The reinstatement of tax retroactive to 1 Jan 50 has already increased difficulty in recruiting; also the retention of current personnel. Hence immediate review of Guam rates becomes imperative. Recommend authority for interim adjustment to Navy rates pending Army-Air Force Wage Board determination if delay is anticipated by that organization. In order to preclude recurrence of similar inequitable situations, it is strongly recommended that coordination at Departmental level be effected as outlined in Memorandum of Agreement between Navy and War Department, dated 12 Feb 47. 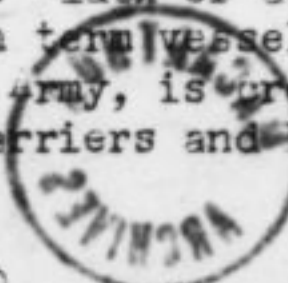
