It is considered essential that charter provisions to berth line vessels permit diversion of the vessel to any port in Japan or Korea as deemed necessary by the FECC. It is recommended that the following minimum lot cargo acceptable for delivery be as follows:

Japan Ports	3,000 M/T
Korean Ports	2,000 M/T
Okinawan Ports	3,000 M/T

Memo for Record:

1. Flea control, particularly in newly occupied or forward areas in Korea is a major problem. BHC has been found to be more effective than DDT as a flea powder for disinsectizing floors and grounds. DDT now available for troops is not being sufficiently effective. It is desired therefore to issue small cans of Japanese manufactured BHC for troop use in forward areas and in bulk for use by crews in stabilized areas. Technical papers available here indicate some possibility of toxic effects to animals from application of BHC dust to the skin but practical results do not seem to bear this out. It has been extensively used for agricultural insects without ill effects on the users. The technical papers are in disagreement. The consensus of all technical personnel here is that use would probably be safe and that the warnings cited are somewhat alarmist and do not represent practical experience. The 406th Medical Laboratory may do some patch tests for skin irritation, if volunteers can be secured.

2. Information as to whether there is further evidence available in Washington is desired. Lt Col Long, Consultant in Preventive Medicine, Medical Section, GHQ, concurs. Present radio requests such information.

1. CINCFE message ZX 13368 stipulated the conditions under which commercial communications carriers would be permitted to operate in Korea. Two of the provisions are that the carriers will assume all responsibility and expense incident to transportation of personnel and facilities to Korea and that only US citizens would be included in the station complement. This second provision was modified by CINCFE message Z 16300 to grant permission for use of Philippine Nationals.
