I, SALVADOR M. ORENDAIN, Filipino, of legal age, and now residing at 2238 Rizal Avenue, Manila, being duly sworn, depose and say:

That on or about the 15th of December 1941, I was approached by a foreman (name I do not remember) in U.S. Army Quartermaster Depot at Pier No. 1, in Port Area, Manila, and told me to hire some laborers to work at the same Quartermaster Depot and that I would be the capataz. I agreed and recruited more than 20 laborers. On 16th December 1941, we rode in an Army truck and drove to the Quartermaster Depot at Pier No. 1, Manila. Upon arriving there, I was introduced by the foreman to Major Smith and told the officer that I was the capataz who hired the laborers. On that day we were assigned to unload and load Army supplies and ammunitions from the vessels which were docked at Pier No. 1. These supplies were to be taken to different military installations. We worked at the Pier No. 1 from the 16th of December 1941 until the 2nd of January 1942. During these times, frequent raids by the enemy were made at the Pier and we had to take cover. On the evening of January 1st, 1942, I was told by Major Smith that the Army was to leave for Corregidor that night. We were told to load the vessel with supplies, and at 11:00 o'clock that night the vessel "S.S. Mactan" left Pier No. 1. Before Major Smith left, I was instructed by Major Smith to return the following day at Pier No. 1, and throw every Army weapon such as rifles, bullets, machine guns that were left behind. I did return the following day and with the help of some laborers at the Pier we threw into the sea said Army weapons. In the afternoon of that day, I received a telephone call from Major Smith that I must destroy all telephone connections in the Office of the Quartermaster at Pier No. 1. Later in the hours following, I saw Japanese Forces coming. An Officer, thru an interpreter, told me why I was there. I told him that I was the watchman of the place. He then told me to quit the place and I went home.

As a capataz in the U.S. Army Quartermaster Depot at Pier No. 1, I was to receive P4.00 per day. I was also told to receive an extra pay for overtime, but I do not know how much. From 16 December 1941 until January 2, 1942, my laborers and I, were not able to draw our salary. We were told that the paymaster had left for Corregidor.

That to the best of my recollections, the following laborers are the living workers who worked under me at U.S. Army Quartermaster Depot at Pier No. 1. The list of the laborers under my supervision was lost:

Before me, the undersigned officer authorized to administer oaths in cases of this kind, personally appeared TEODORO MIRANDA, of legal age, married and a resident of Barrio Kakutot, Arayat, Pampanga, who, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

That I started to work for the U. S. Army in April 1941 as a Carpenter at ₱2.50 per day. After 15 days of work, my superiors found out that I was a good carpenter my salary was increased to ₱2.80 per day. That after further 15 days of work I was made Capataz of about 150 men who were working as laborers, carpenters, and masons at Fort William McKinley, Rizal. Mr. O'Leary was the who made Capataz and increased my wage to ₱4.00 per day and was approved by Lt. Col. Connety.

That we made two barracks in the Office of the Quartermaster for about two months. When finished these, we were assigned at the Signal Field to make two big barracks and one small barrack for Officers. We made for about 2½ months. After these, we were assigned to A Range to make a magazine warehouse which we did for 1½ months. When this was finished, I went back to the Quartermaster where we made a big warehouse for a month. Then I was given a vacation to take my extra day period, because every month we got 6 or 8 days extra period. According to the Quartermaster that this will be paid at the end of the job, but they gave me a vacation to pay said extra days. I received full payment until December 5, 1941. My Foreman was Mr. Lancaster and the Superintendent of my work was Major Ivy and the Officer-in-Charge of the Quartermaster was Lt. Col. Connety, all of whose whereabouts I have no information or knowledge.

That while I was taking my vacation, in November 1941, I was called up even though my credit days were not yet paid and I was ordered to work again because of the magazine warehouse I made. I inspected all the doors and made the necessary finishing touches on same.

That when the war break out, we were working in the A Range where we were making a magazine warehouse. On December 10, 1941, I found out that Major Ivy of the 57th Infantry in Fort McKinley was assigned to his unit and my Foreman, Mr. Lancaster, was assigned as a Mechanic for the trucks and I got no more Foreman and Superintendent. On December 11, 1941, while Major Ivy was passing by, I called his attention to the fact that we are about to finish the magazine warehouse and asked him what work we were to do next and he told me that if the work is finished I will distribute the men to other work in progress in the camp.

That on December 12, 1941, because the war was becoming so hot and dangerous that I decided to evacuate my family which I did on December 14, 1941. Then, on December 17, 1941, I went back to work and although there was a great confusion in the camp, I worked for 4 days then we were told to get our salary from the Philippine University, December 19, 1941, but on this date there was a big dogfight in Manila so we were unable to get our salary.

