New York Times Correspondent Lindesay Parrott, Tokyo 28 June: Japanese officials and the press tonight challenged the impression created here that all 2000 Japanese prisoners of war who returned to the port of Maizuru yesterday as the first group to be repatriated this year from the Soviet Union intended to join the Communist Party and were under oath to Sovietize Japan. . . .

Chicago Tribune Correspondent Walter Simmons, Tokyo 28 June: Yesterdays arrival at Maizuru of the seasons first repatriation ship jammed with 2000 Japanese war prisoners converted to Communism was interpreted today as Russian defiance of Gen MacArthur who frequently has demanded that Russia accelerate the sluggish pace of repatriation. It is believed the ship was deliberately packed with well fed, doctrinaire Communists, converted during almost 4 years in Siberia. . . .

Chicago Tribune Reporter Walter Trohan, Washington 28 June: International war criminals are offered an avenue to possible freedom from American imprisonment by Supreme Court Justice Douglas. Attorneys for Japanese war lords and German war prisoners are preparing to see American court action under the Justice's suggestion that those serving prison terms for war crimes ask lower Federal courts to determine whether they are being legally held. . . .

New York Times Correspondent Lindesay Parrott, Maizuru  
27 June: The first group of Japanese war prisoners to be  
repatriated this year from the Soviet Union arrived here today  
aboard the Repatriation Ship Takasago Maru, thoroughly indoctrin-  
ated with Communist theory and, according to their own state-  
ment, sworn to join the Japanese Communist Party with the object  
of Sovietizing Japan. . . . Both Japanese and Americans here  
tonight expressed shock at the ideology carried by the new  
group of repatriates. The Japanese Govt and occupation author-  
ities both had been pressing recently for the return home of  
Japanese prisoners remaining in Soviet hands and picturing them  
as victims of the illicit forced labor system and the Russian  
concentration camps. . . . What will be done about the most  
recent indoctrinated repatriates is not clear. Previously,  
former prisoners of the Russians had been carefully screened  
both by the Japanese and American intelligence services before  
being turned loose on the countryside. What the process will  
be with this group remains to be seen.

New York Times, AP Washington 27 June: 6 months after he had sided with the Supreme Court majority in denying a hearing to convicted Japanese war criminals, Justice William O Douglas handed down an opinion today terming the December action "potentially dangerous". At the same time he virutally invited those serving prison terms for war crimes to raise the issue in lower United States courts as to whether they were being held legally. . . .

Radio Commentator George Thomas Folster from Tokyo, NBD 27 June: The first Japanese prisoners of war to be repatriated from Siberia arrived in Japan today. . .remembering that 95,000 men is about equal to 8 Russian divisions you begin to get some idea of how serious this homecoming of Japanese prisoners of war is and they have been told stories of how they were kept in Russia, kept away from Japan, kept away from home, because Gen MacArthur wouldn't send ice breakers to Russia, which of course is a bare faced lie. . . . There is trouble ahead. These Japanese have eaten this Communist food now for 4 years. . . .

Radio commentator Ned Calmer, CBS 22 June: Five members of the National Assembly in Korea were arrested today on orders of President Syngman Rhee who charged them with endangering the national security of the Republic.... They had demanded in a petition to the United National Korean Commission that American and Russian military missions be withdrawn from the country. The petition was drawn up at a time when the administration is attempting to obtain all out military aid from the United States and this fact is believed to have influenced the presidents decision to have the Korean progressives arrested. 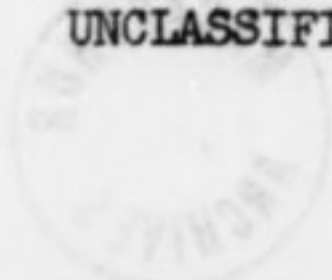

"Rerad 7 June following answers to queries are submitted:

To the best of my knowledge claimant Lim Khee was the owner of Post Exchange concession at Ft Wm McKinley located at the 4 barrios quoted in query. I do not remember any orders having been issued that no concessioner would be given authority to remove any of his stocks from the military reservation. An order was given for the evacuation of the reservation on or about 26 Dec 41, and I have no recollection as to whether or not any foodstuffs, supplies, and other items of military equipment were taken from the barrio stores at this time. I distinctly recollect the following incident relevant to this issue:

That on or about 17 Dec 41 all the families were evacuated from the ~~scouts~~ and other barrios, the evacuees taking with them as much supplies, foodstuffs, clothing, bedding and utensils as they could carry and the transportation available was able to convey for them;

That upon their departure a civilian guard was established in said Scout barrios for the purpose of safe guarding of property therein from theft, pilferage and for fire protection;

That it is my belief that during this evacuation of the Scout barrio families Lim Khee furnished supplies, foodstuffs and other items of his stocks, perhaps on a credit basis, to the soldiers families evacuated, anticipating reimbursement in due time either from said families or from the government;

It is further believed that it was during this barrios evacuation period that Lim Khee must have almost exhausted the major portion of his stocks, taking into consideration that this evacuation involved some 7000 persons;

Further, that it has been an old custom from time immemorial in the Philippine Islands for small tiendas or shops like Lim Khees to extend credit to their customers and settlements made on each payday, and I am satisfied that Lim Khee practised this extension of credit to his Barrio customers, most of whom he must have known personally, both from the viewpoint of it being a good business principle, as well as from the kindness of heart which is a traditional trait of the Chinese and Filipinos. To the best of my recollection no restrictions were placed on private property at any time except on such private property which was left in quarters of officers and soldiers who departed for field service between the period 7 Dec 41 and the evacuation of Ft Wm McKinley; However all private property in the several barrios was placed under protection of civilian guards simultaneously with the evacuation of the population from said barrios on or about 17 Dec 41.

It is believed that claimant Lim Khee has a valid claim against the US Government for the loss of his property".
