2. In WCL 37006 query made on WCL 36126. Baltimore Sun asks clearance Paul Ward, their correspondent, to enter Japan and Okinawa. Clearance was granted for entrance into Japan ourad Z 20830 but clearance had not been received from CG RYCOM. On 26 Aug 49 CG RYCOM advised that guest housing is not available for entrance to command due to typhoon destruction on 23 July and recommended re-application for entry into Okinawa for Mr. Ward about 1 Jan 50. Recommendation was made to C/S that CG RYCOM be informed that American correspondents cannot be excluded but can be told that accommodations are not available at this time. This recommendation was approved by the C/S 28 Aug 49 and CG RYCOM has been advised.

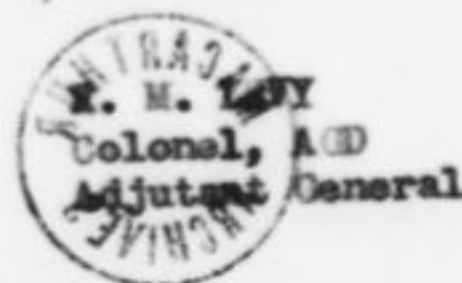



By written orders dated Apr 46, Lt Col Place, then Major, relieved of duty with GHQ and placed on duty with Eighth Army to sit as Australian Member on War Crimes Commission.

Part 1. All the three Nix-Jarboe proposals would adversely affect Japan's international balances and increase the requirements for U. S. appropriated funds.

Part 2. First proposal to barter used woolen overcoats for indigenous commodities would undermine Japan's dollar market. For example, SCAP and Japanese Government are engaged in a campaign to reestablish silk in the American market. To stabilize conditions in the trade floor prices have been established with assurance that they will be held for specified periods of time. If Nix and Jarboe could purchase silk for used overcoats, not only could they undersell SCAP guaranteed prices in the U. S., but they would absorb a portion of the total dollar market for silk available to Japan. Similar considerations would apply to most other commodities purchased under the same barter plan. So long as Japan can sell export commodities for dollars, it would be most unwise to sell for used goods even at attractive prices. As a matter of principle, barter cannot be viewed with favor in areas where regular dollar trade channels are available.

Part 3. Second proposal to sell yen acquired from Japanese syndicate for the overcoats to the Occupation for its uses would detract from Japanese invisible export proceeds. The Occupation, per se, has no use for Japanese yen from this source, since all Occupation yen expenses are paid by the Japanese Government out of a

budgeted account annually appropriated by the Japanese Diet. These yen are carried as costs of the Occupation for future settlement. The yen expenses of semi-official agencies and Occupation personnel, that is, their purchases of indigenous goods and services are normally met by purchase for dollars through the Army Fiscal Officer, who in turn purchases yen for dollars from the Foreign Trade Special Account. These dollar payments for invisible exports are used to purchase essential imports. If Nix and Jarboe were to sell their yen to Army Fiscal Officer and take the dollars, in effect, Japan would be paid for invisible exports in old overcoats rather than in dollars.

Part 4. Third proposal is essentially the same as second, except that Congress would advance the dollars to Nix first and be reimbursed later out of sale of Nix's yen by Army Fiscal Officer. Here again, the normal mechanism by which Occupation personnel pay for indigenous goods and services would be circumvented and their dollar payments diverted to Nix and Jarboe rather than to SCAP commercial funds.

Part 5. In substance, all of the Nix-Jarboe proposals amount to import of used overcoats into Japan in exchange for commodities or invisibles which would otherwise bring dollars into SCAP commercial accounts. This arrangement could be considered if the import items proposed were sufficiently essential that a corresponding reduction could be made in overall import program without adverse effect on exports. Used woolen overcoats do not meet this requirement for the following reasons:

- a. Japanese people are not suffering from Lack of overcoats.
- b. Sufficient woolen and clothing manufacturing capacity exists in Japan to manufacture new and better garments, furnish considerable employment and help rehabilitate the Japanese woolen industry.
- c. Surplus raw wool already exists in Japan for domestic manufacture. Excellent raw wool import availabilities exist in the sterling area, in return for which the sterling area would be willing to accept expanded Japanese exports.

d. Until a balance of foreign exchange accounts is reached, any application of dollars from invisible export proceeds means increased demand for U. S. dollar aid.

