FOR PIO PD UNDER PROVISIONS OF JOS NINE SIGHT ONE THREE Z - 28844 FOUR CHA SEVEN DECEMBER THE FOLLOWING COMMENT BY GENERAL WILLOUCHBY, THE THEATER GEORGE DASH TWO ON A TRIBUNE EDITORIAL OF FIVE DECEMBER IS FILED WITH THE REQUEST THAT YOU RELAY TO THE HERALD TRIBUNE CHA VIZ CLN PARA QUOTE I HAVE JUST SEEN A FRACEIENTARY ACCOUNT OF THE TUESDAY EDITORIAL OF THE HERALD TRIBUNE BROUGHT HERE THROUGH THE WIRES OF THE UNITED PRESS PD THE SHARP CRITICISE OF THE INTELLIGENCE SERVICES OF THIS COMMAND IS WITHOUT THE SLICHTEST DEGREE OF VALIDITY PD PARA QUOTE AS MAGARITHURS CHIEF OF INTELLIGENCE CMA THROUGHOUT THE WAR YEARS IN THE SOUTHWEST PACIFIC AS WELL AS THE UNITED NATIONS VENTURE INTO KOREA CHA I STAND READY TO INMEDIATELY ASSURE DIRECT PERSONAL AND OFFICIAL RESPONSIBILITY FOR INDER QUOTE CONFUSION OF FACTS AND INTELLIGENCE END INNER QUOTE AS SUGGESTED BY THIS EDITORIAL PD I AM NOT PREPARED CMA HOWEVER CHA TO ACQUIESCE SILENTLY IN SUPERFICIAL DEDUCTIONS OR UNWARRANTED CONCLUSIONS PD PARA QUOTE THE UNITED NATIONS FORCES OPERATED UNDER DIRECTIVES TO LIQUIDATE THE HORTH KORMAN COMMUNIST FORCES AND TURN OVER A PACIFIED COUNTRY TO FREE ELECTIONS PD THIS MEANT FIGHTING AND THE OCCUPATION OF GROORAPHICAL SPACE PD THESE FORCES HAVE DONE THAT SUCCESSIBILIT AND MID OCTOBER WERE SITHIN FIFTY

CHINESE INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY CHA THE YALU RIVER PD THE UNITED NATIONS FORCES EMPLOYED FRONTALLY IN THE EIGHTH ARMY SECTOR TOTALLED APPROXIMATELY FOUR ANTRICAN AND FOUR SOUTH KORFAN DIVISIONS AND SMALLER BRITISH CMA FRENCH AND TURKISH CONTINUENTS PO THE TIRED TROOPS REACHED THEIR POSITIONS AFTER MONTHS OF CONTINUOUS AND ENTIRELY CREDITABLE FIGHTING PO THE MANSUVER OF INCHON COMBINED WITH THE BREAK HYPHEN THROUGH OF THE EIGHTH ARMY METTED OVER ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND PRISONERS OF WAR PD THIS OBVIOUSLY SUCCESSFUL UNITED MATIONS CAMPAIGN WAS PLANNED FOR AND PREDICATED ON THE ENSWIBLE OF THE MORTH MOREAN OPPOSITION CLN IT WAS NOT PLANNED FOR WAR AGAINST COMMUNIST CHINA PD PARA QUOTE INFORMATION ON THE ENTRY OF RED CHIMA INTO THE KOREAN WAR INVOLVED BOTH POLITICAL AND MILITARY INTELLIGENCE DASH CHE IN THE FIELD OF INTERNATIONAL DIPLOMACY CHA THE OTHER ON BATTLE FIELD COMDITIONS PD PARA QUOTE POLITICAL INTELLIGENCE ON CHINESE COMMUNIST INNER QUOTE INTENTIORS END INNER QUOTE AND INFORMATION FROM BEHIND THE IRON CURTAIN HAS BEEN PRACTICALLY NON HYPHEN EXISTENT DASH AT LEAST LITTLE OR WONE EVER REACHED THIS HEADQUARTERS PD WILLTARY INFORMATION OF CHINESE COMMUNIST INTENTIONS AND ORDER OF BATTLE WAS NEGLIGIBLE UNTIL DEVELOPED THROUGH OUR ATTACK ON TWENTY FOUR NOVEMBER PD PARA QUOTE DETECTION OF ENEMY MOVEMENTS ON THE BORDER AREA OF NORTH KORRA NECESSITATED RELIANCE UPON AIR RECONMAISSANCE WHICH WAS PROHIBITED NORTH OF THE YALU AND FOUND ITSELF VIRTUALLY IMPOTENT IN VIEW OF THE ENEMYS RESTRICTING OF HIS MOVEMENTS TO THE HOURS OF DARKNESS AND CAPACITY FOR CONCEALMENT RENDERED POSSIBLE BY THE MOUNTAINOUS TERRAIN MARKING THE APPROACHES FROM THE YALU RIVER TO THE BATTLE FRONT PD KNOWLEDGE OF THE ENEXTS ORDER OF BATTLE AND THE ABILITY TO ESTIMATE HIS INTENTIONS WAS DEPENDENT UPON PIECING TOGETHER AND EVALUATING IMPORMATION GAINED THROUGH INTERROGATIONS OF PRISONERS OF WAR PD PARA QUOTE THE INITIAL COLLISION WITH CHINESE COMMUNIST TO 18 A 2 PLACE UNDER CONDITION OF OUR GENERAL PURSUIT OF THE REMNANT MORTH KORMAN ARMY IN DIRECTION OF THE YALU RIVER PD

