NY Herald Tribune, AP Tokyo 13 Jan: Emperor Hirohito escaped prosecution as a war criminal on orders of the US JCOS. Copies of the order are available here. It was issued in Jan 46, as a part of the directive to General Douglas MacArthur to set up the International Tribunal which convicted Hideki Tojo and 24 other Japanese war leaders. At first it was classed as "top secret." Later it was down graded to allow defense attorneys for the 25 Class A Japanese war criminals to use it in their appeal to the Supreme Court of the US.

Specifically, it prohibited prosecution of the Emperor "pending receipt of a further directive." Reliable sources said no such further directive ever was received by General MacArthur. These sources said the decision not to prosecute Hirohito ... came from a US "governmental level," which was not further identified. The Chief of Staff then issued the order.

Trial evidence showed that Hirohito in the early fall of 41 became worried as to whether his admirals and generals, then preparing and rehearsing the Pearl Harbor sneak attack, had enough resources to carry out war. They reassured him. The International Tribunal President, Sir William Webb, of Australia, noted the many trials of evidence leading to Hirohito which were never followed up by the prosecution. He pointedly called Chief Prosecutor Joseph Kenan's attn to the fact that command responsibility rested with the Emperor.... Sir William

Wash Star, San Francisco 13 Jan: The Chinese Communist radio said today that Nationalist Gen Tu Li Ming could be punished as an example to other National leaders whom the Reds list as "war criminals."... The radio accused Gen Tu, Commander of Nationalist troops encircled south of Suchow, of using poison gas against the Communists in his attempts to get out of the trap.... Said the radio, as heard by the Associated Press listening post: "The Peoples Liberation Army gave him a last chance to save his skin, but he threw it away. This will serve as a good lesson to war criminals commanding Kuomintang troops besieged in Peiping, Tientsin and Tangku."...

Wash Star, AP Peiping 13 Jan: Chinese Communists have laid down specific conditions for the beginning of national peace talks, a source here said today.

He listed them as:

- 1-Removal of Generalissimo Chiang Kai Shek and Vice President Li Tsung Jen from office.
- 2--Scrapping of the Chinese constitution.
- 3-A mutual cease fire order with both sides holding their present positions.
- 4-Examination and punishment of "war criminals." Gen Chiang heads the Communist's list.
- 5-Establishment of a coalition govt with a 534 ratio-5 Communist members, 3 Kuomintang and 4 representing all other Chinese political parties.

The Communists, according to this source, apparently did not specify whether the Kuomintang referred to was the present party or the "Kuomintang Revolutionaries" as the Reds classify

Marshal Li Chi Sen and other Kuomintang dissidents.... This same source predicted that Gen Chiang would issue another statement in which he would resign the presidency and go to Formosa. He said this statement might be issued tomorrow. Observers say Nanking's efforts against localized agreements with the Reds obviously are aimed at giving the govt better bargaining power. It localized peace here, another there, could strip the govt of almost all of its remaining authority. Meanwhile, fighting continues here and at Tientsin...

Wash Star, AP: China's Ambassador Wellington Koo said today the Nationalist Govt will keep on trying for peace with the Chinese Communists as long as there appears a chance of getting it. He made the statement to reporters after a 30-minute conference with Under-Secretary of State Lovett at the State Dept.... Asked whether he discussed with Mr Lovett a reported request by China for "mediation" by the US and other big-powers. Dr Koo replied: "It is not in the nature of mediation that we have asked." He refused to amplify, but govt officials have indicated that China has asked advice as a possible step toward mediation....

NY Times, London 12 Jan: The British Govt has been conferring with the US over the question of the Chinese note requesting the views of the US, Britain, France and the Soviet Union on the internal crisis in China. While official quarters would make no comment... it was reported that Britain had now virtually agreed to frame her answer jointly with the US. The rejoinders of the 2 powers will be parallel, if not identical, and will point out in diplomatic terms that there is very little useful advice that they can furnish at this time....

NY Times Correspondent Henry R Lieberman, Nanking 12 Jan: The Communist North Shensi radio asserted tonight that the Communists had captured the 1st of the Kuomintang figures on their "War Criminal" list-Gen Tu Yu Ming, Commander of the 2d Army Groups that had been trapped southwest of Suchow. The broadcast said that Gen Tu had been seized at dawn on Monday while trying to escape disguised as an ordinary soldier....

There was no indication tonight of any major mil activity above the Yangtze River. A telegraphed report from Tientsin said, however, that the Communist artillery had started firing again at 1 PM today following the expiration of a 24 hr cease fire order. The city fathers were said to be still trying to win a local peace in negotiations outside the city....

