

1. The undersigned's tour of duty with the 14th Eng. (P.S.) was from 1 August 1941 to the surrender of Bataan.

- 2. From 9 December 1941 to surrender of Bataan I was the S2 and S3 and Assistant Engineer to the Philippine Division.
- 3. As S3 and Assistant Engineer had indirect charge of all 14th Eng. Bat. operations.
- 4. The only dates that I can recall specifically, of any particular project was the Pilar Bagac read across the Pantengan River from period of 8 Feb. 1942 to 22 Feb. 1942. The Filipino Civilian labor company of App. 200, under the command of 1st Lt. Thomas D. Crabtree worked on various road projects.
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- 6. There were no civilian formen or time keepers in this civilian labor co. Supervision was furnished by non commissioned Officers of the 14th Eng. Bat. Time and dates of work were kept by the acting 1st Sgt. and certified to by the Company Commander.
- 7. This so called Labor Company was well organized and supervised as stated above, and disbanded on the 8th of April 1942.
- 8. The undersigned being Class B Agent Officer for Co. John R. Vance F.D. and he received a large number of paid pyrolls while on Bataan for Civilian Labor. Thus partially clearing the Agent's Cificer's Finance account. There is a possibility that some of these payrolls may be in the Office of Chief of Finance in Washington, D.C.



#### AFFIDAVIT

I, MATIAS ESCUDERO, Filipino, of legal age and a resident of Balanga, Bataan, being first duly sworn, depose and say:

That six (6) years prior to the outbreak of war, I was on many occasions employed as Capataz by the Bureau of Public Works, Department of Engineering, of the Province of Bataan.

On or about 5 December 1941, while I was employed as Capataz by the Engineering Office in Balanga, Bataan, we were told that the U.S. Army needed our services and that we had to work for the 14th Engineers, U.S.E.D. On this date, I was transferred to the employment of said 14th Engineers, as a Capataz, and I was in charge of about 35 men in the making of firing lines and digging of foxholes for the U.S. Army. Our work was at first supervised by the Foreman, Engineer Delfin Rueda. The U.S. Army officer in charge was a Major Mansano. It was our understanding that I would receive \$3.00 per day for my services, and the laborers would receive \$2.00 per day. I kept a record of all the men who worked under me, and I prepared the payrolls for their services every 15 and end of the month, a copy of which were furnished to the American officer. However, the U.S. Army was never able to come to our place, so none of the men were paid from 16 December 1941 to approximately 20 March 1942. For the first half of December, we were paid by Mr. Dominador Valdecenas, who was then the Paymaster of the Philippine Government in Balanga, Bataan. Mr. Veldecenas, is now employed as Municipal Treasurer of Balanga, Bataan. Due to intense bombing and strafing to which we were subjected, about twice a week, by the Japanese, most of the men stopped working prior to 20 March 1942. I remained in the job about 20 March 1942, at which time I was forced to leave, because of the unsafety condition of said place.

The Director, Team #2 Chief, Claims Service, Philippines-Ryukyus Command

In reply to your letter, 20 Aug. 47 (just received) reference claims for services made by laborers, QMC, I submit the following information:

1. On Dec. 19, 1941, I took 150 laborers (about) from the QMC Dept Labor Pool at Manila, and proceeded to Limay, Batsan, where the number was augmented by some 35 already working at that place. The total (about 180) were all Filipino laborers. None were foreman, capatazes, or timekeepers, such duties were taken care of by officers, à civilian employees. Lt. Carandang was the Filipino officer to whom I assigned the duty of time-keeping. At the time the project started these laborers were being paid about 2.40 pesos per day, for an eight hour day. Labor was scarce. The situation demanded longer hours. As the situation became worse, the men were worked 16 hours daily. For the period Dec. 14th to 18th (or thereabouts) the pay of 2.40 per day obtained. From the 19th to 20th until the evacuation was ended, (30th of Dec.) the pay was five pesos per day. I think the 5.00 rate carried on until 15 Jan. 1942, at which time a uniform rate for all services was established.

