The Army said the decision was made in the light of the forthcoming election to form a new government in Korea with the prospect that American troops will be withdrawn from

the country.

NY Times Correspondent Richard J H Johnston, Seoul 28 Apr: The Joint South and North Korea political conference being held in Pyongyang, capital of the Soviet Zone, has announced the adoption of a resolution declaring: "Under no conditions under no circumstances and at no time will the people ever approve separate elections in South Korea. We will do our utmost to prevent holding of separate elections in South Korea." This action was reported by the Soviet controlled North Korea radio.... Among the organizations reported to have subscribed to the demand were the Independence Party of which Kim Koo, Rightist leader opposed to the election, is chairman. The revolutionary party of Dr Kim Kiusic, South Korean Moderate who also opposes the United Nations sponsored elections, is also listed as a signer. respected."

The Commission originally was charged by the UN General Assembly with arranging and observing elections throughout Korea, but the Russians boycotted the Commission and refused to permit its entrance into North Korea. ...

AP Tokyo 26 Apr: News of the Korean uprising in Kobe was not carried by major Japanese language newspapers. A censorship official of allied hq explained the stories were being held "temporarily" at the request of the US Eighth Army, troops of which quelled the

AP Yokohama 25 Apr: Brig Gen C A Willoughby, Intelligence Officer for Occupation Hq, said he regarded the Koreans as definitely dangerous. Lt Gen Robert L Eichelberger, US Eighth Army Commandant, arranged to fly to Kobe Monday for an inspection. Willoughby and Col George A Jones, US Eighth Army Intelligence Chief, agreed that Communists fronted the rioting. Jones characterized the trouble as the first "minor emergency" of the occupation. He cautioned, however, "lets not get the people back in the US all excited. We will handle it."...

"The Koreans decided they could not win in Osaka", said ColJones "so they shifted their attack to Kobe... The Koreans forced the governor under threats to release 70 Koreans who had been arrested earlier for resisting the School Law. We have ordered the rearrest of those 70 and all persons who intimidated the governor, mayor and police chief. When they intimidate public officials, the Koreans are running up against a basic precept of the occupation -- respect for law and order. I am convinced that Communists are behind these disorders, just as they are in Southern Korea. The school dispute

is a pretext. The Japanese police are not physically able to arrest them, so we are doing it. We are using our Kobe troops-negro troops."

Gen Eichelberger said use of the negro troops was not resented, as no color line exists in Japan. He added that the negroes who are regularly stationed at Kobe "are a darned good

outfit -- full of good soldiers; I'm proud of them."

AP Kobe 26 Apr: US Military Police today jailed 800 persons as an aftermath to weekend rioting by nearly 8,000 Koreans. American negro soldiers have stepped in swiftly to quell outbreaks here and in Osaka over a touchy education issue. It was the first time troops have been called out in the 2½ year old occupation. US Eighth Army Hq in Tokyo said 7 known Japanese Communists were among the 800 arrested. American intelligence officers said the disturbances were Communist inspired. A jailed Korean leader told the AP Japanese Communists took part in the riots... Hq termed resistence negligible "due to complete cooperation between Japanese officials and police and American Military Police."... Stern punishment for the leaders was ordered by Lt Gen Robert L Eichelberger, Commander of the Eighth Army...

Gen Eichelberger, described the rioting as "uncivilized," asserted that the Koreans have attempted to take the law into their own hands. He added: "There will be no compromise with subversive mob action."... Gen Eichelberger said the demonstration "degenerated into mob action to such an extent that civil govt ceased to function" and that such action "is inimical to occupation policies and to the security of the occupation.".... Gen Eichelberger said ringleaders of the riots will be tried in provost courts and by military commissions, instead of Japanese

courts.

"NY Times editorial 26 Apr: The firm hand of Gen MacArthur was promptly raised to crush the first serious rioting in Japan our forces have encountered since the occupation... Both before and since the war Korean immigrants have swarmed over the coast of Honshu by the tens of thousands. As a liberated people most of them seem to feel that they are not subject to the law of the land in which they have chosen to settle... Local police in Kobe were outnumbered and overcome.