The Navy and AF have shifted some echelons to Canton, Amoy and Formosa and a nbr of Defense Ministry Offs have received lv to evacuate their families but it is presumed that the mil agencies will retain larger staffs here than the civil organs. The new move to get non-essential civil servants to lv is interpreted

NY Times, Nanking 12 Jan: Mil sources here said today 2 of General Tu's leading Generals, Chiu Ching Chuan and Li Mi, were missing. These sources said that only 6,000 of his 180,000 starving troops had survived the 5 weeks encirclement and that they had been seen marching south to join other govt forces. The Communist rad also said that Nationalist troops had been wiped out in the suburbs of Peiping and said the city would be taken soon.

AP Nanking, Wash Star 12 Jan: Rad reports from Tientsin tonight said the Tientsin National Garrison has rejected a 3 point proposal for the surrender of that North China city to the Communists. The reports said the National force of 60,000 troops had agreed to give up the city of 3,000,000 if they were permitted to be evacuated "with light arms" through the port of Tangku, 27 miles from Tientsin. Some 16 ships were reported waiting off Tangku anticipating the removal of National troops if the Reds accept the proposal. The rad added that the Communists originally offered to accept the surrender of these terms....

The exact situation in Tientsin was still confused here, but it appeared the eventual surrender was being arranged under the pressure of the people's demands. The peace move by the people themselves at Tientsin may set the pattern for settlement of China's civil war on a national basis. It is obvious to observers here that the govt is not making any progress toward a negotiated end of hostilities. It is equally apparent that the 4 big powers ... will shy away from participation in a squabble which has brought only extreme unhappiness to outsiders who interfered.... (Under Secretary of State Lovett said today that the US has received a communication from the Chinese Govt, but that he could not disclose it's nature.... The Chinese Govt asked that the communication be kept in confidence, Mr Lovett said).

AP Wash Star, Peiping 12 Jan: Trustworthy reports from Tientsin today said Communist besiegers had refused to discuss a compromise and demanded complete surrender of the North China industrial city. The Tientsin sources said 4 members of the city council asked the Reds for a cease fire order. The Communists sent them back with a demand for complete surrender of Nationalist forces in the Tientsin Area, these sources said....

Chicago Tribune correspondent Walter Simmons, Tsingtao 12 Jan: Altho its mission in North China is virtually complete, the US Navy shows no sign of leaving this former German Base 170 air miles south of Russian held Port Arthur. Indications are that the Chinese Communists will make no mil attempt to dislodge the American force here but will rely on a political offensive when and if the Chinese Nationalist Government collapses. From a strictly military view, the Navy's position here is precarious....

Mil experts feel that 2 divisions of Marines would be the minimum needed to hold the Tsingtao Peninsula for any length of time against a determined Communist attack.... Altho no Americans here have any desire to kill Chinese, even Communists, Marine Offs are confident they could make a good account of themselves if attacked. The probable result would be a mass slaughter of Communists. The numerous ships in the harbor would help with gun fire. Land based Marine planes are available and carriers are within steaming distance. From a long range viewpoint, these measures couldn't cope with the quarter million man Army with which the Communist probably would attack....

Observers also believe the Communists have no need for the port city since they have no ships. Meanwhile, they are believed to be obtaining ammo thru illicit trade with Tsingtao. Travelers report seeing Communist truck caravans moving north from Nantsun, 35 miles north of here. Govt troops have diverted so much gasoline into the local black market that prices are 20% below regular retail rates. With the departure of the last Naval depts this week...

The Navy virtually has completed it's mission of protecting Americans in the area. Only 170 remain in Tsingtao as contrasted with 500 Soviet citizens. Training of the Chinese Navy ... is all but finished and most units have sailed for southern ports. This leaves the Navy's current mission somewhat obscure and there is much speculation as to the top secret policy directive locked in Vice Adm Oscar Badgers safe.

Wash Star, 12 Jan: Korea will be a main bulwark against Communism in the FE and should have along with China "more positive" help from the US. George F Mott, former Inspector Gen of the US Army Forces in Korea told the Wash Club yesterday. Mr Mott, Col in the Army Reserve, warned against Soviet "enslavement" of the Orient if the US lets Asia go to Communism by default. Describing Korea as an "operating democracy," he suggested additional ways for the US to help that government. Economic aid, cultural and technical cooperation, "objectivity" in reporting news and views of Korea to the rest of the world, agreements or treaties with America for "appropriate military alliance and assistance under certain circumstances."

NY Herald Tribune correspondent Allen Raymond, Tokyo 12 Jan: The Communist sweep in Asia is providing great political capital for Sanzo Nosaka, principal strategist of the Japanese Communist Party, in the current campaign to elect a new DIET. This correspondent followed Nosaka through 4 of his Tokyo rallies last night. He never neglected to warn his listeners that a new China is arising which is going to be Red and that the destiny of Japan is linked inevitably with that of the rest of Asia.

