Z-33385 For CSGID/C2. Ourmsg CX 54169 the necessity for release by BOB of FY 50 MCA funds becomes more urgent daily. If economy and speed of construction are to result from planned prosecution of the program FEC must have these funds to expend now. Advanced planning and preliminary ground work have reached stage where definite commitment of FY 50 funds is essential to keep construction organizations built up in operation and thus avert impairment of construction program.

In view of above if BOB cannot release all MCA funds authorized by Congress an immediate partial release will eventually save many thousands of dollars in ultimate cost. Request that a minimum of \$3,000,000 FY 50 MCA funds be released at once to be divided equally between materials and personnel. It is emphasized early favorable action on this request will save US considerable funds.

Memo for Record:

1. Progress in accomplishment of the Okinawa construction program has reached the point where procurement, invitations to bid and letting of contracts will be set back by any further delay in release of funds presently withheld by Bureau of Budget. Particularly critical is lack of funds for personal services required in the early stages of the program. It is felt that for orderly planning and economical prosecution of construction funds must be released at this time.

2. To achieve release of the funds DA was requested in CINCPAC message CX 54169, 25 Dec 49, for release of all funds in the military program authorized by Congress. No reply has been received on the request contained in this message in view of the short lapse of time since it was dispatched.

1. The main section of the Mladek report, exclusive of the confidential supplements, of which there were two, is 31 pages in length. It contains a clear statement of principles upon which the complementary ordinances and regulations are to be constructed.
2. It is believed that it would be to SCAP benefit to have this report circulated in Washington since it will emphasize the fact that the experts sent here for the purpose have prepared the basic format on sound grounds in spite of the fact that Mr. Sheetz and other individuals, who have seldom dealt with exchange controls, consider the procedures "too regulatory."
3. We have not yet mimeographed this report. We can mimeograph it and send the 20 copies requested or send typed copies and ask Washington to prepare its own mimeographed copies. In the case the latter procedure is adopted the proposed radio would have to be modified accordingly.
4. In view of the fact that the document should be mimeographed for distribution to SCAP Sections and to the Japanese it is recommended that we turn out and forward the 20 copies requested.
5. Upon your approval or modification of the proposal submitted herewith ESS will implement promptly.

is made to recent radio photo transmissions of pictures of Angus Ward and party from Tokyo to ZI via Army facilities for delivery to U.S. Navy and ultimate delivery to commercial news agencies on a reimbursable basis, also similar transmissions from San Francisco to Tokyo to Associated Press pictures covering Nobel award. Specifically, attention is invited to the following quoted communication from W. L. Beale, Jr., Chief of AP Bureau, Washington, to Alan Gould, Executive Editor, AP, New York: "We have obtained approval from the military today for transmission of exclusive picture copy via Army radio from Tokyo to San Francisco on the Angus Ward story. Commander John Levick, Chief of Dept. of Defense Still Picture Section of the Public Information Office, has arranged for the Army radio station in MacArthur's headquarters, Tokyo, to accept transmissions from AP. For the record, the Army (which has no legal right to act as commercial agency) is accepting the pictures for the Navy (which is authorized by statute to serve as agency when there are no commercial facilities available). The Navy will bill us. The pictures will be delivered at the Navy office in San Francisco. Perhaps San Francisco Bureau can expedite delivery by arranging to pick up the negative as has previously been done on pool pictures. These transmissions will be exclusive; we refused to pool." Also, mention is made of the fact that Russell Brines, local AP chief, requested transmission of photo Hideki Yukawa, Nobel Prize winner, in Stockholm, in which picture was in San Francisco at time of request. This headquarters was unable to make arrangements and radioed CSPID. In reply we were advised that arrangements had been

made through Navy to transmit photo from San Francisco as requested. In the case of the Ward pictures, and more particularly in the case of the Nobel picture, some delay was experienced because of necessity for arranging for transmission of pictures via Army facilities with understanding that pictures were being transmitted for Navy with subsequent reimbursement to the Navy by the commercial news agencies. Fully understood here that Navy is permitted by statute to handle commercial traffic in those instances where commercial facilities are not available whereas Army is not so authorized. Feeling here is that Army should not be in position of having to request sponsorship of Navy for transmission of commercial traffic via Army facilities but that Army should be given similar authority, thus avoiding unnecessary delays and embarrassment when Army is called upon to transmit commercial traffic in cases where commercial facilities are not available. In view of foregoing, CINCFE recommends strongly that every effort be made to take this matter up with Secretary Johnson as a matter of unification to the end that existing regulations are amended to permit the Army to provide commercial service to accredited press agencies on the same basis as the Navy. Specifically, it is recommended that this headquarters be authorized to transmit important news pictures to the ZI via Army radio photo facilities for accredited press agencies on a reimbursable basis and further that arrangements be made for the transmission of commercial pictures from the ZI to Tokyo for the syndicates, using Army facilities on an exclusive reimbursable basis.

