A list of Filipino personnel (83 names) is also attached. Very little is known as to what has happened to these employees, but they have not, apparently, been interned. No records as to next of kin are available.

This Department hopes to have a representative in the Philippines who will be able to give those released necessary assistance. If, however, any are released or come under control of our forces at a time when no representative of this Department is available, we would desire the commanding general to extend any assistance which in his judgment the employee might require, in the way of clothing, advances of funds, etc., and in the case of American employees return to the United States at the earliest possible date, and to advise the Department promptly of any who come under his control.

It appears possible that with the invasion of the Islands, at least some information may have been or will be received by our forces as to the welfare of American citizens in Manila. It is suggested that, if possible, the commanding general be queried on this point. Such information, if available, would be appreciated and would be kept confidential if the War Department so desired.