CHINESE INTERNATIONAL BOUNDARY CHA THE YALU RIVER PO THE UNITED NATIONS FORCES EMPLOYED FRONTALLY IN THE EIGHTH ARMY SECTOR TOTALLED APPROXIMATELY FOUR ANTRICAN AND FOUR SOUTH KORRAN DIVISIONS AND SMALLER BRITISH CMA FRENCH AND TURKISH CONTINUENTS PD THE TIRED TROOPS REACHED THEIR POSITIONS AFTER MONTHS OF CONTINUOUS AND ENTIRELY CREDITABLE FIGHTING PD THE MANEUVER OF INCHON COMBINED WITH THE BREAK HYPHEN THROUGH OF THE EIGHTH ARMY NETTED OVER ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND PRISONERS OF WAR PD THIS OBVIOUSLY SUCCESSFUL UNITED NATIONS CAMPAIGN WAS PLANNED FOR AND PREDICATED ON THE ENSEMBLE OF THE NORTH KOREAN OPPOSITION CLE IT WAS NOT PLANNED FOR WAR AGAINST COMMUNIST CHINA PD PARA QUOTE IMPORMATION ON THE ENTRY OF RED CHIMA INTO THE KOREAN WAR INVOLVED BOTH POLITICAL AND MILITARY INTELLIGENCE DASH CHE IN THE FIELD OF INTERNATIONAL DIPLOMACY CMA THE OTHER ON BATTLE FIELD COMDITIONS PD PARA QUOTE POLITICAL INTELLIGENCE ON CHINESE COMMUNIST INNER QUOTE INTENTIONS END INNER QUOTE AND INFORMATION FROM BEHIND THE IRON CURTAIN HAS BEEN PRACTICALLY NON HYPHEN EXISTENT DASH AT LEAST LITTLE OR NONE EVER REACHED THIS HEADQUARTERS PD MILITARY INFORMATION ON CHINESE COMMUNIST INTENTIONS AND ORDER OF BATTLE WAS NEGLIGIBLE UNTIL DEVELOPED THROUGH OUR ATTACK ON TWENTY FOUR NOVEMBER PD PARA QUOTE DETECTION OF ENEMY HOVEMENTS ON THE BORDER AREA OF NORTH KORRA NECESSITATED RELIANCE UPON AIR RECONNAISSANCE WHICH WAS PROHIBITED NORTH OF THE YALU AND FOUND ITSELF VIRTUALLY IMPOTENT IN VIEW OF THE EMEMYS RESTRICTING OF HIS HOVEMENTS TO THE HOURS OF DARKNESS AND CAPACITY FOR CONCEALMENT RENDERED POSSIBLE BY THE MOUNTAINOUS TERRAIN MARKING THE APPROACHES FROM THE YALU RIVER TO THE BATTLE FRONT PD KNOWLEDGE OF THE ENEMYS ORDER OF BATTLE AND THE ABILITY TO ESTIMATE HIS INTENTIONS WAS DEPENDENT UPON PIECING TOGETHER AND EVALUATING INFORMATION GAINED THROUGH INTERROGATIONS OF PRISONERS OF WAR PD PARA GROTE THE INITIAL COLLISION WITH CHINESE COMMUNIST PLACE UNDER CONDITION OF OUR GENERAL PURSUIT OF THE REMNANT MORTH KORMAN ARMY IN DIRECTION OF THE YALU RIVER PD

