In this type of fighting you must expect ups and downs. Reactions are sure to occur in the interval of time between the intiative that the enemy has and the initiative that he is going to lose. I am completely capfirmed in the estimates that I made to the President of the U.S. last week that the enemy lest his great chance for victory in the last three weeks. That does not mean that victory passes to us instantly or without a long hard row and the most difficult struggle. That we will have new hearbreaks, new setbacks is inherent in the situation, but I was never more confident in victory - in ultimate victory - in my life than I am new. General Walker and his division commanders are handling the situation with marked energy and superior efficiency. The South Korean forces, the South Korean commanders are showing a degree of resilience which is inspiring. The Air Forces and the Navy have been splendid in every way. Everyone understands that no matter how great their efficiency they cannot through their own might alone stop vigerous advancing ground troops. It seems to me they have done everything that it was possible for them to do. One of the outstanding features of

the situation today has been the complete cooperation between the various

services. That cooperation has extended to the fullest extent to the Korean

forces. It is now going even further and is extending to the United Nations



Department of Army, Washington, DC ......... Personal to Parks. Reurad WCL 34133. The combat operations are actually being covered and reported and handled not in one area but in three, from Korea, from Tokyo, and from Washington. Correspondents and others involved are competing not only with rival services but with other reporting fronts of their own services. It would be utterly foolish and merely add confusion to situation if censorship should be applied at one level and not at other two. As you know we are forbidden to apply it in Tokyo, and it is hardly conceivable that it would be applied in Washington. Under such circumstances to attempt to apply it in Korea would be merely a sham and a smokoscreen to pass responsibilities that belong to the press to the Armod services. Comparing consorship as was set up in U.S. in World War II as was reported by Time magazine is totally unrealistic for prosent situation. There is no consorship here or in Eighth Army. EUSAK has told correspondents copy will be checked for security only when requested. Copy over sighth Army to Tokyo teletype rolls continuously twenty-four hours a day. Service is excellent. Correspondents are allowed and encouraged pool telephone time immediately after briefings to expedite copy. They are also allowed additional two hour period during slack hours at night. They have failed to use courier service on GHQ courier plane although they are continuously advised to use it for feature stories. During many poriods of day Eighth Army runs 30 minuto backlog on calls. It has taken PIO GHQ semotimes as long as one half hour to get PIO Eighth Army on non-priority basis. Additional circuits now being serviced and more wires should be available to correspondents in near future. Telephone lines have boon used continuously from front to Tokyo. Recording of calls indicates cases where one correspondent has stayed on line filing story for more than hour, this just two nights ago. Following are few examples: on July 19 and 20 during Tanjon Battlo, AP 73 minutes, AP 56 minutes, London Daily Express 49 minutes, INS 49 minutes, and New York Times 42 minutes. Complaints are totally unjustified considering situation. Correspondents have been furnished more information more freely more promptly and have been given greater freedem of movement in FEC than was over permitted in any prior war. Truth is this war is overcovered. There are nearly 200 correspondents in Tokyo-Koron area with at least another 60 enroute. This is far in excess of needs. Regardless of how much you do for press, they are always going to crab and gripo. It appears from this end that best solution would be for you to inform mombors of fourth estate at ANPA lovel of situation and tell them it is about



Treasury checks indorsed by attorney in fact unless assured that the Treasury Dept. will honor such checks when the power is attached to the check and has not been previously filed with Treasury Dept. While there appears to be no regulation requiring prior filing of letters of attorney with Treasury Dept., as stated above, requirements in this regard must be complied with in view of the stand taken by local banks, who, in the final analysis, are the paying agency. 31 CFR 360.5 provides that certain checks indorsed by an attorney in fact must be accompanied by a power of attorney executed after the issuance of the check (for cortain purposes), containing a full description of the check concorned. It has been suggested that, pending official clarification, the local banks transmit checks on hand to the payee thereof through military channels for proper indorsement and return. This rad requests DA coordination with Treasury Dept. to make exception in cases affecting personnel in the Korean war zone if such requirement actually exists.





Yesterday's story tells about 3.5 inch bazookas coming to Far East as most effective ground weapons against tanks. Same dispatch says 105mm. cannons and present bazookas useless against tanks. Spokesman also states estimate North Korean tank strength inaccurate. It appears official communiques this headquarters sufficient without advertising proposed action. Furthermore, dispatches indicate commandeering of General Gordon, sailing date, number of men, and cargo. Dispatch also states equipment load aircraft Boxer, its cargo and purpose of trip. Statement also from Oakland Army base gives complete freighter load for Far East. Today's UP story from San Diego gives full details on Marines, one line says, "Their exact departure time was secret but it appeared they would leave either Thursday night or Friday." Much other data including ships named.

In view of possible enemy submarine action, believe this should cease, and people, military and civilian, stateside, become security-conscious. Furthermore, publicizing name and type of combat units is valuable information to enemy concerning what he will have to meet.

The first from the State Department quoted in part:

"Dispatches received here from UP, AP and Reuters presumably are same as those given world-wide distribution. UP appears principal service for defeatist headlines. Its stories habitually omit or bury SCAP communiques and feature alarming generalities or alleged remarks by disillusioned retreating wounded U.S. troops."

