Part 1. Ref part 4 urnsg DA 36441 DTG 050044Z and part 2 urnsg DA 36840 DTG 060045Z. Representatives of Universities concerned being called to Tokyo. Their new selections as replacements for Casey, Anthony, Monahan, Kruse, Cook, and Hart to be made from remaining applications on hand will be reported SAP.

Part 2. Ref part 5 urnsg DA 36441. University representatives carefully read all applications and reference letters before original decisions to accept candidates named. Anticipate no problems as to qualifications for positions for which applicants have been accepted. Comments on specific cases follow: (a) Qualifications Hugh Saythe will be emphasized as replacement for Monahan. (b) Delayed arrival Marquardt and Howes approved by universities concerned. (c) Comment requested from Tottori University relative Douglas' delay until after 1 August but reply not repeat not yet received. Douglas accepted for Social Science but University desired he handle some elementary instruction in English. His application stated he taught English both in high school and college. If university agrees to delay, trust Douglas will accept. (d) Ibaraki University accepted Cole understanding his qualifications for field of intracultural group education and expecting him to deal with philosophy and psychology of adjustment closely corresponding to his field of interest. Ibaraki still satisfied to take Cole. (e) Nagasaki University accepted Sears for English literature and Business English. (Business English means elementary practice work in English commercial correspondence.) (f) Wheeler's application did not repeat not mention qualification in History but did indicate specifically he had been Head of English Department, Hangchow College and Teacher in English Department, University of Nanking. (g) Aston's application listed English for Foreign Students and Freshman English including composition and contemporary literature. Oita University expects only elementary presentation of English and American literature with main emphasis on English language.

Reurmsg WCL 35375, Section 22 (b) (13) Internal Revenue Code, as amended by Section 202 (a), Revenue Act of 1950, and designation of "combat zone" by Executive Order 1095, dated 20 Dec 50, result in adverse discrimination to disadvantage of United States personnel of the United Nations Command whose performance of duty is as exclusively and importantly devoted to Korean operations as military personnel serving in combat zone as defined. Examples of persons adversely affected are: (a) air force, ground and navy shore-based personnel in Japan and Ryukyus installations who render direct around the clock support to air sorties and naval operations based on and conducted from such installations, (b) prisoners of war transported by the enemy beyond the presently defined geographic limits, and (c) United States civilian personnel, e. g. operations analysts, serving in Korea with the combatant forces. Recommend amendment of basic law to embrace all United States personnel of United Nations Command by extending provisions of Section 22 (b) (13) to all persons accompanying or serving with the armed forces of the United States in combat zone and redefinition of combat zone to include geographical limits of Japanese and Ryukyu Islands and territories of nations engaged in combat against the United Nations Command. If foregoing recommendation is determined to be infeasible, recommend redefinition of Executive Order of combat zone under existing law, to add Japan, Ryukyus, and territories of nations engaged in combat against the United Nations Command.
