### A F F I D A V I T

I, DOMINGO R. ONRUBIA, of legal age, married, and a bonafide resident of the municipality of Caloocan, province of Rizal, being duly sworn according to law, depose and say:

1. That I was the Superintendent who had full charge of the Luzon Bus Line, a subsidiary department of the Manila Railroad Company of the Philippine Islands, before the outbreak of World War II until January 14, 1942;

2. That on December 8, 1941, I had charge of over three hundred (300) employees consisting mostly of drivers and conductors, mechanics, office and field men; the operation of 150 motor vehicles, the shops with complete set of apparatuses, garage, stores, gasoline, oil, parts and accessories at Quezon City and other agencies in the provinces and territories served by the Luzon Bus Line which covered a route of about 525 kilometers, with 135 buses and 15 freight trucks in service;

3. That foreseeing the possibility of the United States being involved in the Pacific War on account of the continuous Japanese aggression in the continent of Asia, on the 4th of December 1941 (at 4:00 P.M.) a meeting of all local bus and truck operators was held at the U. S. Army Headquarters, Quartermaster Department, and Major Cavender presided over that meeting. Our Mr. Exequiel Santos, Asst. Superintendent, represented the Luzon Bus Line in that meeting and each representative was asked to report the exact number of motor vehicles the Army could dispose of and subsequently Mr. Santos was advised that the U. S. Army would commander all trucks and buses in case of emergency;

4. At the outbreak of the war at about noon, December 8, 1941, the U. S. Army through Lt. Col. Rogers, Traffic Control Officer, Lt. Col. Quinn and Major Brettel began ordering the commanding of our buses even going to the extreme of putting out passengers to load soldiers and supplies without giving any receipt;

5. That on December 10, 1941 (at about 10 AM) Captain Brewster G. Gallup, Corp of Engineers, U. S. A. on behalf of the USAFFE high command, came to my office and personally introduced himself as the liaison officer and informed me that from that date all employees of the Luzon Bus Line were under the direct orders and control of the military and that all trucks and buses and all parts and accessories, etc., as well as the garage at Quezon City were commandeered by the USAFFE for its exclusive use. The information was later confirmed by the letter of Brigadier General R. K. Sutherland, U. S. Army Chief of Staff, dated 14 December 1941;

6. That all orders would be strictly carried out secretly and were to be transmitted to me or Mr. Exequiel Santos, Asst. Superintendent;

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7. That on that same date, December 10, 1941, at about 3:00 P.M., the employees were gathered at Quezon City Garage and all were informed of Captain Gallup's orders. Present at the gathering were:

7 Inspectors  
15 Mechanics  
91 Drivers  
52 Conductors

all of whom promised to work and pledge their loyalty to the cause for which the U. S. and the Philippines were fighting. Mechanics, Conductors and Inspectors who knew how to drive were given their assignments and their respective cars to drive.

8. That Major Brettle of the Motor Pool, whose office was located at the Centro Escolar de Señoritas at Azcarraga St. was authorized to requisition for buses or trucks to be assigned by groups of 10 or 20 and also a young lieutenant of Quartermaster Corps whose name I do not remember;

9. That the first assignment of a large fleet of our vehicles was the transfer of the portion of General Lim's forces from Tagaytay to Palico, Batangas province; and a portion of the forces of General Jones in Rosario, Batangas to reinforce the garrisons on the east coast of Tayabas province. Most of my men's work was accomplished during the night although on rush orders the movement of troops was done at the risk of enemy raids during broad daylight;

10. That due to the fast advance of the enemy on or about the 21st of December the orders transmitted to the undersigned were to move at once all troops to the peninsula of Bataan and all drivers must be fully armed and protected. All vehicles were made available and about 50% of General Lim's division was safely transported to the peninsula including two regiments of scouts from Ft. Wm. McKinley and a large volume of supplies. After Christmas day some of our buses, already without roofs, were transporting supplies and ammunitions from rail station of San Fernando, Pampanga, to Bataan while a good portion remained at the peninsula and were used as convoy by the USAFFE;

11. That about 10% of the vehicles which were able to return to Manila were assigned to the motor pool at Sto. Tomas University compound under the USAFFE Comend. Amidst excitement and confusion neither Captain Gallup nor Major Brettel could issue any receipt for the vehicles and other properties commandeered and only left word to destroy anything which the enemy may find useful and the order was duly complied with;

12. That during the last week of December, 1941, the remaining employees retained as reserves were kept at the garage until January 2, 1942, after the invaders occupied Manila, and on January 14, 1942, the Japanese Military Police sealed the gate of the garage and prohibited all employees to get into its premises;

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13. Of the number of employees who served in Bataan during the fight many were able to return sick and weak, some escaping the death march, while four (4) were wounded, 8 drivers and 6 conductors were reported dead at the concentration camp at Cepas and in hospitals in the city and several already received their three years' back pay from the U. S. Army.
