Foster, Biology Department, Oak Ridge, Tennessee, be contacted regarding approximately 90 days' service in Japan to act as an expert consultant in initiating and instructing Japanese pharmaceutical manufacturers in large-scale commercial production of streptomycin. This will entail advising pharmaceutical manufacturers on quality and minimum potency standards of streptomycin, development of manufacturing and refining techniques in commercial scale streptomycin production including installation and operation of plant equipment, and advising on extraction and purification methods in the streptomycin field. Dr. Foster was in Japan for approximately six months during late 1946 and early 1947, during which time he initiated commercial production program for penicillin. He is considered well qualified to act as an expert consultant in developing commercial streptomycin production.

Cost of subsistence will be collected."

Since quoted reference does not provide for the travel of unaccompanied dependents of DA and DAF, and due to requests that have been received for this type of travel for cogent reasons, the Transportation Officer, GHQ, recommends paragraph 2.f.