2. Lieut. Masterson was an agent Finance Officer who paid QMC accounts in the QMC area on Batsan after Jan. 17, 1942.

3. After the evacuation to Bataan was ended (on Dec. 30, 1941) the many small loaded craft along the shores of Bataan still remained to be unloaded. This work was not completed until after Jan. 15, 1942. The strenous sixteen hour daily grind, under hazardous conditions continued about that long. A uniform rate for all Filipino laborers on Bataan went into effect about that time. All Filipino laborers were allowed to return to their homes (by the Japs) after the surrender of Bataan. Four of my laborers were killed by a bomb, about bec. 22, 1941, abourd the "Sikiang" S.S. in Mariveles Bay while engaged in unloading that vessel.

This office has received a large number of claims for anpaid services of civilian laborers rendered the U.S. Army through the 14th Engineers in Bataan after the outbreak of the war in 1941. It is alleged by these claimants that the 14th Engineers recruited their services in the construction of the different projects the 14th Engineers undertook to construct during the siege of Bataan. That their services to the Army, were never paid. Information relative to the actual employment of civilian laborers by the Army, roster, and manner of payment, if ever made, is very limited as no available records have been recovered. In view of this fact, it is necessary that a considerable amount of information be furnished this office by different military personnels who were with the 14th Engineers at that time in order that a just and final determination can be rendered these claims.

Information furnished this office shows that a Major Ace E. Faulkner was with the 14th Engineers in 1941. If you are the individual referred to above, it is requested that you furnish this office information in the form of answers to the questions enumerated below.

- 1. What were the dates of your tour of duty with the 14th Engineers?
- 2. What unit of the 14th Engineers were you assigned with and what position did you hold?
- 3. If you were with the lith Engineers during the siege of Bataan, what projects did you have charged on the construction? Enumerate specifically as many as you can recall.
- 4. State approximately the date each of the above projects was started and finished, and the name of the officers who were directly in charge.

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- 5. Do you recall the construction of Bagac Road and some of the airfields in Bataan by the 14th Engineers? - 6. Who were some of the Foremen, Timekeepers, and other responsible civilians employed by the 14th Engineers?
- 7. Did you have knowledge of the so-called Labor Battalion under the 14th Engineers? If so, to what extent were the members employed by the Army. Give details as to the organization, whether loosely or well organized, the rate of pay paid the members while working for the Army and when the organization was disbanded.

Your kind and prompt cooperation will be greatly appreciated by this office.

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



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

This office is processing a number of claims for unpaid wages filed by laborers allegedly employed by the 14th Engineers, in what they termed as the US Public Works, in the making of firing lines and in digging foxholes in Bagac, Bataan. These laborers were formerly employees at the Bureau of Public Works, Department of Engineering, Province of Bataan. However, the US Army allegedly commandeered their services and they were assigned in making firing lines and in digging foxholes for the US Army. Their work was supervised by Engineer Delfin Rueda, and that you were the Officer-in-Charge of the work, with Matias Escudero as capataz. Payrolls covering these men were allegedly prepared every 15 and end of the month, and copies of same were furnished Lieutenant Roy, an American officer of the 14th Engineers. The claimants alleged that the US Army was never able to pay them in full or in part for their services which lasted up to 20 March 1942. On this date, they stopped working due to intense bombing and strafing to which they were subjected by the enemy.

In order to expedite the processing of these claims, it is requested that a statement be furnished this office covering your knowledge of the existence of this project, inclusive dates of operation, approximate number of men employed, rates of pay of the laborers, and of the capataz and the period for which they were not paid.



The claimants have stated that this battalion was ordered into being by the U. S. Army, and that, work continued on until 1 January 1942, of which time the battalion ceased to exist because of the approach of Japanese Forces.

In order to give credence to these claims, it is necessary that definite proof be established that such an organization actually existed, and that it was under the direct orders and supervision of the U. 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That I ADRIANO DE LA CRUZ, a Filipino citizen, married, of legal age and residing at Balanga, Bataan, after having been duly sworn in accordance with law depose and say:

That on December 16, 1946, I was employed by one Major Pio Magsino of the 14th Engineer U. S. Army in Bataan as Engineer incharge of recruiting and organizing civilians into labor gang to work in army jobs then being undertaken for the defense of Bataan.

That the said army Officer give a wage of P5.00 per day for Engineers. That we were stationed in Kupang Barrion School, which served as my headquarter, Bagac Elementary School and Moron Elementary School buildings, ready at any time of the day towbe sent to the places of assignment.

That the places where we worked were construction of Mabatang defense line at Abucay, trails in Moron, detour in Balanga, Bagac beach defense and bodegas and trails in Mariveles.

