For morale reasons, it is deemed desirable to permit military personnel otherwise entitled thereto on permanent change of station from zone of interior to Japan to transport their dependents to Japan prior to assignment of public quarters under priority system. This arrangement would result from allowing the individual concerned to provide quarters for his dependents at own expense through private agreement, by leasing privately owned quarters not on procurement demand by U.S. Government. No rental allowance to be paid individuals who occupy U.S. Government procured houses. Request consideration be given to amending DA policy expressed in last sentence of reference radio to permit military personnel under stated circumstances to enter into private rental agreements with foreign nationals or agencies in Japan under controls established by the Commander-in-Chief, Far East.

Part 2

If paragraph one, herein, is favorably considered, CINCFE proposes that individuals who enter into private rental agreements for privately owned quarters may, upon application, effect the travel of their dependents and the shipment of household goods and automobile into Japan as follows:

a. Authorize immediate travel of dependents to Japan without regard to the priority system when travel is by commercial means at no expense to the U. S. Government. Travel from ZI to Japan to begin only after clearance to DA by SCAP.

b. Authorize transportation of dependents to Japan without regard to the priority system via government transportation. Dependents for whom travel is requested on government transportation to be included at the end of the current priority list being prepared at the time of receiving the application.







a. Logistics operations required by OI No. 8, with respect to actual transfer of ... property were completed prior to receipt by CINCFE of SR 730-5-1, AFR 67-22. Advance copy of SR arrived this comd approximately 3 Aug 49. Further, transfers were made in bulk.

b. Through the process of screening by PHILAIRCOM, certain quantities of property which were transferred to AF without reimbursement were subsequently determined to be excess to AF and were shipped to Army installations in FECOM outside the Philippines area. An additional quantity was determined to be unserviceable and was transferred under Philippine Bulk Sales Agreement. Consequently, an accurate determination of AF and Army equity is not possible.

Reurmsg WCL 43796 because of devastation of RYCCM quarters caused by Typhocn Gloria it was necessary to evacuate approximately 60 DAGS from Okinawa to Japan. This pers not transferred to Japan, merely placed on TDY, as it was contemplated that quarters could be rehabilitated and return to Okinawa from Japan effected at early date. It now develops that complete quarters rehabilitation will be delayed and fifty DACs now in Japan on TDY cannot be utilized for an extended period. Ten of original sixty have been returned to Okinawa. CO RYCCM requests that those DAGs now in Japan be utilized elsewhere by FAC as continued salary payments with no production for RYCOM will have considerable impact on RYCOMS FY 50 funds. At this time approximately 25 of 50 RYCOM DACS in Japan cannot be absorbed by FAC either in current or anticipated vacancies. Considered here both impractical and expensive to either transfer to Japan such RYCCM pers as are actually surplus to Japan or to return to Okinawa for RIF. Request reconsideration be given request in ourmsg Z 23782 and such action authorized in this instance. It is emphasized that a maximum effort will be made to place this surplus pers with FLC and FLAF installations; however, it is known that utilization of all categories is impossible.





Part 4. After review of all circumstances the following additional conclusions reached: 1. That the contractor has no probable claim against the Govt; 2. That the contractor has no probable legal defense in case the Govt elects to recover and can establish damages; 3. That the Govt would have a probable claim for damages against the contractor in event of contractor's repudiation. However, the amount of damages is at best speculative and depends on future operations, prices obtained for scrap from other sources and methods adopted.

Part 5. Only possible basis upon which the Govt may be liable to contractor is that Govt fire-fighting equipment failed to function after arriving at scene of detonations after fire was in progress.

Part 6. It has been determined that present and future operations to clear area effected by explosion should be undertaken by Army and not rpt not by a civilian contractor. This operation extremely hazardous and can be safely accomplished only by personnel trained in Army techniques. Personnel except at prohibitive cost to Govt. Action already being taken by Army to clear area.

Part 7. In view of the above considerations, authority is requested under provisions JPR 5-502.1(2) to negotiate a termination agreement of subject contract with Lipsett Inc whereby both parties agree mutually to out of subject contract.

- 1. The local representative of the Continental Grain Company has offered informally to exchange 50,000 MTs of new crop Swedish rye for 55,000 MT's of U.S. #2 yellow corn. The Swedish Government or appointed agent would deliver the rye to Japan and the U.S. would deliver the corn to Sweden. No cash would change hands. The cost of 55,000 MTs of corn and transportation charges to Sweden would be paid out of Japan's GARIOA appropriation.
- 2. The current FAS cost of U.S. corn is about \$60 per NT and the transportation cost to Sweden is approximately \$8 per NT. The total cost to the U.S. (out of Japan's GARIOA appropriation) for delivering 55,000 MTs of corn to Sweden, based on a CIF cost of \$68 per NT, would be \$3,740,000. In exchange, Japan would receive 50,000 MTs of rye, which, when divided into \$3,740,000, would cost \$74.80 per MT. This price compares with the current cost of corn ex U.S. landed in Japan of approximately \$73.50. Since rye has a higher extraction rate (more edible product per unit of raw material) and a greater consumer acceptance than corn, it appears that this offer is favorable to Japan.