Into this situation, described as "really dangerous," American troops moved swiftly.... The obvious lesson to be drawn from these disorders is that trouble invariably follows Communist infiltration.... But as long as General MacArthur and our occupation forces remain alert to act we need not become alarmed. It is

NY Herald Tribune editorial 25 Apr: American officials have put no obstacles in the way of political leaders in South Korea who want to attend a conference on the fate of the country held in the Russian Zone, even though the Soviet Union has opposed every effort to create a united Korea, except one that would be a Russian satellite. The opinion of American authorities is that it would be a good thing for men from South Korea to see how little the Reds have to offer. They hold to the theory that Americans who believe in democracy, despite all the mistakes they have made, have won more friends in South Korea than the Russians have in the North. The decision to clear the way for Koreans under American control to visit the Soviet Zone undoubtedly was wise.... A few leaders in Korea recognize what is at stake in the conflict between the US and Russia, but most of the Korean people do not...







"A. Any dissemination of political news by the DA must be made on an impartial and non-partisan basis. It is the duty of commanders to inform appropriate personnel of this policy and to supplement it where necessary.

in information concerning political matters within the United States. It is appropriate for the Army to make available to its personnel stationed outside the Continental United States sufficient current political information to enable them to vote intelligently.

"A. Federal funds. Any material which is paid for in whole or in part with federal funds or sponsored by the Federal dovt, when considered in its entirety, must not contain political propaganda obviously designated to affect the result of any election for federal office or obviously calculated to create bias for or against a particular candidate in any such election.

"(1) Overseas radio stations controlled by the Army are authorized to broadcast political news of a factual nature furnished by national recognized United States news services. Political news broadcasts will not include comment, criticism, snalysis or interpretation.

"(2) Shortwave broadcasting stations controlled by the Army are authorized to broadcast political news of a factual nature released by the State Department or by nationally recognized United States news services.



Japan of US cotton including cotton linters and waste.

"The credit will not become operative until the agreement has been executed both in the US and in Japan, Establishment of the credit resulted from discussions between the DA, Wash, DC, acting on behalf of SCAP, and commercial banks of which 3 have br offices in Japan. The Occupied Japan Export-Import Revolving Fund was established by SCAP for the purpose of providing a credit base and a means for financing, primarily on a self-liquidating basis, Japanese imports and exports of commedities and services which are required for the achievement of the objectives and policies of the occupation and accordingly transferred to the fund and its controller gold valued at approx US \$104,000,000, silver valued at approx US \$18,000,000 and cash US \$378,000.

The cotton to be financed under the credit will be purchased by means of bank ltrs of credit, opened upon application of the controller of the fund in favor of US cotton shippers. The controller may furn notes meturing from 30 days to 10 months from the dates of pmt of shippers' sight drafts with interest payable at rates varying from 25% to 32% per annum. It is expected that 40% of the textiles processed from the cotton financed under the credit will be consumed in Japan and that the remaining 50% will be sold in the customary pro-war Japanese export markets for dellars or currencies convert-

ible into dollare.



Old silver dollars that were quietly hidden instead of being turned in to the banks when China went off the silver standard 13 yrs ago are reappearing. . . With the National currency's value decreasing the peasants in some parts of Hunan refuse to accept notes for farm produce and insist on silver dollars or some other commodity of enduring value. . . Govt agencies are rather half heartedly attempting to prohibit the use of silver as currency and when an open exchange of metal in return for goods is discovered by the police they force the passessors to hand over the silver to the banks in return for notes at the rate of I dollar in currency to 1 silver dollar. This is the same thing as confiscation, since I chinese currency dollar is worth only a minute fraction of an American penny. . .

AP Nanking 19 Apr: With perfunctory clam the National Assembly today elected Generalissimo Chiang Kai Shek president of China, but a bitter battle was developing over the vice president. The incumbent, Sun Fo, appears to have govt party (Kuominteng) support. He is hotly opposed by Gen Li Tsung Jen. . . Gen Lis Managers said if he lost he would resign as director of Chiangs Peiping

Hq and would organize a reform movement. . .