I WENT back to the province where I joined the Labor Battalion in Bataan and I was assigned to work near Magalang and Mt. Arayat, along the boundary-line of the Pampanga River, now known as the "MacArthur Defense Line". We cut the bamboo trees along this line under the direction of Lt. Ram Snyder and one day, while we were working, 3 Japanese planes bombed and strafed our position that we were frightened and were unable to work. Because the Japanese were very near and were able to penetrate thru the Cabanatuan Defense Line, coming from our rear, we were unable to retreat with the soldiers who left us on or about January 7 or 8, 1942, for Bataan, destroying the bridges behind them. I was also unable to receive my pay for this service.

That according to what I know about the work in Fort William McKinley, there were 8 groups working in the construction of barracks, chappel, hospitals and tunnels. We were 8 Filipino Capatazes there. I know these other Capatazes because we often meet together and we often get our salaries together and because some of them were my workers for some time. There were 4 American Foremen. They were Mr. Lancaster, Mr. Breslin, Mr. Wardrop and one whose name I do not now recollect and the 8 Filipino Capatazes were: Balingit, Moreno, Mariano, Juan Espiritu, Teodoro Miranda, Manuel Padilla, Rodriguez and Ysip. The Capataz working in the tunnel was Hernandez. I do not know exactly if that work was included in the new construction. Here we were being paid two times a month, every 5th and 20th of each month.

That I know that some of my men received their back pay, namely: Jesus Ysip and Aniceto Arcega. Balingit, also a Capataz, received his back pay.

Before me, the undersigned officer authorized to administer oaths in cases of this kind, personally appeared TEODORO MIRANDA, of legal age, married and a resident of Barrio Kakutot, Arayat, Pampanga, who, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

That I started to work for the U. S. Army in April 1941 as a Carpenter at ₱2.50 per day. After 15 days of work, my superiors found out that I was a good carpenter my salary was increased to ₱2.80 per day. That after further 15 days of work I was made Capataz of about 150 men who were working as laborers, carpenters, and masons at Fort William McKinley, Rizal. Mr. O'Leary was the who made Capataz and increased my wage to ₱4.00 per day and was approved by Lt. Col. Connety.

That we made two barracks in the Office of the Quartermaster for about two months. When finished these, we were assigned at the Signal Field to make two big barracks and one small barrack for Officers. We made for about 2½ months. After these, we were assigned to A Range to make a magazine warehouse which we did for 1½ months. When this was finished, I went back to the Quartermaster where we made a big warehouse for a month. Then I was given a vacation to take my extra day period, because every month we got 6 or 8 days extra period. According to the Quartermaster that this will be paid at the end of the job, but they gave me a vacation to pay said extra days. I received full payment until December 5, 1941. My Foreman was Mr. Lancaster and the Superintendent of my work was Major Ivy and the Officer-in-Charge of the Quartermaster was Lt. Col. Connety, all of whose whereabouts I have no information or knowledge.

That while I was taking my vacation, in November 1941, I was called up even though my credit days were not yet paid and I was ordered to work again because of the magazine warehouse I made. I inspected all the doors and made the necessary finishing touches on same.

That when the war break out, we were working in the A Range where we were making a magazine warehouse. On December 10, 1941, I found out that Major Ivy of the 57th Infantry in Fort McKinley was assigned to his unit and my Foreman, Mr. Lancaster, was assigned as a Mechanic for the trucks and I got no more Foreman and Superintendent. On December 11, 1941, while Major Ivy was passing by, I called his attention to the fact that we are about to finish the magazine warehouse and asked him what work we were to do next and he told me that if the work is finished I will distribute the men to other work in progress in the camp.

That on December 12, 1941, because the war was becoming so hot and dangerous that I decided to evacuate my family which I did on December 14, 1941. Then, on December 17, 1941, I went back to work and although there was a great confusion in the camp, I worked for 4 days then we were told to get our salary from the Philippine University, December 19, 1941, but on this date there was a big dogfight in Manila so we were unable to get our salary.

I WENT back to the province where I joined the Labor Battalion in Bataan and I was assigned to work near Magalang and Mt. Arayat, along the boundary-line of the Pampanga River, now known as the "MacArthur Defense Line". We cut the bamboo trees along this line under the direction of Lt. Ram Snyder and one day, while we were working, 3 Japanese planes bombed and strafed our position that we were frightened and were unable to work. Because the Japanese were very near and were able to penetrate thru the Cabanatuan Defense Line, coming from our rear, we were unable to retreat with the soldiers who left us on or about January 7 or 8, 1942, for Bataan, destroying the bridges behind them. I was also unable to receive my pay for this service.
