I, DANIEL BOQUER, Filipino, of legal age, and residing at 22 Haig, Mandaluyong, after having been first duly sworn, depose and say:

Sometime during the first week of February 1942, I was assigned by Col. Quinn to work in Motor Pool No. 7 of the Philippine Motor Transport Depots to serve in the capacity as Civilian Personnel Officer. Motor Pool No. 7 functioned until 9 April 1942 at which time it was disbanded due to the full occupancy of Bataan by the Japanese Forces. The Commanding Officer of Motor Pool No. 7 was Capt. Lee E. Stevens ( deceased ) and at the beginning, the people employed as drivers and assistant drivers numbered approximately 500. The drivers and assistant drivers were paid \$50.00 per month and were not given an increase in salary during the time Motor Pool No. 7 was in operation. The employees were divided into squads each having a squad leader who received \$3.00 per day. Between 200 and 300 men were paid for the month of February, however, none of them received their pay for March and April. The reason some men were not paid for the month of February was because a number of them were transferred from Motor Pool No. 7 to Motor Pool Nos. 2 and 3.

From Bataan, I retreated to Corregidor and upon the surrender of Corregidor, I was interned by the Japanese but was released in August 1942. I do not have any records of the Motor Pool No. 7. However, I have good reason to believe that payrolls for the Philippine Motor Transport Depots were evacuated from Bataan and Corregidor as late as 3 May 1942 by submarine. I based this statement on ~~xxx~~ a remark made by Col. Tom Lynch on Bataan to this effect and also the fact that I wrote a letter to my sister in the United States the 1st of May 1942 from Corregidor and this letter was delivered to her in the United States 3 months later. I have seen a large number of men employed in Motor Pool No. 7 in and around Manila since liberation. However, I do not recall any specific names of those employed.

I based this statement on a remark made by Col.
