already has executed at least 2 foreign agreements on international treaty level. The first involved the opening of a direct telegraph line to Moscow from Pyongyang, the Northern capital. The other was an agreement with Manchuria to exchange Northern Koreas plentiful hydro electric power for grains, fuel, and raw materials

Despite objections from both Rightists and Leftists, the American Occupation Force has kept its promise to give Southern Korea virtual self govt by the years end. The Interim Legislature now in session here represents the first step toward popular rule in the Southern Zone.


Christian Science Monitor 16 Lec: Washington lately has received numerous reports, both official and private, that suggests no lessening of tension and strife in Korea. Over the weekend Edwin W Pauley, President Truman's special reparations envoy, disclosed (in reviewing his inspection trip through the Soviet Zone in Korea) that there were indications Russia aimed to force a Moscow dominated government on all of Korea. Simultaneously, the War Dept, making one of its periodic statements on conditions in the southern (or American) Zone, reported increased labor strife and political violence, with independence and unification apparently as far off as ever. A day or two prior to these disclosures Syngman Rhee, Chief of the powerful Democratic Party in southern Korea, now in Washington to plead for immediate Korean independence in at least the American Zone, warned of a popular explosion if the Allies do not free and unify his country quickly. Almost as if anticipating this demand, Acting Sec of State Dean Acheson earlier that same day had declared emphatically that US Forces would stay on in southern Korea until Allied promise of a unified, free, and independent Korea had been achieved. It is armarent here, from all these reports, that peace and prosperity, unification and freedom for Korea are no nearer today than they were the day Japan surrendered. If it is true, as Mr Pauley suggests, that Soviet activities in northern Korea are aimed at eventual domination of all the country, it is equally right to infer from Mr Acheron's remarks that Washington will never accept such an eventuality.

Private firms and individuals in such countries may negotiate imports and exports through USCC, subj of course to pertinent import, export, and exchange regulations. Such firms should communicate with USCC in Wash DC either through regular diplomatic or consular channels or directly.

3. Govt to which you are accredited should be advised of these policies and procedures. If such govt designated a dept, ministry, or other agency through which its Nationals may negotiate sales and purchases with SCAP, that govt should so inform dept, SCAP, gen public. Thereafter either authorized agency or SCAP may initiate correspondence directly with other and begin flow of inquiries and info which necessarily precede trade transactions. In event a govt prefers to have all or most negotiations relating to trade with Japan handled by having its Nationals deal through US Commercial Company, Dept, SCAP, and gen public should be informed to this effect.

"4. A govt which maintained a diplomatic or consular mission in Japan before war or which can reasonably anticipate a considerable volume of trade with Japan during next few years but which has not yet established a liaison mission or trade representative in Tokyo should be advised that an inquiry re possiblity of sending missions and trade representatives to Tokyo should be addressed to dept either through you (in which event you should fwd to Wash and Tokyc simultaneously) or through its Wash mission. All such requests will be fwd to SCAP, who has possibility of determining when arrangements can be made to accomodate add missions.

In contrast to Manchuria, where he said the Russians had carted away enough machinery to wreck the industrial plant; Mr Pauley found industry in operation in the Soviet Zone of Korea.

NY Herald Tribune 15 Dec: A wave of strikes, and attempt to assassinate the head of a major political party and very little industrial recovery were high lights of a report by General Douglas MacArthur today on Korea during September. Despite the difficult period, Koreans were told that they should assume more governmental responsibilities and that American Occupation authorities would act henceforth only as advisers. Others included temporary suspension of 3 newspapers and an address by Lt Gen John R Hodge, American Commander, warning Koreans of political motives behind a Sept railway strike. Hodge said the strike was "Fomented by agitators to discommode and discredit the American Forces in Korea."



The South Korea Coalition Committee recommended only one Han Kook member to Hodge for inclusion among 45 appointees to the 90 member assembly. The other 45 are elective. Political observers said the Han Kooks, having saved face, could be expected to join the assembly soon.

Christian Science Monitor 11 Dec: Moscow radio has stepped up its radiocasts to Korea in recent weeks in an apparent attempt to convince the Koreans that all would be well if Korea were unified under Soviet guidance. The Daily Korean language radiocasts, relayed by a Komsomolsk transmitter from Moscow, are believed to be widely heard in Korea. They paint the American policies in Southern Korea in the blackest possible way and claim that in the Soviet Occupation Zone north of the 38 parallel all the ideals of Democratic Government are being realized.



More surprising still, one Communist leader in the Diet yesterdey assured the adoption of the Pauley report would wipe out 60 yrs of Japanese industrial progress. Meanwhile, the big industrialists are "Unruffled". These men who actually run industry will be entirely satisfied to have their worn out old machinery taken away to China and the Philippines if they can start all over with efficient modern equipment. 

and it has a good chance of winning, because American experts here say Pauley's report was based on such un-reliable figures and on such inaccurate forecasts that

it also is already obsolete.