AT THAT THE LEADING REGINERTS ONLY OF ALLEGEDLY CHINESE VOLUNTEER UNITS NEERS ENCOUNTERED UNDER A COVER DESIGNATION OF THE FIFTY THIRD CMA FIFTY FOURTH AND FIFTY FIFTH ARMIES PD THE POTENTIAL OF AN OVERNIGHT INCREASE OF THESE FORCES CHA AT A DISTANCE OF ONLY FIFTY WILES FROM THEIR BASE CHA WAS NOT IGNORED BY THE EIGHTH ARMY PD THE ENTRY OF CHINESE FORCES CHA THOUGH UNDETERMINED AS TO FULL EXTENT CHA WAS ENOUGH OF AN INTERNATIONAL FACTOR TO ADJUST MILITARY DISPOSITIONS ACCORDINGLY PD PARA QUOTE THERE WAS ONLY ONE WAY TO FIND OUT AND IT IS A SOLDIERS WAY UNDER THE OFFENSIVE MISSION OF THE UNITED NATIONS FORCES CHA AND THAT WAS TO ATTACK PO THIS ATTACK PROMPTLY DISCLOSED A TREMENDOUS BUILD HYPHEN UP OF CHINESE COMMUNIST FORCES IN THE GENERAL AREA OF EIGHT OR MORE ARMIES CHA OR TWENTY POUR DIVISIONS PO IF THE EIGHTH ARRY HAD REMAINED STATIONARY IN POSITIONS AROUND ANJU CHA IT WOULD HAVE FACED EVEN GREATER NUMBERICAL ODDS PD WITH THE ENEMY CLOSE TO HOME TERRITORY CHA IN AN ARTIFICIAL SANCTUARY FROM FROM AIR ATTACK AND AIR OBSERVATION CHA IT WAS NO TRICK TO HOVE CONSIDERABLE MASSES FORWARD CHA TO A FRONT ONLY FIFTY MILES AWAY PD SUCH MOVEMENTS WERE MADE AT NIGHT ON FOOT AND IN MOTOR PD PARA QUOTE UP TO THE LAUNCHING OF THAT ATTACK THE COMMAND WAS CONFRONTED WITH THE NECESSITY FOR DECISION UPON ONE OF THREE COURSES OF ACTION CMA TO WIT CLN PAREN ONE PAREN TO ATTACK CHA PAREN TWO PAREN TO REMAIN IN POSITION CHA OR PAREN THREE PAREN TO WITHDRAW PD THERE WAS NEITHER POLITICAL NOR MILITARY INTELLIGENCE TO INDICATE A WITHDRAWAL PD HAD IT REMAINED IN POSITI N WHILE AS EVENTS HAVE SUBSEQUENTLY DISCLOSED CMA THE CHINESE COMMUNISTS WERE BUILDING UP FOR AN OVERPOWERING ATTACK CMA DESTRUCTION OF THE EIGHTH ARMY WOULD HAVE BEEN INEVITABLE PD DECISION WAS THEREFORE MADE TO ATTACK WITH ALL ELEMENTS ABREAST UNDER CLOSE COORDINATED CONTROL PD THIS ATTACK FORCED THE ENEMY TO REVEAL DASH UNDOUBTEDLY PREMATURELY UNDER HIS PLAN DASH BOTH HIS STRENGTH AND HIS INTENTIONS PO IT PROVIDED THE EVIDENCE

