A F F I D A V I T

Personally appeared before me, the undersigned authority duly authorized to administer oaths in cases of this kind, 2nd Lieut. RODRIGO TECSON, P.A., 30th MPC Co., stationed in Alabang, APO 501, who after being duly sworn, deposes and says:

At the outbreak of the war, I was a 3rd Lieutenant in the Philippine Army. I was stationed in the 3rd Military District in San Fernando, Pampanga, at the time the war started. Col. F. Oboza, was commander of that District at that time. He ordered me to make a search for trucks and busses and to commandeer them for the use of the Army. I was instructed to give receipts for all vehicles which were commandeered. In compliance with this order, on 23 December 1941, I went to Macabebe, Pampanga, and went to the office of La Mallorca Transportation Company. I talked with one of the members of the firm, a Mr. Enriquez, and told him that I was seeking trucks and busses for the Army. He stated that none of his busses were at the garage at that time, but they will be delivered to me when they arrived. I waited until six busses arrived at the garage and took charge of them, and ordered the drivers who were in the busses to deliver them to the military authorities at San Fernando, Pampanga. I went to the house of the man with whom I was talking and he prepared a receipt for the busses, and presented it to me for my signature. I now have the receipt which is in this file before me. The receipt is dated December 23, 1941, and is headed "3rd Military Division, San Fernando, Pampanga," and on which is listed the busses by their public utility number. Receipt is of Col. Oboza's name typed on it and it is signed by me. I recognize this receipt as one that I have signed on that occasion, and I received the busses described herein for the use of both the Philippine and the United States Army, as Col. Oboza, had informed me that the busses were to be used by the United States Army Air Forces at Clark Field, Pampanga.

I do not know anything about any of the other busses for which claim is made in this case.

These busses have no seats on them when I took them. They have been used for the evacuation of civilians before they were commandeered. They were in average condition.

That I authorized certain officers under my command to commandeer vehicles and Lt. Rodrigo Tecson, was one of the officers:

That on different occasions, I sent Lt. Tecson to arrange for the commandeering of vehicles. I do not personally know where he got the vehicles, but I do know that he did commandeer some vehicles, and it is possible that he did commandeer busses from the La Mallorca Transportation Company, owned and operated by Fernando Enriquez of Macabebe, Pampanga.
