Zx34596 For TAG (AGAO-C). Msg WGL 32375. Agree in principle to establishment one way International Money Order Service from U.S.A. to Ryukyus, similar to that now in effect with Japan. Actual commencement of service must await establishment central Postal Administration and domestic money order service in Ryukyus. Conference of provisional governors being convened on 18 January at which all postal matters will be thoroughly discussed and plans made for development responsible indigenous postal administration and comprehensive domestic and international postal services. As soon as possible after conference, negotiations will be opened with U. S. Post Office Department on bilateral agreements covering money orders and other international postal services. Letter follows.

3. Second Ind from DA to FEC, 24 Oct 49, stated Post Office Dept would not consider establishment any form of M. O. Service until assurance was given that the Ryukyuan Postal Administration is "capable, functioning and responsible for its financial obligations," and also that International Money Order Service was preferable to a modified domestic service. Ltr also called for reply giving information and decisions.

4. Matter referred to Ryukyus M. G. for comment and advice in ltr 21 Nov 49. Reply received in 1st Ind dated 9 Dec 49 stating the M. G. did not favorably consider the establishment of any form of M. O. Service at this time, for reason that "Security of funds is deemed insufficient."

5. In view of fact that request originated with the State Dept and influential organizations in USA, reasons given by MG for not favorably considering matter, not considered adequate and matter was referred again to Ryukyus for re-consideration. M. G. requested additional time for study and discussion with Postal Advisor who arrived 6 Dec 49, and with indigenous governments.

6. Ref msg rscd 12 Jan requesting immediate decision and reply. This is interim reply. Final to be forwarded after conclusion of conference at Naha which is scheduled to convene 18 Jan.



M/R: 1. DA msg WGL 29936, 24 Dec 49 states that the COT desires to test the feasibility of using recombined milk on Army transports. Test is to be made on several vessels on instructions from the COT. If tests are successful, the use of recombined milk would be considered on all U. S. Army transports returning from Japan, Okinawa, and Guam. DA msg requests CINCPAC's comment or concurrence.

2. CINCPAC msg XI 33090, 29 Dec 49 requested comment or concurrence from 8th A, MARBO and RYCOM.

3. Concurrence was obtained from the three commands. 8th A (Lt Col Marquis) states that shipping containers cannot be furnished unless procured in Japan. This is considered an unnecessary expenditure since Army transports presently carry a supply of fresh and frozen milk in disposable wooden containers for a round-trip voyage. The required number of containers could be retained on the transports for the recombined milk requirements for the return voyage to the ZI.

4. This msg is for the purpose of informing the DA that:

Part I. There are sufficient stocks of bulk products available in Japan, or slated, to meet the ECA Korea requirements for bulk petroleum products for third quarter Fiscal Year 50, except bulk lube of the specification quoted. Propose to divert bulk lube grade 30 now slated for delivery to Japanese economy to fill Korea requirement for bulk lube red engine.

Part II. All packaged products listed in reference msg except OE 10 have been brought into Japan to meet the requirements of the Japanese economy and have been released or sold to commercial oil companies. Ball and roller bearing and graphite grease are not available in military stocks; however, some VV-G-632, if accepted as a substitute, is available.

Part III. A. The requirement as stated in reference msg for OE 10 appears small. There is available in military stocks 2,940 gallons of OE 10 which can be shipped to Korea immediately. Resupply can be reflected in future FEC slates.

B. The following methods are the only known methods of supplying the requirements for packaged products as set forth in reference msg:

1. To purchase or borrow products from commercial oil companies.

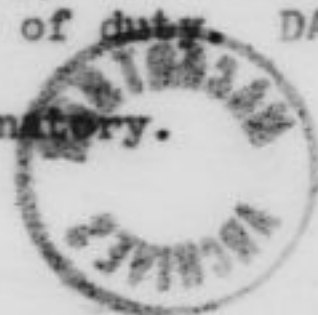

a. Radiogram Z-32484 from SCAP to DA Wash DC, 21 Dec 49, requesting DA to arrange clearances for visiting technicians into steel plants listed in radiogram according to a proposed itinerary. It was suggested that the arrangements be made thru American Iron and Steel Institute.

b. Radiogram VCL 30877, 1 Jan 50, from DA Wash DC to SCAP states AI&SI as a matter of policy does not involve itself in matters of this kind. DA radiogram suggests an arrangement similar to that provided for a group of visiting power engineers and states DA will fully assist any representative designated to manage the project. Under such arrangement a U.S. industry official was engaged with SCAP Commercial Account Funds.

2. Deputy Chief, ESS, has nominated Mr. Hill, former visiting expert consultant to ESS and connected with Loftus Engineering Corp., Pittsburgh, Pa. The proposed radiogram requests DA to negotiate with Mr. Hill to manage the project and also clarifies the phrase "2nd of 2 groups", mentioned in original radio which DA questioned. The first group involved is a four man metallurgical coking coal mission sponsored by IRS who is making arrangements directly with the U.S. plants to be visited. Two members of this group will join ESS sponsored mission upon completion of the first.



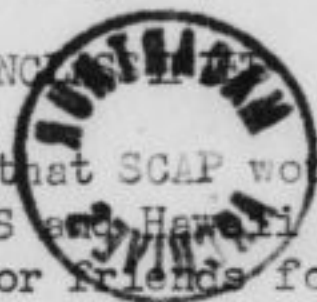