"China's cooperation with Japan is absolutely necessary for any recovery of this country, Mr Nosaka said. It is absolutely necessary to our trade. The new China that is arising will not be the old China. It will be a Communist China, and it will need Japanese products, machinery and goods. In my talks with Chinese Communist leaders when I was in that country they told me that they would never cooperate with a Japan which is linked to imperialist powers. They told me they would deal only with a peaceful democratized Japan, and certainly would not welcome any dealings with an anti Communist Japan. Once the Communists in Japan get a plurality of seats in the Diet, China and Japan will ready to join hands. So, this coming election day, Jan 23, is a day of destiny." Mr Nosaka's skilled campaigning is only 1 of the reasons why many conservatives here call him "the most dangerous man in the country." Trained 8 yrs in Moscow and 8 in Communist China, he is a polished platform performer . . .

Mr Nosaka even conceded that his Communist party is far from perfect. He counseled his listeners to get in and help it, since he said "we are all poor people and should help each other." In a submerged and squalid workmen's district he told his listeners that the cause of all their misery was war, and that it was brought about by the Zaibatsu (the industrial and financial combine) and the Bureaucracy, who are still in power behind Premier Shigeru Yoshida as they were behind former Premier Hotochi Ashida. . . the Communists, and the Communists alone, always fought against the war, and were killed and thrown into prison for opposing it. In the recent Diet, he maintained, the 4 Communist members were the real power which started the graft investigations that have scandalized the country. His major speech on the sweep of Communism in Asia was delivered in a fine residential district where his audience included a fair proportion of university students. "As China goes, he said, so also will Burma and Indonesia go. The world is changing. It is turning Communist, particularly in Asia. They accuse the Communists of wanting to destroy. Our motive is not to destroy, but to build. That is shown in Eastern Europe, where recovery moves without corruption. That is where recovery is succeeding."

Too smart to become involved in direct attack upon the occupation forces and get himself jailed, as have 10 of his colleagues, Mr Nosaka fights the occupation only by indirection. He minimizes all accomplishments for Japan's recovery. He emphasizes demands which are being made upon the people for

Rhee bitterly attacked North Korean leaders after denouncing as "lies" stories published in Moscow that his govt gave American's control of 30% of South Korea's industry.

NY Times correspondent Lindesay Parrott, Tokyo 11 Jan: Japanese political experts, who have been traveling to all parts of the country on the campaign trips of the maj candidates now predict that the Communist Party will more than double its previous vote in the general election on Jan 23. It is expected to send at least 3 times as many rep's to Diet's Lower House in 49 as it did in 47.... These are simply the opinions of men who may be in a position to know, but a number of reasons are ascribed for the conclusion that the extreme left is growing somewhat stronger in Japan.

First, there is much better orgn of the Japanese Communist Party.... It is also clear that the Japanese Communist Party now has plenty of money to spend.... As the Diet's committee which has investigated all other party funds has never touched the Communists, the source of this money is unknown officially.

A second reason given for presumptive increase in Communist vote is increasing disgust of electorate with Socialist Party... younger voters who supported the Socialists last time are now expected to switch to Communists, particularly if they lack real party affiliation of any sort.

Chicago Tribune correspondent Seymour Topping, a Communist Army Hq north of the Hwai River, China 8 Jan: Chinese Communist soldiers are singing victory songs and talking of the day China will enjoy American mechanical wonders. Their admiration for things American was summed up in the words of one Communist off. He told me: "Twenty years after, all China is Communist, we shall have automat restaurants." He described their wonders to me from pictures he had seen. Communist soldiers showed equally great admiration for American gadgets. They had me repeatedly exhibit my camera and baggage and I gave demonstrations on my typewriter.... On the other-hand deep resentment was indicated for American assistance given the National Govt. This was particularly true for American planes. Judging by Communist reactions, the planes are an important morale factor, if not a great combat asset, in favor of the Nationalists. No noticeable hostility to me as an individual American was ever demonstrated. The Red soldiers showed great curiosity about the US and the life of its people.... The Communist soldiers believe American workers solidly support them. One read to me from a Communist newspaper of a demonstration in Washington against aid to Chiang Kai Shek. The CO of the last Communist Unit I visited wrote in my notebook as a farewell memento, "we would like to fight to the end with our American friends for Democracy, freedom and happiness." As I left, he said, "Goodby, I will see you in Nanking."

but the date they expect to reach the Nationalist capital is far later than the time predicted for most observers in Nanking. Only a few of the Red trps spoke of occupation of Nanking, and Nationalist surrender as early as this spring.... In dozens of villages dotting these flatlands, Communist soldiers signal the dawn and the beginning of drill sessions by singing in chorus, "on to Nanking and strike down Chiang Kai Shek." In leisure hrs while they stomp about fires warming themselves, they sing verses in praise of Communist China and Russia. One Jr Red off asked me, "Why is it that our trps can defeat Kuomintang units that outnumber them, have better equip, and support of airplanes given by your govt." He answered his own question: "Because they dont want to fight."