THROUGH PRISONER OF WAR IDENTIFICATIONS AND INTERROGATIONS CHA THAT A SIZEABLE PART OF THE CHINESE CONTINUNTAL ARMY WAS COMMITTED AGAINST OUR FORCES IN KOREA PD PARA QUOTE YOUR SERMING QUESTION OF THE ACCURACY OF INTELLIGENCE ESTIMATES OF ENEMY STRENGTH CMA IS TO A CERTAIN EXTENT ACADEMIC SEMI CLN THE TRANSFER OF LIN PIACS FOURTH FIELD ARMY AGGREGATING FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND MEN ALONE CHA FROM SOUTH CHINA CHA FROM THE HAINAN AND OFFSHORE FORMOSAN AREAS WAS TRAILED FROM ONE RAILROAD TERMINAL TO THE NEXT PD ITS ARRIVAL IN MANCHURIA AND SUCCESSIVE DEPLOYMENT ALONG THE YALU RIVER WAS ALSO KNOWN PD THE ONLY INNER QUOTE ESTINATE END INNER QUOTE IF THAT VACUE TERM COULD BE APPLIED WAS SPECULATION IN TOKYO AS WELL AS IN LONDON AND WASHINGTON PAREN AND PRESUMABLY IN THE EDITORIAL CHAMBERS OF THE HERALD TRIBUNE QUERY PAREN ON IF AND THEM THE CHINESE WOULD INTERVENE PD THE WORLD HELD ITS BREATH CHA CONFRONTED WITH THAT SINISTER POTENTIAL PO THE CHANCELLORIES OF THE WORLD ATTEMPTED BY EVERY DIPLOMATIC MEANS TO INDUCE THE CHINESE COMMUNIST WAR HYPHEN LORDS TO STAY OUT PD ONE CAN HARDLY BLAME THE UNITED NATIONS FIELD COMMANDER FOR THE CHINESE COMING IN EN MASSE AT THEIR OWN TIME AND PLACE PD THAT MOMENTAL DECISION WAS BEYOND THE LOCAL MILITARY INTELLIGENCE SURVEILLANCE SEMI CLN IT LAY BEHIND THE IRON CURTAIN AND IN THE SECRET COUNCILS OF PRIPING PD THERE WAS A BRIEF TWILIGHT ZONE OF EXPECTATION CHA EAGERLY SHARED BY THE ENTIRE BORLD CMA THAT THE FICTION OF CHINESE INNER QUOTE VOLUNTEERS END INNER QUOTE WAS REAL CMA THAT THE ALREADY IDENTIFIED CHINESE FORCES WERE ONLY A SMALL INNER QUOTE TOKEN GESTURE END INNER QUOTE TO A DEFEATED NEIGHBOR CHA THOUGH THERE WAS NO IMPERENT HISTORICAL OR ETHNIC OBLIGATION TO NORTH MOREA PD IT NOW SEEMS APPARENT THAT COMMUNIST AID TO NORTH KOREA BEGAN IN DNE NINE FOUR NINE AND THAT THE DECISION TO INTERVENE IN STRENGTH WAS MADE INCIDENT TO OUR AMPHIBIOUS OPERATIONS ON SEPTEMBER FIFTEENTH PD PARA QUOTE APART FROM THIS CHA CARIA

Subj indivs should be informed that existing conditions in Korea proclude favorable consideration entry Fry and Crows for purposes stated WCL 34806. Logistic support Japan must be other than occupation facilities







Under previsions of JCS 98134, 7 December the following comment by General Willoughby, the theater G-2 on a Tribune Editorial of 5 December is filed with the request that you relay to the Herald Tribune, viz:

"I have just seen a fragmentary account of the Tuesday editorial of the Herald Tribune brought here through the wires of the United Press. The sharp criticism of the Intelligence Services of this command is without the slightest degree of validity.