That we worked from December 16, 1941 to April 9, 1942.

That we were not paid for the above services by the U.S. Army because of the disruption of communications which render payment impossible.

That I recruited \_\_\_\_\_\_ laborers including foremen, timekeeper and mess officers.

That to the best of my knowledge and belief, I certify the following laborers who worked faithfully and continously from Def. 16. 1941 up to the fall of Bataan on April 9, 1942, including their designations, wages and addresses.

That during the first few days of the recent war, sometime on Dec. 12,1941, Major Pio Magsino, 14th Engineer Corps. U.S. Army commanded me to organize the so-called CIVILIAN LABOR CORPS.;

That within four days, being emergency in nature, the said CIVILIAN LABOR CORPS was organized on Dec. 16, 1941 and on the same very day the organization began to operate;

That the said organization was known as the CIVILIAN LABOR CORPS COMPANY B with headquarters at Orani, Bataan;

That the same has been assigned to repair the old Layac road, Layac road detour, repair of Tapulao-Orani road, preparations and digging of foxholes and trenches in Mabatang, Abucay, Bataan, putting of camouflage for the Orani Water Tanks;

That the said routine duties assigned to the corps lasted up to April 9,942, the date of surrender of the Fil-American forces in Bataan;

That by reason of the surrender all records pertaining to the organization were destroyed to escape the brutality of the enemy:

That this Civilian Laborer began to work on Dec. 18, 1941 under the supervision and control of the U.S. Army until April 9, 1942.

That I, PACIFICO CALIMRAS, Filipino citizen, married, of legal age and resident of Orion, Bataan, but presently in Dinalupihan for this purpose, after having been duly sworn in accordance with law, depose and say:

That I am a Filipino by birth in the Municipality of Orion, Province of Bataan, and a Civil Engineer by profession; that before and on the outbreak of the Pacific War on December 7, 1941, I was being employed as Assistant Civil Engineer Supervising some public works projects being done by the Office of the Provincial Engineer, Balanga, Bataan, of the then Commonwealth Government, and that, therefore, with my compensation being . chargeable to the project I held this position on a temporary basis; that a few days later when the U.S. Army in Bataan Peninsula was getting busy preparing the necessary defense to meet the impending Japanese invasion of the Peninsula, Ireported myself for duty in the Army Service to one Major Pio Magsino of the 14th Engineering Corps, United States Engineers ing Department, who at that time was organizing and recruiting civilian laborers; that said Army Officer accepted me at a wage of FIVE PESOS (#5.00) per day; that the first man I recruited was Emilio Baltazar, a high school teacher, who afterwards became our Mess and Ration Officer and on December 16, 1941, Major Pio Magsino, Emilio Beltazar and myself recfuited and organized SIXTY (60) laborers including Amado Suratos, a school teacher as Time-Keeper-Foreman, to work in roads, trails, bridges and air fields and in other miscellaneous army jobs located in the Municipalities of Limay. Mariveles, Bagac and other places to which the civilian laborer gang might be needed; that the laborers were stationed in the school buildings in Orion, employed on a 24-hour basis whereby them were able to meet emergency jobs anytime of the day and night; that as the days passed until the time of final surrender of Bataan Peninsula on April 9, 1942, we had rendered our services as much as we could under the confused and risky condition then occuring, with enemy air raids and bombings growing worse each passing day.

That to the best of my knowledge and belief, I certify that the following laborers who worked under the 14th Engineering Corps, U.S. Army, had rendered faithful, loyal and uninterrupted service from the time we were recruited on DECEMEER 16, 1941, up to the fall of Bataan Peninsula on April 9, 1942; that we had not received any payment of this service so far; and that the following were the names, position, wages and present addressed of the laborers:

#### AFFIDAVIT

I, VIRGILIO J. ONGOCO, Filipino of legal age, residing at 740
Estrada, Sampaloc, Manila, and presently employed by the Hqs. GENED, after having been first duly sworn on oath, deposes and say:

That on 18 June 1946, I called at the office of Claims Service,

AFRESPAC, for conference with Captain Benjamin J. Pulley. Captain Pulley
asked me to verify the affidavit that I made in support of my wage claims,
Pro-3975 for wages due me on services rendered from 1 December 1941 to 4
January 1942, while working with the Civilian Labor Corps, 14th Engineers,
U. S. Army, at Dinalupihan, Bataan.