NY Herald Tribune correspondent Christopher Rand, Shanghai 19 Apr: The delegates from China's racial minorities to the National Assembly will go home disappointed once more. According to minority representatives, their movement in 1946 was broken by a divide and rule tactics on the part of the Kuomintang management. Top Kuomintang leaders also teld them flatly that force is what counts in the modern world-that small peoples have to subordinate themselves completely to neighboring big peoples, and should resign themselves to the fact.

Although there are shining exceptions, China's leaders generally believe that their own type of civilization is superior.

NY Herald Tribune editorial 20 Apr: The meeting of the National Assembly in Nanking has produced no real change in the picture in China. Generalissimo Chiang Kai Shek has been reelected president, despite protestations that he did not want the job, and will be the Ist constitutional executive of the country. He will not only continue to hold his present office but will hold it with a grant of emergency powers that almost nullify the checks and balances of the new constitution. For a time, however, his proposal that be take an office of less prestige so that Dr Hu Shih could be elected president seemed to provide hope that a new spirit might prevail in Nanking, and that the effort to defeat the Chinese Communists with mil power alone might be abandoned. . . American observers of China who hope for the defeat of the Reds in the Civil War regard it as highly unfortunate that Chinese Liberals of great attainments such as Dr Hu, has so little influence in their country. These men, if they had power, should be able to provide an alternative to communism far more attractive than anything the Reds have to offer. While they are consulted now and then, their advice seems to be given less weight than that of generals and politicans notable only for long records of disastrous failure. When the Generalissimo proposed that Dr Hu be given the nations highest office and then, after a little argument, changed his mind the net result was to emphasize once more that talent is being wasted in China and that the outlook there certainly is not bright.





No deadline was set.

UP Wash Post, 15 Apr: Russia has begun putting pressure on American occupation forces in Southern Korea by threatening to cut off the zone's electric power, govt officials disclosed yesterday. . . . officials here said the Russian threats have been made indirectly through the Communist Puppet Tovt in Northern Korea.

AP Seoul, 14 Apr: Lt Gen John R Hodge, US Occupation Commander, last week called the proposed unity conference in the North a Soviet move toward gaining control of all Korea "by fair means or foul." In a press statement today, Hodge said that the registration of 8,000,000 adults, more than 90% of the total eligible in South Korea for the May 10 election, "gives the lie to the loud Communists and their

Dr Wang told the Assembly that the new US aid to China demonstrated the "fundamental soundness of Sino-American friendship" despite criticism of the Central Govt during the past 4 yrs. He said that much of the criticism was "legitimate," but added that some of it was the result of "malicious Communist propaganca," Like a nbr of other Chinese officials, Dr Wang indicated concern over recent developments, interpreted in govt circles as signs of a new US policy to build up Japan. . . .

New York Herald Tribune editorial 15 Apr: The trend of events in China is shown both by the bitter criticism of the Nanking Govt by members of the Nat Assembly, who were supposed to elect a president to serve under the new constitution and then meekly go home, and by the student strikes in the universities. Individua members of the Assembly, could have condemned the govt for inefficiency in the civil war. . . . What is happening confirms earlier evidence indicating that the govt has lost the support of many of the intellectual of China. The worst of it is that a good many of the intellectuals especially the younger ones, seem to be drifting toward outright support of the Communists. . . . Washington Daily News editorial 15 Apr: Gen Bradley told Congress yesterday that the cold war was likely to last a long time. "We can't conceive of Russia calling it off Within the next few years," he said. While a cold war is preferred to a shooting war, let it not be overlooked that there is one place on the globe where the cold war is hot. There is one nation that has been firing bullets at ommunist forces, and has been doing it for more than 2 yrs. It is China. . . : Communism is our acknowledged enemy, but we are not helping China beyond a nominal figure of \$570,000,000 to help retard the present rapid rate of economic deterioration and thus provide a breathing space." About a fifth of that we will let Chiang use for munitions during the coming year. If there is to be no more financial aid for China, there is another way we can help, probably even more effective. Chiang is instituting a new strategy, he reports, designed to free a maximum nbr of troops for offense egainst the Communists. We can furnish instructors and mil advisers to the Nationalist side-an urgent need, according to Gens Wedemeyer and Chennault, An American mission of nearly 1,000 is already in China, sitting in enforced idleness. They could lend a valuable tactical hand in the forthcoming campaign.