"As MacArthur's Chief of Intelligence, throughout the war years in the Southwest Pacific as well as the United Nations venture into Korea, I stand ready to immediately assume direct personal and official responsibility for confusion of facts and intelligence' as suggested by this editorial. I am not prepared, however, to acquiesce silently in superficial deductions or unwarranted conclusions.

North Korean communist forces and turn over a pacified country to free elections. This meant fighting and the occupation of geographical spaces. These forces have done that successfully and by mid-October were within fifty miles of the Chinese International boundary, the Yalu River. The United Nations forces employed frontally in the Eighth Army sector totalled approximately four American and four South Korean Divisions and smaller British, French and Turkish contingents. The tired troops reached their positions after months of continuous and entirely creditable fighting. The maneuver of Inchon combined with the break-through of the Eighth Army netted over 100,000 Prisoners of War. This obviously successful United Nations campaign was planned for and predicated on the ensemble of the North Korean opposition: it was not planned for war against Communist China.

"Information on the entry of Red China into the Korean war involved both political and military intelligence—one in the field of international diplomacy, the other on battle field conditions.

"Political intelligence on Chinese Communist 'intentions' and information from behind the Iron Curtain has been practically non-existent—at least little or none ever reached this headquarters. Military information on Chinese Communist intentions and order of battle was negligible until developed through our attack on twenty-four November.

"Detection of enemy movements on the border area of North Korea necessitated reliance upon air reconnaissance which was predicted North of the Yalu and found itself virtually impotent in view of the enemy's restricting of his movements to the hours of darkness and capacity for concealment rendered possible by the mountainous terrain marking the approaches from the

Yalu River to the battle front. Knowledge of the enemy's order of battle and the ability to estimate his intentions was dependent upon piecing together and evaluating information gained through interrogations of prisoners of war.

"The initial collision with Chinese Communist troops took place under condition of our general pursuit of the remnant North Korean Army in direction of the Yalu River. At that time leading regiments only of allegedly Chinese volunteer units were encountered under a cover designation of the 53d, 54th and 55th Armies. The potential of an overnight increase of these forces, at a distance of only fifty miles from their base, was not ignored by the Eighth Army. The entry of Chinese Forces, though undetermined as to full extent, was enough of an international factor to adjust military dispositions accordingly.

"There was only one way to find out and it is a soldier's way under the offensive mission of the United Nations forces, and that was to attack. This attack promptly disclosed a tremendous build-up of Chinese Communist forces in the general area of eight or more armies, or 24 divisions. If the Eighth Army had remained stationary in positions around Anju, it would have faced even greater numerical odds. With the enemy close to home territory, in an artificial sanctuary free from air attack and air observation, it was no trick to move considerable masses forward, to a front only fifty miles away. Such movements were made at night on foot and in motor.

"Up to the launching of that attack the command was confronted with the necessity for decision upon one of three courses of action, to wit: (1) to attack, (2) to remain in position, or (3) to withdraw. There was neither political nor military intelligence to indicate a withdrawal. Had it remained in position while as events have subsequently disclosed, the Chinese Communists were building up for an overpowering attack, destruction of the Eighth Army would have been inevitable. Decision was therefore made to attack with all elements abreast under close coordinated control. This attack forced the enemy to reveal—undoubtedly prematurely under his plan—both his strength and his intentions. It provided the evidence to show, through prisoner of war identifications and interrogations, that a sizeable part of the Chinese Continental Army was committed against our forces in Korea.