NY Times correspondent Henry R Lieberman, Nanking 11 Jan: Tientsin...was written off as virtually lost here tonight following a rad-telephone report that Communist Gen Lin Piao had accepted an appeal to issue a cease fire order in return for peaceful surrender.... According to a reliable source, reached directly by long distance telephone, govt artillery was silenced at noon today. Communist guns, he said had actually stopped shooting at 6 PM yesterday. Early this morning, he added, 4 city councilors who had gone out as peace emissaries to talk with Gen Lin Piao returned bearing the news that he had agreed to "try and bring the siege to an end through a peaceful solution." The councilors, carrying white flags, crossed the lines on Saturday with the approval of the garrison comdr. Asked to comment on this report, a Nationalist source said here tonight that Tientsin was "gone."... After the councilors returned to Tientsin the telephone source said a report was published-presumably with the garrison comdr's approval under conditions of censorship-reading as follows:

"The Communists have appreciated the courageous action of the councilors and have promised to attach particular attn to their visit. According to the Communist Comd, the Communist Army has no intention of making any attempts on lives and property of the 2 million inhabitants of Tientsin. The Communist Army agrees to undertake peace talks and hopes that the councilors will continue their efforts to spare the people of Tientsin all difficulties and privations. In answer to their appeal, 24 hr cease fire has been ordered." Meanwhile it was confirmed here that resistance had ceased among Gen Tu Yu Ming's 2d Army Grps that had been encircled on the Honan Anhwei border southwest of Suchow.... The activities of the four Tientsin councilors who mediated between the Communists and the Nationalists involved a singular pattern for surrender negotiations in connection with Communist attacks against maj cities. Their venture has aroused all the more interest

in view of the manifest widespread peace sentiment among many civic grps in cities still held by the Nationalists.... The control Yuan, official branch of the govt, issued its own peace appeal today, urging both sides to "think of the people" and issue nationwide cease fire orders.

AP NY Times, Shanghai 11 Jan: Claire L Chennault...expressed willingness today to lead a new American volunteer grp for China. ... The retired American maj gen expressed belief such an air grp could still be effective. Mr Chennault said in an interview that Generalissimo Chiang Kai Shek had not asked for such help. In fact, he said Generalissimo Chiang had not replied to an offer of some veterans of the US 14th AF to return to China and fight again.

NY Times, Peiping 11 Jan: Here in Peiping the sound of sporadic firing has been heard for the last 5 days. Fighting was in progress this afternoon about a mile outside the northwest city gate, according to one neutral observer who went outside the gate.... A political settlement by Nanking is still looked for here. Reports of political moves are taking maj space in the local Chinese press.

NY Times correspondent Benjamin Welles, London 11 Jan: The British Govt has received, and is studying, a note from the Chinese Govt requesting Britain's views on how China can solve her internal crisis, it was learned here on good authority. Similar notes have been sent to the US, the Soviet Union and France, it is understood. While official British quarters refused to comment on the matter-or even to admit that such a note had been received-it was reported that the Chinese Govt had not requested official "mediation" in China's internal affairs by outside powers but rather good advice as to what the Chinese Govt should do to make peace with the Chinese Communists....

NY Times, 12 Jan: Peace in China depends upon the Communists, Dr V K Wellington Koo, Chinese Ambassador to the US, declared last night at a dinner given by the Columbia College Alumni Association at the Biltmore Hotel.... Addressing more than 400 alumni of the college, Dr Koo warned:

"Whether peace will come to China now depends upon the Communists. If the Chinese Communists are not mere tools of International Communism but true patriots of China and like their fellow countrymen equally jealous of China's freedom and sovereignty; if they are really solicitous of the welfare of the Chinese people, then they cannot turn a completely deaf ear to the peace proposals. If they do, they cannot disclaim full responsibility for the continuance of the war in China."

Dr Koo emphasized that China was the key to Asia. The Chinese situation, he said, "is fraught with dire possibilities." "If China falls entirely under Communist control," he said, "it is certain that the repercussions in Asia will be far reaching. ... Gen Eisenhower made a brief speech in praise of Dr Koo.... The Gen said he particularly admired Dr Koo "as an undying and implacable foe of Communism." John Foster Dulles also spoke briefly, expressing his admiration of Dr Koo....