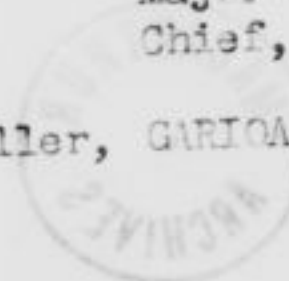

1. The Japanese Government desires to purchase or to authorize the purchase of raw cotton produced in the United States and plans to request offers or to authorize private importers to request offers by sellers of the following described growths, grades and staples:

In addition, sales of cotton textiles to the NEI under ECA coordination is expected to provide dollar proceeds substantially to cover advances made pursuant to this request.

7. Approximately \$96,700,000 worth of cotton has been procured under OJEIRF of which approximately \$57,000,000 has been repaid leaving a balance of \$39,700,000 which will require repayment by 31 March 1950. Assets segregated in Cotton Textile accounts as of 30 November amounted to \$51,000,000 plus \$3,100,000, providing further coverage for outstanding OJEIRF and PL 820 liabilities of approximately \$57,000,000. The most recent OJEIRF reports furnished the banks have been forwarded by airmail.

Re your letter of 25 November replies to questions follow:

Question No. 1

Form 18K of the Securities and Exchange Commission can be substantially completed by the Japanese Government.

Question No. 2

Position here that it would be impractical to reverse Law No. 60 at this late date, and therefore completion of Form 21K not required as all outstanding bonds assumed as government liabilities by Japanese Government.

Question No. 3

No objection here to resumption of trading provided that it is clearly understood that foreign exchange is not presently available for the service of such bonds and may not be available for some time in the future.

Question No. 4

Under Law No. 60 all outstanding obligations of the Japanese Government and Japanese public and private corporations payable in foreign currencies and held by Japanese Nationals or residents within Japan were converted to yen obligations. In addition some of such bonds held by "Axis" nations were voluntarily converted to yen obligations. All other foreign currency obligations of public and private corporations were assumed by the Japanese Government as obligations of that government with appropriate settlement in yen already effected between the government and the issuing corporation.

Question No. 5

Legal relationship of Japanese Government to corporate issues of foreign currency bonds is that government has been paid in yen by the issuer the full value of the bonds and has relieved them of all further liability.

The Japanese Government now regards itself as the obligor on all foreign currency bonds held abroad, and will ultimately pay all such bonds when foreign exchange for such purpose becomes available. It is our understanding that Taiwan Electric Power Co. bonds have been treated in the manner described above to date. Transfer of sovereignty over Taiwan may, however, give rise to a claim for offset against reparations claims of the nation gaining sovereignty.

Question No. 6

View here that Law No. 60 should be recognized and allowed to stand since it is impracticable now to reverse its provisions. The Japanese Government can be expected, in the interest of maintaining its own credit abroad, to honor the obligations it has assumed under Law No. 60 and to pay its foreign currency bonds as foreign exchange becomes available. However, considered here that resumption of payments on these obligations should not be undertaken as long as American aid, in the form of appropriated funds, is being accorded Japan.

Question No. 7

It is not, repeat not, regarded as practicable to restore mortgage liens which were removed by Law No. 60. Successive reorganizations during and since the war and presently contemplated as a part of economic rehabilitation in which mortgage liens have not been carried forward would cause serious problems, particularly in the electric power industry and might well preclude present plans for expansion.

Question No. 8

Appointment of fiscal or paying agent at this time might be regarded as a prelude to early resumption of service on the debt and cause undue speculation in bonds as well as pressure to use foreign exchange for service at the expense of increased American aid. The action would therefore seem untimely and should be postponed until it is determined that foreign exchange is available.

b. Action to identify and cancel all foreign currency bonds converted to yen obligations under Law No. 60 has according to Japanese Treasury reports been completed except for cancellation of some \$7,884,000 of bonds remaining in the U.S. and \$300,000 in other countries which were converted on the basis of safe custody receipts. Identification of such bonds is complete except for less than \$100,000 in total.


