

"Local press reports that the new Revenue act passed 23 Sep 50 makes income taxes due and payable for all servicemen and federal employees serving on Guam retroactive to 1 Jan 50. HR 8920 proposed Revenue Act of 1950 contained this provision but the Senate Finance Committee report shows that since no current payments of tax have been made and since it is likely that most of the individuals in question have carried on their affairs for more than half of 1950 without reserving funds with which to pay this tax, the imposition of tax 1950 incomes would result in hardship. According to information here the Senate Finance Committee made the change effective for the taxable years beginning after Dec 31, 1950. Request info on whether local press reports are true and if so recommend that further legislative action be requested to exempt the taxable year of 1950. Otherwise many servicemen and federal employees, not having made any provision for this tax, will be faced with extreme hardship."

However, the statement that it "will be purely informational rather than political" is not understood. If this means that the films would confine themselves rigidly to the presentation of "facts" in the manner of a training film on the assembly and nomenclature of the alarm clock, excluding all elements likely to influence attitudes, reconsideration is desired. Granted that it would be useful to have available a film to project whenever a curious or puzzled highschool student or housewife wanted to know how membership on the Security Council is rotated, the greater and more immediate meed is for films which will overwhelm the indifference of audiences and make the United Mations comprehensible in terms which are personally significant to each individual causing him or her to sit up and say, in effect: "That's for me! I ween't at San Francisco, but people like me were there. I'm not in the General Assembly, but decisions there affect me. I've never seem or tellest with anyone in UNESCO, but that mitfit is working away on problems that are just as much my problems as they are of anyone also. The United Hations means that the best minds in the world are working for me. " Unless the proposed files in some monsure can arouse such an attitude, they will fill only a secondary need. From the same standpoint, it is wondered whether the Trustesship Council, important though it is, requires a separate film. Some of the apscial agencies would meem to lend themselves to more profitable treatment. Whatever the content of the films, it is imperative that the presentation be simple. Anything unlikely to be clear to a twelve-year-old should





291545 Z Sep 50. This msg in two parts. Part one. Decisions regarding the construction of whaling factory ships do not involve the question of Japan's future whaling rights. Like other SCAP economic policies, approval or disapproval of the proposed construction is not an expression of long-range Allied policy and establishes no precedent. SCAP policy has consistently been to make fullest use of Japanese facilities to increase food production, thus reducing food deficits and their burden upon the U.S. Employment of larger factory ships is in accord with this policy and need not preclude nor prejudice future discussion of Japan's whaling rights.

For your info SCAP favors use of larger factory ships for following reasons: (1) Existing Japanese factory ships were constructed to war-time standards and converted in 1946 to present use. Accordingly they are imperfectly adapted to present use and life expectancy is short. Early replacement is desirable to insure continued efficient operation and to avoid risks to life and cargo; (2) Present Japanese whaling methods involve extraction of whale oil from blubber, bone, and some internal organs on factory ships and

methods were initiated early in the Occupation to alleviate a critically short supply of protein foods. They involve the use of a large number of salting and freezing ships, greatly increasing costs of the expeditions. With the easing of food shortages, but continued demand for edible oil, it is desirable to process most meat for oil, bringing only small quantities of meat to Japan. This is impossible with the existing factory ships. These vessels are too small to permit installation of additional equipment. Employment of larger factory ships will permit change to more economical operation and enable production to meet changing demands; (3) Employment of larger factory ships will make possible technological improvements which will insure higher quality products.

Further delay in reaching a decision jeopardizes the economic success of the expeditions and immobilizes both public and private capital. It is therefore planned to grant early approval for the construction of one ship. Salvage of the other vessel was approved on 28 Sep 50 and is now in progress. Consider that further discussion with UKLM will accomplish nothing significant.

- 1. DA Message WCL 46080 dtg 291545 Z Sep 50 contains the text of an Aide Memoire from the UK delivered to State on 15 Sep 50. UK requests information on the composition of the 1950-51 Japanese Whaling Expedition and raises objection to the approval by SCAP of the construction and salvage of new Japanese whaling factory ships. The UK argument is essentially the following: According to the terms of a U.S. State Department Aide Memoire of 4 Oct 46, any long-range consideration of the rights of Japan to conduct whaling operations is a matter for Allied discussion and decision. UK considers that the proposed construction and salvage of whaling factory ships in Japan is essentially a long-range consideration, and therefore UK should have opportunity to discuss all aspects of the matter with SCAP prior to a decision.
- 2. NR considers that while the construction of new factory ships may be economically a long-range consideration, the use of such ships does not raise the question of Japan's future whaling rights. Like other SCAP economic policies, approval or disapproval of the proposed construction and salvage is not an expression of long-range Allied policy and establishes no precedent. Therefore discussion with UK is not necessary. SCAP granted approval for the salvage of one factory ship on 28 Sep 50, and plans to grant early approval for the construction of a second vessel.

- 3. In ref msg State suggests that SCAP may desire to discuss the contents of the UK note with the UKLM in Tokyo. Upon the advice of DS, NR recommends that the matter not be discussed with UKLM.
- 4. SCAP msg states SCAP's position in subject matter, notifies State of SCAP's reasons for favoring the use of new factory ships, and provides the info on the 50-51 expedition requested by UK.







FEAF was advised by USAF in message that combat crews based in Japan or islands could not be accorded free postage privileges even though such crews took active part in flights over the combat zone in Korea.



Reports required by Paragraph 2D of SR 795-25-2 were not sent during FY 50 because of misinterpretation of requirements of the SR. Corrective action has been taken, and for FY 51 radio reports of purchases are now being forwarded in accordance with instructions contained in SR. The misunderstanding stemmed from the lump sum transfer of funds to this headquarters rather than individual contracts allotments with applicable part program designations. No knowledge here of any part program numbers assigned by DA to lump sum funds.

Suggested as means of complying with requirements of SR 795-25-2 is a composite report to be submitted by projects and headings as required, less part program numbers. 

Pass to the Honorable Charles Brannan, Secretary of Agriculture.

"Reference is made to the decision to control exports of raw cotton from the U. S. In this connection I wish to point out the extreme importance of cotton to the rehabilitation of Japan and other Asian countries. Plans have been made to provide Japan with 1,288,000 bales of U. S. cotton this crop year to meet the essential requirements of her industries and growing population as well as her commitments to export cotton goods to twenty-two other countries under trade agreements negotiated by this Headquarters on behalf of Japan. Cotton textiles are Japan's major export. Failure to obtain the planned amount of U. S. cotton will place a strain upon the Japanese recovery program and any amount less than one million bales this crop year will retard economic recovery in Japan, force her to reduce her trading level with other nations and destroy her ability to provide the textiles for civilian and industrial requirements of other Asian countries where unrest is preventing the growth of freedom and economic stability. These factors must be given full consideration in setting a quota for Japan and I therefore urge that the Japanese quota be at least one million bales. You are assured of full cooperation of this Headquarters and the Japanese Government in the necessary controls. Signed Douglas MacArthur."