NY Times correspondent Walter Sullivan, Canton 11 Jan: A federation of the South China provinces might delay a Communist advance to the southern borders of China for 2 years, according to foreign observers here. Such is the maximum delay that they believe possible, given the best "breaks" and assuming extensive American aid. Yet they see no sign that such aid will be forthcoming. Observers here hold that the Communists take seriously the possibility of such a federation if Nanking falls. The lengthy New Year Message broadcast by the Chinese Communist rad is believed to have been aimed at the US, and particularly at Congress, in its consideration whether it is feasible to halt or slow up the southward march of the Red armies. That broadcast trumpeted the Communists determination not to pause at the Yangtze but to follow through. It cited alleged American plans to muster resistance "south of the Yangtze River and in the distant border provinces." A possibility that is being widely discussed here is that the South China "Kwangsi clique," which includes some of China's most able generals, might retire, taking over the southern provinces on their own.... The strength of a South China federation would lie in the geographical distance of the Red armies from the southern borders and coasts, at present 1,000 miles. Its weakness would be the presumptive mil superiority of the Communists and the precarious economy of its key province, Kwangtung.... Unlike the northern cities, there are few if any starving persons. Hence Canton is politically stable compared with other centers. But, it lacks coal. Governor Soong hopes within a few months to have a rail outlet for the mines near the Hunan

Christian Science Monitor, AP Tokyo 5 Jan: A Russian general has been invited to inspect Japan's Police Force, which the Soviets charge "constitutes a real menace to the reestablishment of the Japanese armed forces." William Sebald Chairman of the Allied Council for Japan, extended the invitation Jan 5 to Lt. Gen. Kuzma Derevyanko, Russian member of the Four Power Council. Gen. Derevyanko said he could not at the moment answer the invitation. The Russian member previously had said the "systematic growth of the Japanese Police Force... may lead to creation of a new threat on the part of Japan against international peace and security." Mr. Sebald replied that he was "greatly surprised" that Gen. Derevyanko should refer to an "alleged rearmament of Japan" through a police force....

Chicago Tribune correspondent David Boguslav, Manila 8 Jan: The Philippines, which is Japanese conscious, has another headache, this one coming from her American brothers over on the Pacific Coast-traditional suppliers of the islands. The Filipino's do not want Japanese goods. They have said so in the halls of the Far Eastern Commission in Washington... nevertheless, they are faced with the ever increasing flow of things the Japs are making... certain importers in the Philippines-Chinese mainly, with some Filipino's-gempted by the huge profits to-be made on these cheap Japanese goods, have elected to side-step public opinion. The way they do it is this: Over on the Pacific Coast... American business men buy bulk shipments of Japanese manufactured gadgets. When they arrive they are relabeled. Then they are shipped to the Philippines, with the marking "made in

Now, the Philippine Customs Commissioner, Alferdo Le Leon, charges that US shippers on the Pacific Coast are labeling goods they buy from Japan as "made in the USA" and sending them to the Philippines. De Leon has ordered his inspectors and appraisers to be on the alert.

Chicago Tribune reported John H Thompson 9 Jan: In 3 yrs of occupation, the letters written by Japanese people to Gen Douglas MacArthur have changed significantly. They reflect a growing appreciation of democracy, and altho much more numerous now, are a distinct break for the Nipponese mail man. ... Beryl Kent, a staff writer of the FEC, wrote that most of the letters exhibited a growing understanding of what freedom meant.... Almost every letter urged MacArthur to remain in Japan...each day's mail indicates the Japanese are quick to respond to any acts of kindness such as American relief efforts in the Fukui earthquake disaster.... Others recently have shown an increasing interest in religion. Many have urged a wider teaching of Christianity, contending that if Japan had been a Christian nation the war would never have been started....

Chicago Tribune, AP Manila 10 Jan: Policy differences are driving a wedge between Filipino defense leaders and their American mil advisers. The Advisory Grp, headed by Maj Gen Albert M Jones, has taken the position that the Philippines would not be an area of actual combat in the event of war, and that the chief danger would lie from within.... The General's recommendation is reported to have offended Secy of Defense Ruperto Kangleon and the Phil Army brass. Jones suggested that less money be spent on a large standing army to repel invaders. The Filipino's interpreted this as favoring abolition of the army altogether. Efforts were made in Washington to have Jones removed.... But Jones is planning to fly to Tokyo Jan '9 to confer with Gen MacArthur. He may then continue to Washington. The Armed Forces are opening their budget hearings today.... They are seeking an increase of 10,000,000 pesos over this year. They contend that the US has not fulfilled its promises under the Mil Assistance Act. Jones has been blamed for this.

Washington Star, AP Nanking 10 Jan: Chinese legislators still in the capital joined the peace debate today at an informal meeting in which several Kuomintang Party members demanded immediate end of the Chinese Civil War. The meeting was held as unofficial but usually reliable sources reported the Nationalists had asked for Big Four mediation of the war. Liu Fu Tung...demanded that members of the legislature to to Yen-an and Manchuria to talk directly to the Communists....

Threatened with expulsion from the party for disloyalty, Liu shouted: "What about those people who send their gold bars to Hong Kong? Is that allegiance to the party?" Northeastern rep Mo Ru Chu said the lawmakers had a legal right to discuss the problem of peace and "we should say what the people want us to say and not just yes, yes to the govt."...

But the legislators failed to reach agreement on unified action. Many legislators already have left Red threatened Nanking. Former Premier Chang Chun returned to Nanking from Central China with a report which may help Chiang Kai Shek decide his future moves....

