1. Incoming message WCL 25330 from the office of the Assistant Secretary for the Far East is a repeat of a cable from the German Economic Office (VFW). Subject radio offers pig iron within the next three months up to 50,000 tons.
2. Outgoing message advises DA with request for repeat to German Economic Office that Japanese import requirements for pig iron have been met by commitments made covering the next six months; that unless exports of steel and machinery are materially improved the steel production program will be revised downward, and that DA and German Economic Office will be advised if and when Japan is interested in buying pig iron.

Reurad June 281906 Z quoting 281622 from OMGUS sgd Hays, and OASFE radio  
W 91359.

Part 2. This headquarters agreeable to inauguration direct radio telegraph  
circuit Japan-Germany in lieu of agreement permitting traffic flow between  
two countries via existing facilities other routes.

Part 3. In consideration of problems involved it is desired that the  
direct circuit should be subject to the following provisions:

- (a) All traffic in each direction will be prepaid on a "country-  
to-country" rate basis.
- (b) Division of revenue will be on a "sender-keep-all" or non-  
accounting basis until a proper settlement becomes possible.
- (c) All messages must be terminal to Japan and Germany only with  
no transit traffic permitted.
- (d) Classifications of messages to be admitted are ordinary or  
full rate, CDE, IC, and NLT. Rates will be on basis of 3.45 gold francs  
per full rate word, converted at 5.1825 per United States dollar, with  
proportionate reductions for other lower classifications.
- (e) Following frequencies are currently cleared for use to Europe  
from Japan and will be used to Germany as required on basis of operation of  
subject circuit: JAL 6810, JAL2 7815, JAL3 11520, JAL4 13875, JAU3 15975,  
JAF3 19800.
- (f) Circuit to Germany will be "forked" with circuit to Paris.

Part 4. Request advice re frequencies and call letters to be used from Ger-  
many, together with a schedule of tests preliminary to commencing operation.  
Include in advice regarding preliminary tests a group of three frequencies  
from those listed in paragraph 3(e) above to facilitate activation of  
acceptable frequency and initial contact.

Part 5. Presumably your proposal for direct circuit does not encompass  
authorization for handling of messages between Japan and Germany over alter-  
nate routes via other countries.

Part 6. Request foregoing proposal be forwarded PROCOM.

BASIC: Rad fm SCAP TOKYO JAPAN to DA WASH DC, 14 July 1949.

NFR:

1. On 15 Sept 48 the CG 8th U. S. Army, requested advise from CCS SCAP as to the possibility of establishing telecommunications, both radiotelephone and radiotelegraph, between Japan and the occupied zones of Germany. This request was received in Tokyo on 16 Sept 48.
2. A command channel radiogram No. C-64207 was dispatched to the DA on 2 Oct 48 requesting advise whether the situation in occupied Germany, as outlined in DA radio (Feb WAR X-96479) had changed sufficiently to permit establishment of the subject service.
3. DA forwarded the text of our radio to OMGUS and CG USFA, asking for their comments. Washington radio from CSCAD to CINCFE (W-91294), dtd 23 Oct 48, contained comments as received from OMGUS and CG, USFA.
4. Under date of 26 Nov 48 the Provisional Posts and Telecommunications Commission in Germany dispatched two letters to SCAP. One letter, file PROCOM/SEC(48)58, subject: "Re-establishment of International Telephone Service between Japan and the US, UK, and French Zones of Occupation in Germany" was transmitted to this headquarters with a copy to the American Telephone and Telegraph Company in New York City. The second letter from PROCOM, file PROCOM/SEC(48)61, subject: "Resumption of International Telegraph Service between Japan and the US, UK, and French Zones of Occupation in Germany, was transmitted direct to SCAP, apparently without copies to anyone.
5. A message was received by SCAP from the AT&T, based on the information contained in PROCOM's letter. The message from the AT&T was received in Tokyo some time prior to the arrival of the PROCOM letter. On the basis of the advice from AT&T, radio telephone service between Japan and the three zones of Germany was resumed effective 15 January 1949.
6. On 28 Jan 49 SCAP dispatched radio No. Z-38017 to the DA, outlining conditions for resumption of radiotelegraph service between the subject areas. This message was followed by a letter to the DA amplifying the info contained in the latter message. In essence these provisions called for resumption of service via the American carriers, Cable and Wireless, Ltd., and Radio France, via the US, London, and Paris respectively.
7. In May 49 a radio (C-50122) was dispatched to the DA for the purpose of determining when a reply to Z-38017 might be expected. On 2 Jun 49 a radio (W-89420) was received from the DA stating that such service must be considered on a tripartite basis. Inasmuch as service via the circuits of the three powers occupying Germany had been suggested we do not understand the statement regarding the "tripartite" basis. Radio W-89420 from the DA further stated that OMGUS now favors a direct circuit between Japan & Germany.
8. On 10 Jun a second radio (091605 Z) was received from the DA quoting additional comments of OMGUS concerning the subject service, all in support of their argument on behalf of a direct circuit between Japan and Germany.

9. On 13 Jun 49 radio C-50736 was transmitted from SCAP to the DA. This radio was in reply to radio 091605 Z referred to in par 8 above and stated that SCAP does not consider establishment of a direct circuit practical at this time, and set forth the various reasons.

10. On 30 Jun radio 281906 was received from the DA quoting a message from OMGUS restating their case for a direct circuit between Japan and Germany. We cannot agree with the argument insofar as transit traffic is concerned. Furthermore, the volume to be expected on this circuit will doubtlessly not result in enough revenue to offset the expense of operation. On the basis of expanding trade, however, the indirect benefits to be ~~derive~~ derived from such a circuit may cause it to be worthwhile, especially in the long range aspects.