Part 6. Cited statements in letters to Dadourian Export Corporation from Japanese ministers, Joji Hayashi, Minister of Welfare, Takayoshi Aoki, Director General Economic Stabilization Board, and Heitaro Inagaki, Minister of International Trade and Industry, cannot be given too much weight since:

a. Ministers have since indicated they had considerable reservations at time of talks.


b. In past some Japanese Government officials have not always displayed adequate concern over U. S. appropriations, the general tendency being to assume that U. S. will eventually make up any foreign trade deficits regardless of amount.

Part 7. In any event, U. S. Congress will hold SCAP, not Japanese Government responsible for any dissipation of dollar funds that may occur. In any of its forms Nix-Jarboe proposal is indirect dissipation of such funds.

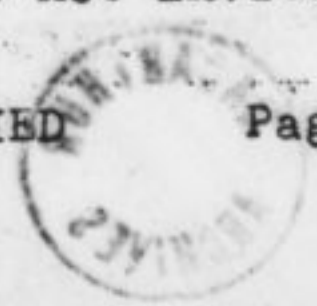

Part 1. Precautions have always been taken by responsible SCAP and Japanese Government officials to prevent the dissemination to suppliers of information on procurement plans and programs for which US Army agencies are responsible. Interested suppliers visiting or domiciled in Japan have been advised on request when procurement of specific commodities is the responsibility of DA Washington. However, quantity, phasing, and specifications are not repeat not revealed and suppliers are advised to make direct contact. Unless this practice is continued SCAP will be placed in the position of refusing to direct interested American suppliers to proper procurement agency. Request the specific details of the cases indicated in first and last sentences, your message.

Part 2. Attention of SCAP technical and procurement agencies has been directed to DA directives cited urmsg. Japanese Government officials have again been cautioned against revealing details of import program including proposed funding.

Part 3. Increased number of direct communications which DA is receiving from industry may be attributed to following:

a. Program requests of Japanese Government initially prepared by Japanese officials who are constantly in contact with Japanese industrial claimants.

b. Agents of American suppliers frequently manage to obtain information on initial program plans of the Japanese Government before these plans reach SCAP for screening and preparation of the SCAP import program.

c. Trade has fairly accurate knowledge of commodities and approximate quantities which have been approved for import over past years and has reason to expect similar procurement by similar agencies for future.

d. Trade has now learned what commodities and approximately what quantities are procured by appropriated funds by competent technical agencies in Washington.

e. Trading firms in Japan pass information to firms in USA as to commodities in which Japan may be interested hoping to negotiate agency contracts with the suppliers.

Part 4. SCAP and Japanese Ministry of International Trade and Industry encounter similar difficulties with respect to procurement of commodities funded by non appropriated funds. Many unsolicited offers are received from American and foreign firms direct or through agents or representatives in Japan quoting on commodities before approval for import has been granted. Such tactics on the part of vendors are understandable since every possible device is used by sellers in a buyers market. Ministry replies to all unsolicited offers by standard form letter advising vendors that offers will be considered only in direct response to a public invitation posted and advertised by the Ministry indicating interest in purchasing certain materials.

Part 5. Continued effort will be made to handle programs and communications relating to DA procurement as confidential in effort to minimize troublesome communications on programmed procurements.

Reurmag WCL-35433. For the reasons set forth in my public statement of August eleventh I believe I can best serve the national interest by remaining at my post of duty here. This statement was as follows: "I could not help but be deeply appreciative of the honor reflected in the desire expressed by certain distinguished members of the United States Senate that I proceed to Washington to give my views for consideration by the Congress on the issue of United States arms aid to the Government of China. I believe, however, that during this moment of critical events in the Far East the interests of the American people are better served by my remaining at my post here, especially in view of the fact that the focal point of inquiry (China) is under the direct jurisdiction of the Joint Chiefs of Staff acting through a naval commander and has never been within the area of my command responsibility or authority. Furthermore, on March 3, 1948 I forwarded on request my general views on this subject to the Chairman of the House Committee on Foreign Affairs. My specific views with respect to the strategic potentialities of the area embracing my Far East Command are fully on file with the Department of the Army. There is little that I could add to either. While it is, of course,

unnecessary for me to confirm my complete loyalty and devotion in the implementation of any directives or views of the Government with reference to my movements and duties, it is my understanding that both the President and the Secretary of Defense have made clear that my return in such circumstances is a matter for the exercise of my own judgment in the light of considerations bearing upon the national interest as I evaluate them.

"Needless to say, it is difficult for me to ignore heartwarming and friendly overtures to return to my native land for which it is only natural for me to long just as would any one else in my circumstances. But an impelling sense of duty in a position of highly critical responsibility leaves me with no other recourse." Signed MacArthur