Meanwhile the foreign office remained silent on its reported request to the Big Four for their help in ending the war....

Nanking and Shanghai reports said pilots who flew supplies to be dropped to the trapped National soldiers were turned back and ordered not to drop the supplies. These pilots said heavy white smoke indicated an intense artillery duel with phosphorous shells being used by both sides....

In Formosa, meanwhile, the new Governor, Gen Chen Cheng, said the island will be used as a stronghold against the extension of the Communist sphere in Asia. In his first news conference as governor, Chen, former overall comdr of Nationalists trps, said

NY Times correspondent Henry R Lieberman, Nanking 10 Jan: The final liquidation of Gen Tu Yu Mings 2d Army grps southwest of Suchow, where they had been trapped with insufficient food and ammo for more than a month, was claimed tonight by the Communist rad. The Communist broadcast said that resistance had ended at 10 o'clock this morning after a 3-day Red assault. ... There was no immediate govt confirmation of the Communist claim....

NY Times, Peiping 10 Jan: In the 5 days since the Communist ultimatum to the govts North China trps was issued over the North Shensi rad, the Communists have intensified their attacks on Tientsin. Observers here believe that the Reds intend to take that city before pressing an all-out offensive on Peiping. With communications between Tientsin and Peiping now reduced to rad telephone and telegraph-with even airplane connections severed...it is almost impossible to get sufficient details of the fighting to evaluate the 3 day old battle in Tientsins environs. Todays reports from Tientsin state that Communist attacks east, west and south of the city have continued. The govt has "withdrawn" from the east arsenal several miles outside the eastern city limits.

Following story Court-Martial Pfc Donald L Baughman in Tokyo carried on UP wires from Connellsville, Pa, today: "The parents of a soldier now being court-martialed in Tokyo for the slaying of a PX bookkeeper said today that Army authorities have sent them no details of the case.

"We have been forced to rely entirely on newspapers for information," Mrs Donald F Baughman said.

"She said they received only a brief msg from Army officials informing them that their son, Pfc Donald L Baughman, and 2 other soldiers would face a court martial for the slaying of Sgt. Paul Wilbern of Columbus Ohio, last Dec 3. The msg added that a ltr of particulars would follow, but none has arrived, she said.

"Mrs Baughman said she has appealed vainly for more info in a cablegram to authorities in Japan and through the Red Cross.

"The court martial began in Tokyo today with the selection of members to hear the case. Baughman and the 2 other defendants, Pfc James H Burks, 20, Cullman, Ala, and Pfc Robert S Keller, 20, of Covington, Ind, allegedly broke into a PX at the Japan Air Materials Area outside Tokyo and caused the death of Wilbern.

"Mrs Baughman said she received a cablegram from her son the day before Christmas saying he was being held but for her not to "worry about me."

Govt forces, compelled to continue fighting by the apparent Communist rejection of peace offers, had reportedly captured Yutang and Kucheng, Communist village bases flanking the Nanking Pengpu Rail Line. ...The Central News Agency said that the capture of Yutang and Kucheng had consolidated govt positions along the key North China rail line.

N. Y. Times Correspondent Lindsey Parrott, Tokyo 9 Jan: The Japanese Govt is drafting a sweeping revision of the national labor laws for presentation to the next Diet. Preliminary info regarding the increased curbs on trade union activities that it proposes is now available here. Such a revision has long been put fwd as a necessity . . . according to unofficial accounts the proposals under consideration by the gov't include 5 major steps. Perhaps the most important of these would provide that labor organizations that have political activities as their principal aim or are under the control of a single political party would forfeit their legal standings as trade unions. . . . The 2d item would propose restrictions on strikes in key industries arising from other than labor conditions-the "Political strikes" that have been a feature of post war Japan. . . . The 3d step would be the legal establishment of public union accounting and union procedure based on a majority vote of membership. Nbr 4 would provide that "unfair practices," such as the sitdown and "production control," . . . would be banned. The 5th would provide legally that all labor contracts must include the establishment of grievance machinery.

N. Y. Times Correspondent Lindsey Parrott, Tokyo 7 Jan: Japanese in increasing nbers are flocking back to the shinto shrines . . . thus further proof has now become available that the theory announced by allied hqs in the early days of the occupation that the shinto faith would disappear as the result of the elimination of state support was incorrect. . . . NY Times Correspondent Burton Crane, Tokyo 8 Jan. The debate within Japanese Govt circles over the establishment of a single exchange rate appears to have narrowed to 2 proposals. The 1st is 350 yen to the dollar and the 2d 300 yen. The Board of Trade favors the 1st and the Economic Stabilization Board the 2d. There is obviously no certainty that either, or even a compromise between the 2, will be adopted, since the occupation authorities will have the final word. However, both boards are studying the problem under orders from Gen Douglas MacArthur's Hq ... again; the black market in the last 3 months has been virtually stabilized at about 325 yen to the dollar, comparing not unfavorably with the occupations official 270 conversion rate. Both boards are attempting to find a formula under which Japan can readjust her prices into some relationship with the world levels.... Either plan would find actual subsidies being paid by the US, which provides funds to prevent disease and unrest....

