Pass to SGO MEDDC. Subject is Streptomycin Consultant. Request that Dr. Jackson W. Foster, Biology Department, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, be contacted regarding approximately 90 days' service in Japan to act as an expert consultant in initiating and instructing Japanese pharmaceutical manufacturers in large-scale commercial production of streptomycin. This will entail advising pharmaceutical manufacturers on quality and minimum potency standards of streptomycin, development of manufacturing and refining techniques in commercial scale streptomycin production including installation and operation of plant equipment, and advising on extraction and purification methods in the streptomycin field. Dr. Foster was in Japan for approximately six months during late 1946 and early 1947, during which time he initiated commercial production program for penicillin. He is considered well qualified to act as an expert consultant in developing commercial streptomycin production.

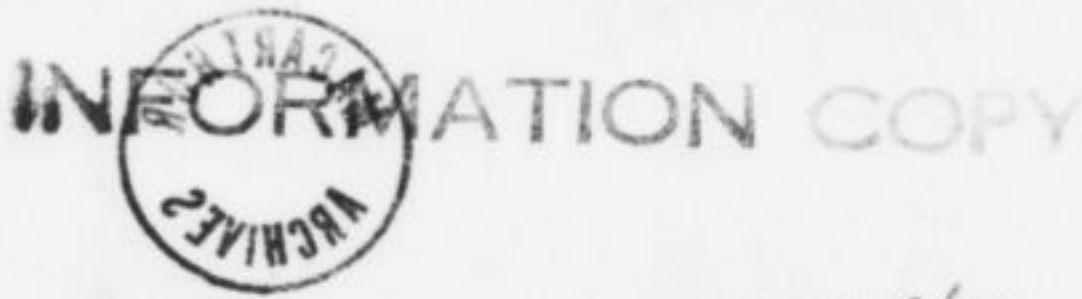

The msg stated that the reason for requesting the lists is to assure compliance with the 1950 Military Appropriation Act.

2. CINCPAC and PHILCOM (AF) were both action addressees on WCL 26248. PHILCOM (AF) replied direct to DA in U 15531 D/M 7 Dec 49 that only subsistence items procured from indigenous sources are local fruits and vegetables as indicated on approved ration issue chart and limited quantities for resale.

3. CINCPAC msg ZX 30922, 5 Dec directed 8th A, MARBO and RYCOM to furnish CINCPAC the info requested by DA in WCL 26248. MARBO in C 18384, 7 Dec and RYCOM in R 08806, 7 Dec furnished negative reports. Eighth A reported in D 82264, 9 Dec that no subsistence items are now being procured from indigenous sources and that bananas are planned for procurement.

4. Action toward procurement of other indigenous foods has been suspended on direction of the DA pending interpretation of the 1950 Military Appropriation Act. In order to secure a decision as to whether the indigenous items authorized for consumption by occupation forces by SCAP Circulars 20 and 25, 1949, can be purchased with appropriated funds for distribution through QM channels, it is considered advisable to list the authorized items in the reply to the DA.

5. This msg is for the purpose of replying to WCL 26248, advising the DA that except for PHILCOM (AF) which has reported separately,

- a. No indigenous subsistence items are now being procured
- b. Bananas are planned for procurement
- c. Certain Japanese indigenous subsistence items are authorized for consumption by Occupation Forces and requesting information as to which of the items may be procured with appropriated funds.

G-1 C/N 5 to PH&W and PH&W C/N 6 to G-4 requested authorization be obtained from DA for Dr. Kochi to travel on USAT to Zone of Interior and return on space available non-reimbursable basis. G-4 C/N 7 to Transportation Officer of 30 Nov. same subject, requested Transportation Officer initiate action to secure necessary DA authorization for this travel.

2. Foreign Nationals are not authorized transportation on USAT without prior approval of DA. (DA Pamphlet 29-14)

3. Paragraph 2 of DA message WCL 39575 of 28 Jan 49 authorizes transportation on USAT to Zone of Interior and return for students and national leaders selected by military government for training when such movement is chargeable to GARIOA funds. Part 1. Provisions of Para 12 SR 55-765-5 as applicable in FEC, preclude coordinated travel except for Doctors and Dentists. However under provisions of Para 11B above cited regulations this command permits coordinated travel without regard to the priority system for the following: (1) General Officers (2) individuals who have cogent compassionate reasons, generally cases in which the wife is physically unable to travel alone and must be accompanied and assisted by the husband and (3) individual cases which meet the following conditions: Specific duty assignment of sponsor is known; wife is sole dependent; and bachelor type quarters which would normally be assigned the sponsor as an individual, but which are suitable for temporary joint occupancy of husband and wife, are available at the duty station and are accepted by the sponsor for joint occupancy until he is eligible for dependent housing under the priority system.