NY Herald Tribune 10 Dec: One of the by products of the disputes between Russia and the US is the division of Korea into two zones, one dominated by the Russian Army and the other by the American Army. Normal trade between the two regions is impossible, with the result that Koreans in the South suffer for lack of goods plentiful in the North, and vice versa. In the Russian Area in the North Left Wing Koreans are being trained to run a Communist State, or something approaching such a State, while in the South Americans are trying to encourage the development of an entirely different system of Government. The results are tragic, as pointed out in a recent interview given to this newspaper by Miss Luisa Yim, President of the Central Womens College of Seoul. Miss Yim puts the blame for the division of her country on Communism and its adherents. She would be supported by most Americans who have followed developments in Korea, especially in view of the Russian refusal-which continued for a long period of time-to negotiate with any Korean leaders who did not represent the extreme left. It must be granted, bowever, that the US also has at least some responsibility for the sad state of affairs in Korea. One American error was to

send troops into Korea without a complement of experts familiar with the country, its language, its culture and its economy and political problems. A second was to depend so completely on American Army Officers in governing the Koreans and in negotiating with the Russians. These officers did not have the political experience and wisdom needed to deal with the strong desire for HFJILFLUNTRFTRM which existed throughout Korea-especially at a time when Red agitators were prepared to take advantage of the unrest. The net result was that American prestige suffered so greatly that the best friends of the US in Korea today are said to be the Korean police, who are used by our commanders to maintain ORDEHZLJSNBP Korea-and the same might be said for Japan-it seems unwise for the US to rely so completely on Army officers to perform political functions. A few American generals have a great political skill, but far more are babes in the woods when they encounter political situations.



Following quoted from Pearson column 9 Dec: "The WD and Gen MacArthur are supposed to be a part of the same Army team, but apparently one of them doesn't always believe in letting ' The right hand see what the left hand doeth!" When this column recently published the text of a secret telegram from MacArthur in which he proposed barring the special correspondents of the Christian Science Monitor, New York Herald Tribune, San Francisco Chronicle and others from Japan, an explosive statement was immediately issued by MacArthur. It was reported by The United Press from Tokyo as follows: "A spokesman for Gen MacArthur denied reports of columnist Drew Pearson that The Supreme Commander had banned several newspapers from Japan, including the Chicago Sun, New York Herald Tribune, PM and The San Francisco Chronicle. There is not the slightest truth in those assertions, a GHQ Public Relations Officer said.

Here is the United Press report from the War Dept: "The War Department declined comment on a report by Drew Pearson that Gen MacArthur banned representatives of several important newspapers from making a trip to Japan. Chicago Tribune 7 Dec Walter Simmons: "A charge by the newspaper columnist Drew Pearson that Gen MacArthur had banned the representatives of six american newspapers from a tour of Japan and Korea caused considerable mystification here today after being flatly denied by an official spokesman.

Pearson alleged that MacArthur had personally radioed the War Department banning representatives of the New York Herald Tribune, The Christian Science Monitor, The Chicago Sun, The San Francisco Chronicle, PM, and the Daily Worker. However, the Herald Tribune already has two correspondents here and neither has been asked to leave. The Monitor has one reporter, and the Chicago Sun has a correspondent, Mark Gayn, who is being recalled by his office as an economy measure. He also represented PM.

The Chronicle has had no representative here except thru various news services. The same is true of the Daily Worker, altho it is known that correspondents of Leftist sympathies have fed it from time to time items calculated to put the American Occupation of Japan in a bad light.

There was some speculation that Pearson's reference might have been to some junket of editors still in the planning stage. Because of the critical housing shortage in Japan and Korea such junkets have not been officially encouraged for some time.

Nothing so depresses working newspaper men on the spot as a descent of junketing editorial executives who monopolize official attention during their stay, receive courtesies unknown to locally based writers, and leave

"Please advise the Secretary that I am particulary interested in Drew Fearsons column for tomorrow relative to General Macarthurs alleged attitude toward the San Francisco Chronicle and certain other newspapers. I am having made and will forward to you by letter compilation of the Chronicles editorial comments upon the occupation of Japan from its inception. handedly I know that we have been most friendly to General Macarthur and most considerate of his problems. Furthermore since my return to my post as editor a year ago I have brought some direct knowledge of conditions in Japan to the leadership and policy direction of this newspaper because of my first hand acquaintance with post surrender Japan. As you may know I served on Admiral Spruances Staff in the early months of the occupation. If the Pearson Publication is accurate I feel stongly that I am due an apology from General MacArthur who may be Supreme Commander of Japan but nonetheless is just another American citizen charged with a heavy national responsibility. If he is capable of such misinterpretation as to evaluate my editorial conduct as constituting "Quackery and downright dishonesty" when rightly or wrongly our conduct has been consistently friendly to him and those others attempting to solve the American problems in Japan then I am concerned about what else he might be misinterpreting. As you know I have a deep and personal

interest and a considerable personal investment in the proper solution of the problems of the Pacific. Philadelphia Record 3 Dec. Drew Pearson Washington: A top secret cablegram has just been received
by the War Department from General MacArthur, banning
several important newspapers from taking a trip to
Japan. They include the New York Herald Tribune,
Christian Science Monitor, Chicago Sun, San Francisco
Chronicle, PM, and the Daily Worker.