NY Times, UP Seoul 8 Jan: The emergency guards tactics chief, Choi Chi Whan, said today that 3 Russian submarines had surfaced off South Korea 4 days ago and signalled Communist guerrillas to launch an attack on the provisional capital of Cheju. Mr Choi reported the Soviet submarines had surfaced off Cheju Island on Jan 4.... Mr Choi said 2 submarines had appeared off the town of Sanyang in the afternoon and 1 off Hanrinri at night. He said Cheju police reported that the Soviet flag had been clearly visible from shore.

Radio Commentator Walter Winchell, ABC 9 Jan:... Behind the scenes of the III World War, Tokyo-Gen MacArthur has requested at least 240,000 new American troops to man the Japanese islands-just in case....

Radio Commentator George Thomas Folster, NBC News Roundup from Tokyo 9 Jan: I am in Tokyo tonight feeling very much the way I felt in Australia in 1942. That's when the Japs were giving MacArthur hell in the Philippines.... Tonight history is repeating itself. The same MacArthur is here, in Tokyo, commanding another outpost of American defense in the pacific.... MacArthur is pleading with Wash to give him more troops and more planes; and they havent arrived. Once again MacArthur is on another island... Japan could be another Bataan ... I wonder whether the boys in the back room in Wash are preparing to write off MacArthur again.

Part 1.

1. We appreciate your anxiety re smooth opr of PL 820 Natural Fibers Revolving Fund.

2. In working out the procedure in ourad Dec we have kept in mind situation at this end as well as that in occupied areas. Rules and regs were promulgated with desire to facilitate and expedite use of fund by occupied areas.

3. In coordinating with Gen Acctg Office, however, and when Army Comptroller was brought into picture by Office of Secy of Natl Defense, there developed firm objection to certain provisions of rules and regs, particularly Secs 5 and 6, and GAO and Army Comptroller desired revision before proceeding. However, discussion developed modified procedure transmitted to you in ourad Dec which is within provisions of rules and regs. GAO and Army Compt have agreed we can proceed under this procedure without waiting for revision of rules and regs.

4. We have taken position here that even though their auth to review detailed procedures and handling of acct could be questioned, it would be better to have their beforehand concurrence. Their proposals on procedures were therefore accepted.

Part 2. Fol comments refer your Z 34720.

1. As you know, L 8 T auth Secy of Army to borrow money and use it as revolving fund for purchasing, transporting, insuring, and selling natural fibers, processing materials, and products thereof. 2 A. SP representative will not attempt "detailed opr of the fund." Broad discretion as to opr in occupied area, indigenous agencies to be employed, amts and types of cotton, timing and conditions of purchases, validation of bid acceptance, terms of pms to vendors, adjustments, etc., left to mil govt auths of occupied area. However, Pl 820 Revolving Fund is govt money and subj to budget bureau and GAO reporting and auditing reqmts. This means moneys of fund must be received, expended, and acted for by or on direction of an accountable officer of the fund. The accountable officer must submit quarterly financial statements to Budget Bureau, quarterly acct current statements to GAO, and an annual report to Congress in name of Secy of Army. His accts must be site auditted annually by Gen Acctg Office. Refer cabling difficulties. Staff Communications Office, DA, reassures us of speedy transmission of cables if you use "Jap loan" series and send ltr of credit and repmt cables priority, unclassified. Staff-com suggests spelling out all numbers and following with Arabic numerals in parenthesis to minimize effect of possible garbles. Re shipping documents. Copies of shipping documents must be recd by Fund Accountable Officer in Wash to substantiate his accts. He requires sight draft, copy of invoice, and a copy of bill of lading. Insurance certificates, BAE Inspection Certificates (so long as you continue to use them), and such copies of other shipping documents as are specified by you will immediately be fwded directly to you by accountable officer. These documents should pass through you any way for accurate maint of records you apparently desire. You can pass them to consignee. Notification of bank and other charges and all adjustments will be sent to you. Ref reconciliations. Since above procedure will be followed, there should be no problem reconciling accts. As the official acctg will be at single point rather than at two or more points, difficulties which would indeed be created by split or duplicating fiscal control or acting will be avoided.

b. Shippers are also interested, as are you, in possibilities of direct mill buying. This is in no way hindered by Pl 820. Par 3 of ourad Dec specifically auths this type of buying. Procedure remains same, but substitute mill name for Boeki Cho throughout.