The second from USALO Hongkong quoted in part:

"Foregoing are from leading English language papers, various dates stories are equally unfavorable fault appears lay in two points:

- \*1. Sensational press dispatches by United Press and Reuters, many apparently gleaned from individual soldiers.
- '2. Layout of stories as prepared here which appear deliberately designed place American forces in bad light. Stories normally consist of repetition of unfavorable incidents under each press service by line, local interpretation, Commie radio claims, and buried deep in text CINCFE communique."

Sir Alvary Gascoigne, United Kingdom Ambassador, sent the following letter to CINCFE:

"In a statement by your Public Information Officer dated the 2 July, Press Correspondents in this theatre were requested to be as discreet as possible

about all movements and locations of armies, aircraft, ships and other fighting units, which should not be referred to in detail.

"2. In this connection my Government has instructed me to inform you that should this request not prove to be effective, for instance in the event of the hostilities continuing for a long period of time, they would see no objection if you were to consider that the advantages of imposing a censorship on war reporting might outweight the disadvantages.

"3. In bringing this to your notice I desire to stress to you that my Government's purpose is merely to let you know their views on this matter and to demonstrate their anxiety to cooperate with you in every way possible."

Many of the dispatches amount almost to operational reports which convey intimate information to the enemy of the condition, morale and movements of our units engaged even at the time in a shifting battle conflict. They are not checked with any responsible authority whatsoever and are frequently the emanations of shell-shocked or irresponsible individuals, a certain percentage of such type being readily available in any group of men either military or civilian. These dispatches amount in fact to psychological warfare benefits to the enemy. They depress the morale of our troops and enhance the morale of the enemy. They are frequently so confined to a small incident as to be misrepresentative of what is really taking place.

There seems to be lacking a sense of responsibility to patriotic principles.

The freedom we are giving the press is a new departure which it was hoped the press would respond to by its own sense of responsibilities which should govern

voluntary censorship. There is no slightest evidence that the intermediate controls on these dispatches as they go up through the various editorial offices are exercised to rewrite or delete in any way or in any other way to check through the higher echelons to censor mistakes made in the field.

It is earnestly suggested that a conference be held with the senior press people in an endeavor to spur them to a more active realization of what voluntary censorship entails. A word from the head office to the working echelons would have the greatest possible effect upon field reporters who are in constant fear and dread of a charge of relative backwardness in covering their beats. This matter is of the gravest importance as it is undeniable that if the present voluntary censorship does not accept its obligations and show improved results actual censorship will have to be imposed. The lives of our soldiers and the success of our operations cannot continue to be sacrificed at the alter of sensationalism.

MEMO FOR RECORD:

Reference radio from DA is probably a result of a radiogram sent by the Japanese Government, approved by CCS, to the Universal Postal Union at Bern, Switzerland o/a 3 July 1950, in which the UPU was requested to advise member nations that international postal service with Korea is temporarily suspended. It is not believed advisable to reestablish or continue International mail service with Korea on a broad scale because of the present disorganization of the Korean Government and normal communication facilities. Military necessity requires full utilization of the highways, railroads, and all forms of transportation for the conveyance of troops, supplies and equipment, which would make impossible delivery of mail to addressees.

Capt. Bowen, Postal representative from GHQ now on TDY with USAFIK, has been instructed to look into the possibility of reestablishing international mail service between member nations of UPU and the Republic of Korea and to advise this headquarters to what extent international service may be resumed. He will not look into this matter, however, until he has performed his primary mission of organizing the Army-Air Force Postal Service in Korea.

FOR JCS PD Due to cryptographic security, it has been necessary to reword the proclamation which is quoted berewith: 953

"Personnel of the Armed Forces of North Korea and other persons of North Korea who are taken into custody or fall into the hands of armed forces now under my operational control in connection with hostilities in Korea will be treated in accordance with the humanitarian principles applied by and recognized by civilized nations involved in armed conflict. I will expect similar treatment for American nationals and members of the Armed Forces of the United States, as well as other nationals and members of other Armed Forces who may join the United States in the Korean conflict and who may at any time be in North Korean hands. Operating pursuant to resolutions adopted by the United Nations Security Council, and as commander of forces placed under my command by such resolutions, I will hold responsible any individual acting for North Korea who deviates from these principles or who causes, permits or orders any deviation from such principles. MacArthur."



Following is situation regarding evacuation of personnel from Korea, as of 290200Z.

Grand total 1767 individuals, men, women and children, have been evacuated Korea to Japan; 862 air, 905 surface.

812 have been classified and reported. 110 dependents of all kinds, 351 U. S. Government employees, 179 missionary personnel various denominations and nationalities, and 172 miscellaneous other personnel. The 351 U. S. Government employees consist of 26 DACs, 14 ECA, 309 State Department (this figure not reliable), and 2 missionaries.

896 evacuees have been processed and moved from debarkation area to billets under control of Eighth Army to await disposition.

Two evacuation ships enroute to debarkation port from Pusan, SS Jesse Lykes with 91 evacuees mostly State Department males, few missionaries; Letetia Lykes with 70 evacuees, mostly missionaries, few State Department employees.

Except for 400 civilian and military porsonnol, all male still on duty, this is believed to complete evacuation.