"Your seeming question of the accuracy of intelligence estimates of enemy strength, is to a certain extent academic; the transfer of Lin Piac's Fourth Field Army aggregating 500,000 men alone, from South China, from the Hainan and offshore Formosan areas was trailed from one railroad terminal to the next. Its arrival in Manchuria and successive deployment along the Yalu River was also known. The only 'estimate' if that vague term could be applied was speculation in Tokyo as well as in London and Washington (and presumably in the editorial chambers of the Herald Tribune?) on if and when the Chinese would intervene. The world held its breath, confronted with that sinister potential. The chancellories of the world attempted by every diplomatic means to induce the Chinese Communist war-lords to stay out. One can hardly blame the United Nations Field Commander for the Chinese coming in en masse at their own time and place. That monumental decision was beyond the local military intelligence surveillance; it la the find the Iron Curtain and in the secret councils of Peiping. There was a trief tailight zone of expectation,



eagerly shared by the entire world, that the fiction of Chinese 'volunteers' was real, that the already identified Chinese forces were only a small 'token gesture' to a defeated neighbor, though there was no inherent historical or ethnic obligation to North Korea. It now seems apparent that Communist aid to North Korea began in 1949 and that the decision to intervene in strength was made incident to our amphibious operations on September 15th.

"Apart from this, the circumstances involved call for an understanding that behind her undeclared war, Communist China is undoubtedly prepared to further commit any needed segment of her enormous potential for war.

"These facts are sent to you in the public interests and it is hoped that you will publish them. It is time for distinguished newspapers such as yours to appeal to calmness and reason, avoiding hysterical accusations or deductions. In this as always you can render a valuable public service."

Reference your TCL 29170 of 30 Nov it was realized that action proposed mymsg Z 24918 of 10 Nov would require Congressional action and coordination on a governmental level. R 755-60-5 is a DA regulation and does not cover disposal of United Nations scrap which is defined as that scrap generated by all military forces operating in Korea. As an interim measure CINCFE is disposing of scrap under the authority of SR 755-60-5 dated 1 Feb 1950, SR 755-60-20 dated 29 August 1950, and a general authority to provide such civilian type supplies in Korea to prevent disease, starvation, and unrest, and for minimum construction and reconstruction to further military operations of the United Matiens Command. These regulations are inadequate, however, as they do not cover the long term problem of disposal of United Nations scrap. Request that action be initiated now to deal with long term problem of disposal of scrap in Korea, Donation of usable scrap to the UN relief agency responsible for the relief and rehabilitation of Korea will assist in solving the scrap disposal problem and also save the United Nations money on procuring and transporting to Korea, materiels which would otherwise be required if scrap is not made available. Since United Nations relief is partially supported by the United States, this action will result in a savings to the United States taxpayers as well as the taxpayers of other United Nations involved. Ref to para 25, SR 755-60-20, 29 Aug 50 believed to be in error as referenced SR has only four numbered paragraphs.

MEMO FOR RECORD: The 64th Fngr Base Topographic Battalion by letter to the Engineer, GHQ, FEC, 410, subj: Procurement of Technical Tquipment, dated 15 Nov 50 and informal routing slip, subj: Procurement of Technical Equipment, dated 22 Nov 50, requested 4 new Webendorfer Big Chief Model 29, 22" x 29" presses. The 4 additional presses will allow for increased map reproduction within the 64th Engr Base Topographic Battalion, use of standardized functions such as lay out, stripping, paper cutting, film usage, and in turn simplify the procurement and storage of necessary topo supplies.

This message requests that 4 each, presses, Webendorfer Big Chief 29's be added to Operational Project Army-FEC-GEN-1-51-OP for the 95th Engineer Base Reproduction Company to allow for increasing the press capacity of the 64th Engineer Base Topographic Battalion, and eventually to replace the LTE presses presently in use at the 64th Engineer Base Topographic Battalion which will in turn allow for the elimination of certain duplicating functions in operation, maintenance and supply.
