Service until assurance was given that the Ryukyuan Postal Administration is "capable, functioning and responsible for its financial obligations," and also that International Money Order Service was preferable to a modified domestic service. Ltr also called for reply giving information and decisions.

There are sufficient stocks of bulk products available in Japan, or slated, to meet the ECA Kerea requirements for bulk petroleum products for third quarter Fiscal Year 50, except bulk lube of the specification quoted.
