In view of policy enunciated in letter, CSCAB-M, DEPTAR, OCofS, 2 Oct 50, subject: Replacement of Military by Civilian, info is rqstd whether this policy is construed to authorize the employment of all categories of civilian mess attendants, including mess supervisors, cooks, cooks helper, bakers, and butchers in army TO&E messes, and to permit payment from appropriated funds. MARBO operations currently hampered by rotation of military personnel for mess assignments, which seriously affects military duties. Recommend appropriated funds be utilized to pay civilian mess attendants.

Part One. United States citizen civilian employees of the Army, and other United States citizens within Article of War 2 are tried exclusively by courts-martial and not repeat not by occupation courts regardless of nature of offense.

Part Two. Prior to declaration of emergency, MSTs personnel who were not subject to Army courts-martial jurisdiction under Article of War 2, and who were not triable by the Navy under the Articles for the Government of the Navy, were tried by occupation courts exclusively, regardless of nature of offense. No other jurisdiction existed in this theater to try such individuals. This practice was discontinued upon declaration of national emergency which vested jurisdiction in the Navy. Merchant seamen not within Article of War 2 and not considered accompanying or serving with the United States Naval forces are subject to Japanese criminal court-jurisdiction and are being tried in such courts.

Part Three. COMNAVFE proposes that United States citizens and others subject as civilians to Navy courts-martial jurisdiction be tried in the international SCAP established occupation courts. Occupation courts are now used primarily for the trial of offenses affecting security of the occupation and for trial of persons not subject to trial by other courts, including Japanese courts, in furtherance of SCAP policy to remove occupation controls in Japan. The use of occupation courts for the trial of United States citizens subject to Army, Navy, or Air Force courts-martial jurisdiction is not contemplated. Trial of MSTs personnel by occupation courts would

For SACCA FAOA. Urmsg DA 40754 Jan 51. Subject is Ryukyus procurement processed soybeans for testing.

1. Advise against purchase of processed soybeans. Present high cost of unprocessed soybeans would make cost autoclaved soybeans prohibitive. Even if sample test of processed soybeans proved advantages listed your message, high import cost would force distribution price beyond reach of average consumer. Current price for soybeans already has made price of products too high and reduced demand in Ryukyus where lower cost foods such as sweet potatoes, millet and barley are more advisable and economical. If procurement considered at all by Fycom, agree that purchase should be from non-appropriated funds.

2. Honen Oil Co. of Japan states not interested in securing rights and equipment for process nor in purchasing Horvath-processed soybeans. Their discussions in this connection purely exploratory responses to sales efforts of vendor.

for experimental purposes. Possible advantages cited are (a) higher food value than unprocessed soybeans (b) longer storage possibility (c) time and fuel saved in cooking and (d) shipping space saved.

2. Instant message discourages the procurement of processed soybeans even for experimental purposes. The cost of soybeans is high and the cost of heat treated soybeans would be prohibitive. Even if sample distribution validated the advantages listed above, the cost of end products would be too high for the normal consumer. It is deemed inadvisable to encourage the development of tastes for expensive processed foods which Ryukyus will not be able to afford to import in future years.