I have carefully studied this affidavit, and on this date, I still attest to its accuracy and swear to the validity of its allegations. I further state that I do not know the whereabouts of Mr. Pedro P. Talastas for I have not seen him since he ceased working for the 14th Engineers, the later part of December 1941. I would like to point out that themfollowing named/were under under my supervision until 4 January 1942, and that after that date, together with these men, I escaped to the hills and no one of us were further employed by any U. S. Government Agency from then until the end of the war in 1942.

On 25 April 1946, I was at Dinalupihan, Bataan, and at that time, I saw all men whose names were listed above. They made endeavors to intimidate me in favor of the claims that they had filed with the Claims Service, ATAMSPAC. That at the time of this visit, I mentioned that I had a claim registered with the Claims Service, AFRESPAC, for the period from 1 December 1941 to 4 January 1942, at which time, all the men listed hereon expluined that they too, had filed claims with the Claims Service, AFRESPAC.

but for the period of from 18 December 1941 to 9 April 1942 and I should try to execute a new affidavit to coincide with the period of their claims.

I refused any suggestion on their part and I feel that the claims of these men are in no way justified, and that their claims are fraudulent.

I swear that the above statements are true and correct to the best of my knowledge and belief.

I certify that during and after the war, 8 December 1941 to 9 April 1942, I was the First Sergeant of Company "A" 14th Engineer (PS). That the Company was engaged on the following missions:

Combat Team (attached to the 57th Infantry Combat Team)
Road Maintenance (Mariveles - Saysa-in)
Issuing war materials to the front.
Construction of obstacles
Planting mines (Land)
Engaged in withdrawal action until the surrender

That from 10 December 1941 to 12 December 1941 this company was stationed in Bo. Dila Dila, Sta. Rita, Pampanga, aweiting orders. Ordered and transferred to Bo. San Juan, Guagua, Pampanga. Was detailed Road Maintenance and Traffic from San Fernando to Hermosa from 13 December 1941 to 28 December 1941. Then from 29 December 1941 to 22 January 1942 was stationed in Bo. Bani, Balanga, Bataan. Was detailed on Road Maintenance, construction of bridges and Back Roads and planting mines (land). Two (2) Platoons were detailed and attached to the 57th Infantry for clearing firing line (night operation) at Mabatang Front.

That the Company on or about 22 January 1942 to 29 January 1942 was stationed at Patoc Trail, Orion, Bataan. Was on reconnaisance job and to apprehend stragglers.

Then that on 30 January 1942 to 24 February 1942 the company was stationed in Biaan River. Was on road maintenance from Little Baguio to Saysayin, Bataan, construction of obstacles (trenches and barbed wire) and planting mines (land).

That from 25 February 1942 to 2 March 1942 the Company moved to Signal Hill and constructed a trail for the Plane Observation Post. Then from 3 March 42 to 24 March 42 the company was stationed in Catmon River, Bataan and constructed the Pantigan-Catmon ridge road. That on or about 25 March 42 to 2 April 1942 the company was ordered and stationed in Little Baguio. Was on the process of constructing a hospital. That materials were already on the hospital sight. Suddenly all available troops behind the line were organized into Reserves. Then were thrown into the line and engaged in combat. That supplies and materials were taken from different supply points and dump points. That on some of these jobs and works, I used to inspect. It has been also the duties of the 57th Infantry and our Platoon to clear the field as a firing line as a result of which the bottom parts of some of the houses were taken off but others were totally cleared off. There were no civilians employed with our unit.

At my first entrance at the Philippine Scouts before the outbreak of the war, I know that Colonel Harry A. Skerry was in command of the 14th Engineers but was replaced by Major Frederick G. Saint. The last named officer was not with us when we reached Abucay and I do not know where their quarters are during that time. Captain Dampwolf was the Commanding Officer and Lieutenant Leitz as the Platoon Leader.

After we reached Abucay, I do not know what place it was, we were assigned, almost the whole 14th Engineers, to construct a lateral road with indefinite length. In the construction of this lateral road, there were two (2) civilians attached to the 1st Platoon but I saw that there were several civilians working with the other units. After finishing the lateral road, we were assigned to other several jobs after which the surrender came inevitably.