In his telegram to the War Department, General MacArthur accused these papers of "downright quackery

and dishonesty."

MacArthur's cable was sent after the War Department Wired him, suggesting that a group of newspaper editors and correspondents make a brief tour of Japan and Korea as they recently did through Germany. The War Department, which is always loath to make suggestions to MacArthur, phrased the telegram in tactful language, proposing that it might be a good idea to let the press get a real picture of the occupation.

The Supreme Commander in the Pacific was not hesitant about replying. First he objected; then, when the War Department sent him a second cable, he reluctantly accepted-but turned thumbs down on the above mentioned

papers.

While many Army men would agree with MacArthurs opposition to the Daily Worker, which is an official Communist Publication, the War Department was surprised

at MacArthurs banning of the Christian Science Monitor, which is non partisan, and the New York Herald Tribune, which is Republican. The San Francisco Chronicle, also Republican, is edited by Paul C Smith, who had a brilliant war record in the Marine Corps and Navy, and who, during a recent trip through Germany, was vigorous in his

praise of the US Army's work.

MacArthurs top secret telegram follows in full: "CINCAFPAC, Tokyo-While continuing my doubts as to the advisability of the contemplated trip, in view of the insistence of the War Department, I will withdraw my objection. I would like to have an opportunity to pass upon those contemplated for selection before their invitation is accomplished. I believe the list should not include actual writers but should be limited to publishers and editors and should not include those connected with papers of known hostility to the occupation. Such papers are the Christian Science Monitor, Herald Tribune, Chicago Sun, San Francisco Chronicle, PM, Daily Worker and others of this stamp whose articles and editorials have not only been slanted but have approached downright quackery and dishonesty. Signed, MacArthur" note-Secretary of State Byrnes, talking to a closed door session of Kilgore Committee, recently said of General While that fellow has been doing a fine job, nevertheless he is a prima donna-because I have known him for 30 years-and when you send out there for costs (occupation costs), he is liable to fly the coop and raise a lot of sin.

A committee of Congress recently visited Korea, supposedly on an investigation trip. But what they didn't find out would fill a book -- a book, incidentally,

which may be one reason why General MacArthur is loath to have certain newspapermen visit in the Pacific.

Army censorship has hushed it up, but serious rioting has occurred in Korea, with about 50 civilian policemen killed in the city of Taegu. Their bodies were horribly mutilated by an arcused mob of natives. Police cruelty was given as the reason for the uprising. American MPs patrol the streets of Taegu and other cities, but are under orders not to get mixed in civilian brawls.

Meantime, factories are at a standstill because of lack of supplies and transportation, while part of the civilian population is on the verge of starvation. Insiders blame conditions on various factors, including the Russians and the blundering of Lieut Gen John R Hodge, US Commanding Officer.

The fact that our military and American Military Govt Detachments get three square meals a day and are billeted more or less comfortably, while Koreans must do without, also hasn't helped matters. Neither has the fact that Hodge is constantly feuding with the AMG Chief, Maj Gen Archer L Lerch, who is griped over alleged disscriminating against the AMG by Hodge in the allocation of food supplies and vehicles.

Lerch contends that he cannot do a satisfactory administrative job with what Hodge gives him, but is afraid to make an official complaint because Hodge is his superior officer. Korean conditions probably will not improve until either Hodge or Lerch is removed—— and insiders who know all the facts say it should be Hodge.

Another sore point is Hodges brass hat manner of handling enlisted men. The caste system is perhaps

worse in Korea than any other occupation area, and one thing which especially riles enlisted men is the disposition of liquor.

An officer can store as many bottles as he want's in his billet, and only the liquor left over after officers buy all they want is turned over to Enlisted Mens Clubs. As a result, the clubs frequently don't get any.

Gen Hodge, however, was hesitant about serving liquor to the Congressional Committee which inspected Korea. At first, he decided to serve only Suntory, a Jap brand of scotch, at a party in his private dining room at the Chosen Hotel in Seoul. At the last minute, however, he changed his mind, and requisitioned ½ a case of champagne, 3 bottles of port wine, and 3 bottles of sherry for the party.