Recommended plans will be submitted by JG within 90 days after receipt of directive for repair and rehabilitation of refineries proposed for operation. Maximum utilization of existing equipment and domestic materials is required; requests to import specialized items not locally available will be considered. 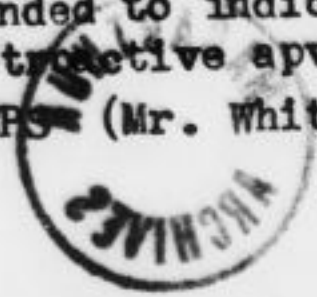

1. Request for approval of travel of Ohtagaki and Kawasaki to the United States was made by Pan American Airways System for the stated purpose of coordinating activities of the Kei-han-shin Electric Railways as agents for PanAm in Japan. Pan Am is bearing expenses of travel. Approval for travel in no manner indicated authorization for any other activities although there would be no objection to the development of interest abroad in the proposed 1950 American Fair proposed for Japan.

2. Messrs Ohtagaki and Kawasaki held informal discussions with Messrs Hale and McDermott of this headquarters concerning projected plans for the Fair which, it is understood, would be sponsored by the Asahi Shimbun Sha (The Asahi Press). They were informed that SCAP approval would only be required in the event the Japanese Government supported and-or sponsored the project and made request for the allocation of critical materials, expenditure of yen funds not appropriated for such a purpose, or the use of foreign exchange from SCAP Trust Fund accounts. The Japanese indicated that they were prepared to underwrite the event and that no request would be made for official funds or foreign exchange. In connection with the participation in the Fair by American exhibitors the Japanese were informed that any foreign exchange expenses involved would have to be borne by the foreign exhibitors.

3. Although an exhibition as proposed conceivably may have some merit in promotion of foreign trade, no headquarters approval has been accorded. In view of the circumstances do not consider it advisable that official encouragement be indicated to American exhibitors by DA.

This radio in two parts: Part I: Assumed here that Reserve Officers not on Extended Active Duty in Far East Command who are given mobilization assignments in accordance with SR 140-5-50 may receive pay for reserve duty training in such assignments within limitations prescribed by paragraph 3 Department of the Army letter, AGAO-S 353 (9 Jun 49) CSGOT-M, Subject: Assignment of Training Categories to Organized Reserve Corps Units, FY 1950. Far East Command plans contemplate mobilization assignments for Reserve Officers not on Extended Active Duty in accordance with SR 140-5-50 and, in addition, mobilization assignments to appropriate type T/D units which may be authorized in case of mobilization. This is considered feasible and justified particularly with respect to General Headquarters, Far East Command, Mobilization assignments of Reserve Officers to appropriate T/D units would aim not only at providing a basis for proper utilization of Reserve Officers in Far East Command in case of mobilization, but at fixing a duty assignment for reserve duty training consistent with officers' grade, arm or service and MOS. 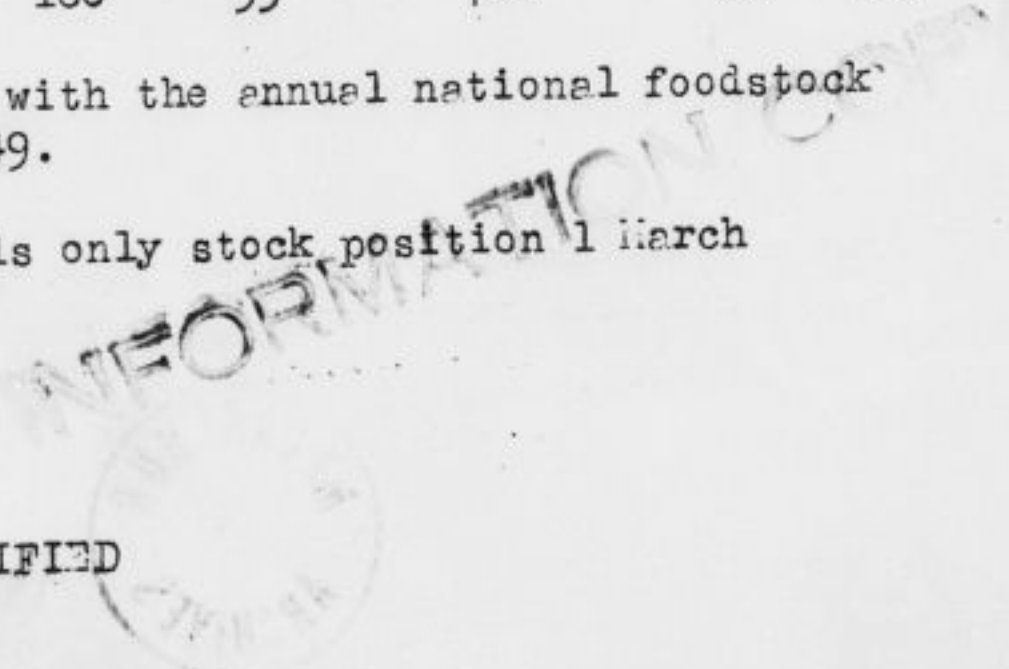

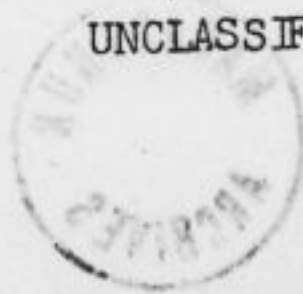