c. Both you and shippers apparently desire to purchase on basis of shippers class. Procedure in ourad Dec would in no way interfere with this type buying. Usual commercial practice, according to Mr Read Dunn of Natl Cotton Council, would be purchase by Japanese agency (Boeki Cho or individual mill), pmt against shipping documents out of irrevocable ltr of credit; claims against shipper by Japanese agency if determined appropriate upon inspection of cotton in Japan; counter-offers by shipper; arbitration if necessary by arbitration board in Japan. Adm details of presentations of claims and arbitration can be kept most simple with Japanese agency dealing directly with vendor under SCAP supervision. Final settlement would be cabled to SP representative by SCAP, settlement pmt would be made to Natural Fibers Revolving Fund, Wash DC, by vendor. Accts receivable against Japanese agency or firm would be credited with net amt of repayment by vendor when recd, and SCAP would be notified of adjustment. If you eventually desire to include importers in this procedure that can be worked out when you are ready.

d. Banks, either US or Japanese naturally, will not desire any opr which will reduce or eliminate pmts to them. From point of view of Army and Japanese economy, however, overall costs of program are important. Therefore, banks should be used so as to receive necessary svcs at lowest overall cost. Use of Japanese banks at present would offer little or no advantage and would double bank costs. When your program has progressed to point Japanese firms are buying individually, and if use of interntal banking channels should then seem desirable, that can be worked out.

N Y Herald Tribune correspondent A T Steele, Peiping 4 Jan: More official and non official organizations added their voices today to the clamor for peace in Nationalist China. The chairmen of 7 provisional and city councils in North China, including those of Peiping and Tientsin, issued a statement appealing to the Communists to let bygones be bygones and open peace talks immediately with the government. At the same time, 50 members of the National Assembly who reside in North China dispatched joint telegrams to president Chiang Kai Shek and Communist leader Mao Tse Tung calling for cessation of fighting and peace negotiations.

Coincident with these moves, teachers and professors in local schools and universities and representatives of various peoples organizations formed a Peace Promotion Council to push peace agitation. The significant things about the peace chorus in China so far are that it comes from only one side, and that it shows little appreciation of the enormous gap which still separates the view points of the two warring camps. It is essentially an emotional reflecting the pent up frustration of a people fed up to the teeth with civil war. The fact is that political and ideological issues have receded into the background in the public mind.

Generally speaking, the public is less concerned with the terms of peace or which political leaders may be made

It was the first official announcement that the hard pressed Chinese Govt is suing for peace with the Chinese Communists--although China has been rife with rumors for peace for nearly 2 weeks. The announcement said that some 3,000 Marines would be put aboard Naval vessels in Tsingtao Harbor to await further orders for movement--expected prior to Jan 25. . . . The announcement said that the hq of Vice Admiral Oscar C Badger would remain here. . . .

AP NY Times, Wash 3 Jan: State Dept officials expressed surprise tonight at the announcement of the withdrawal of US Marines from China. This office is receiving many inquiries from overseas comds regarding the new system of allowances and differentials for classification act employees, requests for determinations of eligibility, requests for explanation of proper payroll procedures, requests for statements of periods of duty and leave for which differentials and allowances will be paid, et cetera. These questions are of such nature that the replies, to be accurate and complete, would be too lengthy to transmit by radio.

As previously radioed, the effective date of the discontinuance of the former 25% differential and the beginning of the payment of new allowances and differentials is the beginning of pay period which includes 2 Jan. Regulations which will give complete instructions on all phases of the new system of pay are now in final form and 1 advance copy will be air mailed to each overseas comd this week.

Primary purpose of our previous radiograms stating amounts of allowances and differentials authorized was for planning and budgetary purposes and for notification to the affected employees. In order to prevent overpayments, underpayments, possible inaccurate payroll procedure, etc, it is suggested that overseas comds in preparing payrolls do not include payment of any of the new

A. Pay which is subj to tax (Para 3 A, DA Cir 347, 48), will include pmts for lump sum accrued lv and reenlistment allow. Coll of tax thereon will conform to Para 7, Cir WT of Internal Revenue Bureau. In the case of lump sum accrued lv pmts, only that portion of pmt which represents pay is subj to tax; that portion of the pmt which represent allow is not subj to tax.

B. Withholding tax will not be coll when forfeitures of all pay and allowances are involved, but will be coll on the full amt of pay due in cases involving fines and on final pay accts when indebtedness exceeds pay due.

C. Withholding stmt (W-2) for reserve components, prepared by personnel officers, as provided in Para 7B, DA Cir 347, 48 the total wage block will include all pay received by the individual for inactive and active duty training periods irrespective of whether or not such pay was subj to withholding tax.

D. During such period as a member of reserve component is on active duty with the RA or AF or attending a service school, the provisions of Sect 2 of DA Cir 347, 48 will apply.

E. Salary pmts for services performed as a minister of the gospel are exempt from withholding. (See Cir WT, Para 5) (1). Therefore, tax will not be withheld from the pay of Army Chaplains.
